Red-Hot Dawgs Return To Safeco for First of Three vs. No. 25 Beavers

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (21-23 overall, 10-8 in the Pac-10) returns to action this week with the last five home games of the season on tap. First up is a three-game series vs. 25th-ranked Oregon State (28-12, 11-7 Pac-10), which is tied with Washington State for third in the Pac-10, one game ahead of UW, which has won six straight Pac-10 games. The opener will be played Friday at 6:30 p.m. at Safeco Field, home of the Mariners. Saturday's game two is scheduled for 2:00 p.m. and on Sunday, first pitch is at 1:00 p.m. Following the OSU series, the Dawgs host BYU in the final two home games of the season next Tuesday at Wednesday, both at 6:30 p.m. All three UW-OSU games will air live on radio at KKNW AM-1150 while the Friday night game will also be shown live on Comcast SportsNet Northwest television. Senior RHP Jorden Merry will start on the mound Friday, while senior righty Jason Erickson starts Saturday and freshman RHP Andrew Kittredge goes on Sunday. CHAFFEY FIELD DEDICATION: Husky Athletics will honor its top baseball donor this weekend with a Field Dedication Ceremony. Husky Ballpark will be re-named Chaffey Field in recognition of the contributions of loyal supporter Herb Chaffey. A 1961 UW graduate, Chaffey has been a generous and long-time devotee of Husky Athletics. He founded Chaffey Homes in 1963, a fully integrated land development and homebuilding company that has built more than 14,000 homes in Washington State. Chaffey is heavily involved in the local baseball community as the founder of Chaffey Baseball, a club in its 30th year of producing collegiate and major league baseball players. In all, 39 Chaffey players have played for UW over time, including current players David Bentrott, Andy Bethel, Brady McGuire, Julien Pollard, Brandon Rohde and Aaron Russell.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach Ken Knutson became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. In 2007, he became only the 17th coach in Pac-10 history to reach 500 career wins. Last year, he became the winningest coach in any sport in UW history. Those are just a few of the many accomplishments on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 17 at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 580-392-2 (.597). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 300-137-2 (.686) record in home games. He is 237-183 (.564) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 55 All-Pac-10 first-teamers, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants Joe Ross, Tighe Dickinson, Kevin Miller and Josh Scoffeld.

HUSKIES BACK AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington will return to Safeco Field for the third consecutive season this year. However, this season, the Dawgs will play two games at the home of the Mariners. The UW played Arizona State April 3 at Safeco, and will play Oregon State there this Friday. The OSU game starts at 6:30 p.m. and is the first game of a three-game Pac-10 series. Two seasons ago, the Huskies beat No. 8 OSU, 6-2, in their first-ever game at Safeco. Attendance was 10,421, a league record for a Pac-10 game at the time. In 2008, the Huskies edged Arizona, 1-0, on a two-hit, 15-strikeout shutout by Nick Haughian as 5,187 fans watched. Tickets are \$8 and UW students are admitted free.

SQUAD BREAKDOWN: UW's 35-man roster, like most college baseball rosters, is a bit on the young side this year. Among the 35 players, there are six seniors, six juniors, 11 sophomores and 12 freshmen, meaning that 23 of 35 (66 percent) players are freshmen or sophomores. The squad includes 23 returners and 12 newcomers (all of them freshmen). The UW's returning players have competed in a total of 909 games. Thirteen different veteran position players have combined for 1,951 career at bats while returning pitchers have made 81 career starts and pitched 643.2 innings in a UW uniform.

WASHINGTON'S TEAM: The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington. For the second straight season, however, this year's squad consists entirely of student-athletes who played their high school ball in Washington. Not surprisingly, the majority of the team comes from western Washington as 29 of the 35 come from west of the Cascade Mountains. Thirteen players come from King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 27 of 30 come from King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, which, essentially, form the Seattle metropolitan area.
