Three-year letterman guard and part-time starter during each of his previous three seasons ... Has 820 career points, needing 180 more to become UW's 28th 1,000-point scorer ... Enters the season as the most accurate free throw shooter in school history, having converted 87.7 percent (178-of-203) of his chartiy shots ... Ranks No. 2 among Pac-10 free throw shooters behind only UCLA's Rod Foster who shot 88.8 percent (309-351) from 1980-83 ... Enters the season tied for ninth among all-time Huskies with 239 career assists ... Arguably the quickest player in the Pac-10 ... One of only two players with more than one full year of experience with the Huskies, joining Will Conroy. 2002-03 (Junior) — Played all 27 games with 13 starts ... His 52 treys were 23 more 3-pointers than any teammate had ... Converted 95.7 percent of his free throws (44-of-46), a figure that led all Pac-10 players but was 10 shy of the minimum standard for qualifying in the conference statistics ... Tallied double-figure points on 13 occastions, topped by a four 17-point performances ... Led all UW scorers three times and was the team's top assister twice ... Had five steals against UCLA (Jan. 2). 2001-02 (Sophomore) — Distributed 15 assists against Arizona State (Jan. 10), just one shy of the school record of 16 ... Amassed 126 assists, the seventh-highest single-season total in Husky history ... Named Pac-10 Player of the Week on Dec. 3, 2001 after tallying a career-high 27 points at San Diego (Dec. 1) ... Led the team in assists (126), 3-pointers (48) and steals (27) while ranking second in scoring (12.0 ppg) ... Tallied double-figure points 18 times, including two 20-point performances ... Distributed five-or-more assists on nine occasions and was the team's top assister during 21 games ... Led the team and ranked second among Pac-10 players by converting 88.6 percent (101-114) of his free throw attempts ... Ranked second among Huskies with 65 assists, the fourth-highest figure ever for a UW freshman ... Registered 29 steals, the third-highest single-season total for a Husky freshman ... Hit two spinning shots in the lane at Oregon (Jan. 18), forcing overtime with the first and winning the game at 0:06 with the second ... 





Two-year letterman ... Arguably the most improved player in the Pac-10 last season ... Emerged as a quality playmaker and dangerous scoring threat ... One of only two players with more than one full year of experience with the Huskies, joining Curtis Allen ... Turned down numerous scholarship offers in order to walk on at Washington in the fall of 2001 ... Was awarded a scholarship on the first day of classes in 2001 when one unexpectedly became available. 2002-03 (Sophomore) — Registered the most dramatic scoring increase among Pac-10 players, improving his freshman point production (2.5) by over 10 points per game ... His 12.7 point scoring average ranked second on the team and 21st among conference scorers ... Topped the 20-point plateau twice ... Tallied a career-high 32 points at Gonzaga (Dec. 2), including a late 3-pointer that forced overtime ... Paced all UW scorers eight times and was the top assist man during 20 games ...
