Dawgs Return Home For Busy Week, Face Stanford Sat. At Safeco Field

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (20-18 overall, 5-7 in the Pac-10) returns home after a stretch of seven of eight games on the road. It's a busy week for the Dawgs as they play host to Gonzaga (13-27-1) Tuesday and Wednesday and No. 21 Stanford (21-13 overall, 10-5 in the Pac-10) this weekend. Game times for the Bulldogs are 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday and 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday. LHP **Adrian Gomez** will start Tuesday, while Wednesday's starter has yet to be determined. The Cardinal, who have won eight straight, come to town Friday through Sunday. Friday's game starts at 6:00 p.m. Saturday's game, which will be played at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners, gets underway at 6:00 p.m. and the Sunday game, back at Husky Ballpark, starts at 1:00 p.m. The UW will start junior LHP **Geoff Brown** on Friday and sophomore RHP **Andrew Kittredge** on Saturday. Sunday's starter has yet to be determined. The Tuesday game vs. Gonzaga and Saturday's game vs. Stanford will both air live on KKNW AM-1150 radio. The homestand continues with four more games the following week, one vs. SeattleU and three vs. UCLA. Here's a look at this week's action:

COACH MEGGS: Lindsay Meggs was named the Huskies' new head coach in July of 2009, just the third different UW head coach in 34 years. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the last three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Meggs currently boasts a 635-325-4 record over 16-plus seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Greg Moore** and **Kevin Ticen**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

SERIES HISTORY: Washington has a good deal of history with former Pac-10 Northern Division mate Gonzaga, including of course three prior games this season. The Huskies hold a 71-53 record head-to-head vs. Gonzaga, which left the Pac-10 after the 1994 season. Feb. 21 in Tucson, Washington was trailing 4-0 and 9-4 and pulled out a 10-9 win over the Zags, scoring three in the ninth. **Doug Cherry** delivered the game-winner with a pinch-hit, RBI single. April 6-7 in Spokane, the Dawgs swept a pair of games vs. the Zags, 3-1 and 5-1. Last season, the Dawgs went 1-2 vs. the Bulldogs, dropping a game in Spokane and splitting a pair in Seattle. Stanford boasts a 44-17 all-time series record over Washington, though prior to 1996, the Cardinal were 17-2 all-time vs. the UW. Last year, the Cardinal won two of three in Palo Alto winning games one (13-3) and three (11-0). Washington won the second game, 9-7, on a ninth-inning homer from Kyle Conley.

HUSKIES BACK AT SAFECO FIELD: Washington will return to Safeco Field for the fourth consecutive season this year when the Huskies host Stanford in a 6:30 p.m. game on Saturday, May 1. Earlier that day, at 12:10 p.m., the Mariners play host to the Texas Rangers at Safeco. Fans who show a ticket stub from the M's game can redeem it for a discounted \$5 ticket to the Husky game. Last season, the Huskies played two games at Safeco. A crowd of 3,675 saw a 3-1 Oregon State win and there were 4,296 on hand for a 6-4 Arizona State victory later in the year. Three seasons ago, the Huskies beat No. 8 OSU, 6-2, in their first-ever game at Safeco. Attendance was 10,421., at the time a league record for a conference game. In 2008, the Huskies edged Arizona, 1-0, on a two-hit, 15-strikeout shutout by Nick Haughian as 5,187 fans watched on. Tickets are \$8 and UW students are admitted free.

WASHINGTON'S TEAM: The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington, and the last two years, it was 100 percent. This year, 31 of the team's 33 players prepped in the state of Washington. The two out-of-staters are Miles Kizer (Phoenix, Ariz.) and Joe Meggs (Terre Haute, Ind.). Of the 31 players from the Evergreen State, 30 come from west of the Cascade Mountains. Fifteen players come from King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 24 of 30 come from King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, which, essentially, form the Seattle metropolitan area.
