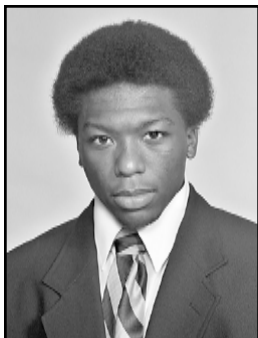

One-year letterman who exploded onto the scene last year and led the Huskies in scoring average (13.0) ... Possesses phenomenal leaping ability ... Originally enrolled at Washington on a football scholarship, but is now on a basketball scholarship after deciding during the off-season to concentrate on the hardwood full-time ... Played all 13 football games in 2002 and started the final six games as a cornerback on the Husky football squad, including the Sun Bowl ... Intercepted two passes and made 34 tackles ... Father Jacque Robinson played tailback for the Washington football team between 1981-84 and amassed 2,300 career yards to ranks No. 7 among all-time Huskies ... Jacque is the only college player ever to earn MVP honors in both the Rose Bowl (1982) and Orange Bowl (1985). **2002-03 (Freshman)** — Named to the CollegeInsider.com's 20-player National All-Freshmen Team ... Honored as a member of the All-Pac-10 Freshman Team ... Played 23 games, starting the final 10 ... Joined the team after the football regular season, participating in his first practice Nov. 26 ... Led the team in scoring average with 13.0 points per game, a figure that ranked 17th among Pac-10 players ... His 300 points tied for fourth among all-time UW freshmen ... Had 19 points, six rebounds, four assists and two steals in his second collegiate game, at Santa Clara (Dec. 7) ... Tallied double-figure points 17 times and led all UW scorers on 11 occasions ... Top scoring effort was a 20-point performance against Arizona State (Feb. 8) ... Tallied eight points and played 23 minutes against UCLA (Jan. 2), two days after his appearance in the Sun Bowl ... Ranked second on the team with 52 assists.

Rainier Beach High School

Averaged 17.9 points, seven rebounds, seven assists and three steals per game as a senior in 2002 ... The 2002 Player of the Year in Washington state for the AAA classification ... Led Rainier Beach to a 28-1 basketball record en route to the 2002 state championship and a No. 7 national ranking from *USA Today* ... The MVP of the 2002 Class AAA state tournament after averaging 25.8 points for the champion Vikings. Scored 31 points as top-ranked Rainier Beach beat No. 2 Mark Morris in the semifinals and finished with 19 in the championship game against No. 4 Mercer Island in a 67-51 victory ... Ranked No. 98 nationally among 2002 prep prospects in Clark Francis' *Hoop Scoop* ... Rated the No. 9 point guard prospect in the West by Prep West Hoops ... One of 100 finalists for the McDonald's High School All-America team ... Collected 20 points and seven rebounds and received MVP honors after leading the City team to a 112-98 victory over the State squad in the 2002 Class AAA All-State game at KeyArena on April 13 ... Honored as the *Seattle Times* Class AAA state player of the year in both football and basketball ... As a senior, totaled over 1,200 yards rushing and 500 yards receiving while scoring 21 touchdowns ... A first-team A.P. all-state selection who received first-team All-Metro League accolades at running back, defensive back and kick returner ... A *SuperPrep* All-American in 2001 who was ranked as the nation's 17th-best player at the athlete position ... Also a standout in track and field, setting a state record of 13.85 seconds in the 110-meter hurdles ... Placed second in the 110-meter hurdles at the 2002 state track meet ... Transferred to Rainier Beach in Seattle prior to his senior year from Logan High School near Oakland, Calif.

Coach Romar on Nate Robinson

“We’re thrilled to have him playing basketball full-time. About three-quarters of the year he played, he played just on instinct until he began to learn what we wanted at the end. Initially what you saw was him not worrying about running an offense and just playing. His instincts allowed him to pass but when we started running structure his comfort level allowed him to go score. This may sound crazy but he will be a much different player next year. He will know from day one exactly what we are trying to get across to him, offensively and defensively. There won’t be any guess work, which will allow him to play better basketball. Nate’s got a swagger about him that just rubs off on everyone else. It’s contagious. Not to mention his ability to go up and dunk the ball at 5-foot-9. He can do some things that electrify a crowd. The best way to describe him is as a hard-nosed winner.”

One-year letterman and part-time starter who missed seven late-season games last year with an injured left foot ... Underwent foot surgery during the spring and spent the summer and early fall rehabbing ... Is expected to be ready to play once games begin in 2003 ... A shot-blocking and rebounding specialist. **2002-03 (Freshman)** — Played 20 games with 12 starts ... Averaged 4.8 points and 3.2 rebounds ... Tallied double-figure points twice ... Started 12 consecutive mid-season games before suffering an injured left foot ... Was sidelined seven straight games from Feb. 6 through Mar. 1 before returning for the final two games of the season ... Originally signed with Washington in November of 2000, but did not meet NCAA initial eligibility requirements ... Signed a second letter of intent with the Huskies on Nov. 21, 2001 ... Did not attend a junior college or any other college, preserving four years of eligibility.

Garfield High School

Averaged 8.9 points and 6.5 rebounds per game during his senior season in 2001 for a balanced Garfield attack. The Bulldogs finished with a 27-2 record in 2001 and was ranked No. 1 in the state for most of the season on the strength of a 23-game winning streak ... Shattered the state tournament record with 21 blocked shots, eclipsing the previous record of 17 established by Rob Corkrum of Shadle Park in 1990 ... Single-handedly broke the previous team record of 20 blocks set by Lake Washington in 1995. His 21 blocks helped Garfield push the new team tournament record to 26 ... Averaged 11.5 points and 8.5 rebounds during the state tournament, helping Garfield to a fifth-place state finish. The Bulldogs won their final three tournament games after suffering an 85-82 double-overtime loss to Foss in the first round of the state tournament ... Established a new single-game state tournament record with eight blocked shots against Sehome. ... Rated the No. 9 prep power forward in the West by Pac-West Hoops ... Listed No. 52 nationally by Game Plan Sports Scouting Service ... Ranked No. 100 nationally in The Sporting News Top 100 Recruits ... An honorable mention prep All-American selection by Street & Smith's magazine ... Averaged three points and five rebounds in limited minutes as a junior at Garfield High School ... Emerged as a major recruit during the spring and summer, averaging 14 points, 11 rebounds and five blocked shots during that period ... Selected Washington after receiving recruiting interest from several Pac-10 schools and UTEP.

Coach Romar on Anthony Washington

“Anthony may be as excited as anyone to come back this year and play after playing just enough to get some experience last year. Just as he was getting better he got hurt again, so he had surgery. He will be ready to go before we start getting after it so he will have time to get back into shape. Obviously Anthony is a big, big part of what we are trying to do because he and Hakeem Rollins are the closest thing we have to a low-post presence.”

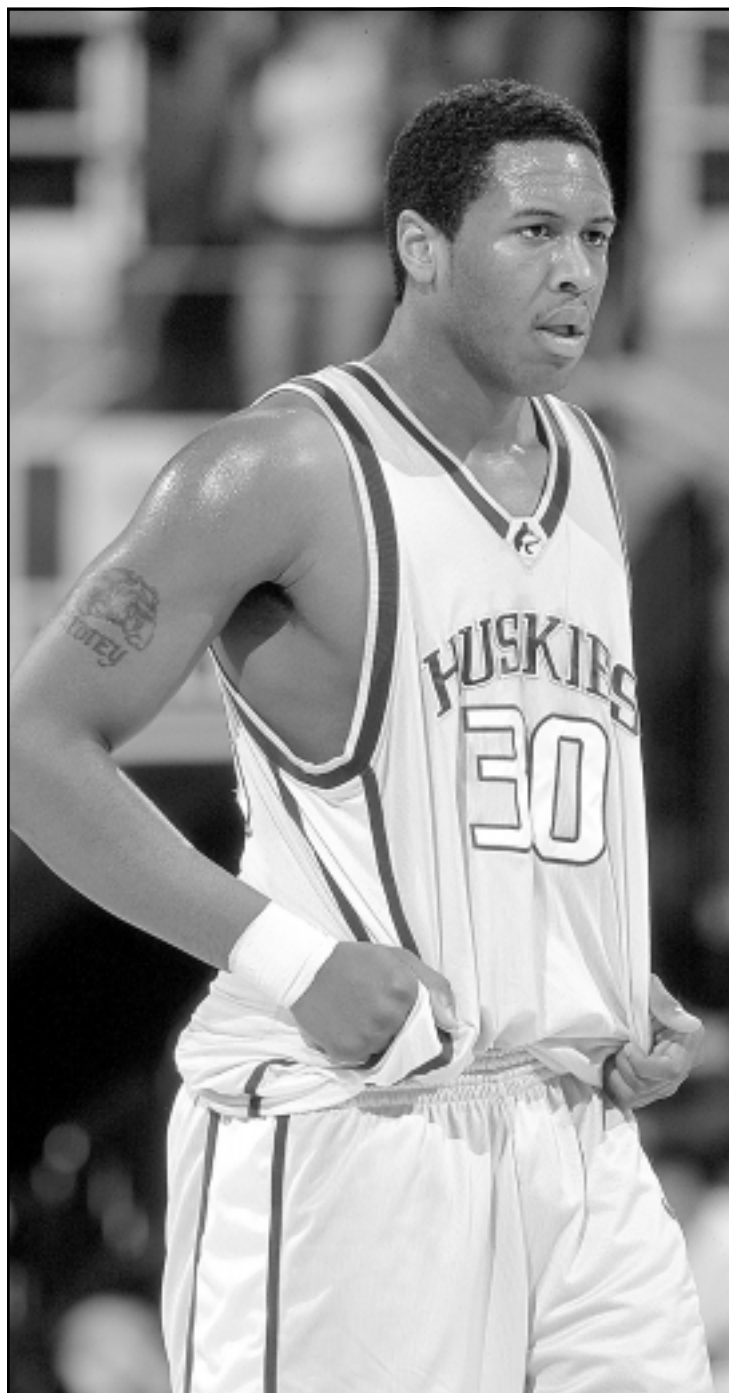
