Diamond Dawgs Close Out 2009 Regular Season at WSU

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (25-27 overall, 13-11 in the Pac-10) travels to Washington State (28-22, 16-8) for the final series of the regular season this Friday through Sunday. The fourth-place (tied) Huskies would need a sweep to be eligible for postseason consideration while the second-place Cougars are hoping to secure their first NCAA berth since 1990. The Husky coaches have only determined a starter for Friday's game as senior right-hander **Jason Erickson** will get the ball for the 5:30 p.m. start. Saturday's first pitch is slated for 2:00 p.m. and Sunday, the Dawgs and Cougs will play a 12 noon game. There is no live radio this weekend, though subscribers can catch broadcasts of all three games on the Dawg Channel at gohuskies.com. Here's a look at this weekend's baseball action:

SERIES HISTORY: Washington State boasts a 227-179 (.559) record in the all-time series vs. UW. However, over the last 17 years, the series has run decidedly in the Huskies' favor. Dating back to (and including) the 1992 season, the Huskies have gone 67-27 (.713) vs. the Cougars (counting conference and non-conference games). Over that same span, the Dawgs have won 34 and lost only 12 (.739) in games played in Pullman. Since the Pac-10 scrapped divisional play prior to 1999, the UW is 32-13 vs. the Cougars and 21-9 in Pac-10 games only. Additionally, the Huskies have won 21 of the last 30 series (two, three or four-game) with only six losses and three ties, and have lost only three of their last 15 series in Pullman. The Dawgs have won six games in a row and 14 of their last 16 at Bailey-Brayton Field. UW's 17th-year head coach **Ken Knutson** is 62-26 (.705) all-time vs. WSU; 31-12 (.721) vs. WSU in Pullman and 10-2 (.833) head-to-head vs. fifth-year WSU head coach coach Donnie Marbut.

COACH "K": In 2004, Husky baseball coach **Ken Knutson** became the winningest baseball coach in the history of the program. In 2007, he became only the 17th coach in Pac-10 history to reach 500 career wins. Last year, he became the winningest coach in any sport in UW history. Those are just a few of the many accomplishments on Knutson's impressive resume. In his 17 at the helm of his alma mater's baseball team, Knutson has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles and six NCAA Regionals. His career record now stands at 584-396-2 (.596). Before becoming the head man in 1993, Knutson served as the UW pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his staff led the NCAA with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 303-139-2 (.685) record in home games. He is 240-185 (.565) in Pac-10 games. He's coached 55 All-Pac-10 first-teamers, and has been named league coach of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistants **Joe Ross**, **Tighe Dickinson**, **Kevin Miller** and **Josh Scofield**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

SQUAD BREAKDOWN: UW's 35-man roster, like most college baseball rosters, is a bit on the young side this year. Among the 35 players, there are six seniors, six juniors, 11 sophomores and 12 freshmen, meaning that 23 of 35 (66 percent) players are freshmen or sophomores. The squad includes 23 returners and 12 newcomers (all of them freshmen). The UW's returning players have competed in a total of 909 games. Thirteen different veteran position players have combined for 1,951 career at bats while returning pitchers have made 81 career starts and pitched 643.2 innings in a UW uniform.

WASHINGTON'S TEAM: The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington. For the second straight season, however, this year's squad consists entirely of student-athletes who played their high school ball in Washington. Not surprisingly, the majority of the team comes from western Washington as 29 of the 35 come from west of the Cascade Mountains. Thirteen players come from King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 27 of 30 come from King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, which, essentially, form the Seattle metropolitan area.
