Washington Hosts #13 Arizona To Finish 1st Half Of Pac-12 Slate

THIS WEEKEND: The Washington baseball team (19-15 overall, 5-7 in the Pac-12) plays host to Arizona (24-12 overall, 10-5 Pac-12) in a three-game series this weekend at Husky Ballpark. The end of the series will mark the halfway point in the 30-game conference schedule for the Huskies. Arizona is ranked No. 13 in the latest Baseball America top 25 and is No. 16 in this week's coaches' poll. The Wildcats are one of three teams (along with UCLA and Oregon) tied atop the Pac-12 standings with a 10-5 league record. Washington blanked SeattleU, 6-0, in its lone midweek game while the Wildcats dropped a 12-8 decision to rival Arizona State in a non-conference game Tuesday. Fans can watch free, live video of all three games, and follow live stats, at gohuskies.com. The easiest way to find the links is to go to the baseball schedule page at gohuskies.com and click on that day's game for the links. Washington will send junior right-hander **Aaron West** to the mound in Friday's series opener. On Saturday, freshman right **Tyler Davis** starts for the Huskies, while sophomore RHP **Jeff Brigham** will make his second start of the season on Sunday. Next weekend, the UW travels to face Portland on Tuesday before taking on Utah next weekend in Salt Lake City. Here's a look at this weekend's games:

COACH MEGGS: Lindsay Meggs is in his third season as head coach at Washington. This spring, one of his chief accomplishments has come to fruition with the opening of the new baseball team building at Husky Ballpark – a clubhouse, coaches' offices, training room, equipment room and donor area overlooking the field. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the previous three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Currently, he boasts a 679-387-4 record over 18 seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Dave Dangler** and **Jordon Twohig**.

DAWG RETURN TO SAFECO FIELD: Washington will play at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners, for the sixth straight season when the Huskies host UCLA on May 11. It will be the Dawgs' seventh game at Safeco, as they played two games there in 2009, and will mark the first time the Huskies have taken on the Bruins at the big-league field. Washington first played at Safeco Field in 2007, when 10,421 fans watched the Huskies beat defending NCAA champion Oregon State, 6-2. Since then, the Huskies have played Arizona (2008), Oregon State and Arizona State (2009), Stanford (2010) and Oregon State (2011) at the Mariners' home.

#3 TY AFENIR, Jr. SS: Has 15 starts at shortstop ... drove in go-ahead run with 10th-inning squeeze Mar. 31 (game 1) at OSU ... 3-for-7 in CSU Bakersfield series ... 1-for-5 with an RBI in 2nd game of SJU series ... started 46 of 54 games last season at shortstop ... made just 5 errors and posted a .969 fielding percentage ... played summer baseball for the Anchorage Bucs in the Alaska League ... teammate of fellow Husky B.K. Santy at Palomar College in 2010 ... uncle, Troy Afenir, played in the major leagues in the early 1990s.

#11 CHASE ANSELMANT, Jr. C: 10 starts at C and 6 at DH ... homered Mar. 24 vs. CSU Bakersfield ... 5-for-12 in Oregon series ... 3-for-8 with 3 RBI in Cal Poly series ... drove in game-winner with SF in 7th (last inning) Mar. 4 vs. Saint Joseph's and then homered in the second game ... 2-for-2 with a 2B, walk and HBP ... started 47 games in 2011, 39 in RF, 5 at DH and 3 at C ... shared team lead for homers ... started 33 games as a freshman, earning third-team Freshman All-America (Ping! Baseball) after batting .347 ... played summer ball for the Brewster Whitecaps in the Cape Code League.

#36 BRANDEN BERRY, Fr. 1B: Started 31 of 34 ... homered in April 6 win over No. 6 Stanford ... 3-for-9, 2 RBI in CSUB series ... 2-for-4 Mar. 13 vs. Portland ... 4-for-12 in Cal Poly series ... 3-for-9 in SJU series ... 3-for-4 with 2 doubles Feb. 27 at CSUN ... terrific opening weekend at SDSU: 8-for-13 (.615) with a 3B and a HR ... singled in first four college at bats ... HR in 9th inning of Feb. 18 win at SDSU ... named the MVP of the CIF San Diego Section as a senior at Rancho Bernardo HS last year ... hit .432 with 10 homers and 46 RBI ... also named first-team all-state.

HR Mar. 24 vs. CSUB ... 4-for-7 in CSUB series ... 2-for-4 Mar. 13 vs. Portland ... 2-run homer Mar. 11 at Cal Poly ... career day Feb. 27 at CSUN, going 3-for-5 with 7 RBI and a grand slam HR ... doubled twice in UCI series ... 4-for-11 with 2 RBI in SDSU series ... transfer from Cuesta College in San Luis Obispo, Calif. ... led Cuesta with a .384 average as a sophomore in 2011 ... also led team in runs, hits, doubles, triples, homers, steals and RBI ... named Western State Conference Player of the Year and CCCAA All-America ... attended Chatfield HS in Littleton, Colo., where he hit .615 with 14 homers and 44 RBI as a senior, leading the state's 5A level in homers and hitting.

IF: Started at 2B Tue. vs. SeattleU and in 1 of 3 at Cal ... also started 1 game vs. Stanford and 1 vs. Gonzaga ... started 1 game vs. Oregon at 2B ... pinch-hit, RBI single in third game vs. Saint Joseph's ... started vs. SeattleU (2B, BB, HBP in 3 plate appearances) ... appeared off the bench in all 3 at SDSU ... in 4 plate appearances, had a single, a walk and a SF ... three-time first-team all-league selection at Eagle (Idaho) High School ... can play 2B, SS or 3B ... also an academic all-league selection all four years of HS ... hit .417 with six homers and 30 RBI as a senior, helping Eagle to the state title.

#12 ERIK FORGIONE, Fr. IF: 19 starts at SS ... had a 2-run triple April 9 vs. Gonzaga ... started all 3 vs. Stanford ... 2-for-5, 2 RBI in CSUB series ... scored only run in 1-0 win over Saint Joseph's March 3 ... 3-for-6 in 2 starts at UCI ... played in all 3 at SDSU ... in season opener, drove in 2 runs to give UW its first lead with 7th-inning single ... teammate and classmate of fellow Husky Robert Pehl at W.F. West HS in Chehalis, Wash. ... three-time first-team all-league and two-time first-team all-state selection ... won state championship as a junior ... drafted by the Angels in the 33rd round of 2011 draft.
