HUSKIES' HOMESTAND CONTINUES WITH THREE GAMES VS. BEARS

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (26-12 overall and 4-5 in the Pac-10 Conference) continues its seven-game homestand with a three-game, Pac-10 series this weekend vs. California (24-19, 8-7). Friday's opener starts at 6:30 p.m. while the next two games both start at 1:00 p.m. Friday's game will air on tape delay on Fox Sports Net, airing Sunday at 4 p.m. and Monday at 1 p.m. Jim Watson and longtime Arizona coach Jerry Kindall will call the action. The Cal student radio broadcasts of all three games can be accessed via gohuskies.com. The homestand concludes next Tuesday, April 29, when NAIA powerhouse Lewis-Clark State makes its annual visit for a 6:30 p.m. game. After that, the UW travels to Washington State for a three-game league series in Pullman May 2-4. Here's a look at this weekend's games:

Sunday, April 27: UW vs. California, Husky Ballpark, 1:00 p.m. - RHP Trevor Gibson (3-0, 4.02)

SERIES HISTORY: Washington is only 15-23 all-time vs. California, but won all three games in Berkeley last season (2-0, 5-4, 10-7). In the opening game of the series, Husky senior Shawn Kohn threw a three-hit shutout in a 2-0 win as **Kyle Larsen** had a solo homer among his three hits. In the second game, Washington scored three runs in the top of the ninth for a 5-4 win. **Tila Reynolds'** two-out, two-run triple tied the game and a Larsen single drove in the eventual game-winner. In the bottom of the ninth, Husky closer **Will Fenton** got out of a bases-loaded, one-out jam by striking out Scott Nelson and Scott Dragicevich to end the game. **Trevor Gibson**, who threw only one-third of an inning, got the win in relief of **Sean White**. Washington led the whole way in game three as reliever **Brian Carter** got the win with a one-third inning outing. Tyler Davidson and **Mike Wagner** went 3-for-5 with three runs, three RBI and a homer for Washington. The Huskies have actually traded road series sweeps with the Bears the last two years as Cal won all three at Husky Ballpark in 2001. Coach Ken Knutson is 7-8 all-time against the Golden Bears.

COACH "K": In 10-plus seasons as the head coach of his alma mater, **Ken Knutson** has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two second-place finishes and four NCAA Regionals. His career overall record stands at 373-247-1 (.601). With those 373 wins, he is the second-winningest coach in UW history, trailing only Bob MacDonald (422). Before becoming the Husky head man in 1993, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 180-79-1 (.694) record in home games. He is 156-111 (.584) in conference games. Knutson has coached 37 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 10 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Travis Jewett**, and **Gregg Swenson** and undergrad assistant **Jeremiah Porter**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

APRIL 23, 2003

EARLIER THIS WEEK: Washington swept a two-day, three-game series from Hawaii-Hilo Monday and Tuesday. In Monday's doubleheader, the Huskies won, 13-1 and 9-2. In the opener, **Jeff Petersen** worked four innings for the win and **Trevor Gibson** went three innings for the save. **Taylor Johnson** went 4-for-4 with a grand slam while **Aaron Hathaway** also homered while going 2-for-5 with three RBI. In the nightcap, **Clay Johnson** threw four shutout innings for a win and the Huskies got home runs from **Chad Boudon**, **Nick Batkoski**, and **Justin Drake**. Reserve first baseman **Steve Ramsey** went 4-for-4 at the plate. Tuesday, the Huskies completed the sweep with a 10-2 win. **Mike Wagner** had three doubles in the game and Hathaway added a single, double and triple in three at bats. **Josh Conover** tossed four innings in the win and two freshman relievers -- **Matt Kasser** and **Keaton Everitt** each fanned three in one inning of work.

OUTSTANDING IN THE FIELD: Washington is having probably its best years ever in terms of its defense. Through 38 games, the Huskies are fielding a Pac-10-leading .979 (third in NCAA Division I) and have made only 30 errors. The Huskies have played error-free in 24 of 38 games so far while opponents have made at least one error in all but nine games. Washington infielders have committed only 17 errors all season. By way of comparison, South Carolina led the NCAA with a .975 fielding percentage last season. Also, opponents have been very wary when it comes to trying to steal bases vs. the UW. Over the last 27 games, opponents have stolen only 11 bases while being caught 13 times.

NICK BATKOSKI, Soph. IF: Backs up at third, second, short and DH ... 13-for-37 so far ... started at 3B Mon. vs. Hilo (game 2) and hit first career HR in first inning ... 2-for-5 with three RBI in that game ... started Apr. 13 at Arizona at DH and belted a two-run single in the first inning ... got a second straight start at DH at Kansas State, going 1-for-3 with a walk ... 1-for-2 as DH in first start Feb. 22 ... 5-for-9 as a pinch hitter ... as a freshman, started five at DH, two at SS, two at second and one at third ... played summer ball for Aloha (Ore.) in the Pacific International League, hitting .323.

CHAD BOUDON, RS-Junior OF/DH: Transferred to Washington after spending the last three years at the University of Hawaii ... 13 homers are good for third in the Pac-10 and 11th in NCAA Division I (entering the week) ... 13 HRs are ninth-most in UW single-season history, six short of the record ... hit 13th Mon. vs. Hilo (game 1) ... homered at Kansas State, one of four UW homers in the fourth inning ... 11th homer was Apr. 11 at Arizona, tying the game at 3-3 in the eighth ... hit 10th HR in April 6 loss to Oregon State ... homered in the first two games at Stanford ... two homers Mar. 14 vs. CSUN ... homered Mar. 22 at UC Irvine ... started each of the last 28 -- 17 at DH and 11 in LF ... 3-for-5 with an HR Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... in 2001, played in 46 games, batting .223 with five homers, 25 RBI and 10 steals ... three-time all-district pick at Shorewood High School, just north of Seattle.

JUSTIN DRAKE, RS-Junior OF: A fourth-year Husky outfielder ... earned a start Mon. vs. Hilo (game two) and went 1-for-3 with a solo homer ... got hit by a pitch and scored all the way from first on an errant pickoff in the 11th inning of last Apr. 11 4-3 win at Arizona ... didn't play in Stanford series and only saw action as PR vs. OSU ... 2-for-3 Mar. 15 vs. CSUN, belting his first homer in nearly three years ... 2-for-5 with a triple Mar. 14 vs. CSUN ... started two of three vs. Gonzaga, one in Lancaster and one vs. WSU ... 2-for-3 with an RBI double Mar. 9 vs. WSU ... started vs. UCSB and Houston opening weekend, going 6-for-8 with three RBI ... hadn't had a hit in nearly two years ... had been injury-plagued the last couple of seasons, playing in only eight games last year and in nine in 2001, when he was granted a medical redshirt season ... as a freshman in 2000, started 20 games, primarily as a center fielder.

AARON HATHAWAY, Soph. C: Has started 29 of 38 games at catcher ... batted No. 3 in all three at Arizona and K-State, and in two of three vs. Hilo ... 2-for-5 with a HR and three RBI Mon. vs. Hilo (game 1) and then 2-for-3 with three RBI, a double and a triple Tue. vs. the Vulcans ... HR Mar. 29 at Stanford ... three-run double Mar. 26 at Portland ... 3-for-4 Mar. 14 and 2-for-4 Mar. 15 vs. CSUN ... first homer of the year in 8-1 win Mar. 9 vs. WSU ... WSU didn't steal a base in six tries against him ... has picked off six baserunners, more than double anyone else in the Pac-10 (including pitchers) ... has allowed only nine stolen bases while gunning down 11 would-be base stealers ... turned in an outstanding freshman campaign, earning first-team Freshman All-America acclaim from Collegiate Baseball ... started 48 games at catcher in 2002, including 31 of the last 33 ... played so well defensively in the NCAA Houston Regional at Rice that he made the all-tournament team despite going 1-for-17.

GREG ISAACSON, Junior 2B: Has started 32 of 38 at second base ... scored three runs in Tue. win over Hilo ... stole three bases in Hilo series ... 4-for-5 with a homer and three RBI at Kansas State ... went 5-for-12 (.417) with five runs, five RBI and two steals in OSU series ... hit third home runs of the year in April 4 win over the Beavers ... 3-for-12 with two walks and an HBP in series at Stanford ... went 3-for-6 with a homer and two doubles Mar. 26 at Portland ... belted a grand slam Mar. 11 at OSU, breaking a 5-5 tie and capping a six-run eighth inning ... only his second career HR ... three hits Mar. 23 at UCI ... five errors in 146 chances so far (.966) ... had game-winning RBI single in the ninth Feb. 14 at LMU ... a walk-on who played in only four games as a freshman and didn't play at all the first 15 games of last year ... started 44 of the last 46, however.

BEN JOHNSON, Junior C: Has served as the Huskies' No. 2 catcher in each of the last two seasons ... 1-for-3 with an RBI double Mon. vs. Hilo (game 2) ... started Apr. 12 at Arizona and Apr. 6 vs. Oregon State, when he threw out only would-be basestealer ... first hit of the year was a three-run homer Mar. 26 at Portland ... started in that one and also started Feb. 15 at Loyola and Mar. 16 vs. CS Northridge ... a switch-hitter ... started 19 games as a freshman and 12 last year ... missed most of the fall practice season with a medical condition, but is fully recovered now ... drafted by the Astros in the 29th round of the 2000 draft.

TAYLOR JOHNSON, Soph. OF: Has started 36 of 38 games this season in right ... went 6-for-7 with a grand slam and five RBIs in Mon. doubleheader vs. Hilo ... had a hit in seven straight ABs, dating back to previous game ... 1-for-4 with two runs at Kansas State ... hit fifth homer of the year in Mar. 16 win over CSUN ... two homers in final two ABs in Mar. 7 win over Washington State ... followed that with a homer in his first at bat at Oregon State ... four hits in the Mar. 11 win at OSU ... 5-for-10 with four runs in OSU series March 11-12 ... 3-for-12 with six RBIs in WSU series ... 4-for-10 at Lancaster tournament ... homer and four RBI Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... 21 of the last 33 in right to end last year ... Huskies went 15-6 in those 21 games ... batted .326 with a wood bat in league play last summer for the Bend (Ore.) Elks.

KYLE LARSEN, Soph. 1B: Batted 2-for-3 with two runs and two RBI Mon. vs. Hilo (game 1) ... sat out game two, his first non-start of the year ... went 0-for-3 at Kansas State, but walked twice, scored twice and was hit by a pitch ... reached base six times in the Arizona series ... three hits and three RBI in OSU series ... seven homers third on the team ... homered in three straight games (UCSB,

Houston and first at LMU) ... 3-for-3 with four runs and a two-run homer Mar. 7 vs. WSU ... 5-for-6 with homer, double, four RBI Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... led off the ninth vs. UCSB with a homer to tie the game at 5-5 ... two-run HR in the first inning vs. Houston, a 4-1 win ... 2-for-4 with a double and HR Feb. 14 at LMU ... 2-for-4 Feb. 16 vs. the Lions ... 4-for-11 with a homer and a double in Gonzaga series... a first-team Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball after a strong first season at UW ... finished with the second-best average on the team (.342) after having spent much of the year as the Huskies' top hitter ... after 621 career error-free chances, made first career error Mar. 12 at Oregon State ... still has only one error in 785 career chances (.999).

BRENT LILLIBRIDGE, Freshman OF/IF: Had a 13-game hit streak broken Mon. vs. Hilo (game 1) ... streak was the longest of the year by a Husky ... over those 13: 24-for-53 (.453) with 15 runs, 17 RBI and six homers ... walked twice and was hit by a pitch in the streak-breaking game ... singled in game two and then went 2-for-4 with a triple in Tue. series finale ... has led off the last five games for the UW, scoring in the first inning of three of those ... entered the UW as an infielder, but has started 17 of last 18 in center field ... the team's leading hitter with his .391 average ... batting .459 and slugging .811 in Pac-10 play, good for fourth and second in the league, respectively ... 3-for-4 with two homers, three runs, three RBI and a stolen base at Kansas State ... went 3-for-3 Apr. 12 at Arizona and, in his first game as leadoff hitter belted a homer in the first Apr. 13 ... in OSU series: 7-for-12 (.583) with a homer and three RBI ... in five games the previous week, went 7-for-21 with nine RBI ... hit a grand slam in Mar. 30 loss at Stanford ... that GS gave the UW an 11-10 lead in the seventh ... also made two spectacular leaping catches in that game ... first career homer in Mar. 26 win at Portland ... in the game-winning run with a single in the ninth vs. UCSB ... a three-year team captain at Jackson High in Everett ... led Jackson to a 31-5 league record over his last two seasons ... career .420 hitter in high school.

JOHN OTNESS, Freshman 3B: Washington's everyday starter at third base after winning a preseason battle for the starting job ... has started 35 of 38 this year, one at DH and 34 at 3B ... three RBI Tue. vs. Hilo ... 3-for-6 with a homer at Kansas State ... RBI double Apr. 11 at Arizona and RBI triple Apr. 12 ... 4-for-12 with a homer and four RBI in OSU series ... in five games the week before that, went 11-for-21 (.524) with six runs, three doubles and four RBI ... hit first HR of the season in Mar. 26 win at Portland ... 5-for-12 in CSUN series ... 4-for-13 with two doubles and a triple in WSU series ... 3-for-5 Mar. 7 vs. WSU ... three hits in win over SDSU ... 6-for-16 in the NCAA regional last year and reached on a two-strike HBP one batter before Jay Garthwaite's two-out, three-run homer in the bottom of the ninth beat Rice, 7-6, to force a second championship game.

STEVE RAMSEY, Junior OF/1B: Serves as a left-handed option at DH and a top left-handed bat off the bench ... started Mon. vs. Hilo at 1B (game 2), going 4-for-4 with a double ... pinch hit double Tue. vs. Hilo and thus a hit in five straight ABs ... got an RBI, pinch-hit single Mar. 15 vs. CSUN ... started twice as DH so far ... was the UW's top pinch hitter last season, connecting for six pinch hits on the year.

SIMI REYNOLDS, Freshman OF: Has started 10 games in center field ... came off the bench twice vs. Hilo, singling in Tue. game ... younger brother of Husky senior SS Tila as well as Oregon State second baseman Kerisi ... Mar. 16 vs. CSUN: 2-for-4 with a double ... three hits, three runs Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... started Feb. 15 at LMU, when he went 3-for-3 with a double and an RBI ... spent the fall as a walk-on cornerback on the football team, but red-shirted the year ... one of the most decorated athletes in recent Washington high school history ... led Skyline to three straight league titles in baseball and three straight top-five finishes in the state ... led summer baseball teams to three top-three national finishes over the last four years ... helped football team to state championship as a junior and a third-place finish as a senior ... earned the 2002 Athletes for a Better World "Spirit of ABW" award after co-founding "Athletes for Kids" ... one of several community service awards he's received.

TILA REYNOLDS, Senior SS: Returned for his senior year despite being drafted by the Brewers in the 13th round of the 2002 draft ... fourth straight season as the Husky starter at shortstop ... in nine career games vs. Cal, is batting .395 (15-for-38) with seven RBI ... has started 37 of 38 at SS so far, sitting out Mar. 16 vs. WSU ... only one hit in Hilo series, but scored five runs ... 2-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a walk last Tue. at Kansas State ... 3-for-9 in the series at Portland ... only Husky with more than one RBI in UCI series; he had two ... five errors in 137 chances so far (.964) ... prior to Mar. 11 at OSU, had hit in nine straight games, going 18-for-36 (.500) during the streak ... 3-for-6 with a single, a double and a triple in Mar. 1 win over Northridge ... 2-for-5 in win over San Diego State ... 3-for-4 Feb. 23 vs. Gonzaga and 6-for-10 in the three-game series ... younger brother, Simi, is a freshman CF ... named the No. 9 senior prospect in the U.S. by Baseball America ... named to the NCAA Regional all-tournament team last year ... often the Huskies' No. 2 hitter last year, batting .403 (60-for-149) when hitting in that spot last season ... led the team with .347 average and with 19 stolen bases last year ... had hitting streaks of 13 and 14 games last season.

MIKE WAGNER, Junior OF: Formerly a third baseman for the Huskies, moved to left field at mid-season last year and had started all 20 (19 in LF, 1 in RF) before spraining left ankle prior to the Mar. 21 game at Irvine ... missed all three games at UCI and both games at Portland, but returned as the DH in Stanford series and again vs. Oregon State ... DH'd twice at Arizona and then returned to the outfield Apr. 13, when he went 2-for-4 ... 4-for-7 with two RBI in two games vs. Hilo ... three doubles in Tue. game vs. UHH ... belted two homers in Mar. 30 loss at Stanford ... 4-for-12 in Stanford series ... homered Mar. 14 vs. CSUN and hit in all three in that series ... 2-for-6 with a homer and five RBI in Mar. 1 win over CSUN ... solo homer in Mar. 7 win over WSU ... had two RBI on bases-loaded HBPs in Mar. 8 win over the Cougs ... 3-for-5 with a homer and three RBI Feb. 23 vs. Gonzaga ... 6-for-12 in the three-game series vs. the Zags ... homered Feb. 14 and Feb. 15 at Loyola ... has yet to be caught stealing in 11 career attempts ... named a Baseball America Summer All-American this fall after a great summer with North Adams (Mass.) ... was the league MVP after leading the league in batting, slugging, on-base, hits and runs.
