### Apple Cup Of Baseball Comes to UW; Dawgs Taken On Cougars This Weekend

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (29-16 overall, 8-7 in the Pac-10), fresh from a sweep of USC in Los Angeles and a win Tuesday at Portland, returns to Husky Ballpark for a three-game series vs. cross-state rival Washington State this Friday through Sunday. All three games will air live on KKNW AM-1150. Friday's series opener starts at 6:30 p.m. with UW right-hander Jorden Merry getting the start. Saturday's 2:00 p.m. game will feature Husky righty Cam Nobles while on Sunday, southpaw Nick Haughian will start the 1:00 p.m. contest. The Huskies, ranked No. 30 in this week's Collegiate Baseball poll, have moved their game scheduled for next Tue. vs. Lewis-Clark State to the following Tue. (May 20). An additional game might be added for May 13. Next weekend, the Huskies play their final road games of the season at Arizona State. Here's a look at this week's games:

SERIES HISTORY: Washington State leads the all-time series vs. Washington with 226 wins and 177 losses. However, in 15 prior seasons under coach Ken Knutson, the UW has gone 60-26 against WSU and Knutson is 8-1 headto-head vs. current Cougar head coach Donnie Marbut. Last year, the Huskies swept a three-game series in Pullman. In the first game, Bradley Boyer belted a two-run homer in the 11th in a 5-3 win. In game two, the Dawgs notched 22 hits in a 15-4 win. In the finale, the Dawgs broke a 4-4 tie with two runs in the eighth and then hung on for a 6-5 win. Two years ago in Seattle, WSU won the series opener, but Washington won games two and three in the season's last weekend.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach Ken Knutson became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. Last season, he became only the 17th coach in Pac-10 history to reach 500 career wins. Those are just two of the many accomplishments on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 15-plus seasons at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 555-363-2 (.604). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 286-125-2 (.695) record in home games. He is 224-169 (.570) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 52 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in 15 seasons, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants Joe Ross, Donny Harrel, and Tighe Dickinson.

### WASHINGTON BASEBALL

**PACKTHE PARK VS. WSU:** During the Diamond Dawgs' upcoming three-game series vs. Washington State May 9-11, the Huskies are hoping to "Pack the Park," with a goal of filling the stands for all three games. The series features a number of promotions. First, all UW faculty and staff, and their immediate families, can attend for free. There will be a clinic for Junior Husky Club members following the Saturday game. On Friday, Wingzone will provide wings for the first 100 Washington students. Foam fingers will be handed out all three days, while supplies last. Saturday and Sunday are both Little League Days, where kids can join the Huskies on the field for the National Anthem and run the bases afterwards. And, Sunday is Mothers Day, with special contests and giveaways for moms all day. For tickets, visit gohuskies.com.

**RUGGED PAC-10:** Any team that plays in the Pac-10 can say that it has a pretty tough schedule. But this year, all the more so. In the three most widely respected college baseball polls, three *different* Pac-10 teams were ranked No. 1 this preseason. Collegiate Baseball magazine was first, ranking Arizona No. 1 in its preseason top 40. Then, Baseball America issued its preseason top 25 with UCLA holding the No. 1 spot, just in front of Arizona. Then, the preseason USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll was released with Arizona State voted as the preseason No. 1 team. Then, add in the fact that Oregon State is the two-time defending national champion and isn't even one of those three No. 1 teams and the Pac-10 is clearly a challenge this season.

**WASHINGTON'S TEAM:** The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington. This year's squad, however, represents a first in the Ken Knutson era as all 38 players on the roster played their high school ball in Washington. In fact, the majority of players (20 out of 38) attended high school in King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 32 of 38 are from either King County or the two counties that abut King Country from the south and north (Pierce and Snohomish, respectively). In other words, 32 of 38 players on this year's team come from within about a 40-mile radius of the UW's Seattle campus.
