

Two-year letterman ... Brings a tremendous all-around game as an excellent defender and rebounder ... Coach Lorenzo Romar's first recruit at Washington ... Signed a letter of intent on May 6, 2002 ... Former prep teammate at Dominguez (Calif.) High School of Tyson Chandler, the No. 2 selection in the 2001 NBA Draft. **2003-04 (Sophomore)** — Played all 31 games, starting 25 of them ... One of five Huskies to average double figures with an 11.2-point scoring average ... Scored a career-high 22 points on 10-of-13 shooting in UW's 77-72 loss at 13th-ranked North Carolina State (Feb. 22) ... Registered two double-doubles ... Tallied 11 points and 10 rebounds at Houston (Dec. 20) ... Had 14 points and 12 rebounds against USC (Jan. 8) ... Helped the Huskies to a 19-12 record and their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1999 ... The 12-6 Pac-10 record and second-place conference finish were UW's best since 1986. **2002-03 (Freshman)** — Played all 27 games, starting the final 15 outings of the season ... Registered a double-double against second-ranked Arizona (Feb. 6) with 10 points and 11 rebounds ... Scored the game-winning basket at home against USC (Jan. 4) on a rebound and put-back with 0:03 remaining ... Registered double-figure points on five occasions ... Led all UW rebounders seven times ... Ranked second on the team with 4.1 rebounds per game, the leading average among returning UW players ... Blocked 12 shots, tying him for ninth among all-time Husky freshmen.

Long Beach Poly High School

Averaged 19 points and nine rebounds per game as a senior in 2002, helping the Jackrabbits to a 30-4 record ... Poly finished as the Southern California Regional runner-up to eventual state champion Westchester ... Named to the 10-man California all-state team selected by *Cal-Hi Sports* ... Rated the No. 10 prep small forward in the West by *Prep West Hoops* ... A top-100 national prospect and one of the top 25 players on the west coast according to several recruiting services ... Ranked No. 96 in the *Student Sports* Hot 100 and No. 100 by *Hoop Scoop* ... Attended Dominguez High School in Compton, Calif. the previous three years where he played alongside Tyson Chandler who was the second selection in the 2001 NBA Draft ... As a junior in 2001, averaged 16 points, five

rebounds, three assists and three steals, helping Dominguez to a 31-4 record and its third consecutive division II state championship. Dominguez also won the title in 1999 and the 2000 state championship squad was ranked No. 1 nationally in *USA Today*.

Coach Romar on Bobby Jones

"With the way we have played he has probably played out of position. He's done a remarkable job and proved to be a matchup problem for opponents because of his speed and quickness. I think he's one of the best defensive players in the country. He's very, very versatile. You can't leave Bobby Jones on the bench very long. He needs to find a way to avoid foul trouble because it hurts us when he is not in the game. He is the model of the type of player that we want here at the University of Washington in terms of his unselfish team attitude, mental toughness and his academic standing."

Wooden Award candidate ... Two-year letterman guard who led Washington in scoring during each of his first two seasons ... Garnered first-team All-Pac-10 acclaim in 2004 ... Registered 38 career double-figure scoring games ... Possesses phenomenal leaping ability ... Originally enrolled at Washington on a football scholarship, but is now on a basketball scholarship after deciding prior to the 2003-04 season to concentrate on the hardwood full-time ... Played all 13 football games in 2002 and started the final six games as a cornerback on the Husky football squad, including the Sun Bowl ... Intercepted two passes and made 34 tackles ... Father Jacque Robinson played tailback for the Washington football team between 1981-84 and amassed 2,300 career yards to ranks No. 8 among all-time Huskies ... Jacque is the only college player ever to earn MVP honors in both the Rose Bowl (1982) and Orange Bowl (1985). 2003-04 (Sophomore) — Played all 31 games, starting 21 of them ... A first-team All-Pac-10 Conference selection ... One of five Huskies to average double figures with a 13.2-point scoring average ... Led the team and ranked 13th among Pac-10 scorers with 13.2 points per game ... Tallied double-figure points 21 times and led all Husky scorers on seven occasions ... Topped all UW rebounders four times ... His team-leading 53 steals were the third-highest total among conference players ... Also led UW in free throw accuracy, hitting them at an 85.3-percent clip (87-102) that ranked third in the Pac-10 ... Voted the Feb. 2 Pac-10 Player of the Week after leading UW to a home sweep of the Arizona schools ... Tallied a career-high 31 points on 11-of-15 shooting and added five rebounds and five steals during the Huskies' 96-83 win over No. 9 Arizona (Jan. 29) ... Scored 23 of his 25 points after halftime at Oregon State (Jan. 17), including a 3-pointer inside the final second that forced overtime in UW's 103-99 win ... Robinson's heroics at Oregon State rallied UW from a 16-point second-half deficit to post the pivotal victory that stopped a five-game losing streak and started a run of 14 wins in the next 16 games ... Helped the Huskies to a 19-12 record and their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1999 ... The 12-6 Pac-10 record and second-place conference finish were UW's best since 1986 ... Topped the Huskies with 27 points, on 9-of-15 shooting, in their 102-100 first-round NCAA loss to UAB (Mar. 19). 2002-03 (Freshman) — Named to the CollegeInsider.com's 20-player National All-Freshmen Team ... Honored as a member of the All-Pac-10 Freshman Team ... Played 23 games, starting the final 10 ... Joined the team after the football regular season, participating in his first practice Nov. 26 ... Led the team in scoring average with 13.0 points per game, a figure that ranked 17th among Pac-10 players ... His 300 points tied for fourth among all-time UW freshmen ... Had 19 points, six rebounds, four assists and two steals in his second collegiate game, at Santa Clara (Dec. 7) ... Tallied double-figure points 17 times and led all UW scorers on 11 occasions ... Top scoring effort was a 20-point performance against Arizona State (Feb. 8) ... Tallied eight points and played 23 minutes against UCLA (Jan. 2), two days after his appearance in the Sun Bowl ... Ranked second on the team with 52 assists.
