Huskies Take Break From Pac-10; Take On BYU, UC Riverside This Week

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (16-13 overall, 5-4 in the Pac-10) takes a break from conference play this week as the Huskies begin a stretch of six straight non-conference contests. Tuesday and Wednesday, the Dawgs travel to Provo, Utah, to face Brigham Young (19-13, 6-3 in the Mountain West) in a pair of 2:00 p.m. MDT/1:00 p.m. PDT games at Miller Park. This weekend, UC Riverside (20-12 overall, 2-1 in the Big West) visits Husky Ballpark for a three-game series. Tuesday, the Huskies will start sophomore LHP **Nick Haughian**, while on Wednesday, another sophomore lefty, **Tyler Cheney**, will get the start. This weekend's starting rotation is yet to be determined. The string of non-league action continues Tuesday, April 17, at Portland before USC comes to Seattle April 20-22 for a three-game Pac-10 Conference series. Here's a look at this week's games:

SERIES HISTORY: Brigham Young leads the all-time series vs. UW, 13-8-1, while UC Riverside also holds a series advantage, 10 wins to eight. The Huskies beat BYU twice in the three games last season, winning 10-1 in game one, losing 4-2 in game two and winning 12-1 in game three. In the opener, Tim Lincecum allowed no runs and only one hit while striking out 14 in six innings. The Huskies and Highlanders last faced one another in Riverside in 2005, with the UW winning two of three. The Huskies won the first two with ease, 9-0 and 19-3, before getting saddled with a 14-1 loss in game three. The last time that Riverside came to Seattle, in 2002, the Highlanders won two of three.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 14-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. He recently became the 17th Pac-10 coach to reach 500 wins and his career record now stands at 513-333-2 (.606). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 256-114-2 (.691) record in home games. He is 210-153 (.579) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 50 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 14 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Donny Harrel**, **Tighe Dickinson** and undergrad assistant **Jeff James**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

KNUTSON PASSES #500: Husky head coach Ken Knutson is already the winningest baseball coach in UW history, but he reached another milestone on March 5. Knutson, who enters this week with a career record of 513-333-2, won his 500th career game on March 5 vs. Southern Utah. Entering this season, only 16 Pac-10 coaches had ever reached 500 career victories, a group that includes legends like USC's Rod Dedeaux, Arizona's Jerry Kindall and Jim Brock and Bobby Winkles of Arizona State. Knutson took over at his alma mater prior to the 1993 season and is in his 15th year in charge. Only Stanford's Mark Marquess has more seniority or more wins among current Pac-10 coaches.

HUSKIES AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington's home game against Oregon State on Friday, May 4, will be played at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners. The Huskies and Beavers will square off in the first game of a three-game Pac-10 series at 7:30 p.m. that night, and the game will air live on FSN television. Tickets are only \$5 for adults and \$3 for children and seniors and all UW home game ticket policies will apply (i.e., family plan, group tickets are available and UW students and Olympic Sports Pass holders will be admitted free). Washington last played on a big-league field in 1997, when the Huskies playing a tournament at the Metrodome in Minneapolis. The Huskies also used to host a tournament in the Kingdome, the Mariners' former home, and played an exhibition vs. the Mariners in the Kingdome in 1986.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Counting those in the "others receiving votes" category, the preseason Sports Weekly/ESPN coaches' poll ranked 55 teams this season. Washington will play at least 24 games against teams that received votes in the preseason ranking. Those 24 games come against eight different teams, including six conference opponents. The Huskies will play a total of 12 games against four teams ranked in the top 25 in the preseason poll – three each against No. 14 Arizona State, No. 15 Oregon State, No. 21 UCLA and No. 25 Stanford. Well-respected baseball web site boydsworld.com ranks the Huskies' schedule as the 22nd-toughest in the nation (among 291 Division I programs), which is in the middle of the Pac-10 (fifth, to be precise). All nine Pac-10 teams' schedules rank in the top 30, according to boydsworld.com.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, 34 of the 37 players on the current roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is are sophomore pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.), Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.) and freshman infielder Travis Nishioka (Honolulu, Hawaii). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 34 in-state players, 31 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades) and 17 are from King County, where the UW is located.

#4 MICHAEL BURGHER, Jr. OF: Started 18 of last 22 in CF ... 4-for-10, 2 doubles in UCLA series ... both doubles came in Apr. 7 win vs. Bruins ... 3-for-4, 3 RBI in win over ASU ... 6-for-12 in WSU series ... over last 15 games: 14-for-36 (.389), 11 walks, 6 steals ... 3-for-3 with a BB, SB and a run Mar. 9 vs. Pacific ... started in CF vs. ECU (1-for-5) ... played in 26 games last season, starting 12 ... UW went 8-4 in his starts last season.

#3 DOUG CHERRY, Fr. IF: RBI double in first AB Mar. 3 vs. UC Irvine ... 3 at bats in 5 games during spring break trip ... captained Inglemoor HS last year ... named to his summer team's (Taylor Baseball) all-time team at shortstop.

#29 KYLE CONLEY, So. OF: Started 13 of first 15 games, but has had season come to and end as he'll undergo surgery on his left shoulder ... hit safely in the season's first 7 games.

#28 DANNY COX, So. SS: Has started 12 at SS and 1 at 2B ... last season vs. BYU: 3-for-10, HR ... 2-for-5, 2B, 3B and game-winning run in Mar. 25 win at WSU ... had a 7-game hit streak Feb. 17-Mar. 3 ... solo homer vs. Duke ... as a freshman, started 52 of the Huskies' 61 games at SS ... only 4 errors in 102 chances in Pac-10 play last year ... drafted by Twins in the 34th round in 2005.

#18 JOEY DUNN, Jr. C: Had started every game this season at catcher until Apr. 7 at UCLA ... 4-for-6 in UCLA series ... 3-for-4 over last 2 ASU games ... 2-for-5, 2 RBI in Mar. 24 win over WSU ... solo homer in 6-5 win over Pacific March 10 ... error-free so far in '07 ... 3-for-5 Feb. 27 vs. Portland ... started 29 games behind the plate as a freshman in 2005 and 10 more last season ... UW went 9-1 with Dunn as starter behind the plate last season ... started 19 of UW's 24 Pac-10 games as a freshman.

#1 MATT HAGUE, Jr. 3B: Starter at 3B after playing OF last 2 years ... 3-run homer in Apr. 7 win at UCLA ... last year vs. BYU: 6-for-8, 5 runs, 3 RBI, 4 walks, 3 SB ... 4-for-14 in WSU series and again in ASU series ... 3-for-10, 3 BBs, 3 SBs in CSUN series ... 4-for-8 in March 10 doubleheader sweep of Pacific ... 2-for-4 with 3-run HR Mar. 5 vs. SUU ... entered junior season with .394 batting average in 350 career at bats, good for the top career BA in school history ... first-team All-Pac-10 last year ... preseason third-team All-America from Collegiate Baseball.

#43 AARON RUSSELL, Fr. IF: Singled in first AB Mar. 3 (game 2) vs. UC Irvine ... started at 3B Mar. 4 vs. UCI ... first-team all-league SS at Interlake HS last season ... led league in RBI and was third in HRs as a senior.

#41 RYAN SCOTT, Jr. C: Reserve catcher transferred to UW from Tacoma CC ... hasn't yet played ... helped team to third-place finish in NWAACC tourney ... younger brother, Troy, will join UW next season.

#13 MATT STEVENS, Jr. OF: Moves from third base, where he started 56 games last year, to right field, where he's started 9 ... got first start in 8 games Sun. vs. ASU ... started 2 games in Pacific series ... also saw action at 1B ... started 2 of 3 at ECU Invitational, both in RF ... started last 2 at Cal Poly in RF (1-for-9) ... belted 17 home runs last season, second in the Pac-10 (behind teammate Zach Clem's 20) and fourth in UW single-season history ... hit for the cycle at CS Northridge on Feb. 18, 2006, finishing the game 5-for-6 with two homers ... six homers in league play were most in the Pac-10 ... first-team Academic All-Pac-10 last year ... saw freshman season (2005) cut short by broken bone in hand.

#44 BRETT WILCOX, So. C: Catcher joined team Mar. 26, first day of spring quarter ... started at C in Apr. 7 win at UCLA, going 1-for-5 with RBI double ... caught an inning Sat. vs. ASU ... played last season at Bellevue CC ... MVP of KingCo 4A Conference as senior at Bothell High in 2005.
