UW Closes Out 9-Game Homestand vs. Seattle U. and No. 12 UCLA

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (24-19 overall, 8-7 in the Pac-10) wraps up a nine-game homestand with four games this week. First up, the Huskies take on Seattle University (7-30) Tuesday night at 6:00 p.m. at Husky Ballpark. It'll be the third and final meeting between the two teams this year and the final non-conference game of the regular season for the UW. This weekend, No. 12 UCLA (30-10 overall, 7-8 Pac-10) visits for a three-game series. Game times are 6:00 p.m. on Friday, 2:00 p.m. on Saturday and 1:00 p.m. Sunday. Washington enters the week on a four-game winning streak, having swept then-No. 21 Stanford this past weekend. UCLA lost all three to Arizona State last weekend in Los Angeles. The Bruins face Pepperdine on Tuesday. Junior lefty **Ben Guidos** is slated to start on Tuesday vs. the Redhawks. The UW will start junior LHP **Geoff Brown** on Friday and sophomore RHP **Andrew Kittredge** on Saturday. Sunday's starter has yet to be determined. Fans can catch live stats and live video of all four games on the "Dawg Channel" at gohuskies.com. After the homestand wraps up on Sunday, the Huskies have three remaining Pac-10 Conference series left on the docket. They'll travel to Oregon State May 14-16, host Oregon May 21-23 and wrap up the regular season with three games at USC May 28-30. Here's a look at this week's action:

COACH MEGGS: Lindsay Meggs was named the Huskies' new head coach in July of 2009, just the third different UW head coach in 34 years. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the last three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Meggs currently boasts a 639-326-4 record over 16-plus seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Greg Moore** and **Kevin Ticen**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

MAY 3, 2010

SERIES HISTORY: Washington has a long history vs. Seattle University, but until this season, when the Redhawks' baseball program was revived, the two Seattle-based programs hadn't played since 1986. Earlier this season, the Huskies beat SeattleU, 5-2, on March 23 at Bannerwood Park and then again, by a 6-5 score, a week later at Husky Ballpark. UCLA boasts a 32-17 all-time record against Washington. Last season at Jackie Robinson Stadium, UCLA swept the series, winning 4-2, 13-0 and 6-3.

WASHINGTON'S TEAM: The Husky baseball roster has always been dominated by in-state players, as most college baseball rosters are. The squad consistently has about 90 percent of players from the state of Washington, and the last two years, it was 100 percent. This year, 31 of the team's 33 players prepped in the state of Washington. The two out-of-staters are Miles Kizer (Phoenix, Ariz.) and Joe Meggs (Terre Haute, Ind.). Of the 31 players from the Evergreen State, 30 come from west of the Cascade Mountains. Fifteen players come from King County, the county in which the UW is located, and 24 of 30 come from King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, which, essentially, form the Seattle metropolitan area.

Gulls to the New England Collegiate Baseball League title during the summer.

SS: Doubled off the bench Apr. 27 vs. Gonzaga ... started Mar. 30 vs. SeattleU (1-for-3, RBI) ... started the first 2 games of the season at shortstop ... batted .265 and was a perfect 7-for-7 stealing bases as a freshman in 2009 ... played at Seattle Prep, just north of UW campus.

#2 BRADLEY BOYER, Sr. IF/OF: 16 in LF, 8 starts at 2B, 6 in RF, 1 at 3B and 1 at SS ... 2-for-5, 3 RBI Wed. vs. Gonzaga ... had a pinch-hit double in the 9th that scored 2 runs Apr. 20 vs. Portland. ... started all 3 in LF and as leadoff hitter at Cal ... 5-for-13 in Cal series ... 3-for-9 with a double in 2 starts vs. Arizona ... 2-for-5 with 2 RBI Mar. 19 at CS Fullerton ... 4-for-5 last Mar. 5 at Long Beach and 2-for-5 on Mar. 7 ... had game-winning RBI with 2 out in the 9th Feb. 26 vs. Fresno State ... 3 RBI and a homer Feb. 27 vs. Fresno ... fifth-year senior returned after having missed last season due to Tommy John elbow surgery ... easily the Huskies' most experience player ... entered 2010 with 130 starts and 524 at bats.
