Huskies Head Into Home Stretch; Face Portland & Stanford This Week

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (23-21 overall, 8-7 in the Pac-10), heads into the final three weeks of the season with a busy schedule this week. Tuesday (6:30 p.m.) and Wednesday (3:00 p.m.), the Huskies play host to Portland (19-23) in a pair of non-conference games. This Friday through Sunday, the Huskies travel to face Stanford (19-26, 4-14 Pac-10) in a three-game, conference series. First pitch Friday is at 6:00 p.m. while Saturday and Sunday's games get underway at 1:00 p.m. LHP **Nick Haughian** is slated to start Tuesday vs. Portland while the second game's starter is yet to be determined. This weekend, the Huskies will hand the ball to RHP **Jason Erickson** on Fri., RHP **Elliott Cribby** on Sat. and RHP **Jorden Merry** on Sun. All but the Friday game will air live on KKNW AM-1150 (Friday's game will be available over the internet). Here's a look at this week's games:

SERIES HISTORY: The Huskies lead the all-time series against Portland, 82-44-1. However, the Pilots have won two of three this season against Washington. Portland won 13-11 at Husky Ballpark on Feb. 27. The Huskies won the following meeting, 14-10, in Portland on March 20. On April 18, Portland won a six-inning, rain-shortened game, 5-4. Stanford holds a 38-14 record against the Huskies, including a three-game sweep last season in Seattle, when the Cardinal won, 5-0, 14-6, and 10-2. The Cardinal also swept a three-game series in 2005 in Palo Alto, meaning they have won six straight. In 2004, the Huskies won two of three, including the series finale. Husky head coach Ken Knutson is 45-16 all-time vs. Portland 11-21 all-time vs. Stanford.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 14-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. He recently became the 17th Pac-10 coach to reach 500 wins and his career record now stands at 520-341-2 (.604). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 262-117-2 (.690) record in home games. He is 213-155 (.579) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 50 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 14 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross, Donny Harrel** and **Tighe Dickinson**.

KNUTSON PASSES #500: Husky head coach Ken Knutson is already the winningest baseball coach in UW history, but he reached another milestone on March 5. Knutson, who enters this week with a career record of 520-341-2, won his 500th career game on March 5 vs. Southern Utah. Entering this season, only 16 Pac-10 coaches had ever reached 500 career victories, a group than includes legends like USC's Rod Dedeaux, Arizona's Jerry Kindall and Jim Brock and Bobby Winkles of Arizona State. Knutson took over at his alma mater prior to the 1993 season and is in his 15th year in charge. Only Stanford's Mark Marquess has more seniority or more wins among current Pac-10 coaches.

HUSKIES AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington played its first game ever at Safeco Field last Friday, beating then-No. 8 Oregon State, 9-6. A crowd of 10,421 watched the Husky win, marking the largest-ever attendance for a conference game in Pac-10 history. The old record of 9,772 was set in Tucson for an Arizona-Arizona State game in 1980. The attendance was also the second-most ever for a Husky baseball game, just shy of the 10,688 who attended the NCAA Regional final game vs. Mississippi State in Starkville, Miss., in 1997.

INJURY BUG: Washington has suffered a rash of recent injuries, greatly reducing the number of available players. Two regular outfielders are out for the remainder of the season: Kyle Conley and Andy Lentz. Additionally, Brett Kaluza missed last weekend due to illness and Ty Rasmussen suffered an arm injury during the April 27 game, but managed to return a week later. In the infield, second baseman Bradley Boyer missed six games due to an ankle injury, but returned two weeks ago. SS Brian Pearl missed several games earlier due to a back problem. Behind the plate, catchers Joey Dunn, Max Kwan, Bryce Anderson and Ryan Scott have all missed significant time due to injury while, on the mound, the Huskies missed Brandon McKerney for the first part of the season and recently discovered that Cam Nobles' season is over due to an injury.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, 35 of the 38 players on the current roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is are sophomore pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.), Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.) and freshman infielder Travis Nishioka (Honolulu, Hawaii). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 35 in-state players, 32 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades) and 17 are from King County, where the UW is located.
