SEATTLE -- Brook Lopez scored a career-high 31 points as 14th-ranked Stanford defeated Washington 65-51 for its first win at Bank of America Arena since 2001. Lopez hit 11-of-17 shots and grabbed 13 rebounds for the Cardinal, which limited UW to 29-percent shooting (15-of-52). The Huskies suffered their first double-digit home loss since Dec. 3, 2003. They missed all seven second-half 3-point attempts, making just 3-of-12 for the game. UW led briefly at 5-2 on a Jon Brockman basket and Ryan Appleby trey 1:07 into the game. Stanford responded with an 11-2 run, capped by three consecutive Lopez baskets. The Cardinal lead was 33-22 at halftime and increased to as many as 21 points during the second half. UW never drew closer than 12 points after that. Stanford did not have any other double-figure scorers, but Seattle native Mitch Johnson chipped in eight points, seven rebounds and six assists. Quincy Pondexter, a prep teammate of Lopez at Fresno's San Joaquin Memorial, led the Huskies with 15 points and Brockman added 13 points and 13 rebounds.

SEATTLE -- James Harden scored 25 points, helping Arizona State stop an 11-game series losing streak against Washington with a 77-63 win at Bank of America Arena. The Sun Devils (17-9, 7-7) defeated UW for the first time since 2004. ASU outscored the Huskies (15-13, 6-9) by 27 points from 3-point range, shooting 13-of-25 beyond the arc to just 4-of-21 for UW.
