UW Gears Up For Five Straight Pac-10 Weekend Series; Arizona First Up

WHAT'S UP?: The Washington baseball team (21-13-1 overall, 5-4 Pac-10) enters the coming weekend in second place in the Pac-10 standings. This Friday through Sunday, one of the two teams the Huskies share second place with comes to Husky Ballpark as Arizona (21-15-1, 5-4) visits for a three-game series. This weekend's series marks the first of five consecutive Pac-10 weekends for the Huskies. Friday's game time is 6:30 p.m. while Saturday and Sunday, first pitch is 1:00 p.m. Admission for Saturday's game is free, a part of the annual Spring Fling that also includes the spring football game and a Husky softball game vs. Stanford. There will be no live radio for the Arizona series. However, live stats for all three games will be available at gohuskies.com. Next week, the Huskies host British Columbia in an exhibition game Wednesday night before travelling to Corvallis for a three-game, Pac-10 series at Oregon State next weekend. Here's a look at the Arizona series, with the Huskies' probable starting pitchers:

Fri., April 23: Arizona at Washington, Husky Ballpark, 6:30 p.m. – RHP Kyle Parker (1-1, 3.94)

Sat., April 24: Arizona at Washington, Husky Ballpark, 6:30 p.m. – RHP Matt Kasser (2-0, 6.91)

Sun., April 25: Arizona at Washington, Husky Ballpark, 6:30 p.m. – RHP Tim Lincecum (4-1, 2.95)

SERIES HISTORY: Arizona leads the all-time series against Washington, nine wins to seven. The first ever Wildcat-Husky meeting was at the 1992 NCAA West I Regional in Tucson, when sixth-seeded UW beat top-seeded UA, 6-5. All 15 subsequent meetings have come in three-game series over the last five seasons. Last year in Tucson, the Cats took two of three from the Huskies in Tucson. In game one, the Huskies won, 4-3 in 11 innings, when Mike Wagner was hit by a pitch in the 11th and pinch runner Justin Drake scored all the way from first on an errant pickoff throw. The following day, Arizona crushed the Dawgs, 13-4. Derek Decater was 3-for-3 with two doubles and three RBIs. In Sunday's game, **Brent Lillibridge**, making his first start in the leadoff spot, led off the game with a home run and the Huskies scored four in the first, but Arizona stormed back for a 9-4 win. Jeff Van Houten's three-run homer in the third gave his team a 5-4 lead. Husky head coach **Ken Knutson** is 6-9 vs. Arizona. Wildcats head man Andy Lopez is 3-3 vs. Washington.

COACH "K" : Now in his 12th season in charge of the Washington baseball team, **Ken Knutson** has compiled an impressive list of accomplishments. Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two other second-place finishes and five NCAA Regional berths. His career overall record now stands at 410-266-2 (.606). With 410 wins, he is the second-winningest coach in UW history, trailing only Bob MacDonald (422). Before becoming the Husky head man in 1993, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 198-87-2 (.694) record in home games. He is 172-119 (.591) in Pac-10 games. Knutson has coached 40 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 11 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Travis Jewett**, and **Gregg Swenson** and undergrad assistant **Scott Robertson**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

APRIL 20, 2004

LAST WEEK: Washington rebounded from a tough stretch of four losses in five games by taking two of three from Georgia Tech in Atlanta last weekend. Friday, the Huskies extended their losing streak to four games in an 8-4 loss to the Yellowjackets, who scored five runs in the sixth after the Huskies had taken a 3-1 lead on a two-run homer from **Ben Johnson**. Saturday, the Huskies rebounded with a 7-3 win behind a strong start from **Matt Kasser**, who allowed three runs over six and two-thirds. **Zach Clem** was 2-for-5 with a homer and three RBI. Sunday, the Huskies jumped on the Jackets early, scoring eight in the second and three in the third en route to a 16-2 win. Starter **Tim Lincecum** took a no-hitter into the sixth and finished with nine Ks and one hit allowed over six innings. **Nick Batkoski** had a three-run double in the second and a three-run homer in the third to finish 2-for-5 with six runs batted in. Johnson and **Matt Lane** also hit home runs for the Huskies, who also scored five in the eighth thanks to seven walks and a hit batter.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. In fact, 32 of the 36 players on the preseason roster are from the state of Washington, and another, **Trent Baysinger**, grew up in the city of Moscow, Idaho, just a mile or so from the Washington border. Aside from Washington and Idaho, only two other states are represented on the Husky roster as two players come from the state of Colorado — RS-freshman **Matt Tucker** and sophomore **Devin Warner** — and other from Oregon, freshman **James Allan**.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES: Perhaps more than in any other season since the 1999 merger of the Pac-10's two divisions, the preseason publications have a lot of good things to say about the 2004 Husky baseball team. The Huskies were ranked no lower than 35th in the various preseason polls: No. 23 in Collegiate Baseball, No. 27 in the ESPN/Sports Weekly coaches' poll, No. 35 in Baseball America and No. 18 in the NCBWA (baseball writers) poll. Baseball America, in its extensive preview edition, tabbed the UW for a sixth-place finish, but included the Dawgs in its postseason projections. The Huskies were represented by **Will Fenton** on the preseason All-Pac-10 team while Fenton was also named the No. 9 Pac-10 prospect for the 2004 draft. Junior 1B **Kyle Larsen** was No. 10 on that list while freshman RHP **Tim Lincecum** was named the No. 5 newcomer in the league. Additionally, Fenton was tabbed for the best fastball and the best breaking ball in the league while junior C **Aaron Hathaway** earned best defensive catcher and best arm for a catcher. Sophomore SS **Brent Lillibridge** was named best infield arm in the league and Larsen was named best defensive 1B.

POSITION PLAYER NOTES (in alphabetical order):

NICK BATKOSKI, Junior OF/ IF: Had a big weekend at Georgia Tech, going 4-for-9 with a double, a homer and six RBI ... started at short on Sunday and went 2-for-5 with six runs batted in (a three-run double and a three-run homer) ... started both games vs. Oregon State at shortstop, his first such starts this season ... 4-for-9 with two RBI and two doubles in OSU series ... 11-for-last-26 with ... didn't play in Cal or ASU series ... belted a pinch-hit, three-run double in the eighth inning of Mar. 6's 11-6 win over Mizzou ... broke a 5-5 tie with a three-run, two-out double in the ninth vs. UC Riverside (Feb. 28) ... two-run single in the seventh tied the Feb. 21 Gonzaga game at 3-3 ... UW went 16-3 in the 19 games he started last year ... started three of four in the NCAA Regional last year.

BRIAN BAUER, Soph. IF: The Huskies' top backup at shortstop, can also play second and third base ... saw action at 3B last Tue. vs. Oregon State and at 2B Sun. at Georgia Tech when he got an RBI after being hit by a pitch with the bases loaded ... got first career start Mar. 23 at Gonzaga at 2B ... pinch hit single Mar. 12 vs. LMU ... redshirted the 2002 season as a freshman at San Diego State before transferring to UW last year ... saw action in six games last year and went 2-for-4 with a homer for the year ... a two-time 4A All-KingCo first-teamer at Woodinville High.

NICK BURNHAM, Soph. OF: Has started three games and played in 16 others ... started Sat. at Georgia Tech (0-for-3) ... got second start Mar. 22 in CF at Gonzaga (1-for-4, RBI) ... played off the bench in all three Missouri games and two vs. LMU and WSU ... 1-for-2 with a stolen base in a start opening day.

ZACH CLEM, Soph. OF: Has become a ball magnet lately as he's been hit by 16 pitches in the last 20 games ... leads the Pac-10 with his 16 HBPs ... entered the week third in the Pac-10 with 10 homers, second with .724 slugging mark and fifth in batting at .388 ... 27th in the nation in slugging ... 6-for-13 with two HRs and five RBI at Georgia Tech ... 5-for-8 with a double in two Oregon State games ... named the Pac-10 Player of the Week for the second time in three weeks after a great series at Arizona State (Mar. 26-28) ... 6-for-12 with two doubles, two homers and nine RBI in the series in Tempe ... grand slam in seventh inning Mar. 28 at ASU gave the UW a 6-5 lead ... later that same game, drove in two with a ninth-inning single to break a 6-6 tie ... came off the bench to go 2-for-2 with a homer, a double and three RBI Mar. 23 at Gonzaga ... homered in each of the three wins over Loyola Marymount ... 7-for-12 in the LMU series, with seven runs and six RBI ... 5-for-9 in Missouri series and his first career homer in Mar. 6 win over the Tigers ... 2-for-4 opening day at USD ... saw action in only four games last season.

AARON HATHAWAY, Junior C: Has started 28 of 35 games at catcher and another four in right field ... had a great game last Tues. vs. OSU, going 3-for-5 with three RBI, two runs and a homer ... drove in runs in the eighth (to cut OSU's lead to 3-2), the ninth (to tie it at 3-3) and 11th (to tie it at 4-4) ... has allowed only 11 steals while throwing out 10 and picking off four others ... 4-for-12 with a home run in Cal series ... 2-for-5 with a double and two runs at Portland on Apr. 6 ... 4-for-6 with a homer and two RBI Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... Mar. 13 vs. LMU, HR in eighth to break a 3-3 tie as UW won, 6-3 ... also had two-run double in the first of Mar. 14 win over Loyola ... drove in three in that game ... led off the 11th inning of the Feb. 21 win over Gonzaga (4-3) with a game-winning homer ... two-run triple in 10th inning Feb. 14 at San Diego ... named a preseason, third-team All-American by Collegiate Baseball ... has been the Huskies' starting catcher each of the last two seasons ... a career .328 hitter entering the year, he's even better known for his defense ... picked off nine baserunners in 2003, triple the next highest total in the Pac-10 ... allowed only 17 stolen bases all last season while starting 49 games behind the plate ... has made NCAA Regional all-tournament teams in each of his first two seasons ... emerged as the UW's No. 3 hitter the second half of last season, batting third in 27 of the Huskies' last 29 games ... named the top defensive catcher and top throwing catcher in the Pac-10 in Baseball America's season preview.

GREG ISAACSON, Senior 2B: Has started 33 of 35 at second base ... had an eight-game hitting streak broken last Fri. ... 2-for-10 in Georgia Tech series ... fourth in the Pac-10 with 10 steals and had stolen nine straight before being caught Apr. 4 at Cal ... 6-for-15 in Washington State series ... 4-for-12 with three doubles in series at Cal ... hit a grand slam Mar. 21 at WSU ... eight RBIs in first WSU series ... 7-for-13 in Loyola Marymount series ... 3-for-5 with two-run HR in Mar. 12 win over LMU and 3-for-4 Mar. 14 against the Lions ... two-run double in the 10th Feb. 14 broke a 6-6 tie ... started 54 of 60 at 2B last season and made only 10 errors in 271 chances on the year (.963 fielding percentage).

BEN JOHNSON, Senior OF/C: Has played LF, RF and C so far, starting 24 of 35 ... has started last 10 in a row ... started all three at Georgia Tech, one in RF and two at C ... 3-for-13 in the Tech series, with two homers and five RBI ... 2-for-4 with a double and four RBI in only game at Cal (RF) ... homered from both sides of the plate Mar. 23 at Gonzaga, when he was 2-for-4 with four RBI ... 4-for-10 with 6 RBI in WSU series in Pullman ... solo HR Feb. 27 broke 2-2 tie in 4-2 win over Sacramento State ... has served as the Huskies' No. 2 catcher in each of the last three seasons also now a regular in the OF ... drafted by the Astros in the 29th round of the 2000 draft.

TAYLOR JOHNSON, Junior OF: Played in all of the last eight games, but started only four (two vs. WSU, one vs. OSU, one at Tech) ... 2-for-4 with a triple at Tech ... started two of three in CF in ASU series ... reached base four of nine times in Tempe ... homered in ninth Mar. 23 at Gonzaga ... 2-for-4 with two runs in win over Missouri ... 2-for-4 with an RBI double in win over Sacramento State (Feb. 27) ... had a good weekend vs. Gonzaga ... provided game-winning RBI in Feb. 21 win, singling to drive in Lillibridge in the eighth ... two-run HR Feb. 23 in 3-0 win ... after spending much of the last two seasons as the starter in right, is now the usual starting CF ... started 26 games as a freshman and 45 last season.

MATT LANE, Freshman C: Has emerged as the Huskies' regular DH in games vs. RHPs ... stated five of last seven at DH and pinch hit in two others ... homer Sun. at Georgia Tech opened the eight-run second ... 4-for-9 in two games in Atlanta ... started two of three at Cal, going 2-for-12 with a home run and five RBI ... started two of three at ASU (4-for-9 with two doubles) ... got first start at C Feb. 29 vs. OSU ... solo HR in the fourth broke a 3-3 tie Feb. 20 vs. Gonzaga.

KYLE LARSEN, Junior 1B: Started all 35 so far at first base ... 36-for-84 (.429), 23 RBI over last 22 games ... has hit safely in 22 of the last 25 games ... 3-for-5 with four RBI Apr. 10 vs. Washington State, when he was a single short of hitting for the cycle ... 7-for-10 in series at California ... two-out double drove in winning run in ninth Mar. 22 at Gonzaga and homered in Mar. 23 game at GU ... first-inning grand slam in Mar. 12 win over Loyola Marymount ... also homered the following day vs. the Lions ... 6-for-11 in LMU series ... named the top defensive first baseman in the Pac-10 by Baseball America ... has made only four errors in 1,303 career fielding chances ... went 621 chances before making his first career error ... Freshman All-American in 2002 after hitting .342 ... drafted by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2001 draft.

BRENT LILLIBRIDGE, Soph. SS: After a solid weekend vs. Washington State (7-for-12, three doubles), struggled in two Oregon State games (0-for-12, 8 Ks) ... 2-for-4 Sat. at Georgia Tech and 0-for-2 with two walks Sun. ... started both OSU games and Sun. at Tech in center field ... has started 31 at SS and four in CF ... had a strong weekend at Arizona State, going 5-for-16 with three doubles ... hit three homers in WSU series in Pullman (Mar. 19-21), including two on Mar. 19 ... four of six HRs this year have led off games ... reached base seven times and stole three bags in two games at Gonzaga ... second in the Pac-10 with 11 steals and hasn't been caught in 11 straight tries ... had hit safely in 14 straight prior to the loss vs. Missouri ... came back after breaking streak, going 3-for-5 with two RBI Mar. 7 vs. Mizzou ... HR in the season's first at bat to lead off Feb. 13 at San Diego and hit the first pitch of Feb. 15 game out for a homer ... has reached base 69 times in 32 games ... posted one of the best freshman seasons in the nation last year and possibly the best premiere season in Husky history ... named All-Pac-10 and Freshman All-America after batting .388 with 13 homers last year ... played center nearly all of last season, but moved back to his natural spot (shortstop) this year ... started in CF for the U.S. National Team last summer388 average last year was No. 2 in the nation among freshmen and his .699 slugging mark was best among Division I frosh ... named to the all-tournament team at NCAA Regional ... in Pac-10 games last season: 39-for-99 (.394) and slugged .758 with 12 doubles, eight homers, 26 runs and 21 RBI ... Baseball America tabbed him with the best infield arm in the Pac-10 and listed him as the No. 17 sophomore player in the country ... named third-team preseason All-America by Collegiate Baseball and a whonorable mention All-America selection by collegebaseballinsider.com.

TYLER MACH, Freshman IF/OF: After not playing in WSU series, started both vs. OSU (one at 3B, one at DH) ... didn't start at Georgia Tech ... went 4-for-4 with a homer and three RBI Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... homered on the first pitch of his first college at bat Feb. 14 at San Diego, starting at DH ... two-run homer in the Missouri tie ... has started 13 games at DH thusfar and three at third base ... batted over .400 in each of three seasons at Kentlake High.

JOHN OTNESS, Senior 3B: Has started 32 of 35 at 3B ... 2-for-13 in Georgia Tech series ... homered Mar. 26 at ASU ... only one error in 77 fielding chances this season ... 3-for-6 with HR Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... went 2-for-5 with a homer and two RBI Mar. 7 vs. Missouri ... 2-for-4 with a double and a homer Feb. 21 vs. Gonzaga ... at San Diego, went 6-for-16 (.375) with a homer and four RBI ... HR in the first Feb. 14, when he went 4-for-6 ... team captain after having served in that role last season as well ... named to the all-tourney team at the NCAA Regional at Long Beach last year.

MATT TUCKER, RS-Freshman IF/OF: Has started only one of the UW's last nine games, April 10 vs. Washington State (0-for-3) ... started two games at California ... started two games at Arizona State, going 2-for-7 with a double ... 4-for-12 in WSU series in Pullman, starting all three ... started all three vs. LMU and twice vs. Missouri, all in RF ... hit first career homer and had four RBI in Mar. 6 win over Missouri ... also played shortstop part of Mar. 7 game and second base Mar. 5 ... got first start as right fielder vs. UC Riverside ... appeared as PH in all three games at San Diego ... sat out his last season due to surgery on his left shoulder ... recovered in time to play summer ball, batting .288 ... older brother, Michael Done, was UW's starting third baseman for three seasons (2000-02).
