# Streaking Huskies Open Pac-10 Slate vs. Beavers In Corvallis

**THIS WEEK:** The Washington baseball team (16-6) begins Pac-10 Conference play this weekend at Oregon State on a hot streak, having won 11 straight games. The Huskies have played their last 14 at home and will play eight more home games in a row after the OSU series. Friday's game starts at 5:00 p.m. while Saturday's first pitch is at 1:00 p.m. Sunday's game time has been moved to 2:00 p.m. All three games will air live on KKNW AM-1150 and Sunday's game will also air live on FSN-TV. The Huskies will start LHP **Nick Haughian** (2-1, 3.54) Friday vs. the Beavers. Saturday, junior RHP **Jorden Merry** (3-0, 1.31) will get the ball. Sunday's starter has yet to be determined. After the OSU series, the Huskies return home to play Tuesday vs. Portland before Brigham Young visits Husky Ballpark for a three-game series next Thursday through Saturday. **SERIES HISTORY:** Oregon State holds a 218-177-1 advantage in the all-time series with Washington. Last year, the Huskies won two of three from the eventual (and then-No. 8) Beavers. In the opener, played in front of 10,421 fans (a Pac-10 record for a conference game), the UW won 6-2 behind six strong innings from starter **Jason Erickson**. In game two, catcher **Joey Dunn** notched three hits and four RBI in a 9-6 Husky win. OSU won game three, 8-2.Husky coach **Ken Knutson** is 43-38 all-time vs. Oregon State.

**COACH "K":** In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. Last season, he became only the 17th coach in Pac-10 history to reach 500 career wins. Those are just two of the many accomplishments on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 15-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 542-353-2 (.605). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 279-121-2 (.697) record in home games. He is 216-162 (.571) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 52 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 15 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross, Donny Harrel**, and **Tighe Dickinson**.

#### WASHINGTON BASEBALL

**MARCH 27, 2008** 

**HUSKIES AT SAFECO FIELD:** Washington's home game against Arizona on Friday, April 4, will be played at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners. The UW and UA will square off in the first game of a three-game Pac-10 series at 6:30 p.m. that night. Tickets are \$8 and group tickets (15 or more) are only \$5. UW students will be admitted free. Last year, the Huskies beat Oregon State, 6-2, in front of 10,421 fans at Safeco Field in their first ever game at the Mariners' home, setting a Pac-10 attendance record for a conference game. Prior to last season, UW last played on a big-league field in 1997, when the Huskies playing a tournament at the Metrodome in Minneapolis. The Huskies also used to host a tournament in the Kingdome, the Mariners' old home, and played an exhibition vs. the Ms in the Kingdome in 1986.

**11-GAME WIN STREAK:** The Huskies enter the conference season on an 11-game winning streak, with all of those victories coming at home over a 12-day period. The win streak is the UW's longest since the 2003 Dawgs won 11 in a row. It's also tied for the fourth-longest win streak in Husky history. However, only the 2003 streak included games only against Division I opponents. The UW's longest-ever win streak was a 19-game run in 1979. After that, a 15-game streak that covered the end of the 1993 season and the beginning of 1994. The Huskies had a 13-game streak in 1985 and two separate 11-game streaks in 1997. During this current streak, the Huskies are batting .315 with a 1.82 team ERA.

**RUGGED PAC-10:** Any team that plays in the Pac-10 can say that it has a pretty tough schedule. But this year, all the more so. In the three most widely respected college baseball polls, three *different* Pac-10 teams were ranked No. 1 this preseason. Collegiate Baseball magazine was first, ranking Arizona No. 1 in its preseason top 40. Then, Baseball America issued its preseason top 25 with UCLA holding the No. 1 spot, just in front of Arizona. Then, the preseason USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll was released with Arizona State voted as the preseason No. 1 team. Then, add in the fact that Oregon State is the two-time defending national champion and isn't even one of those three No. 1 teams and the Pac-10 is clearly a challenge this season.

**WASHINGTON'S TEAM:** The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington. This year's squad, however, represents a first in the Ken Knutson era as all 38 players on the roster played their high school ball in Washington. In fact, the majority of players (20 out of 38) attended high school in King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 32 of 38 are from either King County or the two counties that abut King Country from the south and north (Pierce and Snohomish, respectively). In other words, 32 of 38 players on this year's team come from within about a 40-mile radius of the UW's Seattle campus.
