Huskies Face Final Road Test of 2003; Travel To Face UCLA in Crucial Series

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (33-14 overall and 8-7 in the Pac-10 Conference) closes out the 2003 road schedule by travelling to face UCLA in a three-game series at Jackie Robinson Stadium. The Huskies and Bruins play at 6:00 p.m. Friday and 1:00 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. All three games will air live on KKNW AM-1150 and also over the internet via gohuskies.com. The Huskies, currently in fourth place in the Pac-10 will be looking to maintain their above-.500 league record in the hopes of making the postseason and, only two games behind first-place Stanford in the loss column, still hold hopes of a league title. After the UCLA series, the Huskies return home for the final six games of the season, hosting Arizona State (May 17-19) and USC (May 23-25). Here's a look at this weekend's games:

Sunday, May 11: UW at UCLA, Los Angeles, Calif., 1:00 p.m. – RHP Clay Johnson (4-3, 5.93)

SERIES HISTORY: UCLA leads the all-time series vs. the UW, 21-7, though Washington won two of three last year at Husky Ballpark. Husky coach Ken Knutson is 6-9 against the Bruins. Last season, the UW lost the opener, 8-1, before winning the next two, 5-4 and 9-5. In the first game of the series, UCLA starter Mike Kunes shut down the Dawggs' offense, holding the Huskies to a run on three hits. The only run he allowed came on a solo homer by Tyler Davidson with two outs in the ninth. Davidson had all three UW hits while Nick Lyon and Wes Whisler each homered for UCLA. In game two, a one-out RBI single from **Mike Wagner** in the ninth broke a 4-4 tie. An Adam Berry homer in the top of the ninth had tied it for the Bruins. In the third game, a seven-run fifth was all the Huskies needed in a 9-5 win. The UW got three-run homers from Jay Garthwaite and **Greg Isaacson** in that inning and **Clay Johnson** threw a complete game for the win, allowing four earned runs on 11 hits while fanning eight Bruins. Josh Arhart and Brandon Averill hit home runs for UCLA and starter Doug Silva suffered the loss in a four-plus-inning outing.

COACH "K" : In 10-plus seasons as the head coach of his alma mater, **Ken Knutson** has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two second-place finishes and four NCAA Regionals. His career overall record stands at 380-249-1 (.604). With those 380 wins, he is the second-winningest coach in UW history, trailing only Bob MacDonald (422). Before becoming the Husky head man in 1993, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 185-81-1 (.695) record in home games. He is 160-113 (.586) in conference games. Knutson has coached 37 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 10 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Travis Jewett**, and **Gregg Swenson** and undergrad assistant **Jeremiah Porter**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

MAY 8, 2003

EARLIER THIS WEEK: Washington swept a pair of non-conference games from Portland Tuesday and Wednesday to close out the non-Pac-10 slate. Tuesday, the Dawgs hit five homers in a 16-4 win. **Chad Boudon** belted his school-record-tying 19th of the year and freshman **Brent Lillibridge** had a grand slam among his three hits. Senior **Tila Reynolds** went 3-for-5 with a homer, two doubles and four RBI and the UW also got homers from **Nick Batkoski** and **Brian Bauer**. **David Dowling** worked 2.1 relief innings for the win. Wednesday, the Huskies broke a 3-3 tie in the seventh on a two-run, two-out single from Boudon, winning 9-5. **Greg Isaacson** went 3-for-3 with three runs and two walks and reliever **Trent Baysinger** got the victory.

OUTSTANDING IN THE FIELD: Washington is its best year ever in terms of its defense. Through 47 games, the Huskies are fielding a Pac-10-leading .981 (third in NCAA Division I) and have made only 35 errors. Washington's school record for fielding percentage is .964, set in 1980 and tied in 1994. This year, the Huskies have played error-free in 29 of 47 games so far while opponents have made at least one error in all but 11 games. Washington infielders have committed only 19 errors all season. By way of comparison, South Carolina led the NCAA with a .975 fielding percentage last season. Also, opponents have been very wary when it comes to trying to steal bases vs. the UW. Over the last 37 games, opponents have stolen only 22 bases while being caught 18 times.

IF: Backs up at third, second, short and DH ... 16-for-45 so far ... 2-for-3 with a solo homer in start at 3B Tue. ... started at 3B Apr. 21 vs. Hilo (game 2) and hit first career HR in first inning ... 2-for-5 with three RBI in that game ... started Apr. 13 at Arizona at DH and belted a two-run single in the first inning ... got a second straight start at DH at Kansas State, going 1-for-3 with a walk ... 1-for-2 as DH in first start Feb. 22 ... 5-for-10 as a pinch hitter ... played summer ball for Aloha (Ore.), hitting .323.

CHAD BOUDON, RS-Junior OF/DH: Transferred to Washington after spending the last three years at the University of Hawaii ... tied the UW single-season HRs record with 19th Tue. vs. Portland ... hit three homers Apr. 25 vs. Cal, becoming only the second Husky ever to hit three in a game ... also set a modern UW record with eight RBI ... 19 homers are also good for first in the Pac-10 and are fourth in Division I ... in Pac-10 play, batting .367 with nine homers and 21 RBI ... nine homers in league play is first in the Pac-10, and .972 slugging pct. is second ... 21 Pac-10 RBIs ranks thrd ... two-run, two-out single in 7th broke 3-3 tie Wed. vs. Portland ... 18th homer Sat. at WSU, when he went 3-for-4 with a double ... homered at Kansas State, one of four UW homers in the fourth inning ... 11th homer was Apr. 11 at Arizona, tying the game at 3-3 in the eighth ... hit 10th HR in April 6 loss to Oregon State ... homered in the first two games at Stanford ... two homers Mar. 14 vs. CSUN ... homered Mar. 22 at UC Irvine ... started each of the last 34 -- 21 at DH and 13 in LF ... 3-for-5 with an HR Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... in 2001 at Hawaii, played in 46 games, batting .223 with five homers, 25 RBI and 10 steals.

JUSTIN DRAKE, RS-Junior OF: A fourth-year Husky outfielder ... 1-for-4 as a starter in LF Wed. vs. Portland ... earned a start Apr. 21 vs. Hilo (game two) and went 1-for-3 with a solo homer ... got hit by a pitch and scored all the way from first on an errant pickoff in the 11th inning of Apr. 11 4-3 win at Arizona ... 2-for-3 Mar. 15 vs. CSUN, belting his first homer in nearly three years ... 2-for-5 with a triple Mar. 14 vs. CSUN ... started two of three vs. Gonzaga, one in Lancaster and one vs. WSU ... 2-for-3 with an RBI double Mar. 9 vs. WSU ... started vs. UCSB and Houston opening weekend, going 6-for-8 with three RBI ... hadn't had a hit in nearly two years ... had been injury-plagued the last couple of seasons, playing in only eight games last year and in nine in 2001, when he was granted a medical redshirt season ... as a freshman in 2000, started 20 games, primarily as a center fielder.

AARON HATHAWAY, Soph. C: Has started 36 of 47 games at catcher ... batted No. 3 in 14 of last 16 games ... 2-for-5, two RBI Tue. vs. Portland ... broke a seven-game hitting streak vs. L-C State ... had gone 14-for-29 (.483) during the streak ... in five games the week before last, went 12-for-22 (.545) with seven RBI, seven runs ... 3-for-7 with three RBI earlier this year in two games at Portland ... 2-for-5 with a HR and three RBI Apr. 21 vs. Hilo (game 1) and then 2-for-3 with three RBI, a double and a triple Apr. 22 vs. the Vulcans ... HR Mar. 29 at Stanford ... first homer of the year in 8-1 win Mar. 9 vs. WSU ... has picked off seven baserunners, more than double anyone else in the Pac-10 (including pitchers) ... has allowed only 14 stolen bases while gunning down 14 would-be base stealers ... turned in an outstanding freshman campaign, earning first-team Freshman All-America acclaim from Collegiate Baseball ... played so well defensively in the NCAA Houston Regional at Rice that he made the all-tournament team despite going 1-for-17.

GREG ISAACSON, Junior 2B: Has started 41 of 47 at second base ... reached base eight times in two games this week vs. Portland ... 3-for-3 with two walks Wed. ... 4-for-6 with a double, a homer and four RBI Apr. 29 vs. Lewis-Clark State ... 3-for-4 with a homer and a double Apr. 27 vs. Cal ... 7-for-14 in Cal series ... over the last 25 games, has batted .392 (40-for-102) with eight doubles, five homers and 20 RBI ... last year vs. UCLA: 4-for-11 with six RBI ... stole three bases in Hilo series ... 4-for-5 with a homer and three RBI at Kansas State ... third home run of the year in April 4 win over the Beavers ... went 3-for-6 with a homer and two doubles Mar. 26 at Portland ... belted a grand slam Mar. 11 at OSU, breaking a 5-5 tie and capping a six-run eighth inning ... only his second career HR ... only five errors in 202 chances so far (.975) ... had game-winning RBI single in the ninth Feb. 14 at LMU ... a walk-on who played in only four games as a freshman and didn't play at all the first 15 games of last year ... started 44 of the last 46, however.

BEN JOHNSON, Junior C: Has served as the Huskies' No. 2 catcher in each of the last two seasons ... doubled, scored and drove in a run in start May 3 at WSU ... 1-for-3 with an RBI double Apr. 21 vs. Hilo (game 2) ... started Apr. 12 at Arizona and Apr. 6 vs. Oregon State ... first hit of the year was a three-run homer Mar. 26 at Portland ... started in that one and also started Feb. 15 at Loyola and Mar. 16 vs. Northridge ... started 19 games as a freshman and 12 in 2002 ... drafted by the Astros in the 29th round of the 2000 draft.

TAYLOR JOHNSON, Soph. OF: Has started 43 of 47 games this season in right ... 2-for-3 vs. Lewis-Clark State ... 2-for-4 last Apr. 25 vs. Cal ... went 6-for-7 with a grand slam and five RBIs in Apr. 21 doubleheader vs. Hilo ... had a hit in seven straight ABs, dating back to previous game ... hit fifth homer of the year in Mar. 16 win over CSUN ... two homers in final two ABs in Mar. 7 win over Washington State ... followed that with a homer in his first at bat at Oregon State ... four hits in the Mar. 11 win at OSU ... 5-for-10 with four runs in OSU series March 11-12 ... 3-for-12 with six RBIs in WSU series ... homer and four RBI Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... batted .326 with a wood bat in league play last summer for the Bend (Ore.) Elks.

KYLE LARSEN, Soph. 1B: Broke nearly two-month long HR drought with eight homer May 3 at WSU ... 5-for-14 on the weekend vs. the Cougs ... two-run double Wed. vs. Portland ... 3-for-6 with two RBI in Apr. 25 win over Cal ... batted 2-for-3 with two runs and two RBI Apr. 21 vs. Hilo (game 1) ... sat out game two, his lone non-start of the year ... reached base six times in the Arizona series ... three hits and three RBI in OSU series ... seven homers third on the team ... homered in three straight games (UCSB, Houston

and first at LMU) ... 3-for-3 with four runs and a two-run homer Mar. 7 vs. WSU ... 5-for-6 with homer, double, four RBI Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... led off the ninth vs. UCSB with a homer to tie the game at 5-5 ... two-run HR in the first inning vs. Houston, a 4-1 win ... 2-for-4 with a double and HR Feb. 14 at LMU ... a first-team Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball after a strong first season at UW ... finished with the second-best average on the team (.342) after having spent much of the year as the Huskies' top hitter ... after 621 error-free chances, made first career error Mar. 12 at Oregon State ... still has only one error in 854 career chances (.999).

BRENT LILLIBRIDGE, Freshman OF/IF: Entered the week ranked No. 43 in Division I in batting and is currently the No. 1 hitting freshman in the nation ... leading the team with .409 average ... entered the week ranked fourth in the league in batting and seventh with .672 slugging percentage ... in Pac-10 games, is batting .431, third in the conference738 slugging pct. in Pac-10 play is fourth in the league ... 11 doubles in Pac-10 play leads the league ... 3-for-4 with a grand slam Tue. vs. Portland ... had a 13-game hit streak broken Apr. 21 vs. Hilo (game 1) ... streak was the longest of the year by a Husky ... over those 13: 24-for-53 (.453) with 15 runs, 17 RBI and six homers ... has led off the last 14 games for the Huskies, scoring a run in 11 of those ... over the last 25 games, has batted .441 (45-for-102) with 29 runs, 31 RBI and seven homers ... four doubles in three games at WSU ... entered the UW as a SS, but has started 23 of last 24 in center field ... 3-for-4 with two homers, three runs, three RBI and a stolen base at Kansas State ... went 3-for-3 Apr. 12 at Arizona and, in his first game as leadoff hitter belted a homer in the first Apr. 13 ... hit a grand slam in Mar. 30 loss at Stanford ... that GS gave the UW an 11-10 lead in the seventh ... also made two spectacular leaping catches in that game ... first career homer in Mar. 26 win at Portland ... in the game-winning run with a single in the ninth vs. UCSB ... a three-year team captain at Jackson High in Everett ... led Jackson to a 31-5 league record over his last two seasons.

JOHN OTNESS, Junior 3B: Washington's everyday starter at third base after winning a preseason battle for the starting job ... 3-for-5 with two doubles Apr. 29 vs. L-C State ... has started 44 of 47 this year, two at DH and 42 at 3B ... three RBI Apr. 22 vs. Hilo ... 3-for-6 with a homer at Kansas State ... 4-for-12 with a homer and four RBI in OSU series ... in five games the week before that, went 11-for-21 (.524) with six runs, three doubles and four RBI ... hit first HR of the season in Mar. 26 win at Portland ... 5-for-12 in CSUN series ... 4-for-13 with two doubles and a triple in WSU series ... 3-for-5 Mar. 7 vs. WSU ... 6-for-16 in the NCAA regional last year and reached on a two-strike HBP one batter before Jay Garthwaite's two-out, three-run homer in the bottom of the ninth beat Rice, 7-6, to force a second championship game.

STEVE RAMSEY, Junior OF/1B: Serves as a left-handed option at DH and a top left-handed bat off the bench ... pinch-hit, two-run homer Apr. 29 at L-C State ... started Apr. 21 vs. Hilo at 1B (game 2), going 4-for-4 with a double ... pinch hit double Apr. 22 vs. Hilo and thus a hit in five straight ABs ... got an RBI, pinch-hit single Mar. 15 vs. CSUN ... started twice as DH so far ... was the UW's top pinch hitter last season, connecting for six pinch hits on the year.

SIMI REYNOLDS, Freshman OF: Has started 10 games in center field ... came off the bench twice vs. Hilo, singling in the Apr. 22 game ... also came off the bench twice vs. Cal ... younger brother of Husky senior SS Tila as well as Oregon State second baseman Kerisi ... Mar. 16 vs. CSUN: 2-for-4 with a double ... three hits, three runs Mar. 1 vs. CSUN ... started Feb. 15 at LMU, when he went 3-for-3 with a double and an RBI ... spent the fall as a walk-on cornerback on the football team, but red-shirted the year ... one of the most decorated athletes in recent Washington high school history ... led Skyline to three straight league titles in baseball and three straight top-five finishes in the state ... led summer baseball teams to three top-three national finishes over the last four years ... helped football team to state championship as a junior and a third-place finish as a senior ... earned the 2002 Athletes for a Better World "Spirit of ABW" award after co-founding "Athletes for Kids" ... one of several community service awards he's received.

TILA REYNOLDS, Senior SS: Returned for his senior year despite being drafted by the Brewers in the 13th round of the 2002 draft ... fourth straight season as the Husky starter at shortstop ... 3-for-5 with a homer, two doubles and four RBI Tue. vs. Portland ... hit first HR of the season May 2 at WSU, going 3-for-6 with 3 RBI in that game ... has started 46 of 47 at SS so far, sitting out Mar. 16 vs. WSU ... ranks first on the team and 10th in the Pac-10 with 11 steals ... 2-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a walk last Apr. 15 at Kansas State ... only six errors in 175 chances so far (.966) ... prior to Mar. 11 at OSU, had hit in nine straight games, going 18-for-36 (.500) during the streak ... 3-for-6 with a single, a double and a triple in Mar. 1 win over Northridge ... younger brother, Simi, is a freshman CF ... named the No. 9 senior prospect in the U.S. by Baseball America ... named to the NCAA Regional all-tournament team last year ... led the team with .347 average and with 19 stolen bases last year ... had hitting streaks of 13 and 14 games last season.

MIKE WAGNER, Junior OF: Formerly a third baseman for the Huskies, moved to left field at mid-season last year and had started all 20 (19 in LF, 1 in RF) before spraining left ankle prior to the Mar. 21 game at Irvine ... missed all three games at UCI and both games at Portland, but returned as the DH in Stanford series and again vs. OSU ... DH'd twice at Arizona and then returned to the outfield Apr. 13, when he went 2-for-4 ... 10 homers ranks 10th in the Pac-10 ... 3-for-7 with that 10th homer May 2 at WSU ... 3-for-5 with a homer Apr. 25 vs. Cal ... 4-for-7 with two RBI in two games vs. Hilo ... three doubles in Apr. 22 game vs. UHH ... belted two homers in Mar. 30 loss at Stanford ... 2-for-6 with a homer and five RBI in Mar. 1 win over CSUN ... had two RBI on bases-loaded HBPs in Mar. 8 win over the Cougs ... 3-for-5 with a homer and three RBI Feb. 23 vs. Gonzaga ... 6-for-12 in the three-game series vs. the Zags ... homered Feb. 14 and Feb. 15 at Loyola ... has yet to be caught stealing in 11 career attempts ... named a Baseball America Summer All-American this fall after a great summer with North Adams (Mass.) ... was the league MVP after leading the league in batting, slugging, on-base, hits and runs.
