Huskies Wrap Up Home Schedule Against Warriors, Sun Devils

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (27-21 overall, 7-11 in the Pac-10 Conference) plays its final four home games of the regular season this week. Tuesday evening, Lewis-Clark State (the NAIA's No. 1-ranked team) comes to Husky Ballpark for a 6:30 p.m. game. Friday through Sunday, Arizona State (30-20 overall, 11-7 Pac-10) comes to Seattle for a three-game conference series. The Huskies would likely have to win all of their six remaining Pac-10 games to entertain a reasonable hope of making the NCAA tournament field. If they did win all six, the Dawgs would finish 13-11 in Pac-10 play and, since the 1999 merger of the league's two divisions, no Pac-10 team with a winning conference record has been left out of the NCAA tournament. There will be no over-the-air radio broadcasts of any of the UW's remaining seven regular season games. However, audio broadcasts for all seven will be available at gohuskies.com. Here's a look at this week's games. Starting pitchers for the ASU series are all still to be determined.

SERIES HISTORY: Washington is 16-15 in its 31 all-time games against Lewis-Clark State, the top traditional power in NAIA baseball. The Huskies have won their last two meetings against the Warriors, beating them 8-4 last season and 15-3 in 2003. In 2002, L-C won by a 6-5 score and in 2001, the team split a pair of games at Husky Ballpark.

COACH "K": Last season, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 13 seasons (including 2005) at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two other second-place finishes and six NCAA Regionals. His career overall record now stands at 455-294-2 (.607). Before becoming the Husky head man prior to the 1993 season, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 224-96-2 (.699) record in home games. He is 189-135 (.583) in Pac-10 games. Knutson has coached 44 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 12 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross, Donny Harrel**, and **Gregg Swenson**.

WEB & RADIO BROADCASTS: Live audio of all of Washington's games this year will be available either over the radio, on the internet or both. For information on how to listen to the games, go to gohuskies.com, and click on the audio/video link. All remaining games will air on the internet only. However, if the Huskies make the NCAA tournament, all postseason games would be carried on KKNW AM-1150.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, however, it's nearly unanimous as 35 of the 36 players on the team are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonian on the team is senior second baseman **Mike Rundle**, from Bend, Oregon. However, Rundle, in his first season with the Huskies, played last season at Gonzaga, which is located in Spokane, Wash. Of the 35 in-state players, 29 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades).

HOMERS AND DEFENSE: Over the last several years, Washington has become a fixture in the NCAA rankings in two team categories: home runs (per game) and fielding. Entering this week, the Huskies ranked No. 21 in the nation in home runs (1.21 per game) and No. 5 in fielding (.977). The Huskies were also No. 3 in the NCAA in double plays with 1.29 per game. The UW leads the Pac-10 in homers and is second in fielding, behind Stanford (No. 2 in the NCAA). Last year, the UW ranked sixth in home runs (87 in 60 games) and 25th in fielding (.972). In 2003, the Huskies were second in the nation in homers (96 in 60 games) and third in fielding (.978).

INJURY BUG: More so than any season in recent years, the Huskies have been hit by the injury bug in 2005. So far, five regular players have missed time due to injuries, with three of them requiring surgery. Senior **Taylor Johnson** missed four games (April 15-19) due to a relativel minor hamstring injury, but returned two weeks ago. Starting catcher **Matt Lane** was out since injuring a knee April 8 at UC Riverside and returned to limited duty last weekend vs. Oregon State. Center fielder **Nick Burnham** missed four weeks with a knee injury that needed surgery, but returned to action at WSU. Freshman **Matt Stevens**, who had begun to work his way into a semi-regular spot in the outfield and DH, broke a bone in his hand (requiring surgery) could be out for the rest of the year. Sophomore **Richie Lentz** slated as the Huskies' closer, had elbow surgery earlier this month after having thrown in only one game this season. He's out for the year. Finally, reserve infielder **Josh Showers** has been out nearly all of the season with a back injury.

NICK BATKOSKI, Senior 3B: Has started all but one game at third base ... has played 2B, 3B, SS, OF and DH during his career ... hit a two-out solo homer in the ninth May 15 vs. OSU to force extra innings ... has gone 20-for-64 (.313) over the last 17 games ... 4-for-4 with two doubles and a homer Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... 6-for-10 with five runs, four RBI at UC Riverside ... 4-for-13, 2 RBI in Arizona series ... hit two homers in win over Portland Mar. 8 ... hit .500 (6-for-12) in the series at UC Irvine, scoring three of the UW's six runs on the weekend ... named Pac-10's top defensive 3B by Baseball America.

MICHAEL BURGHER, Freshman OF: Emerged as a semi-regular starter in center due to Nick Burnham's knee injury ... 1-for-2 in start April 19 at Portland ... 1-for-3 with 3 runs vs. Portland Apr. 5 ... stated two of three vs. USC, going 1-for-7 with a run and a stolen base ... has played in 21 games total, going 6-for-29 with nine runs scored ... started both ends of doubleheader vs. Utah Valley State Mar. 28 ... singled in two ABs vs. UCSB Mar. 6 ... had four ABs off bench at Arizona Mar. 26 and scored two runs despite going 0-for-4 ... drafted by the Dodgers in the 36th round of the 2004 draft.

NICK BURNHAM, Junior OF: Returned to action in WSU series after a month off due to knee injury ... has started 19 games in CF ... 3-for-10 in series at Cal Poly ... started two of three at Santa Clara, going 4-for-9 with a double and three RBI ... started all five at Texas A&M tourney ... four steals in four tries ... started on opening day last year, but made only two more starts during the season ... played in 24 games in 2004.

ZACH CLEM, Junior OF: Went 4-for-4 May 1 at Washington State ... 6-for-11 in WSU series, including two homers and seven RBI ... great weekend at Stanford, going 7-for-12 (.583) with a homer and three RBI ... over his last nine games: 15-for-35 (.429) with three homers and 10 RBI ... 2-for-5 with a two-run homer April 19 at Portland ... 3-for-4 with three doubles and five RBI Apr. 9 at UC Riverside ... solid series vs. USC, going 5-for-12 (.417) ... 5-for-15 at Arizona ... missed some games early due to groin injury ... started all three at Santa Clara, two in LF, one at DH ... 3-for-11 with a double in Santa Clara series ... started 3 of 5 at Texas A&M tourney ... homered in back-to-back games Mar. 2 and Mar. 4, and hit two homers vs. Pacific on Mar. 10 when he was 4-for-6 with three RBI, a double and two homers ... after only three at bats as a freshman in 2003, became an everyday starter in left last year and earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors after batting .336 with a team-high 13 HRs... played on the Aloha (Ore.) team that won the NBC World Series over the summer.

JOEY DUNN, Freshman C: One of three new catchers on the Husky rosters ... has been starting in place of injured Matt Lane ... has started last 16 behind the plate ... 5-for-11 with three doubles in series at Washington State ... 1-for-3 with a double in start April 2 vs. USC ... 2-for-3 in start Mar. 28 vs. Utah Valley State ... started third game at Arizona (1-for-1) ... started game two at UC Irvine ... also played in game two (off the bench) of the Santa Clara series and got first career hit, a single ... singled Mar. 6 vs. UCSB.

MATT HAGUE, Freshman OF/P: After only one previous plate appearance, has started 21 of last 25 at DH or RF and has been on fire ... 33-for-81 (.407) with nine doubles and 21 RBI over the last 21 games ... 6-for-15 (.400) in WSU series ... homered in Apr. 24 loss at Stanford ... 6-for-13 in Cal series ... 3-for-5 with a grand slam, a solo homer and five RBI April 19 at Portland ... 7-for-14 in UC Riverside series ... KYLE LARSEN, Senior 1B: In his fourth year as the everyday starting first baseman ... has made only 11 errors in 1,978 career chances ... with a solo homer April 19 at Portland, tied the UW career record of 166 runs batted in (Kevin Miller, 1996-98) ... 2-for-6 with a grand slam and six RBI Apr. 5 vs. Portland ... 4-for-10, 3 doubles, homer, 4 RBI in Utah Valley State series ... 5-for-12 with two doubles, a homer, six runs and four RBI in Arizona series ... 5-for-12 in series in Cal Poly series ... 2-for-5 with a homer and three RBI Mar. 10 vs. Pacific ... big day March 6 vs. UCSB, when he went 3-for-5 with two homers (including a grand slam) and six RBI ... ranks tied-for-third in UW history in hits (254), tied-first in RBI (166) tied-third in home runs (31), and fourth in doubles (44) ... for the third straight year, named top defensive 1B in the Pac-10 by Baseball America ... also made Baseball America's all-Gold Glove team and was tabbed as the No. 14 senior prospect in the nation ... drafted by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2001 draft.

ANDY LENTZ, Freshman OF/IF: Younger brother of UW sophomore P Richie Lentz and former third baseman Ryan Lentz ... stated at 2B May 15 vs. OSU ... two-run single in the bottom of the ninth forced extra innings April 17 vs. California ... started in CF Mar. 29 vs. Utah Valley State and went 3-for-4 with double and first career homer ... started in LF Mar. 19 at Cal Poly and had UW's only hit ... started in LF Feb. 13 at UC Irvine, going 0-for-3 with an HBP ... started last three games at Texas A&M tournament, all at second base and No. 1 in the batting order ... also started at 2B vs. St. Martin's and twice in three games vs. UC Santa Barbara ... four walks in lone start at Santa Clara.
