





William H. "Tippy" Dye



The 10th coach in school history ... Coached nine seasons at Washington, from 1951-1959 ... Compiled a 156-91 UW record ... His 156 career victories place him third on Washington's all-time list ... Guided the Huskies to

their only Final Four appearance ... The UW finished third, losing 79-53 to Kansas in the national semifinal before beating Louisiana State 88-69 in the consolation game ... The third place national finish is the highst in Husky men's basketball history ... Won the PCC Northern Division championship in his first three seasons as head coach, going 77-15 during that span ... Washington changed to the full PCC schedule in 1956 and finished second three of the next four seasons ... Dye is credited with teaching All-America center Bob Houbregs the famous hook shot which historians have called the greatest of all-time ... Dye left Wahington to become the athletic director at the University of Wichita ... Born in Harrisonville, Ohio, Dye graduated from Ohio State after lettering three years in basketball, football and baseball ... He guarterbacked the Buckeyes to one conference title and two secondplace finishes. He coached Brown University to a 14-7 record in 1940 before serving three years in the Navy during World War II. He coached football with the Navy, including a team that included NFL Hall of Fame guarterback Otto Graham. After the war, Dye returned to Ohio State as an assistant football coach and the head basketball coach. He guided the Buckeyes to a 53-34 record from 1947-50, including a 22-4 mark and conference crown in 1950. That 1950 squad played in the NCAA Tournament, losing 56-55 to eventual champion CCNY in the round

The 11th coach in school history... Coached Washington during its first four seasons in the Athletic Association of Western Universities from 1960-63... Led the Huskies to a 57-49 record and a trio of third place conference fin-


ishes his final three seasons ... A native od Stroud, Okla., Grayson graduated from the University of Oklahoma in 1938. After World War II, he obtained his master's degree in physical education at Wayne University in Detroit. His collegiate coaching career began at Nebraska Wesleyan in Lincoln. His 1953 Wesleyan squad posted a 25-3 record and reached the NAIA quarterfinals. He then became an assistant at Oklahoma in 1954 and the took over the head coaching duties at Idaho State in 1957. His three year ISU record of 69-17 included three straight conference titles and NCAA Far West regional appearances.

The 12th coach in school history ... Coached five years, from 1964-68 ... Washington's record improved three straight seasons (1965-67) ... Posted a career record of 53-74 ... Assisted his predecessor John Grayson for three

years (1961-63) ... Born in Breckenridge, Texas, Duckworth was raised in Arkansas. He was an allstate player at Van Buren (Ark.) High School before spending two years in the Navy. He was player-coach at the U.S. Naval Base in Washington, D.C. and was named to the Navy Olympic allstar team. In 1948 he enrolled at Arkansas where he played freshman basketball. Duckworth transferred to Tulsa where an automobile accident curtailed his basketball career and moved him into an assistant coaching role. He graduated from Tulsa in 1951 and received a master's of physical education in 1956 from Oklahoma State.

16th year as an NBA assistant, Winter had been a coach at the NCAA Division I or professional level for 54 years. That is the longest tenure of any active coach in college or professional basketball ... After a stellar playing career at USC, Winter joined the Kansas State staff as an assistant (1947-51) before being named head coach at Marquette in 1952 at the age of 28. Winter returned to Kansas State as head coach from 1954-68 before taking over at Washington. At Kansas State, Winter compiled a 262-117 record while guiding the Wildcats to eight conference titles in 15 seasons. In 1959, he coach KSU to a perfect 14-0 Big Eight record and a 25-2 overall mark ... He was named head coach of the NBA's San Diego Rockets in 1971 and resigned in 1972 to return to the collegiate ranks at Northwestern (1974-78) and Long Beach State (1979-83) . . . Winter ranks No. 64 among all-time NCAA coached with 454 career victories ... He joined the Chicago Bulls coaching staff as an assistant in 1985 and worked until 1999 ... Winter re-joined Head Coach Phil Jackson as an assistant with the Los Angeles Lakers for the 1999-2000 season and helped the Lakers to 2000, 2001 and 2002 NBA championships ... Winter is credited with introducing the triangle offense that helped the Bulls win six NBA titles.



The 14th coach in school history ... Compiled 246 wins in his 14 years at Washington, placing second on the school's alltime coaching victories list ... Ended his career with a record of 246-146, a winning percentage of .628 ... Currently ranks No. 15

among all-time NCAA Division I coaches with 654 career victories combined at Washington, Washington State and Pacific Lutheran ... Coached in 1,090 collegiate games, the third-highest total in division I history behind only Dean Smith (1,133) and Henry Iba (1,105) ... Directed the Huskies to four 20-win seasons, with five teams competing in postseason play including three trips to the NCAA tournament ... Garned many honors while at UW including induction into the National Basketball Hall of Fame and a stint as the president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches ... Taught over 500 athletes the game of basketball while coaching at Washington as well as Pacific Lutheran and Washington State ... Concluded his Washington career with backto-back Pac-10 championships in 1984 and 1985 ... Harshman attended Lake Stevens (Wash.) High School. He attended college at Pacific Lutheran in Tacoma, Wash. where he was a twotime All-America basketball selection. Nickname Origin—Huskies

Washington's teams were called "Sundodgers" before the 1920s, originating when a college magazine of the same name was banned from campus and in protest, students adopted the name. But "Sundodgers" didn't help the Northwest's rain-soaked image, so a committee set out to pick a new name.

The decision came down to "Malamutes" and "Huskies." The committee felt those were appropriate because of Seattle's proximity to the Alaskan frontier. "Huskies" was voted the most appropriate during the 1921 vote.

The current mascot, Spirit, is the 10th Alaskan Malamute to have served as Husky mascot.



The 16th coach in school history and the only Washington coach who also played basketball for the Huskies ... Four-year UW coach from 1990-1993 ... Led the Huskies to a 50-62 record during his tenure ... His 50 wins rank

ninth on Wahsington's all-time career win list ... Arrived at Washington after leading Saint Mary's (Calif.) to the West Coast Athletic Conference title and a berth in the 1989 NCAA Tournament ... Currently coaching at Southwest Baptist, a division II school in Bolivar, Missouri ... Nance attended Southwest Junior College in Bolivar, Mo. before transferring to Washington where he played in 1964 and 1965. He led the 1965 Husky squad in scoring (17.5) and rebounds (9.4) and was an honorable mention All-American. Nance served as an assistant coach at Washington (1967-70) under Mac Duckworth, his college coach, and Tex Winter. He later worked on Joe B. Hall's Kentucky staff (1974-76) as an assistant. Nance posted a 44-64 record as head coach at lowa State (1977-80) and a 114-35 mark at Central Missouri State (1981-85) where his team

won the 1984 NCAA Division II title. He became an assistant on the Fresno State staff in 1986 before beginning a three-year head coaching run at Saint Mary's (Calif.) between 1987-89. His Gael squads amassed a 61-27 record, capped by the school's finest campaign. The 1989 Saint Mary's team had a 25-5 record and earned an NCAA Tournament berth. Outside the basketball arena, Nance was also employed as an assistant Director of the Enforcement and Interpretations program for the NCAA and was a special agent with the FBI.

The 17th coach in school history ... In nine years as Husky head coach, Bender compiled a 116-142 record and led the team to four postseason appearances ... His 116 victories are the fourth-highest total in UW history ... Improved Washington win

total over four consecutive seasons (1994-98) ... That streak included a 20-10 record and NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance in 1998 ... Also led team to NCAA Tournament the following season, finishing with a 17-12 record in 1999 ... Voted Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1996 ... Coached at Illinois State prior to Washington, posting a 60-57 over four seasons ... Earned Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1992 ... Served as an assistant coach at Duke under coach Mike Kryzewski for six seasons in which the Blue Devils went to consecutive NCAA Tournaments ... Participated in 13 NCAA Tournaments, as a player (4), assistant coach (6) and head coach (3) ... As a player, averaged 23.0 points per game as a senior and was honored as a 1975 prep All-American and the Chicago Sun-Times Player of the Year ... Enrolled at Indiana University and was a member of the Hoosiers' 1976 championship team, the last NCAA squad to finish with an undefeated record (32-0) ... Transferred to Duke after his freshman year ... His 1978 Duke team was the national runner-up, making him the only player in NCAA history to play for two different teams in the national championship game ... After his junior season in 1979, Bender was selected by the San Diego Clippers in the sixth round of the NBA draft but did not sign in order to play his senior season ... He graduated from Duke in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in history ... Bender played during the preseason with the San Diego Clippers of the NBA ... Worked briefly at Duke as an assistant director of funding before moving into coaching ... Currently serving as an assistant coach with the Philadelphia 76ers of the NBA, a post he started in July of 2002.
