Huskies Return To Safeco Field For First Of Three Against UCLA

THIS WEEKEND: The red-hot Washington baseball team (26-18 overall, 11-10 in the Pac-12) makes its annual visit to Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners, this Friday to open a three-game series vs. UCLA (31-12, 12-9). The Huskies return from a seven-game road trip on which they won six games. The UW has won seven of its last eight overall and has (importantly when it comes to postseason hopes) moved over .500 in Pac-12 play after sweeping USC last weekend in Los Angeles. The Bruins, who are ranked No. 11 by both Baseball America and the coaches, took two of three from then-No. 13 Purdue last weekend. Friday night's game at Safeco Field, which marks the Huskies' seventh appearance there, gets underway at 6:00 p.m. PT. Saturday (2:00 p.m.) and Sunday (1:00 p.m.), games will be played at Husky Ballpark. Fans can follow live stats and watch live video (free) at gohuskies.com. The UW pitching rotation remains in tact from the past four weekends. Washington will send junior right-hander Aaron West to the mound Friday at Safeco. Saturday, freshman righty Tyler Davis starts for the Huskies, while sophomore RHP Jeff Brigham gets the ball on Sunday. The Huskies host Portland next Wednesday before traveling to face No. 19 Arizona State next weekend. Here's a look at this weekend's games:

COACH MEGGS: Lindsay Meggs is in his third season as head coach at Washington. This spring, one of his chief accomplishments has come to fruition with the opening of the new baseball team building at Husky Ballpark – a clubhouse, coaches' offices, training room, equipment room and donor area overlooking the field. Meggs came to the UW after having spent the previous three seasons at Indiana State and the 13 prior to that at Chico State, where he won NCAA Division II national championships in 1997 and 1999. He helped Chico to the D-II College World Series seven times and won the league eight times. At Indiana State, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 after guiding the Sycamores to a second-place finish, their highest since 1998. Currently, he boasts a 686-390-4 record over 18 seasons as a four-year college head coach. He'd previously served as head coach at Long Beach City College and Oxnard College. Born in San Jose and a graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High, Meggs played four seasons as the starting third baseman at UCLA. He was drafted by the Brewers in 1983, and then again by the Royals after his senior year in 1984. Meggs is joined by assistant coaches **Dave Nakama**, **Dave Dangler** and **Jordon Twohig**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

DAWG RETURN TO SAFECO FIELD: Washington will play at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners, for the sixth straight season when the Huskies host UCLA on Friday. It will be the Dawgs' seventh game at Safeco, as they played two games there in 2009, and will mark the first time the Huskies have taken on the Bruins at the big-league field. Washington first played at Safeco Field in 2007, when 10,421 fans watched the Huskies beat defending NCAA champion Oregon State, 6-2. Since then, the Huskies have played Arizona (2008), Oregon State and Arizona State (2009), Stanford (2010) and Oregon State (2011) at the Mariners' home.
