WASHINGTON at #18 USC Dawgs Close Down Husky Stadium vs. Ducks

THE GAME: The Washington football team (6-3 overall, 4-2 Pac-12) heads south to Los Angeles for the first of two straight road games this Saturday as the Dawgs take on USC (7-2 overall, 4-2 Pac-12) at 12:45 p.m. PT at the Coliseum. It's the second straight trip to USC for the Dawgs, who beat the Trojans, 32-31, on a last-second field goal last year, one season after beating them, 16-13, on another kick with four seconds left in 2009. Washington is receiving votes, but is not ranked, in both polls while USC ranks No. 18 in the AP top 25, but is ineligible to receive votes in the coaches' poll. The Huskies, who played their final game at Husky Stadium prior to major renovations last Saturday, return to the road Nov. 19 at Oregon State before closing out the 2011 regular season vs. Washington State Nov. 26. That game will be played at the Seahawks' CenturyLink Field.

QUICK SNAPS: The Huskies are 6-3 overall and 4-2 in conference for the first time since 2001 ... UW quarterback Keith Price is tied for eighth in the nation with 25 touchdown passes ... 25 TD passes already ranks tied for No. 2 in UW single-season history, three shy of Cody Pickett's record of 28 ... if Price were to maintain his current pass efficiency rating of 156.0, he would surpass the school record (153.8, Brock Huard, 1997) ... at .668, he's also well ahead of the UW season record for completion percentage (.650, Steve Pelluer, 1983) ... Price is 14 in the nation in pass efficiency ... tailback Chris Polk has rushed for 100 yards in seven of nine games this year and now has 18 career 100-yard games, a new school record ... Oct. 29 vs. Arizona, Polk tied the UW modern record by scoring five touchdowns and became the first player in UW history to top 100 yards in both rushing (144) and receiving (100) in the same game ... he also passed the 1,000-yard mark for a third straight season, joining Napoleon Kaufman as one of two Huskies ever to do that ... Polk is second on the UW career rushing yards list with 3,657 yards ... Polk ranks seventh in the nation in rushing (121.8 yards per game) ... senior linebacker Cort Dennison leads the Pac-12 in tackles ... six true freshmen have played this year for the UW: S James Sample, TB Bishop Sankey, TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins, DT Danny Shelton, OLB John Timu and WR Kasen Williams.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Oregon game will air live to a national audience on FX televison. Gus Johnson, Charles Davis and Tim Brewster will provide the commentary. Additionally, "Huskies All-Access" airs each Wednesday evening on ROOT Sports. The program is an up-close look at each Husky game, with features, one-on-one interviews and sideline video.

RADIO: The Washington ISP Sports Network, with its flagship station KJR 950-AM/102.9 FM, will carry the live broadcast of every football game on 16 Northwest radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Damon Huard are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. Many game broadcasts will also be carried on SiriusXM Satellite Radio and can be heard over the internet at gohuskies.com. Touchdown Radio will also air the game nationally.

THE HEAD COACH: In a frequently-told tale, Husky football coach Steve Sarkisian recalls his days as a young assistant traveling to face Washington at Husky Stadium. During the drive across Lake Washington, with the iconic home of the Dawgs towering ahead. Sarkisian marveled aloud at the city, the stadium and the atmosphere surrounding the UW program. A decade or so later, Sarkisian is in charge of the Washington football program he was admiring that day. And in just two years, he has re-established the kind of tough, exciting environment that was then, and is again now, so closely associated with the Husky football. In 2010, Sarkisian's second season in Seattle, the Huskies made another clear step forward. The Dawgs went 7-6 overall and finished third in the Pac-10 Conference with a 5-4 record. Then, in the Holiday Bowl, Washington provided one of the bowl season's top games, beating an 18th-ranked Nebraska squad, 19-7. The win over the Cornhuskers was the last of a series of exciting, gutsy victories in 2010. The season included three Husky wins decided on the very last play of the game (Oregon State, USC and Cal), plus another in which the winning score came inside the final minute (WSU). Sarkisian was introduced as the new head coach of the Washington football team on Dec. 8, 2008. From the start, Sarkisian made it clear that he didn't think it would take long to turn the program around and get it back to the high level of success that UW football has enjoyed throughout its history. In his first season, 2009, he seemed to prove that he was right. Washington, which posted a winless season for the first time in school history the year before Sarkisian signed on, surged to a 5-7 record in 2009, an improvement of five victories over the previous year. No BCS-conference school in the nation could boast such improvement in terms of wins in 2009. And, Sarkisian's Husky squad pulled off that feat against a schedule that included 10 opponents who ended the season bowl-eligible. Sarkisian came to the UW with a wealth of experience as a quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator. His string of success is nearly unprecedented as, during his time at USC, he coached two Heisman Trophy winners and oversaw one of the nation's most consistent and dominant offenses. Sarkisian spent 2007 and 2008 as the Trojans' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He had also previously served as assistant head coach and guarterbacks coach (2005-06), guarterbacks coach (2002-03) and as an offensive assistant (2001) at USC, for a total of seven seasons there. During his seven seasons as a member of the Trojans' staff, the team posted a combined 74-15 record. As offensive coordinator, his record was 22-3. Aside from his various roles at USC, Sarkisian also spent one season as quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders in 2004 and as QBs coach at El Camino College in Torrance, Calif., in 2000, his first coaching job. Sarkisian starred at the guarterback position at the prep, collegiate and pro levels. After his standout career at Brigham Young University, he was played for the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League for three seasons (1997-99). He had a record-setting two-year (1995-96) career at BYU, playing under legendary coach Lavell Edwards. Sarkisian completed 549-of-824 passes (66.6 percent) for 7,755 yards and 55 touchdowns in his career. His 162.0 career passing efficiency rating ranked third on the all-time NCAA list. As a senior in 1996, he led the nation in passing efficiency (173.6, No. 7 all-time) as the Western Athletic Conference champion Cougars went 14-1 and won the 1997 Cotton Bowl. He was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year in 1996, and earned second-team All-America honors. Sarkisian transferred to BYU from El Camino Junior College, where he played two seasons (1993-94). He was a first-team Junior College All-America selection as a sophomore and earned all-conference honors in 1993 as a freshman. He also played baseball at El Camino in 1993. He originally enrolled at USC as a baseball player, spending the fall of 1992 on the Trojans' roster before transferring. Sarkisian was a standout football and baseball player at West Torrance (Calif.) High. He earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from BYU in 1997 after receiving his associate's degree in general studies from El Camino in 1994. Sarkisian was born March 8, 1974. He and his wife, Stephanie, have two daughters, Ashley and Taylor, and a son, Brady.

COACHING STAFF: Washington's assistant coaching staff returns entirely intact for a third straight season. In 2009, every member of the staff was new to the UW (though a couple had worked at the UW in prior staffs). While there are a few of coaches who made their way to Washington via USC, like head coach Steve Sarkisian, more notably, many of the new coaches have very specific ties to the Northwest. Nick Holt is the UW's defensive coordinator, the role he served at USC for three seasons prior to his arrival in Seattle. Holt, however, is tied to the Pacific Northwest by way of the fact that he was head coach at Idaho in 2004 and 2005. He was also an assistant with the Vandals from 1990-97. Offensive coordinator and QBs coach Doug Nussmeier, who grew up in the Portland, Ore., area was a star quarterback at Idaho, where he passed for 10,824 career yards and won the Walter Payton Award (the I-AA Heisman). He's also in the Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame, just like running backs coach Joel Thomas. Thomas, a native of Port Angeles, Wash., is still the Vandals' all-time leader in rushes, rushing yards and rushing TDs. Offensive line coach and run game coordinator Dan Cozzetto, who went to high school in Spokane, is another Idaho grad. Cozzetto, who was also the Washington line coach in 2003, came to the UW from Arizona State, but also coached at Idaho under former head coach Dennis Erickson. Safeties coach Jeff Mills, who played his college football at Western Washington, was a graduate assistant at the UW in 1990 and 1991 under coach Don James. He helped the Dawgs to Pac-10 titles both seasons and the national championship in '91. Mills has also coached at Idaho. Defensive line coach/special teams coordinator/recruiting coordinator Johnny Nansen grew up in Long Beach, Calif., but played football at Washington State and came to Seattle after spending five seasons at Idaho (including two under Holt). Finally, as to the Idaho connection, linebackers coach Mike Cox is a native of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, played for the Vandals under Erickson and former Husky head coach Keith Gilbertson, and coached in Moscow from 1987-94. He came to Washington from the St. Louis Rams. Cornerbacks coach Demetrice Martin was new to the Northwest in 2009, having previously worked with Sarkisian at USC. Another newcomer to this part of the country, receivers coach Jimmie Dougherty, played at Missouri and had most recently coached at the University of San Diego. Washington's two graduate assistants are Jordan Paopao (offense) and Donte Williams (defense). Paopao, who works with the tight ends, was a fouryear starting center at the University of San Diego while Williams, who prepped at Culver City High in the Los Angeles area, was a defensive back at Syracuse.

ENTIRE STAFF RETURNS FOR THIRD SEASON: The UW's entire full-time coaching staff returns, intact, for a third straight season in 2011. Dating back to the mid-1950s, before which records are incomplete, the 2011 season marks the first time in Husky history that the entire coaching staff has remained the same for three straight years. Last year's feat of returning an entire staff for just two straight years marked the first time that had happened at the UW since the 1989 and 1990 seasons.

HUSKIES vs. TROJANS HISTORY: Washington and USC have played one another 81 times since the series began in 1923. The Trojans hold a 49-28-4 series advantage, although the Huskies have gone a closer 9-9-1 over the last 19. Washington won its first-ever meeting against the Trojans, beating USC, 22-0, in Seattle in 1923. When the series re-started in 1927, USC handed the Huskies six straight defeats before Washington reeled off five in a row. The longest streak either way in the series began in 1965, when the Trojans beat Washington for the first time of 10 straight wins. The Huskies are 17-19-4 in the 40 games played in Husky Stadium and 11-29-0 against the Trojans in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. Last season, Washington posted its second straight victory via late field goal as Erik Folk connected from 32 yards to beat USC, 32-31, on the final play of the game. In 2009 in Seattle, Washington handed No. 3 USC a 16-13 win as Folk connected on a 22-yard field goal with three seconds left to cap the game-winning drive. Three years ago in L.A., USC blanked the Dawgs, 56-0, as then-coordinator Steve Sarkisian's offense racked up 488 yards while then-USC defensive coordinator Nick Holt held the Huskies off

the scoreboard. Four seasons ago, the No. 1 Trojans escaped Seattle with a 27-24 win, the second of two straight close matchups. USC overcame three turnovers and 16 penalties. USC out-gained Washington with 460 yards of total offense to the Huskies' 190, but only won the game by three points. In 2006 in L.A., the Huskies dropped a 26-20 heartbreaker to the No. 3 Trojans as time ran out with the Huskies' on the Trojans' 15-yard line. The year before in Seattle, the No. 1 Trojans used a 23-point second quarter to break open a previously close game in a 51-24 win. In 2004, the top-ranked Trojans handed the UW a 38-0 loss, breaking the Huskies' 271-game scoring streak, the longest in Division I-A at the time.

WASHINGTON-USC TIES: Washington's coaching staff ties to USC are obvious as Husky head coach Steve Sarkisian was hired away from the Trojans, where he spent seven of the previous eight seasons (all but 2004). Washington also hired defensive coordinator Nick Holt from Pete Carroll's USC staff and Husky cornerbacks coach Demetrice Martin was a former staff member under Carroll at USC. Finally, Husky head strength coach Ivan Lewis, director of football operations Dennis Slutak and director of player personnel Jared Blank all worked for the Trojans before being hired by Sarkisian. Many of Lane Kiffin's current staff at USC (including Kiffin himself) spent time on Carroll's Trojans staff along with Sarkisian and the other UW staff with USC ties. USC o-line coach James Cregg was on the staff when Holt was head coach at Idaho. As far as players go, the only Washingtonian on the USC roster is RS-Fr. TE Michael Cox (Bainbridge). However, as is the case each year, a good deal of UW and USC players have played with or against one another in high school due to the number of Huskies from the L.A. area. The Huskies roster includes 34 players from (somewhat loosely-defined) southern California: QB Derrick Brown (Winchester), TB Jesse Callier (Downey), TB Deontae Cooper (Perris), DE Talia Crichton (Lakewood), OL Mike Criste (Mission Viejo), CB Gregory Ducre (Los Angeles), OL Skyler Fancher (Costa Mesa), PK Erik Folk (Woodland Hills), LB Princeton Fuimaono (Long Beach), LB Garret Gilliland (Anaheim), DE Andrew Hudson (Redlands), WR James Johnson (Valley Center), OL Erik Kohler (Camarillo), CB Adam Long (Los Angeles), LB Matthew Lyons (Los Angeles), P Will Mahan (Bakersfield), QB Nick Montana (Thousand Oaks), S Sean Parker (Los Angeles), WR Joshua Perkins (Cerritos), CB Marguis Persley (Redlands), TB/FB Dezden Petty (Carson), TB Chris Polk (Redlands), QB Keith Price (Compton), S Will Shamburger (Compton), DE Josh Shirley (Fontana), WR Kevin Smith (Compton), OL Colin Tanigawa (Pasadena), LB John Timu (Long Beach), LB Tim Tucker (Harbor City), OL Siosifa Tufunga (Long Beach), S Greg Walker (Bellflower), QB Erik Wilson (Redondo Beach), DE Corey Waller (Long Beach) and OG Nick Wood (Poway), Lastly, UW safety Nathan Fellner and USC punter Tyler Negrette are cousins.

vs. LOS ANGELES SCHOOLS: Washington has a combined record of 58-87-6 (.404) against the two Pac-10 schools from Los Angeles: 30-38-2 vs. UCLA and 28-49-4 against USC. While that combined record may not sound that successful, it's worth noting that no team in the Pac-12 has a winning record against either one of the two L.A. schools (other than USC's record vs. UCLA). In fact, Washington has more wins against the Trojans and Bruins (combined) than every conference school except Cal (60-112-6 (.354) combined record), and has a better winning percentage against the two than every team in the league. The next closest is Arizona State, which has totaled a combined mark of 19-34-1 (.361) against the Bruins and Trojans.

10 OUT OF 13: Washington enters this week's game at USC having won 10 out of its last 13 games. The last time the Huskies had won 10 out of 13 was at the end of the 2001 season, when Washington went 8-3 during the regular season (they'd also won their last eight in 2000). That year, the Huskies won their first four games of the season (stretching a win streak from the previous season to 12 games) before losing at UCLA on Oct. 13, 2001. After that UCLA loss, Washington reeled off wins over Arizona, ASU and Stanford before falling at Oregon State.

TEAM NOTES

THE PAC-12: This season, the Pac-10 Conference has added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, will play in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and California. Under current plans, each school will play all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. This year, the Huskies will not face UCLA or Arizona State. The last time that Washington didn't face UCLA in a season was in 1992 (when the Pac-10 schedule was eight games). The UW didn't face Arizona State in 2003 or 2004.

CAPTAINS: At the end of the spring practice season, the four captains for the 2011 season, as voted by their teammates, were revealed. They are senior linebacker Cort Dennison (Salt Lake City, Utah), senior wide receiver Jermaine Kearse (Lakewood, Wash.), senior offensive tackle Senio Kelemete (Seattle, Wash.) and senior defensive tackle Alameda Ta'amu (Kent, Wash.). Kelemete was also voted as a season captain in 2010. The team also names two game captains each game. Here's a list of those:

DECADE AFTER DECADE: Washington has won a conference title and a trip to the Rose Bowl in each of the last nine decades, dating back to the 1920s when Washington won the berth in 1923 and 1925. In the 1930s, the Dawgs won the '36 title. In the '40s, Washington earned the trip in 1943 and then barely slipped in under the wire in the 1950s, winning the 1959 crown. The Huskies won two Rose Bowl berths in the 1960s -- 1960 and 1963 -- and one in the 1970s (1977). Titles in 1980 and 1982 did it for that decade and three straight trips to Pasadena to begin the 1990s covered that 10-year span. In the 2000s, UW was the first team to earn Rose Bowl berths in nine straight decades. USC joined the Dawgs in that distinction in 2004 after their New Year's Day appearance in Pasadena.

FINISHING FIRST OR SECOND: UW has finished either first or second in the conference (including ties) in 18 of the last 34 seasons, dating back to a fourth-place finish in 1976. Over that span, Washington has won the championship (outright or shared) eight times — 1977, 1980, 1981, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995 and 2000 — while finishing second 10 other times.

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 178-54-3 (.764) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. So far this year, the UW is 5-2 in such games (Chris Polk has rushed for 100 in every game but vs. Cal and Oregon).

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 77 times. The Huskies' record stands at 65-12-1 (.851) in those contests. Since 1995, UW is 40-9-1 (.810) when rushing for 200 yards.

PLAYING AT HOME: Washington has gone unbeaten at home 13 times in its history, including six times in the last 21 seasons. UW has won 92 of its last 139 (.665) games at Husky Stadium with one tie (92-46-1). Since 1980, the Huskies stand 140-57-2 (.709) at home. Since 1990, the Huskies are 58-33-1 (.636) at Husky Stadium vs. Pac-10/Pac-12 opponents.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium will undergo a massive renovation following the 2010 season. In fact, in order to aid the project, the Huskies will play this season's Apple Cup vs. Washington State Nov. 26 at CenturyLink Field (home of the Seahaws), meaning the Nov. 5 game vs. Oregon was the final game in the "old" Husky Stadium. The Seattle icon was first opened in 1920. Upper decks were added in the 1950s (south) and 1980s (north). Renovations will completely remake the lower bowl and the south deck. The stadium track will be removed and an operations center for the football team will be built into the west end. HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM: The 2011 season marks the 92nd season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. Thanks to several major renovations, Husky Stadium's seating capacity has increased to its current total of 72,500. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium currently stands at 357-169-21 (.673).

FAMILY TIES: As is the case with most seasons of Husky football, there are a number of players on the Washington football team related to either current or former Huskies. The team has one set of brothers in Jermaine (Sr. WR) and Jamaal (RS-Fr. LB) Kearse. Senior TB Johri Fogerson is related to both Nate Robinson (former UW football and basketball player: current NBAer) and former Husky basketball standout Dion Brown. Freshman safety Evan Zeger's father, John, played safety at the UW, lettering in 1980 and 1981, while freshman WR Kasen Williams' dad, Aaron was a four-year letterman (1979-82) wide receiver for the Huskies. Junior, Talia Crichton, is a cousin of former DE Daniel Te'o-Nesheim. Sophomore quarterback Keith Price is a cousin of former UW tailback Jelani Harrison. Freshman linebacker Nick Holt is the son of the UW defensive coordinator of the same name (they are actually Nick Holt V and VI). A little further afield, freshman TE Michael Hartvigson is a cousin to former UW baseball pitchers Chad and Grant Hartvigson. Incidentally, at least three Huskies have close family ties to Washington State. Cooper Pelluer's father played at WSU, as did Husky cornerback Desmond Trufant's brother Marcus. Sophomore safety Nate Fellner is the grandson of former WSU head coach Jim Sweeney. Pelluer's uncle Steve, however, was a UW QB and his father Scott was an assistant coach at UW.
