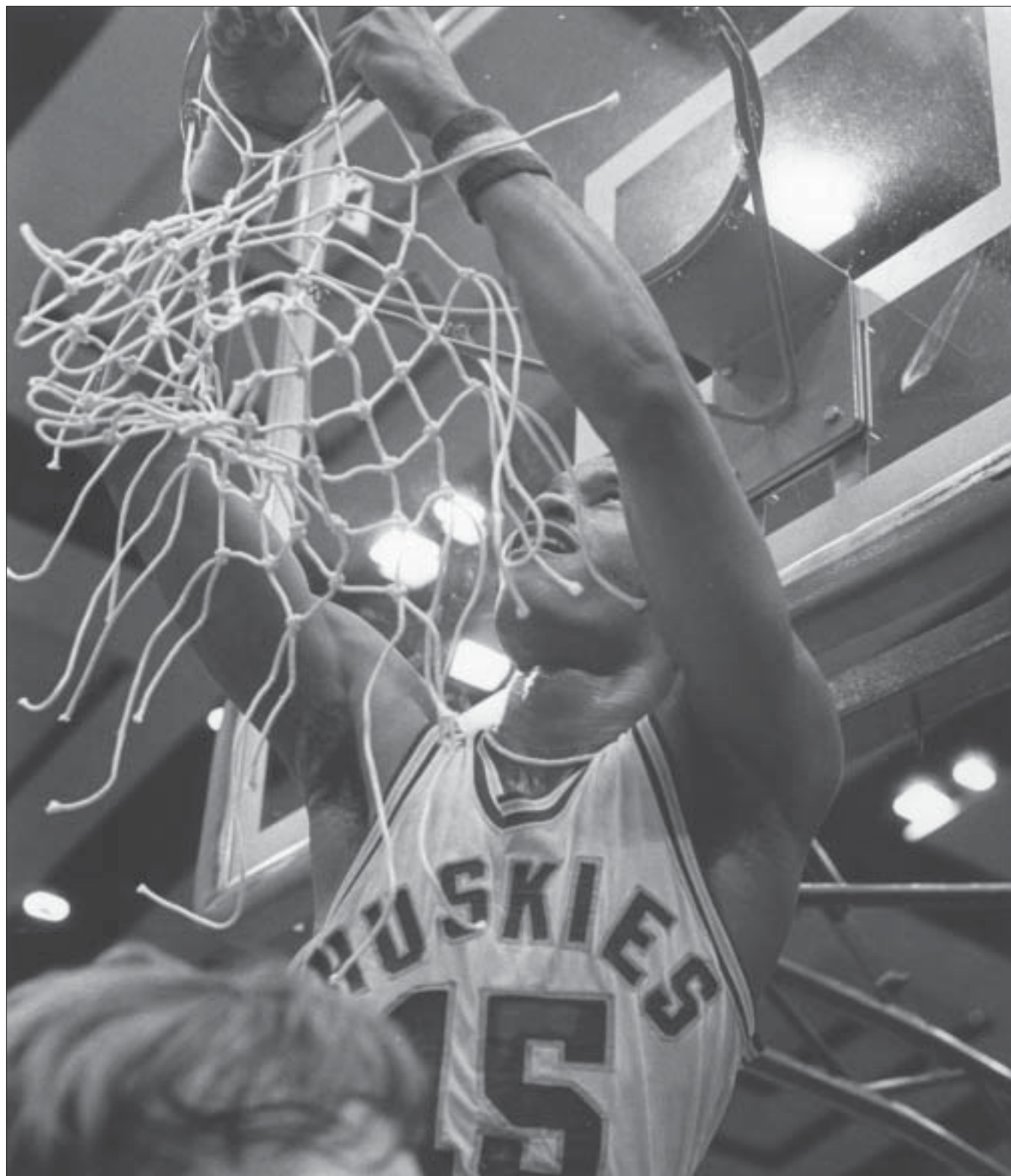

Listed below the year, in **boldface** type, are the head coach's name with the season's overall and conference records listed in parentheses. The left column lists the date of game when available. The third column lists "W" for wins and "L" for losses. The fourth column lists the score with Washington's total listed first. All opponents are listed by current name — i.e., formerly Ellensburg Normal, now Central Washington; formerly Texas Western, now UTEP; etc. Beginning with the 1952–53 season, the NCAA has allowed only games between four-year colleges to be recognized in team and individual statistics. All other games are considered exhibitions, and are so indicated. Prior to 1952–53, competition against four-year colleges and athletic club, all-star, military, high school, YMCA and AAU teams, was recognized by the NCAA.

The third coach in school history ... Led Washington in it's first two seasons in the Northwest Intercollegiate Conference in 1912 and 1913 ... Posted a 26-10 career record ... His winning percentage of 72.2% is the fourth-best among all-time Washington coaches.

Anthony Savage

The fourth coach in school history and one of three individuals to coach both the UW basketball and football teams ... Led Washington to Northwest Intercollegiate Conference championships during both of his seasons as head coach, in 1914 and 1915 ... Compiled a 29-4 career record in his two seasons ... His winning percentage of 87.9% is the second-best among all-time Washington coaches ... Became the football coach at Lincoln High School in Seattle and took over the Washington football squad in 1918 while Claude Hunt was off fighting World War I. Led the UW gridders to a 1-1 record.

Claude J. Hunt

The sixth coach in school history and one of three individuals to serve as head coach of the football and basketball teams at Washington . . . Coached the basketball team in 1918 and 1919, after returning from active duty in World War I . . . Led the team to a fourth-place conference finish in 1919 . . . Hunt graduated from DePauw University in 1911. He was hired as head Washington football coach in 1917 after guiding Carleton (Minn.) College to consecutive undefeated seasons. His UW gridders were 1-2-1 in 1917 and 5-1-0 in 1919.

Leonard B. "Stub" Allison

The seventh coach in UW history . . . One of three individuals to coach both the UW basketball and football teams . . . Coached basketball one season, in 1920 and tied for fourth in PCC play . . . Allison's squad was the last at Washington to be nicknamed "SunDodgers" . . . Graduated from Carleton (Minn.) College and became an assistant football coach at Washington in 1919. He was the head football coach in 1920, guiding the team to a 1-5 record. Allison coached the last UW football game at Denny Field on Nov. 5, 1920 which ended in a 3-0 loss to Stanford . . . He later coached football at California (1935-44) and led the Bears to a 10-0-1 mark, a No. 2 ranking in the A.P. poll and a 13-0 win over Alabama in the 1938 Rose Bowl.

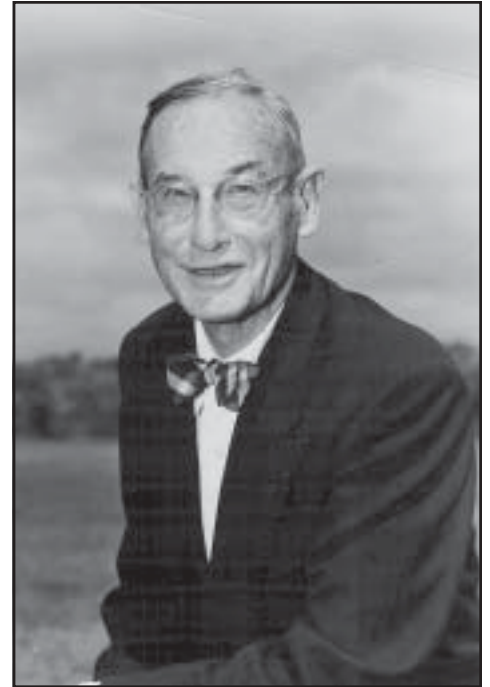

Fast Fact

Washington's school colors, Purple and Gold, were adopted in 1892 by a vote of a student assembly on the original downtown Seattle campus. One patriotic group favored Red, White and Blue as the University's colors, reasoning that "since the school was named after the father of our country, our national colors should be the school's colors." The opposing faction argued that national colors should not be degraded for such everyday use. The debate was ended when a young English instructor, Miss Frazier, stood and read the following excerpt from Lord Byron's "Destruction of Sennacherib."

*"The Assyrian came down like the wolf
on the fold,
And his cohorts were gleaming in purple
and gold;
And the sheen of their spears was like
stars on the sea,
And the blue wave rolls nightly on deep
Galilee."*

Clarence "Hec" Edmundson



The eighth basketball coach in school history ... Coached the UW basketball team for 27 years (1921-47) and the track & field team for 36 years (1919-55) ... Started as track coach and football trainer in 1919, retired in 1955 after 36 years as track coach and 27 as head basketball coach ... Compiled a 488-195 record making him the winningest coach in UW men's basketball history, third among all-time Pac-10 coaches ... Coached the Huskies to 11 of their 21 20-win seasons ... Coached for 25 years in the PCC Northern Division finishing first 12 times and second six times ... His UW track teams won eight Northern Division titles and three PCC crowns ... Including a four-year stint at Idaho (1917-21), Edmundson racked up a 508-204 career record. His winning percentage of 71.4% ranks No. 38 among all-time NCAA coaches.

Born during 1887 in Moscow, Idaho, Edmundson graduated from the University of Idaho where he competed in track. He placed sixth in the 800 meters at the 1912 Olympics in Stockholm, Sweden. He became the head track & field coach at Texas A&M in 1913 before returning to Idaho to coach track and basketball. In 1919, Edmundson's long association with Washington began. He helped dedicate the multi-purpose structure, then called Washington pavilion, with a 34-23 win over Illinois on Dec. 27, 1927.

On Jan. 16, 1948, the year after he stepped down as basketball coach, that same Pavilion was renamed in his honor. He remained as track coach until his retirement in 1955. A tremendous innovator, Edmundson tapped into his track background and became an originator of the fast break style of basketball. He co-founded, along with Tubby Graves, the Washington state high school basketball tournament. At Edmundson's request the 1922 UW team began forming a circle with their hands together in the center to symbolize unity. The handshake quickly spread throughout the country and is still practiced today. Although he denied being the inventor, Edmundson's teams implemented the one-handed jump shot long before Stanford's Hank Luisetti made it famous.

Art McLarney

The ninth coach in school history ... Replaced legendary Hec Edmundson who led the Huskies the preceding 27 years ... Coached three seasons, from 1948 to 1950, posting a fine 53-36 record ... Washington won the 1948 Pacific Coast Conference Northern Division title during his inaugural season ... The UW came within one game of the 1948 Final Four, but lost 64-62 on a last-second shot by Baylor ... McLarney was a two-time all-coast guard at Washington State where he was also an All-America shortstop on the baseball team. After college, he was signed by New York Giants manager John McGraw and played at the Polo Grounds alongside Mel Ott, Bill Terry and Carl Hubbell in 1932-33. He then coached at Burlington (Wash.) High School and Seattle-area high schools Cleveland and Roosevelt ... McLarney came to Washington as baseball and assistant basketball coach in 1946. He took over the basketball coaching reins in 1948.

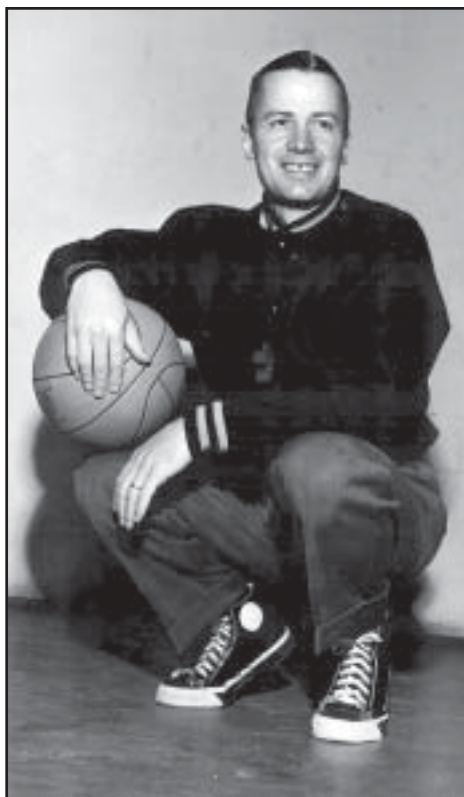

The 10th coach in school history ... Coached nine seasons at Washington, from 1951-1959 ... Compiled a 156-91 UW record ... His 156 career victories place him third on Washington's all-time list ... Guided the Huskies to their only Final Four appearance ... The UW finished third, losing 79-53 to Kansas in the national semifinal before beating Louisiana State 88-69 in the consolation game ... The third place national finish is the highest in Husky men's basketball history ... Won the PCC Northern Division championship in his first three seasons as head coach, going 77-15 during that span ... Washington changed to the full PCC schedule in 1956 and finished second three of the next four seasons ... Dye is credited with teaching All-America center Bob Houbregs the famous hook shot which historians have called the greatest of all-time ... Dye left Washington to become the athletic director at the University of Wichita ... Born in Harrisonville, Ohio, Dye graduated from Ohio State after lettering three years in basketball, football and baseball ... He quarterbacked the Buckeyes to one conference title and two second-place finishes. He coached Brown University to a 14-7 record in 1940 before serving three years in the Navy during World War II. He coached football with the Navy, including a team that included NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Otto Graham. After the war, Dye returned to Ohio State as an assistant football coach and the head basketball coach. He guided the Buckeyes to a 53-34 record from 1947-50, including a 22-4 mark and conference crown in 1950. That 1950 squad played in the NCAA Tournament, losing 56-55 to eventual champion CCNY in the round of 16.

The 13th coach in school history ... As Husky head coach for three seasons, from 1969-71, Winter compiled a 45-35 career mark ... Washington was .500 or better during each of his three seasons ... Through last season, his 16th year as

an NBA assistant, Winter had been a coach at the NCAA Division I or professional level for 55 years. That is the longest tenure of any active coach in college or professional basketball ... After a stellar playing career at USC, Winter joined the Kansas State staff as an assistant (1947-51) before being named head coach at Marquette in 1952 at the age of 28. Winter returned to Kansas State as head coach from 1954-68 before taking over at Washington. At Kansas State, Winter compiled a 262-117 record while guiding the Wildcats to eight conference titles in 15 seasons. In 1959, he coach KSU to a perfect 14-0 Big Eight record and a 25-2 overall mark ... He was named head coach of the NBA's San Diego Rockets in 1971 and resigned in 1972 to return to the collegiate ranks at Northwestern (1974-78) and Long Beach State (1979-83) ... Winter ranks No. 64 among all-time NCAA coached with 454 career victories ... He joined the Chicago Bulls coaching staff as an assistant in 1985 and worked until 1999 ... Winter re-joined Head Coach Phil Jackson as an assistant with the Los Angeles Lakers for the 1999-2000 season and helped the Lakers to 2000, 2001 and 2002 NBA championships ... Winter is credited with introducing the triangle offense that helped the Bulls win six NBA titles.

The 14th coach in school history ... Compiled 246 wins in his 14 years at Washington, placing second on the school's all-time coaching victories list ... Ended his career with a record of 246-146, a winning percentage of .628 ...

Currently ranks No. 15 among all-time NCAA Division I coaches with 654 career victories combined at Washington, Washington State and Pacific Lutheran ... Coached in 1,090 collegiate games, the third-highest total in division I history behind only Dean Smith (1,133) and Henry Iba (1,105) ... Directed the Huskies to four 20-win seasons, with five teams competing in postseason play including three trips to the NCAA tournament ... Gained many honors while at UW including induction into the National Basketball Hall of Fame and a stint as the president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches ... Taught over 500 athletes the game of basketball while coaching at Washington as well as Pacific Lutheran and Washington State ... Concluded his Washington career with back-to-back Pac-10 championships in 1984 and 1985 ... Harshman attended Lake Stevens (Wash.) High School. Washington's all-time career win list ... Arrived at Washington after leading Saint Mary's (Calif.) to the West Coast Athletic Conference title and a berth in the 1989 NCAA Tournament ... Currently coaching at Southwest Baptist, a division II school in Bolivar, Missouri ... Nance attended Southwest Junior College in Bolivar, Mo. before transferring to Washington where he played in 1964 and 1965. He led the 1965 Husky squad in scoring (17.5) and rebounds (9.4) and was an honorable mention All-American. Nance served as an assistant coach at Washington (1967-70) under Mac Duckworth, his college coach, and Tex Winter. He later worked on Joe B. Hall's Kentucky staff (1974-76) as an assistant. Nance posted a 44-64 record as head coach at Iowa State (1977-80) and a 114-35 mark at Central Missouri State (1981-85) where his team won the 1984 NCAA Division II title. He became an assistant on the Fresno State staff in 1986 before beginning a three-year head coaching run at Saint Mary's (Calif.) between 1987-89. His Gael squads amassed a 61-27 record, capped by the school's finest campaign. The 1989 Saint Mary's team had a 25-5 record and earned an NCAA Tournament berth. Outside the basketball arena, Nance was also employed as an assistant Director of the Enforcement and Interpretations program for the NCAA and was a special agent with the FBI.

Bob Bender

The 17th coach in school history ... In nine years as Husky head coach, Bender compiled a 116-142 record and led the team to four postseason appearances ... His 116 victories are the fourth-highest total in UW history ... Improved Washington win total over four consecutive seasons (1994-98) ... That streak included a 20-10 record and NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance in 1998 ... Also led team to NCAA Tournament the following season, finishing with a 17-12 record in 1999 ... Voted Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1996 ... Coached at Illinois State prior to Washington, posting a 60-57 over four seasons ... Earned Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1992 ... Served as an assistant coach at Duke under coach Mike Krzyzewski for six seasons in which the Blue Devils went to consecutive NCAA Tournaments ... Participated in 13 NCAA Tournaments, as a player (4), assistant coach (6) and head coach (3) ... As a player, averaged 23.0 points per game as a senior and was honored as a 1975 prep All-American and the Chicago Sun-Times Player of the Year ... Enrolled at Indiana University and was a member of the Hoosiers' 1976 championship team, the last NCAA squad to finish with an undefeated record (32-0) ... Transferred to Duke after his freshman year ... His 1978 Duke team was the national runner-up, making him the only player in NCAA history to play for two different teams in the national championship game ... After his junior season in 1979, Bender was selected by the San Diego Clippers in the sixth round of the NBA draft but did not sign in order to play his senior season ... He graduated from Duke in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in history ... Bender played during the preseason with the San Diego Clippers of the NBA ... Worked briefly at Duke as an assistant director of funding before moving into coaching ... Currently serving as an assistant coach with the Atlanta Hawks of the NBA after working two years on the Philadelphia 76ers' coaching staff from 2002-2004.
