Huskies Return To Pac-10 Action With Three Home Games vs. Bears

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (21-13 overall, 2-4 in the Pac-10), fresh from four straight non-conference games, return to Pac-10 action this weekend when California (23-14, 5-4) visits Husky Ballpark for a three-game series. The Huskies, winners of 17 of their last 23 games, are 12-2 in home games so far this season. All three games vs. California will air live on KKNW AM-1150. After the Cal series, the Huskies travel to face Portland next Tuesday at 2:00 p.m. before heading out to play Stanford in a three-game series in Palo Alto April 22-24 in the first of two straight road weekends in conference play (a trip to Washington State follows April 29-May 1). Here's a look at at this weekend's games vs. California, with probable Husky starting pitchers:

Friday, April 15: California at Washington, 6:30 p.m. PDT, KKNW AM-1150 – RHP Tim Lincecum (5-4, 3.24)

Saturday, April 16: California at Washington, 1:00 p.m. PDT, KKNW AM-1150 – RHP Kyle Parker (5-4, 4.82)

Sunday, April 17: California at Washington, 1:00 p.m. PDT, KKNW AM-1150 – RHP Matt Kasser (3-3, 5.28)

SERIES HISTORY: California leads the all-time series against Washington with 25 wins and 19 losses vs. the Huskies. However, since the Pac-10's two divisions merged prior to the start of the 1999 season, the Huskies and Bears have won nine games each against one another. Over the last three seasons (2002-04), the Huskies are 7-2 against Cal. Last year in Berkeley, the Huskies lost the opener, 9-4, but came back to win games two and three, 7-4 and 6-4. Husky head coach Ken Knutson is 11-10 against California.

COACH "K": Last season, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 12-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two other second-place finishes and six NCAA Regionals. His career overall record now stands at 449-286-2 (.611). Before becoming the Husky head man prior to the 1993 season, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 222-92-2 (.706) record in home games. He is 184-128 (.590) in Pac-10 games. Knutson has coached 44 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 12 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Donny Harrel**, and **Gregg Swenson**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

BROADCASTS ON THE WEB AND RADIO: Live audio of all of Washington's games this year will be available either over the radio, on the internet or both. For information on how to listen to the games, go to gohuskies.com, and click on the audio/video link. Additionally, 20 regular season games will air live on KKNW 1150-AM. Those broadcasts will also be available via the internet. Some broadcasts may be delayed due to Seattle Thunderbirds hockey playoff games. All three games this weekend Cal, as well as all three the following weekend at Stanford, will air live on KKNW. Go to the baseball page at gohuskies.com and click on "Radio Schedule" under Husky Hits for the KKNW schedule.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Counting those in the "others receiving votes" category, the preseason Sports Weekly/ESPN coaches' poll ranked 66 teams this season. Washington, which tied with Pac-10 foe Arizona for the No. 12 spot in that poll, will play a total of 31 games against teams that received votes in the preseason ranking. Those 31 games come against 11 different teams, including six conference opponents. The Huskies will play a total of 11 games against four teams ranked in the top 12 in the preseason poll – three each against No. 6 Stanford, No. 9 Arizona State and No. 12 Arizona, plus two at No. 10 Texas A&M. Baseball website boydsworld.com ranked the Huskies' schedule as the ninth-toughest in the nation during the preseason. That same website currently lists the UW schedule as 13th-toughest.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, however, it's nearly unanimous as 35 of the 36 players on the team are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonian on the team is senior second baseman **Mike Rundle**, from Bend, Oregon. However, Rundle, in his first season with the Huskies, played last season at Gonzaga, which is located in Spokane, Wash. Of the 35 in-state players, 29 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades).

HOME, SWEET HOME: After opening the 2005 season with 11 straight games away from home, the Huskies' return to the new FieldTurf surface at Husky Ballpark was evidently very comforting. The Huskies won all seven games of the first homestand of the season, beating St. Martin's 10-1, sweeping a three-game series from UC Santa Barbara (6-1, 6-5, 17-4), beating Portland 8-1 and closing with two wins over Pacific, 15-2 and 19-12. The Huskies then got their second seven-game homestand off to a good start with three wins over Utah Valley State, running their home record to 10-0 on the year. While the Huskies lost two of three at home to USC, they're still 12-2 at home so far. In those 14 games, the Huskies have batted .343 with 41 doubles and 28 home runs. By contrast, the Dawgs allowed opponents to hit only .204 with nine doubles and 14 homers. The UW pitching staff compiled a 3.29 team earned run average over the 14 games while opponents pitched at an 8.79 rate. Finally, the UW has made only seven errors in 14 games on the new surface, good for a .987 fielding percentage.

RYAN ANDERSON, Freshman IF: First career hit (a single) in Mar. 6 win over UCSB ... singled off the bench Apr. 5 vs. Portland and Sun. at UCR ... 1-for-1 with run, RBI, Mar. 28 vs. Utah Valley State.

NICK BATKOSKI, Senior 3B: Has started all but one game at third base ... has played 2B, 3B, SS, OF and DH during his career ... 4-for-4 with two doubles and a homer Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... 6-for-10 with five runs, four RBI at UC Riverside ... 4-for-13, 2 RBI in Arizona series ... hit two homers in win over Portland Mar. 8 ... hit .500 (6-for-12) in the series at UC Irvine, scoring three of the UW's six runs on the weekend ... named Pac-10's top defensive 3B by Baseball America.

MICHAEL BURGHER, Freshman OF: Has emerged as the starter in center due to Nick Burnham's knee injury ... 1-for-3 with three runs vs. Portland Apr. 5 ... stated two of three vs. USC, going 1-for-7 with a run and a stolen base ... has played in 16 games total, going 5-for-27 with nine runs scored ... started both ends of doubleheader vs. Utah Valley State Mar. 28 ... singled in two ABs vs. UCSB Mar. 6 ... had four ABs off bench at Arizona Mar. 26 and scored two runs despite going 0-for-4 ... drafted by the Dodgers in the 36th round of the 2004 draft.

ZACH CLEM, Junior OF: Went 3-for-4 with three doubles and five RBI Sat. at UC Riverside ... solid series vs. USC, going 5-for-12 (.417) ... 5-for-15 at Arizona ... had a seven-game hit streak broken Mar. 18 at Cal Poly ... over those seven, was 14-for-28 (.500) with four doubles, four homers and 12 RBI ... the UW's starting LF saw only one pinch hit at UC Irvine due to a groin pull ... started all three at Santa Clara, two in LF, one at DH ... 3-for-11 with a double in Santa Clara series ... started 3 of 5 at Texas A&M tourney ... homered in back-to-back games Mar. 2 and Mar. 4, and hit two homers vs. Pacific on Mar. 10 when he was 4-for-6 with three RBI, a double and two homers ... after only three at bats as a freshman in 2003, became an everyday starter in left field last year and earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors after batting .336 with a team-high 13 home runs ... played on the Aloha (Ore.) team that won the NBC World Series title over the summer.

JOEY DUNN, Freshman C: One of three new catchers on the Husky rosters ... will start in place of injured Matt Lane for the time being ... started two at UC Riverside ... 1-for-3 with a double in start April 2 vs. USC ... 2-for-3 in start Mar. 28 vs. Utah Valley State ... started third game at Arizona (1-for-1) ... started game two at UC Irvine ... also played in game two (off the bench) of the Santa Clara series and got first career hit, a single ... singled Mar. 6 vs. UCSB.

MATT HAGUE, Freshman P/IF/OF: After only one previous plate appearance, has started seven of last 11 at DH ... 7-for-14 in UC Riverside series ... Apr. 5 vs. Portland: 4-for-6, three runs, three RBI, three doubles and a homer ... got first career start in batting order at DH Mar. 26 at Arizona and went 2-for-5 with two homers and five RBI ... only prior plate appearance off bench vs. Pacific Mar. 9, when he walked ... singled in two at bats vs. USC.

TAYLOR JOHNSON, Senior OF/P: Started all 34 so far ... walked four times Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... had an eight-game hit streak broken Mar. 19 at Cal Poly ... over those eight, was 15-for-30, .500, 12 runs, 11 RBI ... has hit leadoff

in last 23 games (UW is 17-6 in those) ... leads team with 12 stolen bases ... 4-for-12, 5 RBI in Utah Valley State series ... 4-for-12 with a homer and four RBI in Cal Poly series ... 4-for-12 with two homers, 5 RBI in Portland and Pacific games Mar. 8-10 ... named Pac-10 Player of the Week when he went 8-for-9 with five walks in three games vs. UC Santa Barbara ... reached base his first 12 plate appearances vs. UCSB ... went 7-for-15 (.467) in Santa Clara series with multiple hits in each game ... homered and drove in two runs in the 3-2 win Feb. 28 at Santa Clara ... hit an eighth-inning solo shot on opening day at UC Irvine ... saw first mound action (1 inning) at Texas A&M Feb. 25 ... taken in 39th round of 2001 draft.

MATT LANE, Soph. C: Regular starter at catcher will be out at least two weeks after hurting right knee Apr. 8 at UC Riverside ... had a three-run double Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... 3-for-8 with a double in two starts vs. USC ... had a career day Mar. 26 at Arizona despite not even starting ... came on in the third as a pinch hitter and hit a grand slam and later hit a three-run homer, finishing 2-for-5 with seven RBI ... game-winning RBI single in ninth Mar. 29 vs. Utah Valley State ... 2-for-10 with a two-run triple in series at Cal Poly ... started six of seven during first homestand, going 9-for-22 (.409) at the plate ... 3-for-4 with homer, 3 RBI Mar. 10 vs. Pacific ... started two of three at UC Irvine and all three at Santa Clara ... 3-for-11 at Santa Clara ... made only one start behind the plate last year, but made 36 starts at DH ... hit .301 with six homers as a freshman ... was a member of the NBC World Series champion Aloha (Ore.) team over the summer.

KYLE LARSEN, Senior 1B: In his fourth year as the everyday starting first baseman ... has made only nine errors in 1,822 career chances ... one RBI short of UW career record of 166 (Kevin Miller, 1996-98) ... 2-for-6 with a grand slam and six RBI Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... 4-for-10, 3 doubles, homer, 4 RBI in Utah Valley State series ... 5-for-12 with two doubles, a homer, six runs and four RBI in Arizona series ... 5-for-12 in series in Cal Poly series ... 2-for-5 with a homer and three RBI Mar. 10 vs. Pacific ... big day March 6 vs. UCSB, when he went 3-for-5 with two homers (including a grand slam) and six RBI ... ranks fourth in UW history in hits (238), second in RBI (165) and tied-third in home runs (30) ... for the third straight year, named top defensive 1B in the Pac-10 by Baseball America ... also made Baseball America's all-Gold Glove team and was tabbed as the No. 14 senior prospect in the nation ... drafted by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2001 draft.

ANDY LENTZ, Freshman OF/IF: Younger brother of UW sophomore P Richie Lentz and former third baseman Ryan Lentz ... started in CF Mar. 29 vs. Utah Valley State and went 3-for-4 with double and first career homer ... started in LF Mar. 19 at Cal Poly and had UW's only hit ... started in LF Feb. 13 at UC Irvine, going 0-for-3 with an HBP ... started last three games at Texas A&M tournament, all at second base and No. 1 in the batting order ... also started at 2B vs. St. Martin's and twice in three games vs. UC Santa Barbara ... four walks in lone start at Santa Clara.

BRENT LILLIBRIDGE, Junior SS: Has earned first-team All-Pac-10 in each of his two previous seasons ... a preseason third-team All-American (Collegiate Baseball) ... preseason All-Pac-10 and the No. 36 junior in the nation by Baseball America ... has started all 33 at SS and has made only four errors ... 5-for-12 with six RBI in UC Riverside series ... hit a grand slam in Apr. 9 win at UCR ... currently on an 11-game hitting streak: 16-for-44 (.364), 11 runs, nine RBI ... 4-for-12 in USC series ... 5-for-11 (.455) vs. Utah Valley State ... during season's first homestand, went 12-for-27 (.444) with 15 runs, 11 RBI and four homers ... hit four HRs in three games in week vs. Portland and Pacific (Mar. 8-10), including a grand slam Mar. 9 vs. Pacific and two homers Mar. 10 vs. the Tigers ... 5-for-5 in March 6 win over UC Santa Barbara ... started all three at SS at UC Irvine, going 4-for-11 with a triple ... had another triple in the 13-2 win over Santa Clara, when he drove in five runs ... made all-tournament team at Texas A&M, going 5-for-15 with five RBI ... had a three-run double vs. Evansville and a two-run homer vs. San Diego347 career average entering the season ranked sixth in UW history ... currently third in UW history with 31 home runs ... started all 60 games last year at either SS or CF ... started in center for the U.S. National Team in 2003 ... all-tournament at the NCAA Regional the last two years388 average in 2003 was No. 2 in the nation among freshmen and his .699 slugging mark was best among Division I frosh.

KIEL LILLIBRIDGE, Freshman IF: Went 2-for-4 Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... 1-for-2 in start vs. USC April 2 ... started at 2B in game two Mar. 28 vs. Utah Valley State and went 2-for-2 with two walks, two runs, two RBI ... went 2-for-2 with a two-run HR off bench Mar. 9 vs. Pacific ... first career hit was an RBI single vs. St. Martin's, pinch hitting for his brother.

D.J. NEYENS, Junior C: Had first AB in loss at Texas A&M Feb. 25 ... first UW hit was a single vs. St. Martin's March 2 ... hit a solo home run in Mar. 9 win over Pacific and then had a single the following day ... played last two seasons at nearby Edmonds CC, helping Tritons to the NWAACC title his freshman year.

CORY RICKARD, Junior OF: Started the season opener in LF (0-for-4) ... started two in CF at UC Riverside ... 4-for-6 April 9 at UCR ... started at DH in Mar. 25 loss at Arizona ... started Feb. 20 at Santa Clara ... 1-for-2 in start Feb. 28 vs. San Diego ... started one vs. UCSB and hit first homer March 6 ... transfer from Spokane Falls CC.

CURT RINDAL, Soph. 1B/DH: Has started 23 of 34 at DH ... 4-for-11 in USC series, starting all three ... hit first career homer Mar. 9 vs. Pacific ... at UC Irvine, went 4-for-11 with three of the UW's six RBI ... started two of three at Santa Clara (2-for-9) ... made all-tournament team at Texas A&M, going 5-for-15 in five starts ... got a medical redshirt season last year after dislocating his left elbow in a practice.

MIKE RUNDLE, Senior 2B: Transfer from Gonzaga starts at second base ... has started 23 of 34 at second base ... in his last 22 games (15 starts), is 15-for-54 (.278) with 15 runs ... 4-for-13 with a double and three runs in Arizona series ... 2-for-6 in two games vs. Pacific ... after missing five straight starts, got back in the order March 6 vs. UCSB and went 3-for-4 with a double and a homer ... hit .221 with an HR and 16 RBI last season at Gonzaga ... played previously at Citrus JC in Glendora, Calif., where he batted .390 as a freshman and .373 as a sophomore ... summer all-league first-teamer, playing for his hometown Bend Elks.
