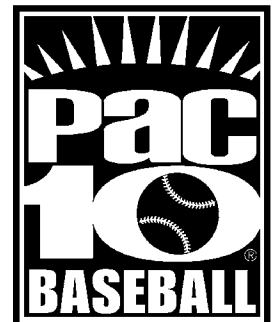

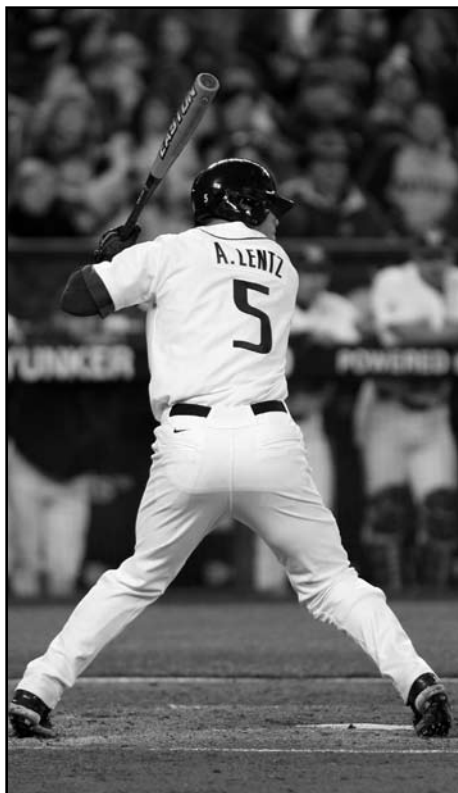

Senior Andy Lentz drove in the game's lone run with an RBI double in the bottom of the seventh inning. Haughian earned National Player of the Week honors for his efforts. In 2007, the Dawgs played host to national champion and eighth-ranked Oregon State at Safeco, winning, 6-2. A crowd of 10,421 watched that Northwest rivalry, the largest crowd ever in Pac-10 history for a conference game and the second-largest crowd ever to watch a UW baseball game.

DRAFTED DAWGS: Washington saw three of its players selected in the 2008 Major League Baseball Draft, and each of them were chosen relatively early in the 50-round draft. First to go was junior left-handed pitcher Nick Haughian, who was taken in the ninth round (266th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Next to be drafted was junior right-hander Jorden Merry, the

Chicago White Sox' 14th-round choice (420th overall). He was followed by RS-sophomore outfielder Kyle Conley, who the Dodgers made their 16th-round selection (487th overall). Both Merry and Conley turned down offers to sign professional contracts and returned to continue their collegiate careers. Haughian played for the Aberdeen (Md.) IronBirds in the New York-Penn League. Additionally, four members of the UW recruiting class were drafted (three of those four ended up enrolling in college).

PAC-10 HONORS: Two Washington players were named to the All-Pac-10 first team at season's end. Junior right-handed starting pitcher Jorden Merry and RS-sophomore outfielder Kyle Conley both earned the prestigious honor, thanks to outstanding seasons. Merry went 8-2 with a 3.61 earned run average and was 8-0 at one point in the season. Conley led the Dawgs in virtually every offensive statistical category, batting .337 with 19 home runs and 57 runs batted, leading the UW in each of those categories. He also led the club (or shared the lead) in runs (49), doubles (13), triples (2), slugging (.746), on-base average (.434) and steals (6). Aside from Conley and Merry, four Huskies earned All-

Pac-10 honorable mention: senior catcher Joey Dunn, junior left-handed pitcher Nick Haughian, senior outfielder Andy Lentz and freshman first baseman Troy Scott. Lastly, two Huskies – Conley and senior pitcher Elliott Cribby – picked up Academic All-Pac-10 honorable mention.

LINCECUM ROLLS ON: Some of the biggest news in Husky baseball came from a former player: San Francisco Giants ace Tim Lincecum. First, Lincecum earned a spot on the National League All-Star team in his first full big-league season. By season's end, he'd compiled a sparkling 18-5 record and 2.62 earned run average while leading the Major Leagues with 265 strikeouts. Then, he walked away with the top spot in what was expected to be a very close N.L. Cy Young Award vote, earning 23 of 32 first-place votes. The award was the highest-ever single-season honor given to a former Husky in a major professional sport, no surprise in that his Golden Spikes Award, won in 2006, is arguably the most prestigious honor ever earned by a current Husky athlete. Lincecum was honored at halftime of the UW men's basketball game vs. Oklahoma State in Dec. and will be on the cover of the MLB 2K9 video game next year.
