Dawgs Head To UCLA Hoping To Keep Good Pac-10 Start Alive

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (15-11 overall, 4-2 in Pac-10 play) takes its first plane trip since late February this weekend as the Dawgs fly to Los Angeles for a three-game series vs. UCLA (13-14 overall, 3-0 Pac-10). The Bruins are coming off of a three-game sweep at Stanford in its first weekend of conference play while Washington followed a sweep of Washington State by taking one of three vs. Arizona State last weekend. This week's series, which will air on KKNW AM-1150, is a Thursday through Saturday affair due to Sunday being Easter. Thursday, in a 6:00 p.m. game, the Huskies will send LHP **Nick Haughian** to the mound as the starting pitcher. Friday, in another 6:00 p.m. start, it'll be RHP **Jorden Merry** starting on the hill for the Dawgs. In Saturday's 1:00 p.m. series finale, the Husky starting pitcher is yet to be determined. After the series in L.A., the Huskies will travel to Provo, Utah, for a two-game, midweek series at Brigham Young before hosting UC Riverside in a home series April 13-15. SERIES HISTORY: UCLA leads the all-time series against Washington, 25-15. However, in recent seasons, that gap has narrowed significantly. In fact, in the old Pac-8 days (1968-71), the Huskies went 0-10 vs. the Bruins. Since the merger of the Pac-10's two divisions prior to the 1999 season, Washington is 15-9 vs. UCLA, including three-game sweepts in 1999 (in Seattle) and 2005 (in Los Angeles). Last year, Washington won two of three, dropping the middle game of the series. In the opener, Tim Lincecum threw one if his best-ever games, striking out 18 in a complete-game, two-hit shutout, a 5-0 Husky win. In game two, UCLA got an RBI single from Eric Taylor Jr. in the 11th inning to win, 3-2. UW had scored two in the ninth to force extra innings. In game three, **Curt Rindal** and **Matt Stevens** homered in a 4-1 Washington victory. Two years ago in L.A., the Huskies swept the season-ending series, 6-0, 6-5 and 16-5.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 14-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. He recently became the 17th Pac-10 coach to reach 500 wins and his career record now stands at 512-331-2 (.607). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 256-114-2 (.691) record in home games. He is 209-151 (.581) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 50 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 14 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross, Donny Harrel, Tighe Dickinson** and undergrad assistant **Jeff James**.

KNUTSON PASSES #500: Husky head coach Ken Knutson is already the winningest baseball coach in UW history, but he reached another milestone on March 5. Knutson, who enters this week with a career record of 512-331-2, won his 500th career game on March 5 vs. Southern Utah. Entering this season, only 16 Pac-10 coaches had ever reached 500 career victories, a group than includes legends like USC's Rod Dedeaux, Arizona's Jerry Kindall and Jim Brock and Bobby Winkles of Arizona State. Knutson took over at his alma mater prior to the 1993 season and is in his 15th year in charge. Only Stanford's Mark Marquess has more seniority or more wins among current Pac-10 coaches.

OVERTHE LAST 16 GAMES: During its last 16 games (13 wins, three losses), the Washington baseball team has put together some very good statistics, not surprisingly. As a team, the Huskies have batted .316 over the last 16 games while holding opponents to a .256 average. UW pitchers have combined for a 3.24 earned run average, allowing only 139 hits in 147.0 innings. The Huskies have 36 doubles, seven triples and 13 homers during the streak while opponents have collected only 27 total extra base hits. UW has stolen 20 bases in 23 attempts while giving up only 15 in 24 tries. And, defensively, the Huskies have made just 16 errors, good for a .975 fielding mark over the streak.

HUSKIES AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington's home game against Oregon State on Friday, May 4, will be played at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners. The Huskies and Beavers will square off in the first game of a three-game Pac-10 series at 7:30 p.m. that night, and the game will air live on FSN television. Tickets are only \$5 for adults and \$3 for children and seniors and all UW home game ticket policies will apply (i.e., family plan, group tickets are available and UW students and Olympic Sports Pass holders will be admitted free). Washington last played on a big-league field in 1997, when the Huskies playing a tournament at the Metrodome in Minneapolis. The Huskies also used to host a tournament in the Kingdome, the Mariners' former home, and played an exhibition vs. the Mariners in the Kingdome in 1986.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Counting those in the "others receiving votes" category, the preseason Sports Weekly/ESPN coaches' poll ranked 55 teams this season. Washington will play at least 24 games against teams that received votes in the preseason ranking. Those 24 games come against eight different teams, including six conference opponents. The Huskies will play a total of 12 games against four teams ranked in the top 25 in the preseason poll — three each against No. 14 Arizona State, No. 15 Oregon State, No. 21 UCLA and No. 25 Stanford. Well-respected baseball web site boydsworld.com ranks the Huskies' schedule as the 22nd-toughest in the nation (among 291 Division I programs), which is in the middle of the Pac-10 (fifth, to be precise). All nine Pac-10 teams' schedules rank in the top 30, according to boydsworld.com.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, 34 of the 37 players on the current roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is are sophomore pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.), Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.) and freshman infielder Travis Nishioka (Honolulu, Hawaii). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 34 in-state players, 31 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades) and 17 are from King County, where the UW is located.
