Huskies Travel To Tempe For Three-Game Series With No. 1 ASU

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (19-16 overall, 4-5 in the Pac-10) wraps up a stretch of seven of eight games on the road with a trip to face No. 1 Arizona State (31-4 overall, 9-3 Pac-10) in a three-game series this weekend at Packard Stadium in Tempe. The Huskies fell to Portland, 3-2, in midweek action Tuesday, continuing a trend of playing in a lot of very close ballgames. The same day, ASU fell, 4-3, to Arizona in a game that did not count in the conference standings. The Sun Devils are ranked No. 1 in each of the major polls and have been much of the season after getting off to a 24-0 start. All three games from ASU will air live in the Seattle area on KKNW AM-1150. You can also listen to those broadcasts via a link from gohuskies.com. First pitch on Friday and Saturday is slated for 6:30 p.m. and on Sunday, the game starts at 12:30 p.m. The UW will start junior LHP **Geoff Brown** on Friday and sophomore RHP **Andrew Kittredge** on Saturday. Sunday's starter has yet to be determined. After the current road stretch comes to an end, the Dawgs will play 12 of their final 18 games of the regular season at home, starting with a pair of midweek games vs. Gonzaga next Tuesday and Wednesday. COACH MEGGS: **Lindsay Meggs** was named the Huskies' new head coach in July of 2009, just the third different UW head coach in 34 years. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the last three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Meggs currently boasts a 634-323-4 record over 16-plus seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Greg Moore** and **Kevin Ticen**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

APRIL 21, 2010

SERIES HISTORY: Arizona State leads the all-time series with Washington, 24-12. The two teams had never played until 1998. Last season in Seattle, the Devils won by scores of 3-1, 12-1 and 6-2, with the first of those three played at Safeco Field. Two seasons ago in Tempe, the Sun Devils swept a three-game series in Tempe, winning by scores of 13-3, 11-4 and 13-7.

HUSKIES BACK AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington will return to Safeco Field for the fourth consecutive season this year when the Huskies host Stanford in a 6:30 p.m. game on Saturday, May 1. Earlier that day, at 12:10 p.m., the Mariners play host to the Texas Rangers at Safeco. Fans who show a ticket stub from the M's game can redeem it for a discounted \$5 ticket to the Husky game. Last season, the Huskies played two games at Safeco. A crowd of 3,675 saw a 3-1 Oregon State win and there were 4,296 on hand for a 6-4 Arizona State victory later in the year. Three seasons ago, the Huskies beat No. 8 OSU, 6-2, in their first-ever game at Safeco. Attendance was 10,421, at the time a league record for a conference game. In 2008, the Huskies edged Arizona, 1-0, on a two-hit, 15-strikeout shutout by Nick Haughian as 5,187 fans watched on. Tickets are \$8 and UW students are admitted free.

WASHINGTON'S TEAM: The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington, and the last two years, it was 100 percent. This year, 31 of the team's 33 players prepped in the state of Washington. The two out-of-staters are Miles Kizer (Phoenix, Ariz.) and Joe Meggs (Terre Haute, Ind.). Of the 31 players from the Evergreen State, 30 come from west of the Cascade Mountains. Fifteen players come from King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 24 of 30 come from King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, which, essentially, form the Seattle metropolitan area.

#2 BRADLEY BOYER, Sr. IF/OF: 12 in LF, 8 starts at 2B, 4 in RF, 1 at 3B and 1 at SS ... had a pinch-hit double in the 9th that scored 2 runs vs. Portland on Tue. ... started all 3 in LF and as leadoff hitter at Cal ... 5-for-13 in Cal series ... 3-for-9 with a double in 2 starts vs. Arizona ... 2-for-5 with 2 RBI Mar. 19 at CS Fullerton ... 4-for-5 last Mar. 5 at Long Beach and 2-for-5 on Mar. 7 ... had game-winning RBI with 2 out in the 9th Feb. 26 vs. Fresno State ... 3 RBI and a homer Feb. 27 vs. Fresno ... fifth-year senior returned after having missed last season due to Tommy John elbow surgery ... easily the Huskies' most experience player ... entered 2010 with 130 starts and 524 at bats.
