

The third column lists "W" for wins and "L" for losses. The fourth column lists the score with Washington's total listed first. All opponents are listed by current name — i.e., formerly Ellensburg Normal, now Central Washington; formerly Texas Western, now UTEP; etc. Beginning with the 1952— 53 season, the NCAA has allowed only games between four-year colleges to be recognized in team and individual statistics. All other games are considered exhibitions, and are so indicated. Prior to 1952–53, competition against four-year colleges and athletic club, all-star, military, high school, YMCA and AAU teams, was recognized by the NCAA.

#### **Anthony Savage**

The fourth coach in school history and one of three individuals to coach both the UW basketball and football teams ... Led Washington to Northwest Intercollegiate Conference championships duirng both of his seasons as head coach, in 1914 and 1915 ... Compiled a 29-4 career record in his two seasons ... His winning percentage of 87.9% is the second-best among all-time Washington coaches ... Became the football coach at Lincoln High School in Seattle and took over the Washington football squad in 1918 while Claude Hunt was off fighting World War I. Led the UW gridders to a 1-1 record.

He was the head football coach in 1920, guiding the team to a 1-5 record. Allison coached the last UW football game at Denny Field on Nov. 5, 1920 which ended in a 3-0 loss to Stanford ... He later coached football at California (1935-44) and led the Bears to a 10-0-1 mark, a No. 2 ranking in the A.P. poll and a 13-0 win over Alabama in the 1938 Rose Bowl.





Washington's school colors, Purple and Gold, were adopted in 1892 by a vote of a student assembly on the original downtown Seattle campus. One patriotic group favored Red, White and Blue as the University's colors, reasoning that "since the school was named after the father of our country, our national colors should be the school's colors." The opposing faction argued that national colors should not be degraded for such everyday use. The debate was ended when a young English instructor, Miss Frazier, stood and read the following excerpt from Lord Byron's "Destruction of Sennacherib."

"The Assyrian came down like the wolf on the fold,

And his cohorts were gleaming in purple and gold;

And the sheen of their spears was like stars on the sea,

And the blue wave rolls nightly on deep Galilee."

#### Clarence "Hec" Edmundson



The eighth basketball coach in school history ... Coached the UW basketball team for 27 years (1921-47) and the track & field team for 36 years (1919-55) ... Started as track coach and football trainer in 1919, retired in

1955 after 36 years as track coach and 27 as head basketball coach ... Compiled a 488-195 record making him the winningest coach in UW men's basketball history, third among all-time Pac-10 coaches ... Coached the Huskies to 11 of their 21 20-win seasons ... Coached for 25 years in the PCC Northern Divison finishing first 12 times and second six times ... His UW track teams won eight Northern Division titles and three PCC crowns ... Including a four-year stint at Idaho (1917-21), Edmundson racked up a 508-204 career record. His winning percentage of 71.4% ranks No. 38 among all-time NCAA coaches. (continued on next column)

Born during 1887 in Moscow, Idaho, Edmundson graduated from the University of Idaho where he competed in track. He placed sixth in the 800 meters at the 1912 Olympics in Stockholm, Sweden. He became the head track & field coach at Texas A&M in 1913 before returning to Idaho to coach track and basketball. In 1919, Edmundson's long association with Washington began. He helped dedicate the multi-purpose structure, then called Washington pavilion, with a 34-23 win over Illinois on Dec. 27, 1927. On Jan. 16, 1948, the year after he stepped down as basketball coach, that same Pavilion was renamed in his honor. He remained as track coach until his retirement in 1955. A tremendous innovator, Edmundson tapped into his track background and became an originator of the fast break style of basketball. He co-founded, along with Tubby Graves, the Washington state high school basketball tournament. At Edmundson's request the 1922 UW team began forming a circle with their hands together in the center to symbolize unity. The handshake quickly spread throughout the country and is still practiced today. Although he denied being the inventor, Edmundson's teams implemented the one-handed jump shot long before Stanford's Hank Luisetti made it famous.



#### **Art McLarney**

The ninth coach in school history ... Replaced legendary Hec Edmundson who led the Huskies the preceding 27 years ... Coached three seasons, from 1948 to 1950, posting a fine 53-36 record ... Washington won the 1948 Pacific Coast Conference Northern Division title during his inaugural season ... The UW came within one game of the 1948 Final Four, but lost 64-62 on a last-second shot by Baylor ... McLarney was a two-time allcoast guard at Washington State where he was also an All-America shortstop on the baseball team. After college, he was signed by New York Giants manager John McGraw and played at the Polo Grounds alongside Mel Ott, Bill Terry and Carl Hubbell in 1932-33. He then coached at Burlington (Wash.) High School and Seattle-area high schools Cleveland and Roosevelt ... McLarney came to Washington as baseball and assistant basketball coach in 1946. He took over the basketball coaching reigns in 1948.
