After Tuesday Game Vs. Portland, Huskies Open Pac-10 Slate At UCLA

THIS WEEK: The Washington baseball team (6-15), fresh from a series win over Nevada, closes out the pre-conference schedule Tuesday at 5:00 p.m. vs. Portland (10-10) before traveling to Los Angeles to open up Pac-10 play at No. 24 UCLA (11-8, 2-1 in the Pac-10 Conference). Last weekend, the Bruins opened their conference slate by taking two of three from USC. Tuesday's game vs. Portland will air live on KKNW AM-1150 and fans can also watch live video at GoHuskies.com. UCLA's audio broadcasts of the three games from L.A. are also available via the internet. The easiest way to access the links is to go to the front page of GoHuskies.com, click on the "Calendar" tab and find the game you want to watch or hear. Washington will send freshman right-hander **Austin Voth** to the mound for Tuesday's game vs. the Pilots. This weekend, senior RHP **Jacob Clem** starts on Friday and sophomore righty **Aaron West** goes on Saturday, with Sunday' starter yet to be determined. Here's a look at this week's games:

COACH MEGGS: Lindsay Meggs was named the Huskies' head coach in July of 2009, just the third different UW head coach in 34 years. In 2010, his first season in charge, he improved the Huskies' season record by five wins over the previous year, going 28-28 against a schedule ranked as high as third-toughest in the nation. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the previous three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Currently, he boasts a 649-350-4 record over 17 seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Dave Dangler** and **Jordon Twohig**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

MARCH 29, 2011

SERIES HISTORY: Washington holds an 89-45-1 record all-time against Portland. Last year, the two old foes split a pair of games, each winning on the road. On April 20, 2010, the Huskies scored two runs in the ninth and had runners at the corners, but couldn't pull off the comeback in a 3-2 loss. A week earlier in Portland, the Huskies edged the Pilots, 6-5, thanks to a solo homer from Miles Kizer, which broke a 5-5 tie in the seventh. In 2009, the Huskies and Pilots played twice. The Huskies beat Portland, 5-2, on an eighth-inning homer from Pierce Rankin in a game played at PGE Park in Portland. Later in the season, Jake Rife went 4-for-4 with a homer in a 6-5 win over the Pilots. UCLA boasts a 35-17 all-time record against Washington. The Bruins have swept the last two series (in L.A. in 2009 and in Seattle last year).

SQUAD BREAKDOWN: Among the 35 players on the 2011 Husky roster, there are five seniors, five juniors, 10 sophomores and 15 true freshmen, meaning that 25 of 35 (71 percent) players are freshmen or sophomores. The squad includes 14 returners and 21 newcomers (15 true freshmen, three sophomore transfers and three junior transfers). Entering the 2011 season, the UW's returning players have competed in a total of 735 Husky baseball games. Seven different veteran position players have combined for 1,488 career at bats, which is actually a relatively low number. Six veteran UW pitchers have combined to make 64 career starts and have pitched 606.1 career innings in a Husky uniform.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE: Each year, Washington boasts one of the toughest schedules in the season, if only by virtue of playing the rigorous Pac-10 Conference. According to well-regarded college baseball website, boydsworld.com, the Huskies have the eighth-toughest schedule in the country, though all of the Pac-10's team rank highly. The Huskies, of course, face the nine other Pac-10 teams. Six Pac-10 teams (Arizona, Arizona State, California, Oregon, Stanford, UCLA) were ranked in either the Baseball America and USA Today coaches' preseason polls, or both. Oregon State and Washington State also each also received votes in the coaches' poll. Additionally, the Huskies travel to Cal State Fullerton for a three-game series at Husky Ballpark. The Titans are ranked in the top 10 in both polls.

WHERE ARE THEY FROM?: Washington's baseball roster has traditionally been heavily dominated by in-state players. The 2011 team is much more diverse than what had been the norm for many years as, of the 35 players, nine players completed their high school career in a state other than Washington (generally over the past few decades, that number has averaged closer to two or three out-of-state players). So, 26 Huskies come from in-state while there are six from California and one each from Minnesota, Indiana and Utah. Of the 26 players from the Evergreen State, 25 come from west of the Cascades, (the western half of the state).

IF: 13 starts at short after having missed first 2 weeks due to injury ... drew a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the ninth to plate the winning run Mar. 26 vs. Nevada ... played in only 1 of 3 vs. DBU, leaving game 1 after re-injuring knee ... returned at CS Fullerton, starting all 3 ... 2-for-5 vs. Ark.-Pine Bluff; 2-for-4, 2 RBI vs. Ok. State ... sophomore transferred from Palomar CC ... hit .312 and earned first-team all-league at Palomar, teaming with fellow Husky B.K. Santy ... uncle, Troy Afenir, played in the major leagues in the early 1990s.

#11 CHASE ANSELMANT, So. C/OF: Started all 19 of 21 so far (14 RF, 3 C, 2 DH) ... 2-run homer in win over BYU Mar. 5 ... 4-for-10 in BYU series ... 2-for-5 with 2 RBI Fri. at CSUB ... 5-for-13 with 2 doubles in Texas State tourney ... made 33 starts, mainly at DH, last season ... earned third-team Freshman All-America (Ping! Baseball) after batting .347 in 2010 ... 5 of 6 homers in 2010 came in Pac-10 play ... last summer, led West Coast League with 7 home runs and was second in league with 34 RBI and 15 doubles.

#21 CALEB BROWN, Jr. OF: 14 starts, all in CF, so far ... 2-for-4 with 2 RBI vs. Ark.-Pine Bluff 3-for-9 with 2 doubles in Fullerton series ... started all 3 games in CF opening weekend ... started 54 of 56 games last year, all in center field ... batted .295 last season ... finished 2010 season on six-game hitting streak ... broke his leg in his third game of last summer and missed all of summer and fall while recovering ... also started 31 games as a freshman in 2009 ... a two-time, first-team all-state selection in both baseball and football at Central Kitsap HS.

#37 BRENDAN GARDNER-YOUNG, Sr. OF: 1-for-2 with 3 runs vs. UAPB ... 1-for-3 as starting LF Mar. 11 vs. DBU ... started all 3 games at Bakersfield, 2 in CF and 1 in LF ... 2-for-4 with a 2-run double over the the 3 games ... played in only 2 games last year as he suffered an injury after opening weekend ... fully recovered for start of 2011 season ... started 44 games two years ago, batting .275 ... teammate of Ben Guidos at Highline HS, just south of Seattle.

#12 REGGIE JONES, Fr. IF: 2-for-2 vs. UAPB ... 1-for-3 in start Mar. 12 vs. DBU ... started at 2B Mar. 3 vs. BYU ... saw action in all 3 at Bakersfield, including first start (at 2B) in middle game of series ... played in 2 of 3 games at Texas State tourney ... had 3 at bats off the bench ... true freshman is a candidate to start at second base ... batted .500 with 7 homers and 15 RBI as a senior at Jordan HS last season ... older brother, Zach, is a senior baseball player at Stanford.

#18 JACOB LAMB, So. IF: Has started all 21 games (8 at SS, 8 at 3B, 5 at 2B) ... went 8-for-11 in the three-game series vs. Nevada ... 2-for-3 vs. UAPB ... 3-for-11 in DBU series ... went 4-for-5 in game 3 of Bakersfield series ... went 5-for-12 with a double and 2 homers in 3 games at Texas State tourney ... homered vs. Missouri State and Air Force ... started 54 of the Huskies' 56 games last year ... 52 of those starts were at 3B ... first-team Freshman All-America (Collegiate Baseball) in 2010 ... batted .347 with 14 doubles and 4 HRs last season ... hit .363 in Pac-10 games last year

(game 1) at Fullerton ... earned 1st 2 starts in Dallas Baptist series (both in LF) ... drove in the game's only run with a single Mar. 12 vs. DBU ... also 2 HBPs in that game ... got three at bats off the bench in the Air Force game, going 1-for-3 and playing RF ... led Bellarmine Prep (San Jose, Calif.) to a 20-13 record as a senior in 2010, batting .355 with 24 RBI ... graduated from Bellarmine with a 4.00 grade point average.

#43 CODY STEPHENS, Fr. IF: 3 starts at 2B ... scored 2 runs in win over BYU ... doubled in start in game 3 at Bakersfield ... team MVP and all-league pick at Clayton Valley last year, batting .436 with 26 RBI, 8 doubles and 10 SB.

#38 RYAN WIGGINS, Fr. C: 10 starts at DH, 3 at C ... made 1st start at C vs. UAPB (2-for-4, 4 runs) ... also 2-for-4 with 2 runners caught stealing (in 2 attempts) in start the next day at Oklahoma State ... 1 start at DH at Bakersfield and pinch hit in other 2 ... started all 3 games opening weekend at DH ... 3-for-10 on the weekend ... slugging freshman could catch, play first or DH ... won four straight Metro League titles at West Seattle High ... first-team 3A all-state catcher and earned some level of All-Metro honors all four years ... drafted by Pittsburgh in 46th round of 2010 draft.

#5 BRIAN WOLFE, So. 1B/OF: After missing 2 weekends with illness, returned at Fullerton, starting 2 of 3 ... started 2 games in RF and 1 in LF at Bakersfield ... 3-for-11 for series at CSUB ... started all 3 games opening weekend at 1B ... 3-for-8 for the tournament at Texas State ... played in 14, starting 11, last season, but missed latter part of season with injury ... 10 of 11 starts came in right field ... homered vs. Cal State Fullerton ... four-year letterman at Snohomish HS, where he teamed with Aaron West on 4A state title team in 2008 ... hit .311 last summer for the Kelowna (B.C.) Falcons.
