Final Non-Conference Series of 2007 Pits Huskies vs. Utah Valley State

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (20-18 overall, 6-6 in the Pac-10) plays its final non-conference, three-game series of the season this week as the Huskies travel to Orem, Utah, for a three-game set at Utah Valley State College (17-24). The trip marks the Huskies' second trip to the Orem/Provo area in the last couple of weeks as the Dawgs played two games at BYU April 10-11. Thursday and Friday, game time at Wolverine Stadium (also home to the Orem Owlz, the Angels' Pioneer League team) is 7:00 p.m. MDT/6:00 p.m. PDT. Saturday's series finale starts at 1:00 p.m. MDT/noon PDT. Live audio of all three games will air live on gohuskies.com. The Huskies will start RHP Jorden Merry on Thursday, LHP Nick Haughian Friday and RHP Jason Erickson Saturday. Next week, the Huskies return to Pac-10 play vs. Oregon State. Game one of that three-game series (May 4, 7:30 p.m.) will be played at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners. Here's a look at this week's games:

SERIES HISTORY: Utah Valley State moved from being a junior college directly to Division I prior to the 2004 baseball season, meaning that 2007 marks the Wolverines' fourth year as a four-year school. The Huskies and Wolverines have played each other three times, when the UW swept a three-game series in Seattle in 2005. In game one, the Huskies got a two-run homer in the first from Kyle Larsen and hung on for a 3-1 lead. In game two, Brandon McKerney, in his first start, gave up only one hit over 6.1 IP in an 11-1 Husky win. In the finale, the Huskies, Washington surrendered a 4-1 lead in the top of the eighth, but scored one in the bottom of the eighth and another in the ninth in a 6-5 victory.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach Ken Knutson became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 14-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. He recently became the 17th Pac-10 coach to reach 500 wins and his career record now stands at 517-338-2 (.604). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 260-116-2 (.691) record in home games. He is 211-154 (.578) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 50 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 14 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants Joe Ross, Donny Harrel and Tighe Dickinson.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

KNUTSON PASSES #500: Husky head coach Ken Knutson is already the winningest baseball coach in UW history, but he reached another milestone on March 5. Knutson, who enters this week with a career record of 517-338-2, won his 500th career game on March 5 vs. Southern Utah. Entering this season, only 16 Pac-10 coaches had ever reached 500 career victories, a group than includes legends like USC's Rod Dedeaux, Arizona's Jerry Kindall and Jim Brock and Bobby Winkles of Arizona State. Knutson took over at his alma mater prior to the 1993 season and is in his 15th year in charge. Only Stanford's Mark Marquess has more seniority or more wins among current Pac-10 coaches.

HUSKIES AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington's home game against Oregon State on Friday, May 4, will be played at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners. The Huskies and Beavers will square off in the first game of a three-game Pac-10 series at 7:30 p.m. that night, and the game will air live on FSN television. Tickets are only \$5 for adults and \$3 for children and seniors and all UW home game ticket policies will apply (i.e., family plan, group tickets are available and UW students and Olympic Sports Pass holders will be admitted free). Washington last played on a big-league field in 1997, when the Huskies playing a tournament at the Metrodome in Minneapolis. The Huskies also used to host a tournament in the Kingdome, the Mariners' former home, and played an exhibition vs. the Mariners in the Kingdome in 1986.

INJURY BUG: Washington has suffered a rash of recent injuries, greatly reducing the number of available players. Two regular starters in the outfield are out for the remainder of the season: Kyle Conley and Andy Lentz. Additionally, Brett Kaluza may miss action this weekend due to injury. In the infield, second baseman Bradley Boyer has missed six straight games due to an ankle injury, but could return this week (he started vs. UBC in Tuesday's exhibition). Shortstop Brian Pearl missed several games earlier due to a back problem. Behind the plate, catchers Joey Dunn, Max Kwan, Bryce Anderson and Ryan Scott have all missed significant time due to injury while, on the mound, the Huskies missed Brandon McKerney for the first part of the season and recently discovered that Cam Nobles' season is over due to an injury.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, 34 of the 37 players on the current roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is are sophomore pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.), Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.) and freshman infielder Travis Nishioka (Honolulu, Hawaii). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 34 in-state players, 31 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades) and 17 are from King County, where the UW is located.
