Huskies Take Break From Pac-10 Play As BYU Visits Husky Ballpark

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team, 22-13 overall and 4-5 in Pac-10 play, returns to Husky Ballpark for four games this week. First up, the UW plays host to the University of British Columbia (24-7) Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. The game will serve as an exhibition game for the Huskies while it will count towards the Thunderbirds' schedule. Thursday through Sunday, Brigham Young (13-18) comes to Seattle for a three-game, non-conference series. Thursday and Friday, first pitch is 6:30 p.m. while Saturday's finale has been changed to 12 noon. RHP **Tim Lincecum** is slated to start Thursday's game while LHP **Tyler Cheney** will go Friday and **RHP** Kyle Parker Saturday. Next Monday, April 17, the Huskies travel to Portland for a 3 p.m. game before returning to Pac-10 play April 21-23 at first-place USC.

SERIES HISTORY: Brigham Young leads the all-time series with Washington, 12-6-1. In their most recent action vs. one another, the Cougars visited Husky Ballpark in 2002. Washington won the first game, 15-8, before BYU took the second, 7-5. The final game ran into a travel-related time limit and ended in a 12-12 tie. Those three games are the only three that UW and BYU have played against each other in a non-neutral site. In 1999, they met in St. George, Utah. They've also played in the old Kingdome, in San Bernardino and Palm Desert, Calif., during the Ken Knutson era and in other neutral-site tournaments prior to that.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. Now in his 14th season at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 483-308-2 (.610). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 238-101-2 (.701) record in home games. He is 198-140 (.586) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 46 first-team All-Pac-10 selections and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross, Donny Harrel, Tighe Dickinson** and undergrad assistant **Mike Rundle**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

NO-HITTER &THE CYCLE: Husky players have already pulled off two of the rarest feats in baseball this season as sophomore third baseman **Matt Stevens** hit for the cycle Feb. 18 and **Tim Lincecum** and **Nick Hagadone** combined for a no-hitter Mar. 12. Stevens went 5-for-6 with a single, a double, a triple and two home runs Feb. 18 at Cal State Northridge to become the first Husky to hit for the cycle since Jon Vander Griend in 1994. March 12 vs. Santa Clara, Lincecum threw six innings and Hagadone three in a 9-0 no-hitter over Santa Clara, the first no-hit game by the Huskies since April 3, 1985, when Bob Goucher and Pete Tjaarda combined for a rain-shortened, five-inning no-hitter over Seattle U. (10-0).

NO-HITTER UNCOVERS HISTORY: Both the Pac-10 Conference and UW baseball media guides have long listed only three no-hitters in Husky history, all during the 1950s. However, the incomplete statistical records for most years prior to the 1990s left plenty of room for other past no-no's that had been lost in history. Since **Tim Lincecum** and **Nick Hagadone** combined for their no-hitter March 12 vs. Santa Clara, the existence of four previously unacknowledged Husky no-hitters have come to light. First was March 22, 1969, when Gary Huson threw a seven-inning no-hitter in a 6-0 win over San Jose State in the Huskies' season-opener. On March 30, 1974, Steve Bazoski threw a seven-inning no-hitter in a 9-0 win at Portland. On April 14, 1978, Rick Anderson threw 10 innings of no-hit ball in a 0-0 tie vs. Oregon State. The game was suspended by darkness after 10 and went down in the books as a tie. Finally, on April 3, 1985, Bob Goucher (four innings) and Pete Tjaarda (one) combined for a rain-shortened, five-inning no-hitter in a 10-0 win over Seattle University.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, however, it's nearly unanimous as 33 of the 35 players on the preseason roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is are freshman pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.) and Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 33 in-state players, 28 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades).

PRESEASON ACCOLADES: The preseason publications offered a mixed forecast for the 2006 Husky Baseball season, but that's not all bad. After all, the Pac-10 preseason coaches' poll, which selected the Dawgs to finish seventh in the conference, made the same prognositication in 2003, when the Dawgs took third. In 2004, the preseason poll slotted the UW fifth, but the Huskies took second. The Huskies earned 10 points in the Sports Weekly/ESPN coaches' poll, good for a No. 37 ranking. Washington was ranked No. 38 in the Collegiate Baseball preseason top-40. Collegiate Baseball also selected Tim Lincecum a third-team preseason All-American. The NCBWA chose Lincecum as a second-team All-American, while Baseball American put him on the third time. Lincecum also made the Roger Clemens Award watch list. Baseball America, in its lengthy season preview, had a lot to say about the Huskies. Lincecum, along with the All-America recognition, was a preseason-All-Conference pick, the league's No. 9 2006 draft prospect in the Pac-10 and the No. 31 college draft prospect in the nation. Lincecum's breaking ball was also recognized as the best in both the conference and the nation. Fellow junior pitcher Kyle Parker was chosen as the No. 92 draft prospect in the nation while sophomore OF/P Matt Hague was tabbed a preseason All-Pac-10 first-teamer and the No. 39 sophomore player in the country. Finally, SS Danny Cox was listed as the nation's 42nd-best freshman.

MICHAEL BURGHER, Sophomore OF: Has started nine games, all in center field ... had two-run single to tie the game at 3-3 in the fifth Feb. 10 at New Mexico State ... played 26 games, starting seven, as a freshman last year.

NICK BURNHAM, Senior OF: 1-for-3 in start Mar. 25 at Cal ... made two starts during Hawaii trip, in LF vs. HPU and in CF vs. Hawaii ... started Mar. 12 vs. Santa Clara, driving in a run in 3 at bats ... 2-for-4 with 2 runs, 1 RBI Mar. 1 at Hawaii Pacific ... 1-for-4 with an RBI in 8-7 over Hawaii on March 4.

ZACH CLEM, Senior OF: 14 homers lead the Pac-10 ... 35 career homers are second in Husky history, seven short of Ed Erickson's record of 42 ... hit three homers last Tue. vs. Portland, the fourth three-HR game in UW history ... 5-for-14 with HR in ASU series ... hit 10th homer Mar. 28 at Portland ... 5-for-11 with two homers, five RBI in Cal series ... seventh homer was in Mar. 19 loss to Cal Poly ... belted sixth homer Feb. 24 vs. Gonzaga ... hit HRs Feb. 19 and 20 at Northridge, including a ninth-inning, two-run shot Feb. 20, which gave UW a 7-6 lead ... had a big weekend at New Mexico State, hitting three homers and driving in nine runs ... hit a grand slam and a three-run homer opening day (Feb. 11) ... provided the winning run with an RBI single Feb. 11 and the winning run with a solo homer Feb. 12 ... the most veteran offensive player on the team, Clem starts everyday in left field again this season ... holds UW single-season and career records for hit by pitch with 24 and 46, respectively ...
