Huskies Visit Arizona State As Pac-10 Play Heats Up

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team, 21-11 overall and 3-3 in Pac-10 play, returns to the road this weekend for a three-game series vs. No. 13 Arizona State (23-9, 2-1) in Tempe. Friday's game begins at 7:00 p.m., Saturday's game is at noon and first pitch Sunday is 1:00 p.m. All three games will air live in the Seattle area on KKNW AM-1150. Those broadcasts are also available via the internet at gohuskies.com. Saturday's game will air on FSN in the Northwest on tape delay, Monday at noon, with Jim Watson and Jerry Kindall calling the action. Washington is slated to start the following pitchers: RHP **Tim Lincecum** on Friday, LHP **Tyler Cheney** on Saturday and LHP **Nick Hagadone** on Sunday. After the ASU series, the Huskies return to Seattle for a three-game series next Thursday through Saturday vs. Brigham Young.

SERIES HISTORY: Arizona State holds a 14-10 lead in its all-time series against the Huskies. Prior to 1998, the two Pac-10 foes had never faced one another, so all 24 UW-ASU games have occured in the last eight seasons. Since the Pac-10's two divisions merged in 1999, the Devils are 13-8 against the Huskies. Last year, on the second-to-last weekend of the season, the UW won two of three over Arizona State in a series at Husky Ballpark, winning 6-4 and 5-3 before dropping the Sunday game, 2-1. The last time the Huskies traveled to the desert, in 2004, the UW also won two of three, winning the first (11-1) and third (8-6) games while dropping the second (9-4). The Huskies have won two of three from ASU in each of the last three years, but are 3-6 all-time in the series as the visiting team.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. Now in his 14th season at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 482-306-2 (.611). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 238-101-2 (.701) record in home games. He is 197-138 (.588) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 46 first-team All-Pac-10 selections and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross, Donny Harrel, Tighe Dickinson** and undergrad assistant **Mike Rundle**.

NO-HITTER &THE CYCLE: Husky players have already pulled off two of the rarest feats in baseball this season as sophomore third baseman **Matt Stevens** hit for the cycle Feb. 18 and **Tim Lincecum** and **Nick Hagadone** combined for a no-hitter Mar. 12. Stevens went 5-for-6 with a single, a double, a triple and two home runs Feb. 18 at Cal State Northridge to become the first Husky to hit for the cycle since Jon Vander Griend in 1994. March 12 vs. Santa Clara, Lincecum threw six innings and Hagadone three in a 9-0 no-hitter over Santa Clara, the first no-hit game by the Huskies since April 3, 1985, when Bob Goucher and Pete Tjaarda combined for a rain-shortened, five-inning no-hitter over Seattle U. (10-0).

NO-HITTER UNCOVERS HISTORY: Both the Pac-10 Conference and UW baseball media guides have long listed only three no-hitters in Husky history, all during the 1950s. However, the incomplete statistical records for most years prior to the 1990s left plenty of room for other past no-no's that had been lost in history. Since **Tim Lincecum** and **Nick Hagadone** combined for their no-hitter March 12 vs. Santa Clara, the existence of four previously unacknowledged Husky no-hitters have come to light. First was March 22, 1969, when Gary Huson threw a seven-inning no-hitter in a 6-0 win over San Jose State in the Huskies' season-opener. On March 30, 1974, Steve Bazoski threw a seven-inning no-hitter in a 9-0 win at Portland. On April 14, 1978, Rick Anderson threw 10 innings of no-hit ball in a 0-0 tie vs. Oregon State. The game was suspended by darkness after 10 and went down in the books as a tie. Finally, on April 3, 1985, Bob Goucher (four innings) and Pete Tjaarda (one) combined for a rain-shortened, five-inning no-hitter in a 10-0 win over Seattle University.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, however, it's nearly unanimous as 33 of the 35 players on the preseason roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is are freshman pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.) and Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 33 in-state players, 28 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades).

PRESEASON ACCOLADES: The preseason publications offered a mixed forecast for the 2006 Husky Baseball season, but that's not all bad. After all, the Pac-10 preseason coaches' poll, which selected the Dawgs to finish seventh in the conference, made the same prognositication in 2003, when the Dawgs took third. In 2004, the preseason poll slotted the UW fifth, but the Huskies took second. The Huskies earned 10 points in the Sports Weekly/ESPN coaches' poll, good for a No. 37 ranking. Washington was ranked No. 38 in the Collegiate Baseball preseason top-40. Collegiate Baseball also selected Tim Lincecum a third-team preseason All-American. The NCBWA chose Lincecum as a second-team All-American, while Baseball American put him on the third time. Lincecum also made the Roger Clemens Award watch list. Baseball America, in its lengthy season preview, had a lot to say about the Huskies. Lincecum, along with the All-America recognition, was a preseason-All-Conference pick, the league's No. 9 2006 draft prospect in the Pac-10 and the No. 31 college draft prospect in the nation. Lincecum's breaking ball was also recognized as the best in both the conference and the nation. Fellow junior pitcher Kyle Parker was chosen as the No. 92 draft prospect in the nation while sophomore OF/P Matt Hague was tabbed a preseason All-Pac-10 first-teamer and the No. 39 sophomore player in the country. Finally, SS Danny Cox was listed as the nation's 42nd-best freshman.

BRADLEY BOYER, Freshman 2B: 5-for-11 in UCLA series ... went 3-for-4 Mar. 28 at Portland as starting SS ... homered Mar. 7 vs. San Diego ... 3-for-5 with 2 RBI Mar. 10 vs. Santa Clara ... pinch-hit, two-out RBI triple in the ninth Mar. 4 at Hawaii broke a 7-7 tie in 8-7 win ... started two games at Northridge at 2B, going 4-for-9 with a homer and 4 RBI ... first college hit was a homer Feb. 18 at CSUN ... tripled in next AB that game.

MICHAEL BURGHER, Sophomore OF: Has started nine games, all in center field ... had two-run single to tie the game at 3-3 in the fifth Feb. 10 at New Mexico State ... played 26 games, starting seven, as a freshman last year.

NICK BURNHAM, Senior OF: 1-for-3 in start Mar. 25 at Cal ... made two starts during Hawaii trip, in LF vs. HPU and in CF vs. Hawaii ... started Mar. 12 vs. Santa Clara, driving in a run in 3 at bats ... 2-for-4 with 2 runs, 1 RBI Mar. 1 at Hawaii Pacific ... 1-for-4 with an RBI in 8-7 over Hawaii on March 4.

ZACH CLEM, Senior OF: 13 homers lead the Pac-10 ... 34 career homers are second in Husky history ... hit three homers Tue. vs. Portland, the fourth three-HR game in UW history ... hit 10th homer Mar. 28 at Portland ... 5-for-11 with two homers, five RBI in Cal series ... seventh homer was in Mar. 19 loss to Cal Poly ... belted sixth homer Feb. 24 vs. Gonzaga ... 28 career HRs tied for sixth in UW history ... hit HRs Feb. 19 and 20 at Northridge, including a ninth-inning, two-run shot Feb. 20, which gave UW a 7-6 lead ... had a big weekend at New Mexico State, hitting three homers and driving in nine runs ... hit a grand slam and a three-run homer opening day (Feb. 11) ... provided the winning run with an RBI single Feb. 11 and the winning run with a solo homer Feb. 12 ... the most veteran offensive player on the team, Clem starts everyday in left field again this season ... batted .332 with team-high (tied) eight homers last year despite battling injuries ... holds UW single-season and career records for hit by pitch with 24 and 45, respectively ... an All-Pac-10 first-teamer in 2004 and an honorable mention selection last year.

KYLE CONLEY, Freshman OF: Has become regular starter in RF ... started last 7 of last 8 ... 4-for-12 in UCLA series ... homered and doubled in Mar. 20 win over Cal Poly ... in three games the previous week (vs. San Diego and Santa Clara): 6-for-9, 4 runs, 3 RBIs ... hit two homers Feb. 26 in win over Gonzaga, including one in the seventh that broke a 5-5 tie ... homered off bench Feb. 24 vs. Gonzaga ... started at DH Feb. 12 at NMSU ...first hit was a single Feb. 20 ... along

with fellow freshman Tyler Cheney, led Richland High to the 4A state title last year.

DANNY COX, Freshman SS: Started 27 of 32 at shortstop ... leads team with 6 steals ... went 4-for-10 in the NMSU series and played error-free defense ... hit .438 with 28 RBI and 10 doubles as a senior at W.F. West High ... drafted by Minnesota in the 34th round of the 2005 draft.

JOEY DUNN, Soph. C: 1-for-3 off bench Sun. vs. UCLA ... 1-for-4 with an RBI in a start Mar. 22 vs. Puget Sound ... started 3 games on Hawaii trip ... tripled March 1 at Hawaii Pacific ... doubled in four ABs on Feb. 12 ... started 29 games last year, all at C ... due to an injury to Matt Lane, started 21 of the season's last 22 games, including 19 Pac-10 games.

TREVOR PETERSEN, Freshman 1B: Started at DH April 1 vs. UCLA and Tue. vs. Portland ... 3-for-4 with first homer vs. Pilots ... first UW action was pinch-hit appearance Feb. 25 vs. Gonzaga ... started at 1B vs. Hawaii Pacific (2-for-3) ... state 1A co-MVP as a senior, when he batted .609 with 11 HRs in 17 games.

CORY RICKARD, Senior OF: Saw action off the bench Feb. 10 at NMSU and in 3 of 4 at CS Northridge ... doubled off bench Mar. 12 vs. Santa Clara ... 1-for-2 Mar. 19 vs. Cal Poly ... played in 21 games, starting 10, last season.

JAKE RIFE, Freshman OF: Has become regular DH vs. RHPs and LHPs ... 2-for-6 with three walks in two starts at Cal ... 3-for-6, 3 RBI in 3 games two weeks ago (USD, Santa Clara) ... drove in game-winning run in ninth with a pinch-hit single Mar. 2 vs. UT-Arlington homered Feb. 24 vs. Gonzaga... batted over .450 in each of his seasons at Lakewood High ... 2A state MVP as a senior.
