UW Set To Begin 9-Game Homestand; UC Irvine, WSU First On Slate

COMING UP: The Washington baseball team (12-15-1 overall, 1-2 Pac-10) returns to Husky Ballpark for a nine-game homestand, hoping to break its seven-game losing streak. Tuesday at 6:30 p.m., the Huskies play host to UC Irvine. The series concludes Wednesday at 2:00 p.m. Friday through Sunday, Washington State makes its annual trip to Seattle for a three-game, Pac-10 series. Friday's game starts at 6:30 and Saturday and Sunday are scheduled for a 1:00 p.m. first pitch. All but the Wednesday game vs. UCI will air on radio at KKNW AM-1150 and also via the internet at www.newschannel1150.com. Here's a rundown of this week's slate:

SERIES HISTORY: UC Irvine has just restarted its baseball program after having it shut down following the 1992 season. The Huskies haven't played a game vs. the Anteaters since 1982 and UCI has won two of three meetings. The Cougars hold a 219-160 series advantage over the Huskies, though Washington is 48-20 against WSU since 1991 and has won 11 of the last 12 against its cross-state rival. March 25 and 26, the Huskies swept a pair of non-league games from the Cougars in a series played in Lewiston, Idaho. In the first game, **Shawn Kohn** and **Trevor Gibson** combined on a four-hitter while **Jay Garthwaite** and **Kyle Larsen** homered in a 7-3 UW win. In game two, the Huskies overcame a 7-2 deficit to win, 18-12. Garthwaite was 4-for-4 with a homer and five RBI while Larsen went 3-for-6 with four RBI.

COACH "K": In nine seasons as the head coach of his alma mater, **Ken Knutson** has led the Dawgs to two Pac-10 championships, four Pac-10 Northern Division titles, two second-place finishes and three NCAA Regionals. His career overall record stands at 326-222-1 (.595). With those 326 wins, he is the second-winningest coach in UW history, trailing only Bob MacDonald (422). Before becoming the Husky head man in 1993, Knutson served as the Husky pitching coach for eight seasons. In 1985, his UW pitching staff led the nation with a 2.80 ERA. Knutson holds a 156-69-1 (.692) record in home games. He is 138-99 (.582) in conference games. Knutson has coached 35 first-team All-Pac-10 selections in nine seasons, and has been named league caoch of the year three times. A 1981 All-Pac-10 left-handed pitcher at the UW, he is joined by assistant coaches **Joe Ross, Travis Jewett**, and **Gregg Swenson** and undergraduate assistants **Daniel Jahn** and **Duggan Moran**.

WASHINGTON BASEBALL

AMONGTHE LEADERS: Several Husky players enter the week among the top of several various Pac-10 statistical rankings, mostly on the offensive side of things. Junior SS **Tila Reynolds** leads the league in batting with his .395 average and also ranks in the top three in five other offensive categories: second in triples, second in steals, second in hit by pitch, third in on-base pct., and third in hits. Junior OF **Jay Garthwaite** is second in the Pac-10 in both RBI and triples, third in slugging and fourth in both homers and RBI. Junior OF **Tyler Davidson** is sixth in steals and 10th in runs while freshman 1B **Kyle Larsen** rates No. 9 in the league on on-base average, despite being a cleanup hitter. The other two Huskies that rank in the hitting categories are sophomore 2B **Greg Isaacson**, who's fifth in sacrifice hits despite having played in only 12 games while senior 3B **Michael Done** is fourth in hit by pitches. Senior RHP **Shawn Kohn** is first in the league in called strikeouts, second in victories, fifth in opponent batting average and eighth in ERA while junior closer **Tyler Shepple**'s four saves ranks third in the conference.

VETERAN SQUAD: After fielding rather youthful squads in each of the last two seasons, the 2002 Husky team is all grown up. Offensively, Washington returns players that made a total of 378 individual starts last year, 80.8 percent of the possible total of 468 (nine players times 52 games). Returning hitters accounted for 429 of last seasons' 531 total hits (also 80.8 percent) and 39 of the Huskies' 46 home runs (84.8 percent). On the mound, returning pitchers accounted for 359.2 of the Huskies' 455.2 innings pitched last year (78.9 percent) and started 44 of last season's 52 games (84.6 percent). In all, current members of the Washington baseball team had earned a total of 43 varsity letters and had started a total of 742 college games prior to the start of the 2002 season.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES: College baseball's preseason publications predicted a solid season for the 2002 Huskies. *Baseball America* ranked the Dawgs No. 24 in their preseason issue and counted the Huskies among the five Pac-10 teams it predicts will make it into the NCAA tournament. Shortstop **Tila Reynolds** was tabbed the preseason All-Pac-10 shortstop and was ranked the best defensive SS in the league. RHP **Shawn Kohn** was listed as the league's No. 1 control pitcher. *Baseball America* also listed Reynolds as the No. 48 junior prospect in the country and 1B **Kyle Larsen** as the nation's No. 42 freshman prospect. Neither *Collegiate Baseball* nor *USA Today Baseball Weekly* ranked the Huskies in the preseason, though the Huskies were among those receiving votes in USA Today's preseason coaches' poll (ranked No. 38, counting past the 25 ranked teams).

IF/DH: Played in two of the three games at Missouri, going 0-for-3 on the weekend ... started at third base in game two of UC Riverside series, going 1-for-4 with an RBI ... started Feb. 24 at Fresno State as the DH, going 1-for-2 ... started two games at DH at the tournament in Phoenix, going 1-for-6 ... started at second base in exhibition win over British Columbia, going 2-for-4 with a grand slam home run.

TYLER DAVIDSON, Jr. OF: Started 27 of 28 in right field so far ... leads team with 32 runs scored and third with five homers ... nine steals is second on team and sixth in the Pac-10 ... 2-for-5 with a run in April 6 loss at Missouri and 2-for-5 with two runs and three RBI the following day vs. the Tigers ... in game one of BYU series, went 1-for-5, but stole four bases in four tries and scored twice ... hit home runs in first two at bats of the season vs. Missouri ... finished that game 4-for-5 with two solo homers, two run-scoring singles and a stolen base ... 2-for-3 with two doubles and three runs the following day vs. Northwestern ... Baseball America's No. 59 college prospect for the 2002 draft.

MICHAEL DONE, Sr. 3B: After starting the year at second base for the first 15 games, has returned to third, where he started the last two years ... second on the team with six homers after leading the UW with seven HRs last year ... 3-for-4 with a double, an RBI and three runs last Friday at Missouri ... 2-for-4 with a double and two walks Sunday at Missouri ... 2-for-6 with two RBI in Gonzaga series ... tied for first on the team with 14 BBs ... walked only 28 times over last two seasons combined ... three-run homer in first inning of March 2 game vs. Utah ... led off the seventh Feb. 24 at Fresno with a solo homer to break a 7-7 tie ... 2-for-2 with three runs and two RBI in Fresno loss ... hit second and third homers in loss to Missouri on Feb. 27 ... went 3-for-5 in that game ... tabbed the Pac-10's top infield arm by Baseball America prior to last season ... drafted by Baltimore in the 40th round last June.

JAY GARTHWAITE, Jr. OF: Named Pac-10 Player of the Week two of the last four weeks ... named the NCBWA national player of the week last week after going 11-for-22 with four homers and 16 RBI last week vs. WSU and ASU ... 16 RBI in the one week alone were more than all but one of his teammates has compiled all season to that point ... 6-for-20 with three RBI in five games last week ... homered in the Saturday game at Missouri, his 10th of the year .. currently ranks fourth in UW history with 27 career homers ... also ranks ninth on the UW career RBI chart ... second in the Pac-10 with 45 RBI ... has homered in five of the last 10 and seven of the last 13 games ... over last 11 games: 22-for-53 (.415) with six homers and 25 RBI ... over last 17 games: 32-for-77 (.416) with nine homers and 34 RBI ... raised average from .238 to .357 over the last 17 ... earned first Pac-10 Player of the Week award after going 7-for-13 (.538) with five runs, seven RBI, three triples and two homers in BYU series ... twice fell a double short of the cycle in the series, hitting two triples to go with a homer and a single in game one ... continued the hot hitting at WSU, going 6-for-7 with two homers and seven RBI in two games ... three doubles and three RBI in five at bats Feb. 24 at Fresno ... 6-for-14 with seven RBI in FSU series ... struggled at the plate in opening weekend, but still managed three RBI in three starts ... went only 2-for-15 with 10 Ks over first five games and is 32-for-77 (.416) since ... had a two-run single in the loss to Missouri ... went 3-for-4 with a home run in the exhibition win over UBC ... led the team in RBI last season ... a 12th-round draft pick in 1999.

AARON HATHAWAY, Fr. C: Has started 17 of 28 games behind the plate ... 0-for-3 with an RBI last time out April 6 at Missouri ... 5-for-5 with two doubles April 2 vs. Gonzaga and 2-for-4 on April 3... 3-for-4 in game one of UCR series, driving in two runs ... got first two steals and first two walks of his career in UCR series ... didn't allow a stolen base until the game at Portland Feb. 26 when the Pilots pulled a double steal of second and third and Hathaway dropped the ball on the exchange ... had a tremendous debut Feb. 15 vs. Northwestern, going 2-for-4 with a double and a triple ... also

threw out a would-be basestealer and picked off a runner at first base in that game ... 2-for-5 with a double and an RBI Feb. 17 vs. Missouri ... also threw out a basestealer in that game.

GREG ISAACSON, So. 2B: After not even appearing in a game all year, has started 12 of the last 13 games at second base and his hit safely in eight of them ... despite lack of playing time, already ranks fifth in the Pac-10 with four sacrifice hits ... 2-for-3 with a run, a steal and an RBI April 5 at Missouri ... 3-for-9 with two doubles and four runs scored in two games at WSU ... 6-for-12 with three runs, two doubles and five RBI in the BYU series ... in first at bat of the year, belted a two-run, two-out double vs. BYU for his first career hit ... went 0-for-4 all of last season.

BRANDON JACOBSON, Jr. OF: Has started 16 of the UW's 25 games as leadoff hitter... UW is 11-5 when he starts ... earned a walk in each of the games at Missouri despite starting only one ... 2-for-7 with four walks, a homer and four runs in WSU games ... 2-for-4 with two walks in win at Arizona State ... 3-for-5 with two runs in the March 5 win at Portland ... hit safely in all three of the Fresno State games ... has one of the UW's two outfield assists of the season so far as he threw out a Northwestern runner at the plate.

BEN JOHNSON, Soph. C: Has started 10 of 28 games behind the plate including two of three in each of the last two weekend series ... 2-for-3 with a walk and a steal last Friday at Missouri ... 2-for-4 with an RBI in win at Arizona State ... belted a solo homer in the ninth inning of the March 5 win at Portland ... 1-for-3 with a two-RBI double opening day ... has only allowed two stolen bases ... started 19 games behind the plate as a freshman in 2001.

BRYAN JOHNSON, Jr. 1B/DH: Second on the team with 28 runs batted in over 28 games ... has an RBI in 19 of his 26 games ... 2-for-11 with two RBI in Missouri series ... pinch-hit, two-run HR April 2 vs. Gonzaga gave UW 6-5 lead ... 2-for-4 with an RBI March 29 at ASU ... two-run homer March 1 vs. Utah ... two homers and three RBI at Portland Feb. 26 ... four RBI in the loss at Fresno State, driving in three with a bases-loaded double ... scored three runs in the Feb. 24 win at Fresno ... 2-for-3 Feb. 15 vs. Northwestern, driving in the winning run with a two-out double in the bottom of the eighth ... solo HR in the second Feb. 16 vs. Northwestern proved the winning run in a 2-0 win.

TAYLOR JOHNSON, Fr. OF: Most recent start in game three of BYU series, when he walked twice and scored twice ... has come off the bench in two games since, March 26 at WSU and April 5 at Missouri ... started in center at Portland Feb. 26 and got a solo homer in the eighth for his first career hit ... singled as PH March 5 at Portland ... saw action in two games during the opening weekend in Phoenix, pinch running in game three and starting in center in game four ... also started exhibition vs. British Columbia, going 1-for-2 with three walks, two runs and two steals.

KYLE LARSEN, Fr. 1B/DH: Started 12 of last 13 as first baseman and cleanup hitter ... a remarkable .451 on-base average thanks to a team-high 14 walks ... entered the week ranked ninth in the Pac-10 in on-base pct. ... had two hits in each of the Missouri games ... 2-for-4 with three RBI in the opener ... 1-for-4 last Tuesday vs. Gonzaga, but didn't play Wednesday ... 5-for-11 with two doubles, a homer and six RBI at WSU ... hit safely in all three ASU games ... hit HRs in back-to-back games March 2 & 3 vs. Utah, the first two of his career ... has hit safely in all but two of 16 games in which he's started ... saw action in three games opening weekend, starting at first base in the 8-7 win over Northwestern ... went 1-for-3 with a walk in that one ... singled and walked coming off the bench in the Feb. 17 loss to Missouri ... 2-for-5 with two singles in the exhibition win over British Columbia ... 14th round draft pick out of high school last June.

JOHN OTNESS, Soph. C/3B: Is in the midst of moving to catcher after starting 11 games at third base ... has hit safely in all 12 games he's started this year ... two-run pinch-hit double April 7 at Missouri ... 1-for-4 with a double as DH in the April 3 Gonzaga game ... 3-for-8 over two games vs. UC Riverside ... 3-for-10 in Utah series and 2-for-5 at Portland March 5 ... started only once at Fresno State after taking a fastball in the head in the Feb. 22 win ... took two stitches behind his left ear but finished the game ... 2-for-4 with two RBI Feb. 26 at Portland ... 2-for-4 with two runs and a steal opening day vs. Missouri ... doubled to drive in second run of 2-0 win over Northwestern.

STEVE RAMSEY, Soph. OF/DH: Hast started only two games in the last two weeks, but is usually the first-choice pinch hitter ... started April 7 at Missouri and went 0-for-3 with a run batted in ... played in all three games vs. BYU, starting once ... hit game-tying single in eighth inning of the 12-12 tie with BYU ... 5-for-8 with two-HBPs and a walk as a pinch hitter this season ... started two games vs. Utah, one at DH and one in left field ... 2-for-5 with a homer March 2 vs. Utah ... pinch hitter Feb. 24 at Fresno, driving in a run with a single to make it 9-7 in the eighth ... also singled as a pinch hitter Feb. 23 at Fresno ... solo home run as a PH led off the sixth inning in Missouri loss on Feb. 17.

TILA REYNOLDS, Jr. SS: Hit safely in first 13 games of the season before going hitless in game two of the UC Riverside series ... has hit safely in 27 of 28 and has sat out only two innings all year ... on a 14-game hit streak, during which he's gone 25-for-56 (.446) with 15 runs and seven doubles ... drove in the go-ahead run in the ninth Sunday at Missouri before the Tigers won it in the bottom of the inning ... 6-for-15 with two doubles and a triple in the Missouri series ...12 stolen bases in 14 tries leads the team and is No. 2 in the Pac-10 ... also leads team with 49 hits, .395 average and nine HBPs ... leads the Pac-10 in average and is second in triples, HBPs and steals ... 3-for-11 in two games vs. Gonzaga ... had a solid opening weekend, starting all four games at shorstop while going 6-for-15 (.400) a the plate ... named Baseball America's No. 53 college prospect and one of two players noted as "Top Defensive Player."

TIM RICE, Sr. C: Has played in three games this year, starting game three vs. BYU and coming off the bench March 1 and 2 vs. Utah ... transfer from Tacoma CC, where he played for current UW assistant coach Gregg Swenson.

MIKE WAGNER, Soph. OF: Started last four of last six at LF... 1-for-3 with two RBI last Friday at Missouri ... 5-for-8 with a triple in two Gonzaga games ... started Saturday at ASU and went 2-for-4 with a homer and a double ... started in left twice in BYU series, going 2-for-4 in game one ... started at third base Feb. 23 and 24 at Fresno State ... hit a two-run double in Feb. 24 win at FSU ... 1-for-3 with two runs, an RBI and a walk opening day vs. Missouri.
