

Pure point guard who will make his Husky game debut next fall as a red-shirt sophomore during the 2005-06 season ... Transferred to UW after one season at the University of Florida ... Will practice with the team, but won't participate in games due to NCAA transfer regulations ... One of the top-rated point guard prospects in the nation coming out of high school ... Admittedly is obsessed with "Pistol" Pete Maravich, constantly watching videos on the ball-handling and passing skills of the NCAA's all-time leading scorer.

University of Florida

2003-04 (Freshman) — Started the Gator's two exhibition games and the season opener against Montana State...Had 10 assists and just four turnovers in the two exhibition games, playing 26 minutes against EA Sports and 27 against Team Nike, starting both games ... Recorded 27 assists to 22 turnovers on the year, seeing time in 23 games ... Played in the final 11 games of the season, picking up an expanded role with the departure of Christian Drejer... Recorded six assists and grabbed five rebounds in first game playing in a Gator uniform against Montana State... In that same contest was perfect from the field (2-for-2), finishing with six points in a season-high 19 minutes of action ... Posted career-highs in steals (2) and blocked shots (1) against then-No. 3 Arizona in the MassMutual Classic ... Scored two points and grabbed two rebounds in eight minutes of action against Vanderbilt ... Three points on 1-of-2 shooting from behind the arc and recorded an assist in 11 minutes of play vs. Ole Miss ... Scored five points and recorded one assist in six minutes of playing time against Kentucky in the SEC Championship game ... He can handle the ball and shoot the basketball. He's played a year at the Division I level. He'll sit out this year and come in and be able to compete for a starting position at the point guard next year. It will be a win-win situation because he will be on the scout team every day. He's going to go up against Nate and Will every day. Those guys are going to have to play every day because he's a good basketball player. It's a great opportunity for Ryan and a big plus for our program for a number of reasons next year."



Walk-on from outstanding high school program whose outside shooting ability could earn him playing time ... Father, Bob Burmeister, lettered in 1969 and 1970 as a defensive back on the Husky football team. **2003-04 (Freshman)** — Played seven games, including four Pac-10 contests ... Saw game action against conference foes USC (Jan. 8), Arizona State (Feb. 28), California (Mar. 4) and Stanford (Mar. 6) ... Hit 4-of-8 shots from the field ... Made two 3-pointers against Columbia (Dec. 30) ... Helped the Huskies to a 19-12 record and their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1999 ... The 12-6 Pac-10 record and second-place conference finish were UW's best since 1986.

Mercer Island High School

Averaged 14.7 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game as a senior in 2003, helping the team to a third-place finish in the KingCo 3A tournament ... The Islanders lost in the semifinals to the eventual state champion Rainier Beach ... Named to the 2002 and 2003 Class 3A all-state tournament teams ... Amassed 466 points his junior year to lead the KingCo Conference ... Named to the *King County Journal*'s All-Eastside team in 2002 and 2003 ... 

Three-year letterman ... Emerged as a quality playmaker and dangerous scoring threat ... He had 142 assists last season and 108 in 2003 to become the sixth Husky to post back-to-back 100-assist seasons, the first since Jaime Booker in 1996 and 1997 ... Turned down numerous scholarship offers in order to walk on at Washington in the fall of 2001 ... One of three players from Seattle's Garfield High School on the Husky roster. 2003-04 (Junior) — Played all 31 games, starting 25 of them ... One of five Huskies to average double figures with a 12.3-point scoring average ... That figure ranked third on the team ... Distributed 142 assists, the secondhighest single-season total in UW history ... His average of 4.6 assists per game ranked fifth among Pac-10 players ... Registered the 23rd 100-assist season in Husky history ... His assist/turnover ratio of 1.78 (139 assists/78 turnovers) was the eighth best among Pac-10 players ... Had 16 games with five or more assists ... Dished out a career-high nine assists against Arizona in the Pac-10 Tournament (Mar. 12) ... Amassed a season-high 29 points against UCLA (Jan. 10) ... Posted double-figure points on 20 occasions, including three 20-point outings ... Helped the Huskies to a 19-12 record and their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1999 ... The 12-6 Pac-10 record and second-place conference finish were UW's best since 1986. 2002-03 (Sophomore) — Registered the most dramatic scoring increase among Pac-10 players, improving his freshman point production (2.5) by over 10 points per game ... His 12.7 point scoring average ranked second on the team and 21st among conference scorers ... Topped the 20-point plateau twice ... Tallied a career-high 32 points at Gonzaga (Dec. 2), including a late 3-pointer that forced overtime ... Paced all UW scorers eight times and was the top assist man during 20 games ... Led the team with 108 assists, becoming the 22nd Husky to post a 100assist campaign ... Ranked fifth among Pac-10 playmakers with 4.0 assists per game ... Led the Huskies with 33 steals. 2001-02 (Freshman) — Turned down scholarship offers in order to walk on at Washington, but then was awarded a scholarship when one became available on the first day of classes for the fall quarter ... Played all 29 games and drew the starting point guard assignment for the final seven games of the season ... Distributed a season-best eight assists at Arizona (Feb. 7) ... Tallied a seasonhigh nine points at Oregon (Feb. 23) ... Ranked third on the team with 46 assists, the seventh-highest single-season total for a Husky freshman ... Led the team with six rebounds against Santa Clara (Nov. 24) ... Voted the team's Defensive Player of the Year.

Garfield High School

Four-year letterman at Seattle's Garfield High School which compiled a 100-15 record during his prep career ... The Bulldogs won the league championship all four seasons ... Served as team captain his final two years ... Averaged 14.5 points, 3.6 assists and 2.0 steals per game in 2001 ... A first team All-KingCo Conference selection in 2001 ... The runner-up in the 2001 KingCo MVP voting ... Garfield finished with a 27-2 record in 2001 and was ranked No. 1 in the state for most of the season on the strength of a 23-game winning streak before an 85-82 double-overtime loss to Foss in the first round of the state tournament ... The Bulldogs won their final three games to earn a fifth-place state finish ... Attended the Nike Camp in Indianapolis and was named a top-10 point guard ... Selected to play in the all-star game at the West Coast All-Star Camp in California ... Averaged 12 points as a junior, helping Garfield to a 28-2 record and a third-place state finish ... Had a nine-point scoring average as a sophomore while the team finished seventh in the state playoffs with an 18-9 record ... Garfield recorded a 27-2 record and won the state championship during his freshman season in which Conroy averaged six points per game ... The premier prep point guard in Washington state in 2001 ... Rated the No. 15 point guard in the West by *Pac-West Hoops* ... Scored a team-high 24 points in the 2001 Northwest Shootout which the Washington state All-Stars lost 87-78 to Oregon on March 23 in Portland ... Also recruited by Boston College, Providence, Pittsburgh, Eastern Washington and Portland.

Coach Romar on Will Conroy

"Will is a warrior. He's taken and made many big shots over his career. He's had big games on the road. Soft-minded guys don't have big games on the road. Mentally tough kids play well on the road. He's had good road games. He has gotten better at distributing the ball over the last couple years. It's always been his goal to lead the Pac-10 in assists. Maybe this is the year that he can accomplish that."
