Huskies Return To Pac-10 Race With Three-Game Series At No. 8 Cal

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (23-12 overall, 3-3 in the Pac-10), after six straight non-conference games, returns to Pac-10 Conference action this weekend when Huskies travel to face eighth-ranked California (24-9-2 overall, 5-4 in the Pac-10) in a three-game series at Evans Diamond in Berkeley. Friday's game gets underway at 2:30 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday, first pitch is slated for 1:00 p.m. Fans can listen to live audio broadcasts of all three games at gohuskies.com and Saturday and Sunday's games will both air live on KKNW AM-1150. The Huskies will send sophomore RHP **Cam Nobles** to the mound on Friday. Saturday's starting pitcher is junior RHP **Jorden Merry** and on Sunday, junior lefty **Nick Haughian** will get the start. After the Cal series, the UW remains on the road for one more game, next Tuesday, April 22 at Portland before a home series vs. UCLA. Here's a look at this weekend's games:

SERIES HISTORY: The Huskies are 24-30 all-time against California. Last year, on the last weekend of the season in Seattle, the UW won two of three, losing the first, 8-3, before winning the next two, 12-2 and 5-4. In the opener, the Bears scored three in the first and Tyson Ross limited UW to two runs over six innings for the win. In game two, a three-run homer from Matt Hague highlighted a five-run first for the UW. In the finale, a Hague homer and a Joey Lind single in the eighth led UW past Cal. The last time they played in Berkeley, the Huskies lost two of three to the Bears.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. Last season, he became only the 17th coach in Pac-10 history to reach 500 career wins. Those are just two of the many accomplishments on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 15-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 549-359-2 (.604). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 285-123-2 (.698) record in home games. He is 219-165 (.570) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 52 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 15 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Donny Harrel**, and **Tighe Dickinson**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

PACKTHE PARK VS. WSU: During the Diamond Dawgs' upcoming three-game series vs. Washington State May 9-11, the Huskies are hoping to "Pack the Park," with a goal of filling the stands for all three games. The series features a number of promotions. First, all UW faculty and staff, and their immediate families, can attend for free. There will be a clinic for Junior Husky Club members following the Saturday game. On Friday, Wingzone will provide wings for the first 100 Washington students. Foam fingers will be handed out all three days, while supplies last. Saturday and Sunday are both Little League Days, where kids can join the Huskies on the field for the National Anthem and run the bases afterwards. And, Sunday is Mothers Day, with special contests and giveaways for moms all day. For tickets, visit gohuskies.com.

RUGGED PAC-10: Any team that plays in the Pac-10 can say that it has a pretty tough schedule. But this year, all the more so. In the three most widely respected college baseball polls, three *different* Pac-10 teams were ranked No. 1 this preseason. Collegiate Baseball magazine was first, ranking Arizona No. 1 in its preseason top 40. Then, Baseball America issued its preseason top 25 with UCLA holding the No. 1 spot, just in front of Arizona. Then, the preseason USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll was released with Arizona State voted as the preseason No. 1 team. Then, add in the fact that Oregon State is the two-time defending national champion and isn't even one of those three No. 1 teams and the Pac-10 is clearly a challenge this season.

WASHINGTON'S TEAM: The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington. This year's squad, however, represents a first in the Ken Knutson era as all 38 players on the roster played their high school ball in Washington. In fact, the majority of players (20 out of 38) attended high school in King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 32 of 38 are from either King County or the two counties that abut King County from the south and north (Pierce and Snohomish, respectively). In other words, 32 of 38 players on this year's team come from within about a 40-mile radius of the UW's Seattle campus.
