Diamond Dawgs Close Out 2007
Regular Season vs. Golden Bears

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (27-26 overall, 9-12 in the Pac-10), which enters the week fifth in the conference standings, wraps up the 2007 regular season this weekend in a three-game series at Husky Ballpark vs. fourth-place California (28-24, 11-10). The series has postseason implications as, with a sweep, the Huskies would guarantee themselves fourth place. Depending on other series' outcomes, Cal could finish as high as a tie for second-place with a sweep while just one win would ensure the Bears sole possession of fourth place. While the NCAA doesn't necessarily go by standings to determine the field for the NCAA tournament, it's worth noting that no fewer than four Pac-10 teams have made it into the 64-team field each of the last 10 seasons and in only one season has an eligible team been "skipped" in the standings in favor of a lower team (coincidentally, it was fifth- and sixth-place (tied) Cal and UW that were bypassed in favor of sixth-place (tied) Stanford in 2005). Friday's 6:30 p.m. game will not air on radio, but as is the case for all three games, fans can catch a live video broadcast on gohuskies.com. Saturday (2:00 p.m.) and Sunday (1:00 p.m.), games will air live on KKNW AM-1150 and also over the internet. The UW's starting pitching rotation for the series has yet to be determined. SERIES HISTORY: California leads the all-time series with a 29-22 record in 51 meetings with the Huskies. Last season in Berkeley, the Bears won two of three from the Dawgs, winning the first two before the UW won the third. In the opener, a 9-3 Cal win, Brandon Morrow struck out eight and didn't walk anyone in seven innings for the win. All three UW runs came on a homer from Zach Clem. Cal won game two, 2-1, with a controversial ending. Bradley Boyer was thrown out at the plate trying to score on a Ryan Anderson single in the ninth, ending the game with the Huskies arguing the call. Washington got a 5-0 shutout behind an eight-inning start from Tim Lincecum in the third game. Clem and Matt Hague hit homers for the UW. In 2004 in Seattle, Washington won two of three vs. Cal.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. That accomplishment is just one item on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 14-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. He recently became the 17th Pac-10 coach to reach 500 wins and his career record now stands at 524-346-2 (.602). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 265-117-2 (.693) record in home games. He is 214-160 (.572) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 50 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 14 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Donny Harrel** and **Tighe Dickinson**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

KNUTSON PASSES #500: Husky head coach Ken Knutson is already the winningest baseball coach in UW history, but he reached another milestone on March 5. Knutson, who enters this week with a career record of 524-346-2, won his 500th career game on March 5 vs. Southern Utah. Entering this season, only 16 Pac-10 coaches had ever reached 500 career victories, a group that includes legends like USC's Rod Dedeaux, Arizona's Jerry Kindall and Jim Brock and Bobby Winkles of Arizona State.

HUSKIES AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington played its first game ever at Safeco Field on May 4, beating then-No. 8 Oregon State, 9-6. A crowd of 10,421 watched the Husky win, marking the largest-ever attendance for a conference game in Pac-10 history. The old record of 9,772 was set in Tucson for an Arizona-Arizona State game in 1980. The attendance was also the second-most ever for a Husky baseball game, just shy of the 10,688 who attended the NCAA Regional final game vs. Mississippi State in Starkville, Miss., in 1997.

INJURY BUG: Washington has suffered a rash of recent injuries, greatly reducing the number of available players. Three regular outfielders are likely out for the remainder of the season: Kyle Conley, Andy Lentz and Jake Rife (who could possibly return). Additionally, Brett Kaluza missed two weeks due to illness (he made his first start since May 15 vs. Gonzaga) and Ty Rasmussen suffered an arm injury during the April 27 game, but managed to return a week later. In the infield, second baseman Bradley Boyer missed six games due to an ankle injury, but returned three weeks ago. SS Brian Pearl missed several games earlier due to a back problem. Behind the plate, catchers Joey Dunn, Max Kwan, Bryce Anderson and Ryan Scott have all missed significant time due to injury while, on the mound, the Huskies missed Brandon McKerney for the first part of the season and recently discovered that Cam Nobles' season is over due to an injury.

NORTHWEST FLAVOR: As is usually the case, the Husky baseball roster is made up primarily of players from the state of Washington. This year, 35 of the 38 players on the current roster are from the state of Washington. The only non-Washingtonians on the team is sophomore pitchers Bryce Mooney (Lake Oswego, Ore.), Geoff Nichols (Portland, Ore.) and freshman infielder Travis Nishioka (Honolulu, Hawaii). For those unfamiliar with Northwest geography, both Lake Oswego and Portland are within a few miles of the border with Washington. Of the 35 in-state players, 32 are from the western part of the state (west of the Cascades) and 17 are from King County, where the UW is located.
