The 17th-ranked Washington Huskies opened the season with a 28-9 defeat at the hands of the defending national champions, the second-ranked Ohio State Buckeyes.

Playing in front of a crowd of 105,078 in the sixth night game ever at Ohio Stadium, Washington's high-powered offense was stifled by the Buckeye defense. The Ohio State defensive line gave Cody Pickett no time to throw and held the Huskies to seven yards rushing.

With running back Rich Alexis bottled up by Ohio State's line, Washington's air-attack duo of Pickett and receiver Reggie Williams generated little offense. The Huskies were held to 147 yards through three quarters and didn't score a touchdown until Pickett's 2-yard run with 3:27 remaining.

Williams got most of his 10 catches on short passes in the slot. Pickett finished 26-for-49 for 255 yards.

Buckeye quarterback Craig Krenzel threw 18 times in the first half as Ohio State took a 21-0 lead.

On Ohio State's second drive, Krenzel hit Drew

Carter on a 37-yard pass to set up Maurice Hall's 2-yard score. Krenzel completed three straight passes for 37 yards on the next drive before scampering for a 23-yard score that made it 14-0.

After punter B.J. Sander pinned Washington on its own one late in the second quarter, the Buckeyes defense forced a punt. Chris Gamble returned Garth Erickson's 34-yard kick 10 yards to the 25 with 2:07 left.

Krenzel completed a key third-down pass to Santonio Holmes before scampering into the end zone on third-and-10 from the 11 with 11 seconds left in the half. Krenzel finished 15-for-27 for 203 yards and ran for 27 more to improve to 16-1 as a starter.

Washington started the second half with its first sustained drive of the game, using short passes and five-receiver sets to go 47 yards to set up Evan Knudson's 46-yard field goal. It was his career long.

OSU put the game away with a 15-yard run by Lydell Ross, who bulled through Jimmy Newell's attempted tackle on his way into the end zone to make it 28-3.

One week after mustering just seven rushing yards against Ohio State, Washington racked up 195 yards on 52 carries en route to a 38-13 win over the Indiana Hoosiers. But it was the Dawgs vaunted air attack that sparked their third quarter charge, handing Keith Gilbertson his first victory as head coach of the Huskies.

The Hoosiers led 13-10 after Bryan Robertson kicked a 39-yard field goal on the first drive of the second half. Moments later, Cody Pickett threw a 10-yard crossing strike to Reggie Williams that the All-American receiver turned into a 70-yard touchdown reception. It was the seventh time Pickett has thrown a TD pass of at least 70 yards.

Indiana seemed poised to erase the 17-13 deficit when Matt LoVecchio's swing pass was broken up by Greg Carothers. Officials ruled it a lateral and Graham Lasee recovered for Washington. That turnover led to a 24-13 lead when red-shirt freshman Shelton Sampson took a handoff - the first carry of his career -

around the left end and across the goal-line from six yards out. He added a 4-yard scoring run with 1:54 left in the third quarter. Pickett threw a 6-yard TD pass to Williams to make it 38-13 going into the fourth quarter. The 28 point outburst tied a school record for points in a single period, done three times previously.

While Sampson did the scoring, Rich Alexis anchored the running game with 75 yards on 18 carries. Sampson finished with 39 yards on 10 carries. The Huskies' 195 yards on the ground marked their highest total since rushing for 212 against Idaho in 2001.

In the first half the Huskies drove 86 yards on their second drive of the game, scoring on Charles Frederick's touchdown catch. The Hoosiers Chris Taylor answered with a two-yard touchdown that capped off a 76 yard drive. Indiana and Washington then traded field goals, heading into halftime tied at 10.

Pickett completed 18 of 26 passes for 290 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Williams had four catches for 98 yards and two TDs.

The 19th-ranked Huskies survived a sloppy start to the second-half, scoring 28 unanswered points to defeat the Idaho Vandals 45-14.

Things looked promising for the Vandals, who had not defeated the Huskies since 1905, early in the third quarter. With the Huskies up 17-7, Cody Pickett fumbled and Idaho took over at Washington's 18. On the next play, Michael Harrington threw a scoring strike to Jimmy Labita, pulling the Vandals to 17-14. Pickett threw an interception on Washington's next possession, giving Idaho another chance to capitalize. The Husky defense stiffened, however, forcing a punt. From there the Husky ground attack put the game out of reach by scoring four-straight touchdowns.

Rich Alexis led the Huskies with 116 yards rushing and two touchdowns, but it was his blocking that ignited the Dawgs. With the Huskies protecting their three-point margin, Alexis leveled Vandal linebacker Patrick Libey, springing Reggie Williams for 12 yards. The momentum changed instantly, and five play later

Alexis took the ball in from 25 yards out. Zach Tuasosopo quickly added a 12-yard scoring run and Cody Pickett a 9-yarder. Shelton Sampson also scored on a 5-yard TD run with under three minutes to play.

The Huskies were without Reggie Williams for the first half, who was forced to sit out after missing a mandatory team function. Nonetheless, the Huskies got off to an inspired start, leading 7-0 after defensive tackle Terry Johnson recovered a fumble in the end zone four minutes after kickoff. Garth Erickson put the Washington defense in position to strike by pinning the Vandals at their own 1 with a 32-yard punt.

After Zach Gerstner's three-yard touchdown reception tied things up, the Huskies responded with a nine play drive capped off by Alexis' eight-yard scamper with 3:15 left in the first. Evan Knudson added a 37-yard field goal in the second quarter.

Keith Gilbertson earned his second win as Husky head coach, and his first over his former school. He coached the Vandals from 1986-88.

Rich Alexis ran for 128 yards while Cody Pickett threw two touchdown passes to Reggie Williams as No. 18 Washington beat Stanford 28-17 in the Pac-10 opener for both schools.

Stanford had a late chance, taking over at its own 25 and trailing 21-17 with 2:54 remaining. Derrick Johnson sealed Washington's victory by intercepting freshman quarterback Trent Edwards' pass and returning it 36 yards for a touchdown. Jimmy Newell intercepted another pass on Stanford's final series.

Edwards was 16-of-32 for 159 yards with two TDs and two interceptions. He threw a 12-yard scoring pass to tight end Alex Smith for an early 7-0 lead, then found Smith for an 18-yard TD to tie it at 14 early in the second period.

Alexis, who had 116 yards rushing in the previous week's 45-14 win over Idaho, posted consecutive 100-yard games for the first time since 2000. He broke a 53-yard run for a TD late in the first quarter. The Huskies didn't wait long to make it 14-7. After forcing a punt,

Washington needed three plays before Pickett connected with Reggie Williams, and the All-American receiver streaked down the left sideline for a 74-yard TD play.

Stanford led 17-14 midway through the third quarter after Michael Sgroi kicked a 28-yard field goal, but the Huskies answered on the ensuing possession when Pickett threw to Williams on a 6-yard score to cap a 76-yard drive.

Pickett completed 20 of 33 passes for 231 yards, but he fumbled twice. His second came inside the Stanford 20 late in the first half, spoiling a chance for Washington to put up more points before the break. Williams had a big day, catching 10 passes for 138 yards.

The Cardinal defense, which led the nation after allowing only four net yards rushing in two games, faced a bigger challenge. The Huskies had 92 yards rushing by the end of the first quarter, with Alexis running for 91.

The 18th-ranked Washington Huskies scored on their first three possessions and built a 16-7 halftime lead against the UCLA Bruins, but could not hold on, falling 46-16 in the Rose Bowl.

The unranked Bruins outscored Washington 39-0 in the second half and 24-0 in the final quarter. The 39-point outburst was the second most the Huskies have ever allowed in a second half.

Roc Alexander started the second half on the wrong foot, taking the kickoff to his own seven instead of downing the ball in the end zone. UCLA defensive end Dave Ball then knocked the ball out of quarterback Cody Pickett's hand at the goal line as Pickett cocked his arm to throw. Rodney Leisle pounced on it for the touchdown, slicing Washington's lead to 16-14.

Pickett's fumble was one of four second-half turnovers UCLA converted into 25 points.

Manuel White, who had 19 carries for 83 yards, put the Bruins ahead to stay with a 1-yard run.

The Huskies advanced inside the red zone follow-

ing White's go-ahead TD, but Pickett's pass over the middle bounced off the shoulder pads of fullback Zach Tuasosopo and into the arms of Leisle at the UCLA 12.

The Bruins converted the turnover into a 39-yard field goal by Chris Kluwe, and Jarrad Page sealed the victory just eight seconds later by returning an interception 24 yards for a touchdown with 12:05 to play. Quarterback Drew Olson then ran one in from 1 yard out with 3:30 left.

Tyler Ebell and Maurice Drew also had short touchdowns for the Bruins, who beat the Huskies in Los Angeles for the fourth-straight time.

Olson was 16-for-24 for 258 yards. Craig Bragg caught eight passes for 142 yards.

Pickett completed 26 of 42 passes for 281 yards and was intercepted twice. He completed 12 of his first 15 passes - six of them to Reggie Williams, who finished with 10 catches for 105 yards and scored the Huskies only touchdown, in the first quarter. Evan Knudson's kicked three field goals, a season-high.

Andy Heiser threw three touchdown passes, Chris Barry blocked two field-goal attempts and Jorge Cordova had five sacks as the Nevada Wolfpack stunned the Huskies 28-17. It was Washington's first nonconference loss at Husky Stadium since Air Force won 31-21 on Sept. 18, 1999, a 10-game streak.

Washington's problems started with Heiser, who completed 19 of 29 passes for 299 yards and three touchdowns. Maurice Mann caught seven passes for 168 yards, including a 25-yard TD.

Nevada defenders sacked Washington's Cody Pickett eight times, with Cordova doing most of the work while also blocking a field goal and forcing a fumble.

Washington had 19 first downs by halftime but trailed 14-7 after struggling with scoring opportunities for the second-straight game.

Pickett completed 19 of 37 passes for 337 yards but threw three interceptions - one returned 37 yards for a TD by Chris Handy in the first quarter. The loss

also spoiled a 120-yard rushing effort by Rich Alexis.

The Wolfpack led 28-10 late in the third quarter after Heiser's 7-yard TD pass to Talib Wise. That capped a five-play, 93-yard drive that followed an apparent interception by Washington's Jimmy Newell inside Nevada's 30. The Huskies, though, were penalized for defensive holding.

Washington pulled to 28-17 less than a minute later on a 52-yard scoring play from Pickett to Reggie Williams.

The Huskies then forced a punt and took over with 11:05 on the clock. Just as they reached field goal range, Cordova sacked Pickett again to force another fumble that was recovered by Nevada's Logan Carter.

Heiser also threw an 8-yard TD to tight end Anthony Pudewell for a 21-7 lead early in the third quarter.

The Wolfpack had the upset in hand when Marlon McLaughlin intercepted a deep throw by Pickett at midfield with 3:03 to play. McLaughlin held Williams to three catches for 77 yards.

Charles Frederick caught a pair of touchdown passes and returned a punt for another score as Washington upset No. 22 Oregon State 38-17.

Frederick scored on passing plays of 35 and 87 yards, after breaking out with an 86-yard punt return. He finished with nine catches for 216 yards, the third most in school history. His 371 all-purpose yards broke a 53-year old school record held by Hugh McElhenny.

Cody Pickett completed 19 of 40 passes for 285 yards and three scores for the Huskies, who snapped a two-game losing streak.

Oregon State quarterback Derek Anderson was 21-of-48 for 344 yards and a touchdown, but was intercepted three times. OSU tailback Steven Jackson, who went into the game ranked second in the nation with an average of 146.2 yards a game, was held to 49 yards on 22 carries.

The Huskies surprised favored Oregon State by jumping out to an early lead with Frederick's 86-yard punt return. Frederick easily ran past seven Beavers to

make it 7-0 at 8:32 of the first quarter.

Washington extended its lead on tailback Kenny James' 2-yard scoring run early in the second quarter. It was James' first rushing touchdown of the season.

The Beavers narrowed it to 14-7 on Anderson's five-yard keeper, set up by his 30-yard pass to Mike Hass, who reached improbably between two defenders to pull down the ball.

On Washington's next series, Richard Seigler intercepted Pickett and ran back 30 yards, setting up Kirk Yliniemi's 39-yard field goal with 4:11 left in the first half.

Frederick caught a 35-yard touchdown pass from Pickett in the third quarter to make it 21-10. On the next series, Marquis Cooper intercepted Anderson and the Huskies went on to score on Pickett's 1-yard pass to Ben Bandel. Evan Knudson added a 43-yard field goal before Frederick's 87-yard TD reception made it 38-10 in the fourth quarter.

Anderson hit George Gillett with a 29-yard scoring pass for the final margin.

Matt Leinart threw for 351 yards and four touchdowns as No. 5 Southern California beat Washington 43-23 for its first victory at Husky Stadium in 10 years.

Leinart completed 19 of 29 passes without an interception as the Trojans compiled 565 total yards.

Washington quarterback Cody Pickett threw an interception off his back foot with USC's Kenechi Udeze in his face. Ronald Nunn picked it off and returned the ball 57 yards for a TD in the first period.

The Huskies missed receiver Charles Frederick, who sprained his left shoulder in the first quarter, and tailback Rich Alexis, who sat out after bruising his thigh the previous week at Oregon State.

The Trojans led 20-7 early in the second period after a 21-yard TD run by LenDale White, but missed a chance to extend it when Ryan Killeen's extra point attempt was blocked. He also missed two field goals in the half, including a 20-yarder.

The Huskies answered White's touchdown with an 80-yard scoring drive to keep things within reach, pull-

ing to 20-14 when Pickett found Reggie Williams for a 10-yard TD only 32 seconds before halftime.

The Trojans regrouped at the break, though, and Leinart found Bush on a 60-yard pass play to make it 26-14. Bush caught the ball in stride at midfield and went untouched to the end zone.

In the fourth quarter Leinart connected on a 52-yard TD pass to Brandon Hancock. His fourth score, a 37-yarder to Reggie Bush, put USC ahead 43-17.

Hershel Dennis carried 14 times for 98 yards. And Bush, a freshman running back, had a big day with five passes for 132 yards and two TDs. He also rushed 12 times for 81 yards.

The matchup between receivers Mike Williams of USC and Reggie Williams of Washington favored the Husky. Mike Williams had six catches for 43 yards while Reggie Williams had nine receptions for 115 yards and a touchdown. Yet while Washington's Williams had more yards, he was held without a reception in the second half and fumbled in the second quarter.

Reserve quarterback Casey Paus threw two second-half touchdown passes and redshirt freshman tailbacks Kenny James and Shelton Sampson combined for 235 yards rushing in Washington's 42-10 win over Oregon.

Sampson rushed for 131 yards and three touchdowns on only six carries, highlighted by a 77-yard TD run in the fourth quarter that put the Huskies ahead 42-10. James ran for 104 yards on 18 carries.

Paus was 5-of-8 for 117 yards. He opened the third quarter after Cody Pickett was sidelined by a blow to the head in the first half.

The Northwest rivals played classic Northwest-style football, with a 40-degree temperature at kickoff and a steady, cold rain falling all night after the start of the second quarter.

Oregon led 10-0 after the first quarter after a 36-yard field goal by Jared Siegel and an 85-yard scoring pass from Kellen Clemens to Demetrius Williams, but that was it for the Ducks.

The Ducks had the Pac-10's No. 2 rushing offense,

averaging 151.0 yards, but were held to 73 yards rushing on 34 attempts. Terrence Whitehead, coming off a career-high 172-yard effort against Stanford, had 54 yards on 19 runs.

Paus sparked the Huskies to 15 straight points in the third quarter. On the first series of the second half, James broke a 56-yard run to set up an eight-yard TD carry by Sampson. Just like that, Washington led 13-10 and never trailed again.

Washington's Charles Frederick made it 22-10 on a 10-yard TD pass from Paus. Frederick was a surprise starter after missing much of the previous week's practice with a bruised chest.

Reggie Williams collected a large chunk of his 130 receiving yards on a 63-yard strike from Paus to open the fourth quarter. A 55-yard fumble return by Greg Carothers and Sampson's 77-yard scamper completed the 42 unanswered points put up by the Huskies.

Washington wasn't penalized until 10 minutes remained, while the Ducks committed 10 penalties for 75 yards.

Mike Bell rushed for 222 yards - including touchdown runs of 67, 69 and 37 yards - and the Arizona Wildcats snapped a string of 13 consecutive home losses in the Pac-10 by stunning Washington 27-22.

Bell's TD runs of 69 and 37 yards came in a 59-second span of the fourth quarter.

Washington went 88 yards in 12 plays on its second possession, Cody Pickett throwing three yards to Adam Seery for the touchdown.

Bell followed with a 67-yard scoring run, but Tom Robinson's snap on the extra-point try was high. Holder James Molina's desperation pass was intercepted and Washington led 7-6 with 4:05 left in the first quarter.

Derrick Johnson intercepted Kris Heavner's pass at the Arizona 22 to set up Washington's second touchdown, a one-yard run by Shelton Sampson.

Arizona cut the lead to 14-13 in the final seconds of the first half when Gary Love stripped the ball from Washington receiver Charles Frederick at the Arizona 21 and returned it to the 50. Heavner threw 33 yards

to Mike Jefferson, then hit Biren Ealy for a touchdown with 26 seconds left in the half.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Huskies made it 16-13, pinning Arizona on its one, and gang-tackling Bell in the end zone for a safety with 9:58 left.

Bell's 69-yard dash up the middle gave Arizona the lead for the first time, 20-16 with 7:28 to play.

Pickett fumbled on Washington's next possession, and the Wildcats recovered. Two plays later Bell raced 37 yards to put Arizona ahead 27-16 with 4:38 to play.

Pickett, who completed 31-of-51 for 351 yards and two scores, completed a 41-yard pass to Isaiah Stanback to set up a 4-yard touchdown toss to Corey Williams to cut the lead to 27-22 with 3:49 left. The two-point conversion try failed when Patrick Howard stopped Pickett two yards shy of the end zone.

The Huskies drove to the Arizona 28 on their last possession, but consecutive false-starts pushed them to the 38. Pickett threw three incompletions, the last deflected by Lamon Means to preserve the victory.

Geoff McArthur had six catches for 180 yards, including a 79-yard touchdown reception in the opening seconds, and California set a school record with 729 total yards in a 54-7 rout of Washington.

Aaron Rodgers was 20-for-33 for a career-high 348 yards and three touchdowns and also ran for a score. Cal ended a 28-year home losing streak to the Huskies. Washington had won 10 in a row in Berkeley. Four of the previous five meetings had been decided by eight or fewer points.

J.J. Arrington carried 14 times for 185 yards in place of starter Adimchinobe Echemandu, the Pac-10's second-leading rusher held out with a sprained ankle, and the Bears averaged more than 10 yards per carry while rushing for 381 yards.

Cal leveled Cody Pickett several times with its aggressive blitzing defense that led to three first-half sacks, and the Bears often used double coverage on Reggie Williams, who was held to four catches for 23 yards.

Pickett was 22-of-39 for 225 yards and threw two interceptions.

Zach Tuiasosopo scored Washington's lone touchdown on a three-yard run in the second quarter.

McArthur, the nation's second-leading receiver, had four catches for 131 yards in the first quarter and broke the school's all-time single-season record for receiving yards.

Cal punted for the first time midway through the third quarter but Charles Frederick muffed the return to give the Bears the ball back at the 26.

Cal's third- and fourth-string running backs scored fourth-quarter touchdowns, with Michael Porter capping the blowout with a 51-yard TD run with 2:44 left. The school compiled its most yards since gaining 670 against Utah in 1958.

It was Washington coach Keith Gilbertson's first trip to Memorial Stadium to face his former team since taking over as head coach of the Huskies.

Cody Pickett threw a 21-yard strike to Corey Williams with 1:10 to play, lifting Washington to a 27-19 win over No. 8 Washington State in another thrilling Apple Cup.

Pickett established a rhythm in the fourth quarter and directed a 73-yard drive that kept the Huskies from their first losing season in 27 years. He completed 23 of 45 passes for 183 yards and two touchdowns.

The Cougars took a 10-0 into the second quarter, after Devard Darling hauled in a 17-yard strike from Matt Kegel with 4:46 left in the first.

The Huskies got on the board at the end of the second as Pickett connected with Charles Frederick from four yards out. Washington State Kicker Drew Dunning added a field goal for the Cougars, giving them a 13-7 lead at the half. He scored the only points of the third quarter, on a 20-yard attempt.

Shelton Sampson's six-yard score pulled the Huskies to within two, 16-14, with 12:01 left in the fourth quarter. They trailed 19-14 after Drew Dunning's fourth

field goal, a 26-yarder, with 4:43 on the clock.

Pickett found Charles Frederick for a 15-yard gain to Washington State's 39 on fourth-and-four near midfield with two minutes to play. Then he fired a shot to Williams in the right corner of the end zone.

Marquis Cooper sealed the win for Washington when he intercepted a pass by Josh Swogger and returned it 38 yards for the final TD, touching off pandemonium amidst the 74,549 at Husky Stadium.

Washington State's Jonathan Smith had 128 yards rushing, breaking off runs of 28 and 19 yards on the first drive of the third quarter, leading to Dunning's 20-yard field goal. Smith added two 14-yard bursts in the fourth to set up Dunning's 26-yarder.

Washington State quarterback Matt Kegel benched himself after taking a few hits on his sore throwing shoulder. Swogger was 10-of-23 for 107 yards with three interceptions.

Kegel was 6-of-12 for 50 yards with one TD and two interceptions before leaving in the second quarter.
