Washington travels by commercial aircraft on all road trips except the Oregon and Washington State trips on which the Huskies travel by bus. Flight information is available prior to each travel week.

Media accompanying the team should make their own travel plans. Washington travel coordinator Mary Ryles (206) 685-0100 reserves a few extra rooms at each team hotel. Media should call each hotel directly and mention that they cover Washington basketball.

Media should contact Dan Lapse of the UW Media Relations office in advance of road trips concerning game credentials, parking passes and interview requests. Washington players and coaches are sometimes available by request at hotels and sometimes briefly before or after practice, subject to travel itineraries.

Washington's locker room opens up approximately 15 minutes after the game on the road if the visiting locker room area is large enough to accommodate the press. If the locker room facility is too small, other arrangements will be made and announced prior to the game.

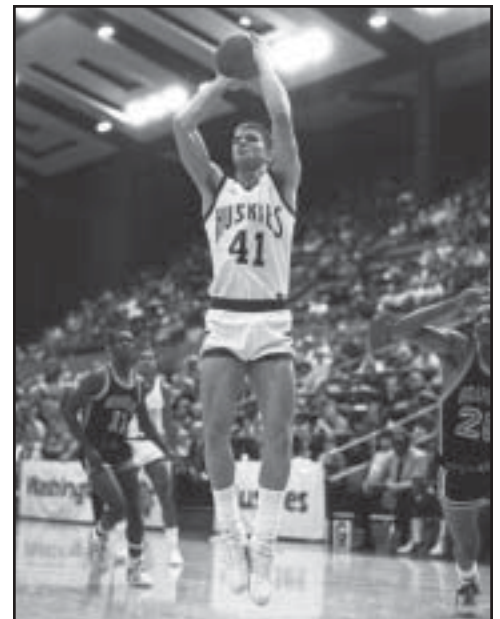
