Huskies Return To Pac-12 Play With Three-Game Series At OSU

THIS WEEKEND: The Washington baseball team (15-7 overall, 2-1 in the Pac-12) returns to Pac-12 play this weekend as the Huskies travel to Corvallis for a three-game series vs. Oregon State (15-7 overall, 4-2 Pac-12). Last weekend, the Huskies swept a three-game series from CSU Bakersfield, the last non-conference weekend series of the year for the UW. The Beavers lost to of three to Arizona last weekend after having opened the conference slate with a sweep at Cal the week before. Oregon State is ranked No. 22 by Baseball America and No. 19 in the coaches' poll. The UW received three votes in this week's coaches poll and are ranked No. 33 in the Perfect Game top 50. Game times in Corvallis are 5:35 p.m. on Friday and 1:05 p.m. both Saturday and Sunday. Saturday's game will be televised live on ROOT Sports in the Northwest. Fans can also watch OSU's online video broadcasts of the other two games (subscription required) and follow live stats via Gametracker. The easiest way to find the links is to go to the baseball schedule page at gohuskies.com and click on that day's game for the links. Washington will send junior right-hander **Aaron West** to the hill Friday night. On Saturday, freshman right **Tyler Davis** will start for the UW and, on Sunday, sophomore RHP **Austin Voth** will take to the mound for the Dawgs. Here's a look at this weekend's games:

COACH MEGGS: Lindsay Meggs is in his third season as head coach at Washington. This spring, one of his chief accomplishments has come to fruition with the opening of the new baseball team building at Husky Ballpark – a clubhouse, coaches' offices, training room, equipment room and donor area overlooking the field. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the previous three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Currently, he boasts a 675-379-4 record over 18 seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Dave Dangler** and **Jordon Twohig**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

MARCH 27, 2012

SERIES HISTORY: UW and OSU have been meeting on the baseball diamond for over 100 years, dating back to 1911. Since then, the Beavers have a 226-182-2 all-time series lead. Last year in Seattle, the Beavers won two of three, winning Friday's game at Safeco Field by a 6-4 score and game two by a final of 7-3. In the finale, the Huskies edged OSU, 7-6, scoring the winning run on a bases-loaded walk in the ninth. Two seasons ago in Corvallis, OSU also won the first two games before the Huskies scored a one-run win in game three.

STINGY DAWGS: Twenty-two games into the season, Washington's pitching statistics are impressive, as the Huskies' 3.00 team ERA and .218 opponent batting average would indicate. But as the season has gone on, those numbers have gotten more and more impressive. Since returning from their opening series at San Diego State (where the UW won two of three), the Husky pitching staff has a 2.39 ERA and opponents are batting just .196 against them over 19 games. Since returning from a four-game trip to UC Irvine and CS Northridge (where the UW won three of four), the UW staff ERA is a miniscule 1.67 and opponents are hitting just .181 over 14 games. Since that Northridge game, the UW has used 14 different pitchers, and none of them has an ERA over 3.86 over that stretch, while nine of them have ERAs under 2.00. As for the Husky offense, it's been solid over those spans as well as the UW has batted .289 since opening weekend (97 points higher than the opponents) and .293 since the CS Northridge game (112 points higher).

THEY'RE COMING FROM ALL OVER: The 2012 Husky baseball roster includes players from seven different states. Of the 35 players on the official roster entering the season, 18 are from Washington, 11 are from California, two are from Idaho and there is one player each from Arizona, Colorado, Hawai'i and Indiana. Washington's baseball roster has traditionally been heavily dominated by in-state players. Of the 18 players from the Evergreen State, 17 come from west of the Cascade Mountains, (the western half of the state).

Baseball) after batting .347 ... played summer ball for the Brewster Whitecaps in the Cape Code League.

#36 BRANDEN BERRY, Fr. 1B: Started 21 of 22 ... 3-for-9, 2 RBI in CSUB series ... 2-for-4 Mar. 13 vs. Portland ... 4-for-12 in Cal Poly series ... 3-for-9 in SJU series ... 3-for-4 with 2 doubles Feb. 27 at CSUN ... terrific opening weekend at SDSU: 8-for-13 (.615) with a 3B and a HR ... singled in first four college at bats ... HR in 9th inning of Feb. 18 win at SDSU ... named the MVP of the CIF San Diego Section as a senior at Rancho Bernardo HS last year ... hit .432 with 10 homer and 46 RBI ... also named first-team all-state.

#21 CALEB BROWN, Sr. OF: Started all 3 vs. CSUB, homering in first game ... started 2 of 4 vs. Saint Joseph's and 2 of 3 at UCI ... 2-for-5 with 3 RBI and a HR Feb. 25 at Irvine ... doubled as PH Feb. 22 vs. SeattleU ... was limited last season due to an injuries, but still started 22 games, all in CF ... one of only two seniors on the roster ... as a junior in 2010, started 54 of 56 games, all in center field ... batted .295 that season ... also started 31 games as a freshman in 2009 ... a two-time, first-team all-state selection in both baseball and football at Central Kitsap HS.

#27 MICHAEL CAMPOREALE, Jr. OF: Started 20 of 22 games ... HR Mar. 24 vs. CSUB ... 4-for-7 in CSUB series ... 2-for-4 Mar. 13 vs. Portland ... 2-run homer Mar. 11 at Cal Poly ... career day Feb. 27 at CSUN, going 3-for-5 with 7 RBI and a grand slam HR ... doubled twice in UCI series ... 4-for-11 with 2 RBI in SDSU series ... transfer from Cuesta College in San Luis Obispo, Calif. ... led Cuesta with a .384 average as a sophomore in 2011 ... also led team in runs, hits, doubles, triples, homers, steals and RBI ... named Western State Conference Player of the Year and CCCAA All-America ... attended Chatfield HS in Littleton, Colo., where he hit .615 with 14 homers and 44 RBI as a senior, leading the state's 5A level in homers and hitting.

IF: Started 1 game vs. Oregon at 2B ... pinch-hit, RBI single in third game vs. Saint Joseph's ... started vs. SeattleU (2B, BB, HBP in 3 plate appearances) ... appeared off the bench in all 3 at SDSU ... in 4 plate appearances, had a single, a walk and a SF ... three-time first-team all-league selection at Eagle (Idaho) High School ... can play 2B, SS or 3B ... also an academic all-league selection all four years of HS ... hit .417 with six homers and 30 RBI as a senior, helping Eagle to the state title.

#12 ERIK FORGIONE, Fr. IF: 12 starts at SS ... 2-for-5, 2 RBI in CSUB series ... scored only run in 1-0 win over Saint Joseph's March 3 ... 3-for-6 in 2 starts at UCI ... played in all 3 at SDSU ... in season opener,

drove in 2 runs to give UW its first lead with 7th-inning single ... teammate and classmate of fellow Husky Robert Pehl at W.F. West HS in Chehalis, Wash. ... three-time first-team all-league and two-time first-team all-state selection ... won state championship as a junior ... drafted by the Angels in the 33rd round of 2011 draft.

#26 PARKER GUINN, Fr. C: Got first hit Mar. 25 vs. CSU Bakersfield ... made first appearance as a defensive replacement at C Feb. 27 at CSUN ... also played March 4 vs. Saint Joseph's ... named first-team all-league and all-area, as well as second-team all-state, as a senior, batting .450 with four homers and 30 RBI ... led team to state playoffs all three years.
