No. 13 Huskies Host Portland Before Traveling to Dedeaux Field To Face USC

WHAT'S UP?: The Washington baseball team (28-15-1 overall, 12-6 in the Pac-10) plays host to Portland in a pair of non-conference games Tuesday and Wednesday (both 6:30 p.m.) before traveling to play USC in the final road series of the season. The UW, which took two of three from then-No. 1 Stanford last weekend, enters the week second place in the Pac-10, a half-game behind the Cardinal. The Huskies are ranked No. 13 in this week's Collegiate Baseball poll, No. 15 by Baseball America and No. 21 in the Sports Weekly/ESPN coaches' poll. All five games will air live on KKNW AM-1150. After the USC series, the Huskies return home for their final seven games of the year: May 18 vs. Lewis-Clark State, May 21-23 vs. UCLA and May 28-30 vs. UC Irvine. Here's a look at this week's games, with UW starting pitchers:

SERIES HISTORY: Washington is 72-39-1 all-time against Portland, including an 8-5 win at Pilot Stadium on April 6 of this season. In that game, the Huskies rapped six doubles and **Richie Lentz** worked four innings of one-hit relief for the win. The Dawgs have won eight in a row over the Pilots. Washington is only 9-24 all-time against USC. However, last year, the Huskies swept a three-game series in Seattle on the final weekend of the regular season. In game one, the Huskies handed USC a 26-2 loss, tied for the most lop-sided loss in Trojans history. Washington won game two, 5-1, and then completed the sweep with a 10-8 victory after allowing six runs in the first inning. Husky head coach **Ken Knutson** is 35-11 all-time vs. Portland, a former Pac-10 Northern Division opponent, and 8-10 against Southern California.

COACH "K" : Now in his 12th season in charge of the Washington baseball team, **Ken Knutson** has compiled an impressive list of accomplishments. Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two other second-place finishes and five NCAA Regional berths. His career overall record now stands at 417-268-2 (.608). With 417 wins, he is the second-winningest coach in UW history, trailing only Bob MacDonald (422). Before becoming the Husky head man in 1993, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 203-88-2 (.696) record in home games. He is 179-121 (.597) in Pac-10 games. Knutson has coached 40 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 11 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Travis Jewett**, and **Gregg Swenson** and undergrad assistant **Scott Robertson**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

MAY 11, 2004

LAST WEEK: In perhaps the biggest regular-season series in Husky Ballpark history, the Huskies won two of three against No. 1 Stanford last weekend. Friday night, the UW edged the Cardinal, 3-2, in 10 innings. **Nick Batkoski** drove in the winning run with a bases-loaded, one-out single in the 10th. **Kyle Parker** threw eight strong innings in the start, allowing two runs on five hits and **Tim Lincecum** threw the ninth and 10th for the win. Saturday, Stanford scored down the stretch for a 7-2 win. Jed Lowrie belted three doubles for the Cardinal, who broke away from a 2-2 tie in the fourth with runs in the fifth, sixth, seventh and ninth. Sunday, Washington scored runs in the game's first five innings and Lincecum fanned 13 over eight innings for the 9-2 victory. **Brent Lillibridge** hit the first pitch of the bottom of the first out for a solo homer and **John Otness**, who went 3-for-5 with three RBI, belted a two-run homer in the second. Lincecum, who earned his second win of the weekend, allowed two runs on seven hits and his last seven outs came by strikeout.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. In fact, 32 of the 36 players on the preseason roster are from the state of Washington, and another, **Trent Baysinger**, grew up in the city of Moscow, Idaho, just a mile or so from the Washington border. Aside from Washington and Idaho, only two other states are represented on the Husky roster as two players come from the state of Colorado — RS-freshman **Matt Tucker** and sophomore **Devin Warner** — and other from Oregon, freshman **James Allan**.

POSITION PLAYER NOTES (in alphabetical order):

NICK BATKOSKI, Junior SS/OF: Has emerged as the starter at shortstop, having started 12 of the last 13 there ... 4-for-13 with 3 RBI in Stanford series ... drove in winning run with single in the 10th May 7 vs. Stanford ... homered the following day ... 7-for-14 with five runs batted in at Oregon State ... had a big weekend at Georgia Tech, going 4-for-9 with a double, a homer and six RBI ... started at short on Apr. 18 at Tech and went 2-for-5 with six runs batted in (a three-run double and a three-run homer) ... 4-for-9 with two RBI and two doubles in home OSU series ... belted a pinch-hit, three-run double in the eighth inning of Mar. 6's 11-6 win over Mizzou ... broke a 5-5 tie with a three-run, two-out double in the ninth vs. Riverside ... two-run single in the seventh tied the Feb. 21 Gonzaga game.

BRIAN BAUER, Soph. IF: The Huskies' top backup at shortstop, can also play second and third base ... saw action at 3B Apr. 12 vs. Oregon State and at 2B Apr. 18 at Georgia Tech when he got an RBI after being hit by a pitch with the bases loaded ... got first career start Mar. 23 at Gonzaga at 2B ... pinch hit single Mar. 12 vs. LMU ... redshirted the 2002 season as a freshman at San Diego State before transferring to UW last year ... saw action in six games last year and went 2-for-4 with a homer for the year ... a two-time 4A All-KingCo first-teamer at Woodinville High.

NICK BURNHAM, Soph. OF: Has started three games and played in 17 others ... started Apr. 17 at Georgia Tech (0-for-3) ... got second start Mar. 22 in CF at Gonzaga (1-for-4, RBI) ... played off the bench in all three Missouri games and two vs. LMU and WSU ... 1-for-2 with a stolen base in a start opening day.

ZACH CLEM, Soph. OF: Only 1-for-12 vs. Stanford after he went 6-for-14 in Oregon State series ... tied for Pac-10 lead with 18 HBPs ... entered the week fifth in the Pac-10 with 10 homers, seventh with .623 slugging mark ... had a 13-game hit streak May 8 vs. Stanford ... 4-for-12 in Arizona series ... 6-for-13 with two HRs and five RBI at Georgia Tech ... 5-for-8 with a double in two Oregon State games ... named the Pac-10 Player of the Week for the second time in three weeks after a great series at Arizona State (Mar. 26-28) ... 6-for-12 with two doubles, two homers and nine RBI in the series in Tempe ... grand slam in seventh inning Mar. 28 at ASU gave the UW a 6-5 lead ... later that same game, drove in two with a ninth-inning single to break a 6-6 tie ... came off the bench to go 2-for-2 with a homer, a double and three RBI Mar. 23 at Gonzaga ... homered in each of the three wins over Loyola Marymount ... 7-for-12 in the LMU series, with seven runs and six RBI ... 5-for-9 in Missouri series and his first career homer in Mar. 6 win over the Tigers ... 2-for-4 opening day at USD ... saw action in only four games last season.

AARON HATHAWAY, Junior C: Despite a sprained ankle, started two of three vs. Stanford last weekend, going 2-for-6 with two walks ... went 2-for-3 Apr. 30 at OSU, but injured ankle May 1 after going 1-for-3 with a double ... didn't play May 2 ... named Pac-10 player of the week after going 6-for-13 with four runs and four RBI vs. Arizona ... drove in winning run in ninth Apr. 24 vs. Arizona ... has started 34 of 44 games at catcher and another five in right field ... had a great game Apr. 13 vs. OSU, going 3-for-5 with three RBI, two runs and a homer ... drove in runs in the eighth (to cut OSU's lead to 3-2), the ninth (to tie it at 3-3) and 11th (to tie it at 4-4) ... has allowed only 13 steals while throwing out 14 and picking off five others ... 4-for-6 with a homer and two RBI Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... Mar. 13 vs. LMU, HR in eighth to break a 3-3 tie as UW won, 6-3 ... led off the 11th inning of the Feb. 21 win over Gonzaga (4-3) with a game-winning homer ... two-run triple in 10th inning Feb. 14 at San Diego ... named a preseason, third-team All-American by Collegiate Baseball ... has been the Huskies' starting catcher each of the last two seasons ... a career .328 hitter entering the year, he's even better known for his defense ... picked off nine baserunners in 2003, triple the next highest total in the Pac-10 ... allowed only 17 stolen bases all last season while starting 49 games behind the plate ... has made NCAA Regional all-tournament teams in each of his first two seasons ... named the top defensive catcher and top throwing catcher in the Pac-10 in Baseball America's season preview.

GREG ISAACSON, Senior 2B: 2-for-10 vs. Stanford, but also stole three bases in May 8 loss ... reached base 13 times in Oregon State series ... May 1 at Oregon State, went 4-for-4 with a walk, two HBPs, five runs, five RBI and a homer and scored go-ahead run in the ninth ... scored three runs May 2 at OSU ... 6-for-10 with eight runs in OSU series ... won the Apr. 25 game vs. Arizona with walk-off, two-run homer in the 10th ... has started 42 of 44 at second base ... second in the Pac-10 with 17 steals and had stolen nine straight before being caught Apr. 4 at Cal ... 6-for-15 in Washington State series ... 4-for-12 with three doubles in series at Cal ... hit a grand slam Mar. 21 at WSU ... eight RBIs in first WSU series ... 7-for-13 in Loyola Marymount series ... 3-for-5 with two-run HR in Mar. 12 win over LMU and 3-for-4 Mar. 14 against the Lions ... two-run double in the 10th Feb. 14 broke a 6-6 tie ... started 54 of 60 at 2B last season and made only 10 errors in 271 chances on the year (a .963 fielding percentage).

BEN JOHNSON, Senior OF/C: Has played LF, RF and C so far, starting 30 of 44 ... has started 16 of last 19, mostly in right ... started all three vs. Arizona (1 at C, 2 in RF) and started all three at Georgia Tech (1 in RF and 2 at C) ... 3-for-13 in the Tech series, with two homers and five RBI ... 2-for-4 with a double and four RBI in only game at Cal ... homered from both sides of the plate Mar. 23 at Gonzaga, when he was 2-for-4 with four RBI ... 4-for-10 with 6 RBI in WSU series in Pullman ... solo HR Feb. 27 broke 2-2 tie in 4-2 win over Sacramento State ... has served as the Huskies' No. 2 catcher in each of the last three seasons also now a regular in the OF ... drafted by the Astros in the 29th round of the 2000 draft.

TAYLOR JOHNSON, Junior OF: Played in 14 of the last 17 games, but started only nine ... started all three vs. Stanford (3-for-9) ... 3-for-7 with two homers and six RBI at OSU ... grand slam May 2 at OSU ... 2-for-4 with a triple at Georgia Tech ... reached base four of nine times in Tempe ... homered in ninth Mar. 23 at Gonzaga ... 2-for-4 with two runs in win over Missouri ... had a good weekend vs. Gonzaga ... provided game-winning RBI in Feb. 21 win, singling to drive in Lillibridge in the eighth ... two-run HR Feb. 23 in 3-0 win ... after spending much of the last two seasons as the starter in right, is now the usual starting CF ... started 26 games as a freshman and 45 last season.

MATT LANE, Freshman C: Has emerged as the UW's regular DH vs. RHPs ... stated 12 of last 16 at DH and pinch hit in two others ... 3-for-9 vs. Stanford ... three-run double in highlighted a six-run first inning Apr. 23. vs. Arizona ... 2-for-6 with six walks in Arizona series ... HR Apr. 18 at Georgia Tech opened the eight-run second ... 4-for-9 in two games in Atlanta ... started two of three at Cal, going 2-for-12 with a home run and five RBI ... started two of three at ASU (4-for-9 with two doubles) ... got first start at C Feb. 29 vs. OSU ... solo HR in the fourth broke a 3-3 tie Feb. 20 vs. Gonzaga.

KYLE LARSEN, Junior 1B: Batted 3-for-10 vs. Stanford ... tied May 7 game vs. the Cardinal with a solo homer in the sixth (UW won, 3-2, in 10) ... went 4-for-14 with eight RBI in OSU series ... 4-for-6 with 6 RBI May 2 in Corvallis ... became third Husky ever to hit three homers in a game Apr. 25 vs. Arizona ... all three were solo shots to lead off an inning ... 5-for-12 in Arizona series ... seven homers in Pac-10 play tied for league lead ... started all 44 so far at first ... 3-for-5 with four RBI Apr. 10 vs. Washington State, when he was a single short of hitting for the cycle ... 7-for-10 in series at California ... two-out double drove in winning run in ninth Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... first-inning grand slam in Mar. 12 win over Loyola Marymount ... 6-for-11 in LMU series ... named the top defensive first baseman in the Pac-10 by Baseball America ... has made only four errors in 1,378 career fielding chances ... went 621 chances before making his first career error ... Freshman All-American in 2002 after hitting .342 ... drafted by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2001 draft.

BRENT LILLIBRIDGE, Soph. CF/SS: Hit first pitch of the first inning out in May 9 win over Stanford ... hit two homers Apr. 24 vs. Arizona, including one to lead off the game ... went 6-for-13 with five runs at Oregon State ... 4-for-5 with five runs in May 1 win at Corvallis ... had a solid weekend vs. Washington State (7-for-12, three doubles) ... 2-for-4 Apr. 17 at Georgia Tech and 0-for-2 with two walks Apr. 18 ... has started 31 at SS and 10 in CF ... had a strong weekend at Arizona State, going 5-for-16 with three doubles ... hit three homers in WSU series in Pullman (Mar. 19-21), including two on Mar. 19 ... six of nine HRs this year have led off games ... fourth in the Pac-10 with 13 steals and hasn't been caught in 13 straight tries ... had hit safely in 14 straight prior to the loss vs. Missouri ... came back after breaking streak, going 3-for-5 with two RBI Mar. 7 vs. Mizzou ... HR in the season's first at bat to lead off Feb. 13 at San Diego and hit the first pitch of Feb. 15 game out for a homer ... named All-Pac-10 and Freshman All-America after batting .388 with 13 homers last year ... started in CF for the U.S. National Team last summer388 average last year was No. 2 in the nation among freshmen and his .699 slugging mark was best among Division I frosh ... named to the all-tournament team at NCAA Regional ... Baseball America tabbed him with the best infield arm in the Pac-10 and listed him as the No. 17 sophomore player in the country ... named third-team preseason All-America by Collegiate Baseball.

TYLER MACH, Freshman IF/OF: Started one vs. Stanford (Fri.) and one (Sun.) at DH at OSU ... 4-for-8 with a double, a homer and four RBI in the series at OSU ... after not playing in WSU series, started both home games vs. OSU (one at 3B, one at DH) ... didn't start at Georgia Tech or vs. Arizona ... went 4-for-4 with a homer and three RBI Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... homered on the first pitch of his first college at bat Feb. 14 at San Diego, starting at DH ... two-run homer in the Missouri tie ... has started 14 games at DH thusfar and three at third base.

JOHN OTNESS, Senior 3B: Has started 41 of 44 at 3B ... 5-for-12 (.417) in Stanford series ... two-run homer in second inning of May 9 win ... only one error in 101 fielding chances this season ... 3-for-6 with HR Mar. 22 at Gonzaga ... went 2-for-5 with a homer and two RBI Mar. 7 vs. Missouri ... 2-for-4 with a double and a homer Feb. 21 vs. Gonzaga ... at San Diego, went 6-for-16 (.375) with a homer and four RBI ... HR in the first Feb. 14, when he went 4-for-6 ... captain after having served in that role last season ... named to the all-tourney team at the NCAA Regional last year.

MATTTUCKER, RS-Freshman IF/OF: Has started only one of the UW's last 18 games, April 10 vs. Washington State (0-for-3) ... started two games at California ... started two games at Arizona State, going 2-for-7 with a double ... 4-for-12 in WSU series in Pullman, starting all three ... hit first career homer and had four RBI in Mar. 6 win over Missouri ... also played SS part of Mar. 7 game and second base Mar. 5 ... got first start as right fielder vs. UC Riverside ... appeared as PH in all three games at San Diego ... sat out his last season due to surgery on his left shoulder ... recovered in time to play summer ball, batting .288 ... older brother, Michael Done, was UW's starting third baseman for three seasons (2000-02).
