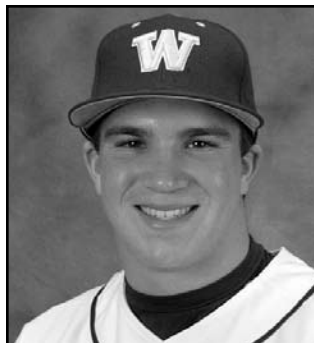

2008 (Freshman) - Played in 42 games, starting 41 ... made 40 starts at shortstop and one at second base ... in second game (Feb. 23 at UC Riverside), went 3-for-5 with an RBI and four runs ... 1-for-2 with two runs, a double and three RBI Mar. 21 vs. Utah Valley ... 3-for-4 with a pair of doubles March 25 vs. Hawai'i-Hilo ... 2-for-3 March 30 at Oregon State ... 1-for-2 with two RBI the following game vs. Portland ... 2-for-4 with first college home run May 17 at Arizona State ... earned first-team All-WCCBL during the summer, playing shortstop for the Bend (Ore.) WASHINGTON

2008 (Freshman) - One of the Huskies' most-often used pitchers during his freshman season, as he was second on the team with 20 appearances ... made 16 appearances out of the bullpen and started four times ... picked up first save March 8 in 5-4 win over Cal Poly ... earned second save in next appearance, working two innings in a 4-1 win over Holy Cross ... got a victory in first college start March 21 vs. Utah Valley, when he allowed only one hit, no runs and no walks over 5.0 innings ... earned a win in relief March 30 at Oregon State, working three innings in a 6-4 win ... no decision in a great outing April 8 vs. Portland ... threw 8.0 scoreless innings that day vs. the Pilots, allowing only two hits while striking out a season-high eight as the UW won, 3-0, on a three-run homer in the ninth ... suffered lone loss of the season in start April 14 at Gonzaga ... pitched in seven Pac-10 games ... played summer ball for the Newport (R.I.)

Gulls, helping the team to the championship round of the playoffs ... finished the regular season 4-2 with a 2.23 ERA in 12 appearances ... over 32.1 IP, struck out 38 and allowed only 21 hits (.181 opponent average) ... got the win in only playoff start, allowing one earned run on three hits over six innings.

JACKSON HIGH SCHOOL

Played four years of varsity baseball - two at Kamiak (2004-05) under coach Steve Merckele and two (2006-07) at Jackson under coach Kirk Nicholson ... along with current Husky teammate Cam Nobles, helped the 2006 Jackson team to one of the best seasons in state history as the team finished 27-0, won the state 4A title and finished as the No. 2-ranked team in Baseball America's final top-25 poll ... went 10-0 for that state title team his junior year, posting a 0.98 earned run average with 78 strikeouts in 69 innings ... pitched five innings for the win and also hit a two-run homer in the state championship game at Safeco Field ... went 6-2 as a senior, captaining the team to an 18-3 record and a league title ... posted a 0.93 ERA with 83 strikeouts in 45 innings ... named first-team All-WesCo, first-team all-area and second-team all-state as a junior ... one of only three pitchers named first-team 4A all-state as a senior, when he was also first-team All-WesCo as a pitcher and designated hitter and first-team all-area ... selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 23rd round of the 2007 draft.

2008 (Junior) - Appeared in 20 games, tied for second-most on the team ... all outings came in relief ... earned a save April 11 vs. BYU, when he fanned three in 3.0 innings of work ... got the win in the Huskies' April 8 victory over Portland, working 0.2 innings as the UW won 3-0 on a ninth-inning homer ... longest outing of the season was a 3.2-inning appearance Feb. 22 at UC Riverside on opening day, when he suffered the loss despite allowing only one run ... had nine straight scoreless appearances from March 7 through April 8 ... allowed a run in only six of 20 outings ... spent a second consecutive summer playing for the Green Bay (Wis.) Bullfrogs in the Northwoods League. 2007 (Sophomore) - Earned honorable mention Academic All-Pac-10 ... appeared in a total of 16 games, with six starts and 10 relief appearances ... also served as a starting DH in one game (May 9 vs. Portland) ... picked up lone save of the season in the Huskies' first win, throwing three shutout innings in the win over St. John's ... first start was March 4 vs. UC Irvine, in which he took the loss ... no decision despite a six-inning start in a UW win March 10 vs. Pacific ... got the victory in a start March 18 vs. Cal State Northridge, allowing two runs on five hits over six innings ... started in a Husky win March 25 at Washington State, but no decision (4.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 0 BB, 3 K) ... took the loss April 1 vs. Arizona State, allowing four earned in three-inning start ... worked an inning in the Huskies' 6-2 win over No. 8 Oregon State at Safeco Field ... also threw 3.0 scoreless innings two days later vs. the Beavers ... got the win in relief May 9 vs. Portland, working 1.2 shutout innings of relief ... also started at DH that day, going 0-for-2 with a run and a hit-by-pitch ... worked 2.2 shutout innings over two outings in the Stanford series ... spent the summer pitching for the Green Bay (Wis.) Bullfrogs ... went 6-2 with a 4.02 ERA for the Bullfrogs, who won the division title for the first half of the season. 2006 (Freshman) - Spent much of the season in the regular starting rotation, starting 12 games and appearing in relief in three others ... no decision in first career start despite outstanding game Feb. 12 at New Mexico State ... threw five innings, allowing three hits, one run and three walks while striking out one in a 5-4 UW win ... picked up the win the following weekend at CS Northridge (Feb. 19), throwing seven and two-thirds shutout innings in a 2-1 Husky victory ... allowed just five hits and no walks in that one ... tough-luck loss March 25 at California, allowing two

runs and no walks over six and two-thirds innings in a 2-1 Husky loss ... no decision despite a great game April 1 vs. UCLA: 8.2 IP, 8 H, 3 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 3 Ks ... also pitched well in a loss to BYU April 14: 7.0 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 0 BB, 2 Ks ... three good long relief outings, though no decision in any of them: at USC (April 22): 5.2 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 0 BB, 1 K; at Stanford (May 13): 6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 2 Ks; vs. Washington State in the season's final game: 6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 1 K ... walked only four over his final 31.1 innings of work ... in Pac-10 games only, posted a 3.16 ERA, ninth-best in the conference ... allowed just five walks over 37 innings in conference ... pitched and hit during summer ball for the Alaska Goldpanners.

Born in Moses Lake, Wash. ... parents are Steve and Carrie Conley ... has an older sister, Lexie ... father and grandfather were both college football players ... majoring in economics.

WASHINGTON

2008 (RS-Sophomore) - Played in 54 of the Huskies' 55 games, starting 52 ... started 31 in left field, 19 in right

and two at DH ... named to the All-Pac-10 first team ... also picked up Academic All-Pac-10 honorable mention ... drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 16th round (487th overall) of the 2008 draft, but elected to return to UW ... led (or shared the lead) the team in virtually every offensive category, including batting average, runs, hits, doubles, triples, homers, RBI, slugging and stolen bases ... finished among the Pac-10 leaders in several categories: second in slugging percentage (.746), fourth in home runs (19), ninth in RBI (57) ... in Pac-10 games only, led the conference with .776 slugging mark and was second with eight homers in league play ... earned Pac-10 Player of the Week honors in two straight weeks (May 6 and May 13) ... May 6 honor came after he went 8-for-10 with three doubles, a triple, two homers and nine RBI in the Huskies' first-ever sweep of USC in Los Angeles ... won the award the following week after hitting four homers and driving in nine over four games vs. Portland and Washington State ... on April 8, hit a pinch-hit, three-run homer with two outs in the bottom of the ninth to break a scoreless tie for a 3-0 win over Portland ... two days later, broke a 1-1 tie with a two-run homer in the eighth in a 5-1 win over BYU ... the next day, April 11, hit two homers in a 12-4 win over Brigham Young ... had three two-homer games during the season (Apr. 11 vs. BYU, May 3 at USC and May 11 vs. WSU) ... opened the season by hitting safely in all four games at UC Riverside, including hitting a three-run homer in the series finale ... homered in back-to-back games vs. Hawai'i-Hilo ... starting with that April 8 home run to beat Portland, hit 15 homers over his last 26 games ... in a stretch of five games from April 8-14, hit five homers and drove in 12 ... 4-for-4 with two doubles, a triple and two RBI in May 2 game at USC ... two homers the next day and four RBI in series finale ... 3-for-5 with a double and a homer in first of three vs. Washington State and then 3-for-3 with two homers and four RBI in the third game of that series ... homered in three straight

games May 17-23 ... earned second-team All-NECBL honors for the Newport (R.I.) Gulls ... during the regular season, hit .278 with a league-leading eight homers and 37 RBI in 30 games ... then in the playoffs, hit .417 with five homers and 13 RBI in only six games as the Gulls made it to the championship series. **2007 (Sophomore)** - Played in 18 games, starting 13 (10 in left field, three in right field) ... granted a medical redshirt season after undergoing surgery on his left (non-throwing) shoulder ... didn't see any game action after the March 24 Washington State game ... 4-for-10 with a triple, two runs, two RBI and three walks in the season-opening series at Cal Poly ... also hit safely in all three at the tournament at East Carolina, going 3-for-10 for the weekend ... 1-for-4 with two RBI Feb. 27 vs. Portland ... 2-for-3 with a double March 5 vs. Southern Utah ... also 2-for-3 March 10 (game one) vs. Pacific ... drew 13 walks in 50 at bats ... sat out the summer to recover from surgery. **2006 (Freshman)** - Played in 34 of the Huskies' 61 games, starting a total of 20 (12 in right field and eight as the DH) ... first career hit was a single Feb. 20 at CS Northridge ... followed that with a pinch-hit, three-run homer in a 14-4 win over Gonzaga Feb. 24 ... two days later, hit two homers vs. the Zags, going 2-for-4 with three RBI ... the second of those two homers was a two-run blast that broke a 5-5 tie in the seventh, lifting UW to a 7-5 win ... had two hits in three straight starts vs. San Diego and Santa Clara March 7-12 ... March 20 vs. Cal Poly, went 2-for-4 with a double and a home run ... started all three vs. UCLA, hitting safely in all three and finishing the weekend 4-for-12 ... had a two-run, pinch-hit double in the seventh inning vs. Washington State in the last game of the year, starting a rally that ended in a 5-3 win (UW was down 3-0 in the seventh) ... played summer ball for the Wenatchee (Wash.) Applesox, the West Coast Collegiate Baseball League champs.

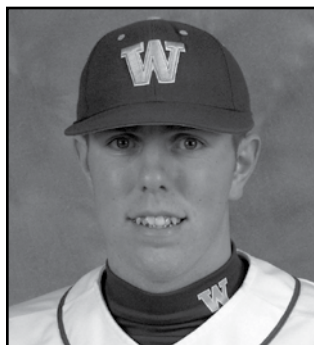

first save with a very good outing March 15 vs. Holy Cross ... in that game, threw 3.2 innings, allowing no runs on two hits and no walks while striking out a season-high five batters ... also got a save in next appearance, working four innings March 20 vs. Utah Valley ... made it three saves in three appearances with a two-inning performance March 24 vs. Hawai'i-Hilo ... got the final out April 19 in a 7-4 win at Cal for fourth save ... worked four scoreless frames for the save May 3 at USC ... didn't allow an earned run in 10 of 16 outings ... earned honorable mention All-WCCBL during the summer as a pitcher for the Kitsap (Wash.)
