The top 10 teams and the 2 advancing individuals will be announced in front of the scoreboard immediately following play on Saturday, May 17.

CARTS

Participants and coaches, other than the designated coaches, may not use golf carts, pullcarts or caddies during the regional, including the practice round. Each will be provided with one cart.

CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The West Regional Championship will be a 54-hole competition. If conditions dictate a change of format, only the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee can make a decision to shorten the tournament.

The West Regional will consist of a 54-hole tournament with 27 teams and six (6) individual players competing. The low ten (10) teams and low two (2) individuals not on those teams will advance to the NCAA Championships. Playoffs and tie breakers, as set forth in Appendix A of the NCAA Men's Golf Handbook, will be used to determine advancement to the championships. There will be no cut of the field unless deemed necessary by the Games Committee

If the 3rd round cannot be completed but the morning wave completed its 54 holes, those scores shall count, regardless whether all teams in the afternoon wave complete their round. If some, but not all, of the teams in the afternoon wave complete the round, the scores of those teams who have posted for the 3rd round will count. The round for those teams unable to post a score will not be continued, and the regional shall be complete. If a minimum of 36 holes cannot be completed, the games committee will select the regional representatives to the finals taking into consideration 18-hole scores and other selection criteria.

CREDENTIALS

Each team will receive credentials for all members of the official travel party. Credentials must be worn for entrance to the team areas.

The designated coaches are required to wear their credentials at all times while on the course.

DRUG TESTING

Drug testing may occur at any session of the championship. Student-athletes who compete in these championships may be subjected to drug tests in accordance with Bylaws 18.4.1.5 and 31.2.3 and may be determined to be ineligible as a result thereof. and thereafter, student-athletes who are tested shall remain eligible only if they test negative.

EQUIPMENT

The type of equipment (e.g. balls, clubs) to be used shall be determined by the individual team and must be acceptable under USGA rules. The one-ball rule (brand) will be in effect. Golf bags must have the name or logo of the school on them.

Players and coaches will be required to use spike-less shoes during competition. This includes all practice rounds. Range finders may be used during practice rounds; coaches and players cannot use them during competition.

The media workroom will be located adjacent to the dining room in the Gold Mt. clubhouse. Round by round results will be provided in the media workroom and via the internet. Tournament notes and quotes from selected participants will also be produced. Copying, faxing, phone, and wireless internet services will be provided in this area to credentialed media and coaches.

Interviews will be conducted in the admin. area in the clubhouse. Coaches are requested to make themselves and their team members available for post competition interviews upon request after a 10-minute cooling off period.

NCAA MERCHANDISE

NCAA merchandise will be available for purchase after the rules meeting in the clubhouse and during the competition in the clubhouse.

OFFICIALS

The NCAA Golf Committee along with representatives of the official governing body will serve as the officials and will make decisions pertaining to the conduct of the championship, such as pairings, setting up the course, rules of golf, etc.

PAIRINGS AND TEE TIMES

Both first and 10th tees will be used for the entire competition. However, the committee reserves the right to use only the first tee, or mini-wave if necessary. Tee times will not be altered to accommodate travel schedules.

The committee will pair teams in groups of three for the practice, first and second rounds according to their seeding. Third round pairings for teams and individuals will be by position according to score. For purposes of ranking teams for third round pairings, ties will be broken by using the non-sudden death tie breaker procedures outlined in Appendix A of the Handbook. When a tie exists between individuals on the same team, the individual with the lowest numerical team position will be given the later tee time.

Daily results, pairings and tee times will be available at the course as well as at the headquarter hotels (at the front desk).

PARKING AND PERMITS

Team parking will be set aside at no charge in the main lot, in front of the driving range. Spectator's parking is available in the main lot of the course at no charge. Handicap parking is available near the clubhouse. Parking permits will be distributed at registration.

PRACTICE ROUND

An 18-hole practice round will be conducted on Wednesday, May 14th beginning at 8:00am. Specific tee times for participating teams and individual players have been predetermined and will not be altered.

In an effort to maintain the conditions of the course and the speed of play, **each participant must wear soft spikes, tee off from the designated tee marker, and play only one ball.** A player may chip or putt more than one ball on or near the putting green only. Violations of this policy will result in the player or team being removed from the golf course.

Teams are limited to five (5) players during the practice round. Groups of six are not allowed, and coaches are not allowed to play during the practice round. Head coaches or a designated official institution representative will be required to be with the team during the entire round. **Coaches are responsible for monitoring pace of play, misconduct, and the one-ball rule.**

PROGRAMS

Programs will be provided for the official travel party and distributed at registration. Additional programs may be purchased at the course pro shop.

REFRESHMENTS/HOSPITALITY

Fruit, nutrition bars, snacks and water will be provided for participants on the course throughout the tournament. A buffet lunch will also be available in the Clubhouse dining room between 11:00am and 1:30pm daily for teams only (meals may be ordered from the menu by teams and spectators alike at any time). Credit card charge slips may be set up prior to the championship for lunch and pro-shop needs.

REGISTRATION

Registration will take place in the clubhouse at Gold Mountain Golf Complex on Tuesday, May 13th from 1:00pm to 6:00pm.

Any team that is unable to register during this time can register between 7:30am and 9:30am in the Clubhouse at Gold Mountain Golf Club on Wednesday, May 14th, or by appointment.

RESULTS

Tournament results will be compiled using the official GolfStat scoring software. Copies of the day's results will be available at the headquarter hotels front desk after the completion of each round. In addition to the round by round results, the University of Washington will maintain running leader boards located on the course in the Gold Mt. Dining Rm. Live scoring will also be available via the internet at www.gohuskies.com, www.golfstat.com, www.ncaasports.com.

RULES

The 2008 NCAA Championship Tournament will be conducted according to the USGA Rules of Golf with certain modifications to be referenced at the rules meeting.

Per NCAA Bylaw 17.33, member institutions shall conduct all of their intercollegiate competition in accordance with the playing rules of the Association in all sports for which the NCAA develops playing rules. For those sports in which the Association follows rules that are developed by other governing bodies and modified by the governing sports committee, the adopted playing rules shall be used. The governing sports committee will not consider any results for selection purposes that are not played in accordance with NCAA rules, or those rules adopted by an outside organization.

The NCAA Division 1 Men's Golf Championships shall be conducted according to the USGA Rules of Golf. The NCAA Rule Sheet shall be used during the regional.

ADVICE

In addition to the provisions of Rule 8-1, the Note and Decision 8-1/100 under Rule 8 of the USGA Rules of Golf will be in effect. Thus, each team may appoint up to two persons to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants on that team provided that:

- a. up to two persons may be appointed to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants on that team at any one time, and the appointed persons must wear the identification band provided by host.
- b. the persons are identified to the games committee before the start of the competition each day;
- c. the persons do not give advice to, or ask for advice from, another team's players or coaches;
- d. the persons is not given advice by any other representative of that team; and
- e. the advice is given in a private manner that does not unduly delay play.
- f. the persons are designated by the institutions athletics department to perform coaching duties and who serves in that capacity on a volunteer or paid basis.

The player may ask for advice from, or give advice to, the appointed person in accordance with a, b, and e above. Advice includes pointing out the line for putting.

Penalty for breach of condition:

By a player-two strokes.

By a coach-two strokes will be added to the coach's team's score.

Coaches should be familiar with the information contained in the memorandum to coaches regarding potential penalties for actions by a coach.

UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

Unsportsmanlike Conduct (i.e. profanity, club throwing, acts of defacing the golf course, use of electronic devices including iPods and cellular phones, ect)-During the round, defined as from the time the player makes his first stroke until the score card is submitted in the box, at the first offense of any act of unsportsmanlike conduct during the championships (regionals and finals), the student-athlete and coach will be notified immediately on the golf course and provided a warning. The offending institution's director of athletics will receive a letter from the NCAA, informing the institution that one of its student-athletes had been warned for unsportsmanlike conduct during the championships. The second offense of unsportsmanlike conduct will result in disqualification form the championships. Any unsportsmanlike conduct incurred at the regionals would be carried over to finals. However, the committee shall have the right, without warning, to disqualify and individual for that round (or championships) for any flagrant act of unsportsmanlike conduct.

In addition to the unsportsmanlike conduct policies, coaches, administrators and student-athletes shall be subject to the misconduct policies and penalties in NCAA Bylaw 31.1.10. The golf committee may also impose other penalties deemed appropriate.

PACE OF PLAY

Pace of Play-USGA Rule 6-7 states, in part: "The player shall play without undue delay and in accordance with any pace of play guidelines that the Committee may establish" and thereafter prescribes penalties for slow play.

Allotted Time-When play is in groups of three, groups will be required to play at the pace of play established by the committee.

Definition of Out of Position-The first group to start will be considered out of position if, at any time during the round, the group is behind on the prescribed schedule, as detailed on the Pace of Play Time Chart provided to each team coach.

Any subsequent group will be considered out of position if it (a) is taking more than the prescribed schedule and (b) reaches the tee of a par-3 hole that is open and free of play, or reaches a par-4 or par-5 hole and any player has not made a stroke from the teeing ground before the hole is open and free to play.

Note: Both (a) and (b) must occur for a group to be Out of Position.

Group Out of Position-If a group is out of position, the players in that group may be monitored and timed in accordance with the flag system.

Timing-When a group is being monitored and timed, each player in the group is expected to play any stroke within 40 seconds after timing of the stroke begins.

Other than on the putting green, the timing of a player's stroke will begin when he has had reasonable opportunity to reach his ball; it is his turn to play without interference or distraction. Time spent determining yardage will count as time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, timing will begin after a player has been allowed a reasonable amount of time to lift, clean and replace his ball, repair his ball mark and other ball marks on his line of putt and remove loose impediments on his line of putt. Time spent looking from beyond the hole and /or behind the ball will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

Pace of Play Penalties-

- One bad time exceeding the allotted time-Warning.

- A second bad timing-1 stroke penalty

- A third bad timing- Additional 2 stroke penalty

- A fourth bad timing-Disqualification.

The USGA Rules of Golf shall be followed, along with any local rules the games committee deems necessary. Members of the golf committee and the golf rules officials will be available for interpretations of the rules and other decisions governing the competition. Penalties based on the rules of golf are not subject to appeal.

RULES MEETING

A meeting will be conducted to review tournament procedures, local rules and items of importance to the competition on Wednesday, May 14th immediately following welcome banquet at the Gold Mountain Golf Club.

NCAA merchandise will be for sale after the meeting.

SCORING

Scorecards shall be kept in accordance with Rule 6-6 of the USGA's "Scoring in Stroke Play." The scorecard will be deemed returned to the golf committee when the player or coach places it in the scoring area. Scoring tents will be in placed on holes 9 and 18. Players are required to turn in their scores with their group prior to interacting with anyone other than the designated coaches.

SPECTATORS

Spectators must remain on the cart paths or in the rough and approximately 15 yards from the players at all times (including practice areas). There may be no communication between players and spectators that could be deemed advice of any nature for the duration of the 18 holes. All institutional personnel, with the exception of the designated coaches, are considered spectators. Ringers on electronic devices must be turned off. Spectators must refrain from smoking. Carts will not be provided for spectators.

SQUAD SIZE, LINE UPS AND SUBSTITUTIONS

During registration, the head coach must submit his or her lineup according to playing position. The five contestants from each institution must be determined by the conclusion of registration. No substitutions will be allowed after the conclusion of registration without the approval of the games committee. A player may be substituted before his team's first tee time of the first round of the regional if the head coach notifies the games committee prior to the first tee time. The substitute must assume the position of the replaced player.

TRAINING ROOM / MEDICAL INFORMATION

There will be a certified athletic trainer on site beginning 1 hour before the first tee time each day. The following modalities will be provided: Hydroculator (moist heat), combo ultrasound/stem unit, ice, biohazard supplies and taping supplies.

TRAVEL OPTIONS AND TOLLS

Gold Mountain Golf Course can be reach by either driving across the Tacoma Narrow bridge or driving to downtown Seattle and ferrying to Bremerton. Travel time is slightly shorter traveling from the airport via the Tacoma Narrows bridge. The bridge is a toll bridge – There is a \$3.00 charge, payable by cash, check or credit/debit card on the eastbound lanes only (leaving Gold Mountain).

The drive and ferry ride through Seattle to Bremerton is slightly longer but is especially scenic and relaxing. There is a toll for the ferry. It is approximately \$60 per vehicle each way. The Hampton Inn Hotel (headquarter hotel for even seeds) overlooks the ferry dock in Bremerton.

UNIFORMS AND LOGOS

Contestants from each institution must wear uniforms of the same color during practice and competition. Walking or Bermuda shorts are permitted provided they are team shorts and are the same color. In the best interest of intercollegiate golf and to prepare for the NCAA Championships, participants must wear appropriate golf attire at the tournament site.

An institution's officials uniform and all other items of apparel (e.g. socks, T-shirts, visors, hats and towels), that are worn by student-athletes in competition, may bear a single manufacturer's trademark, not to exceed 2 ¼ inches square, including any additional material (e.g. patch) surrounding the normal trademark or logo. (This rule also applies to coaches' attire).

If a student-athlete wears headgear during competition, it must display only an institutional, conference or NCAA logo or no logo. If there is no logo, a coach's or team member's headgear must be of an institutional color.

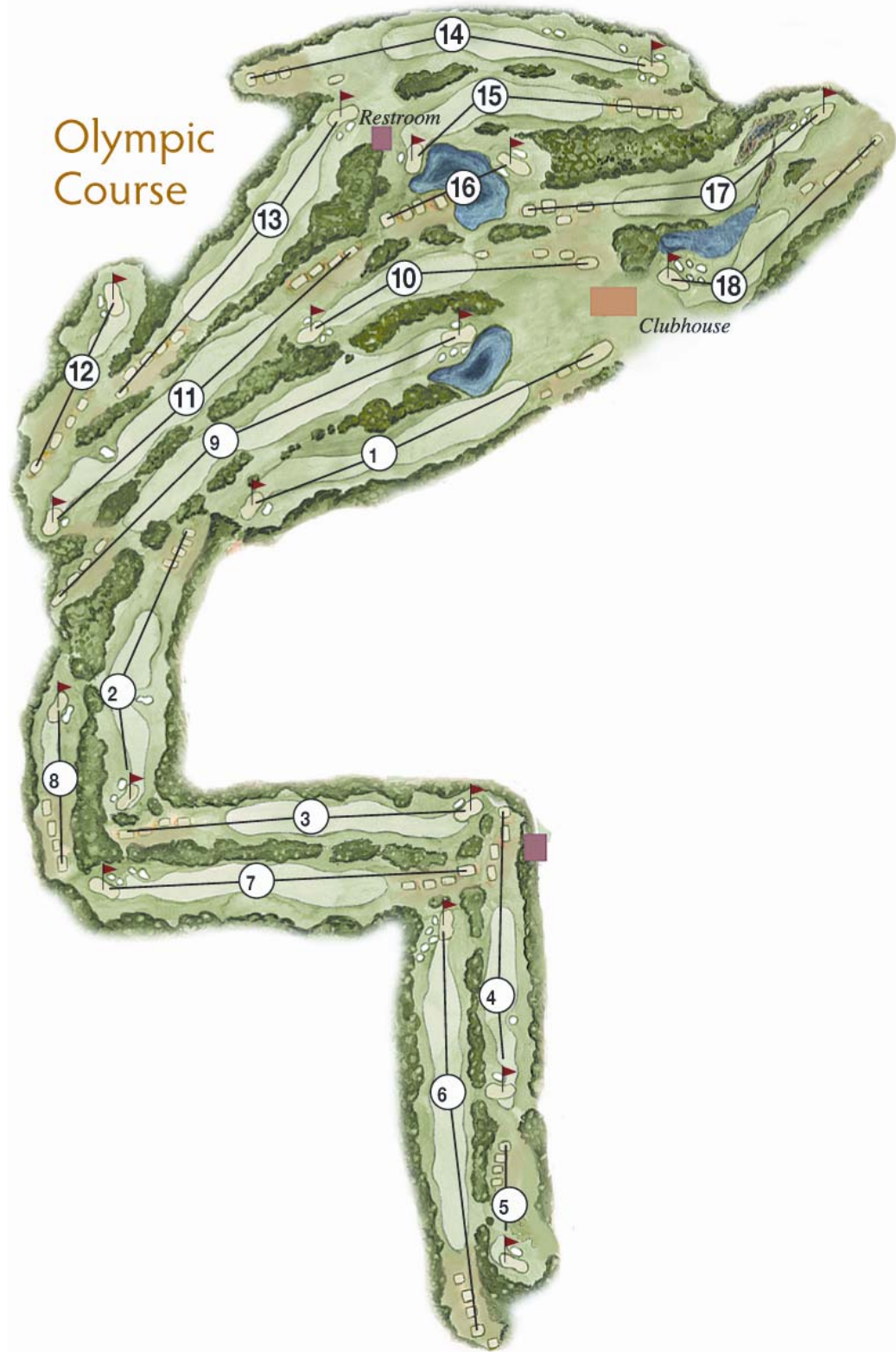
VIDEOTAPING, FILMING AND STILL PHOTOGRAPHY

Institutions are permitted to videotape championship competition of their team or their individual student-athletes for archival, coaching, or instructional purposes. Each institution is permitted to use one camera and may videotape only that portion of competition in which it participates. The videotapes may not be used for any commercial purposes.

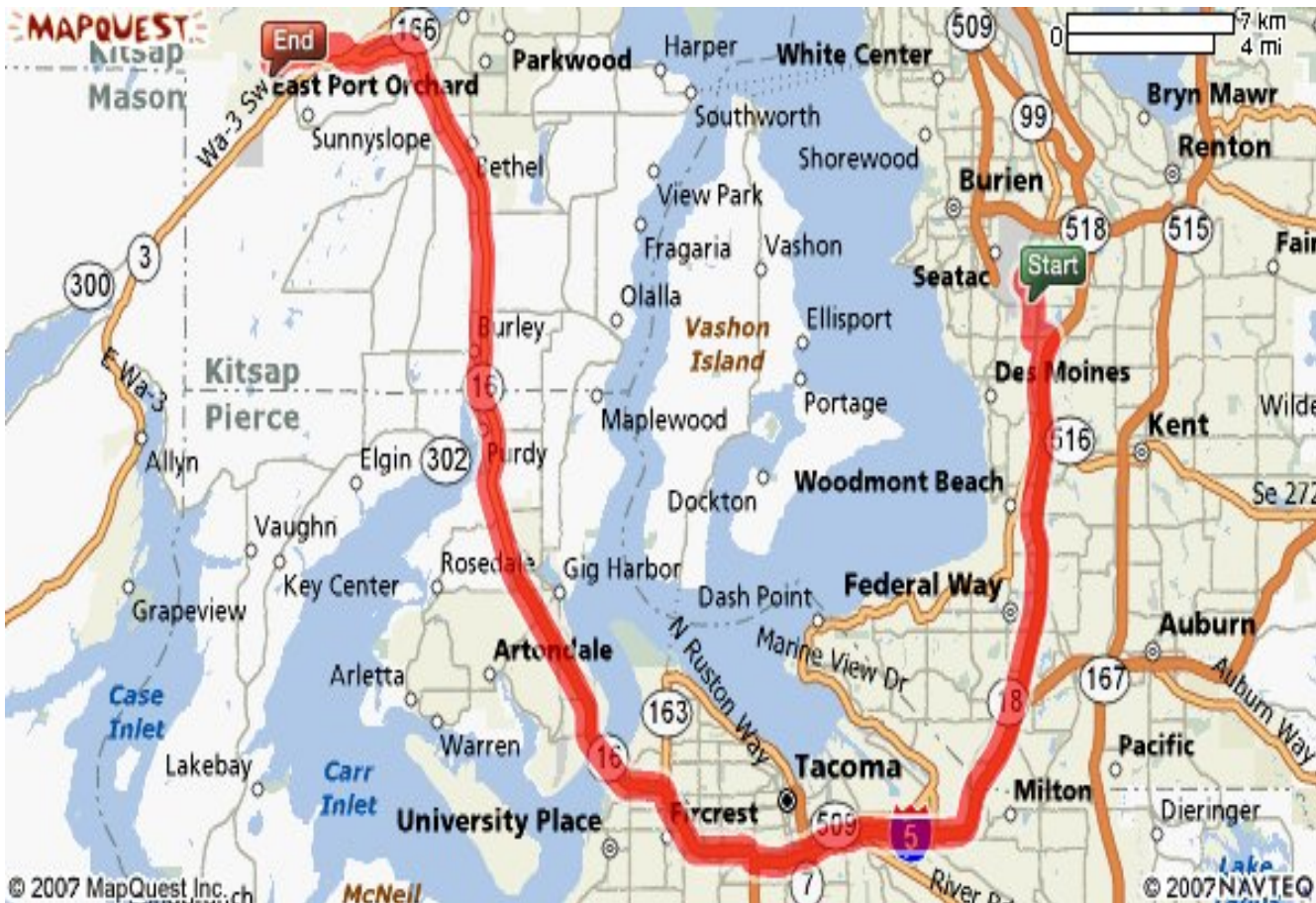

SEATAC Airport to Hampton Inn

The Hampton is located just off the Seattle/Bremerton Ferry Dock. Because of the hotel's location you have two options you can choose from to get to the hotel from the airport. If some of your players have never been to the Seattle area, we highly recommend that you head to downtown Seattle and take the ferry to Bremerton. The other option is to drive around the Puget Sound, which will take about 45 minutes to one hour from the airport.

Option #1 SEATAC to Hampton Inn via Seattle/Bremerton Ferry

If you elect to take the ferry, the ferry exits onto Washington Avenue and the hotel is less than a few hundred feet from the ferry terminal. These directions are from SEATAC to Seattle Ferry terminal. Included below is a list of departure times for the ferry from Seattle to Bremerton. The ride on the ferry is approximately 50 minutes.

MAP: SEATAC AIRPORT TO HAMPTON INN VIA FERRY



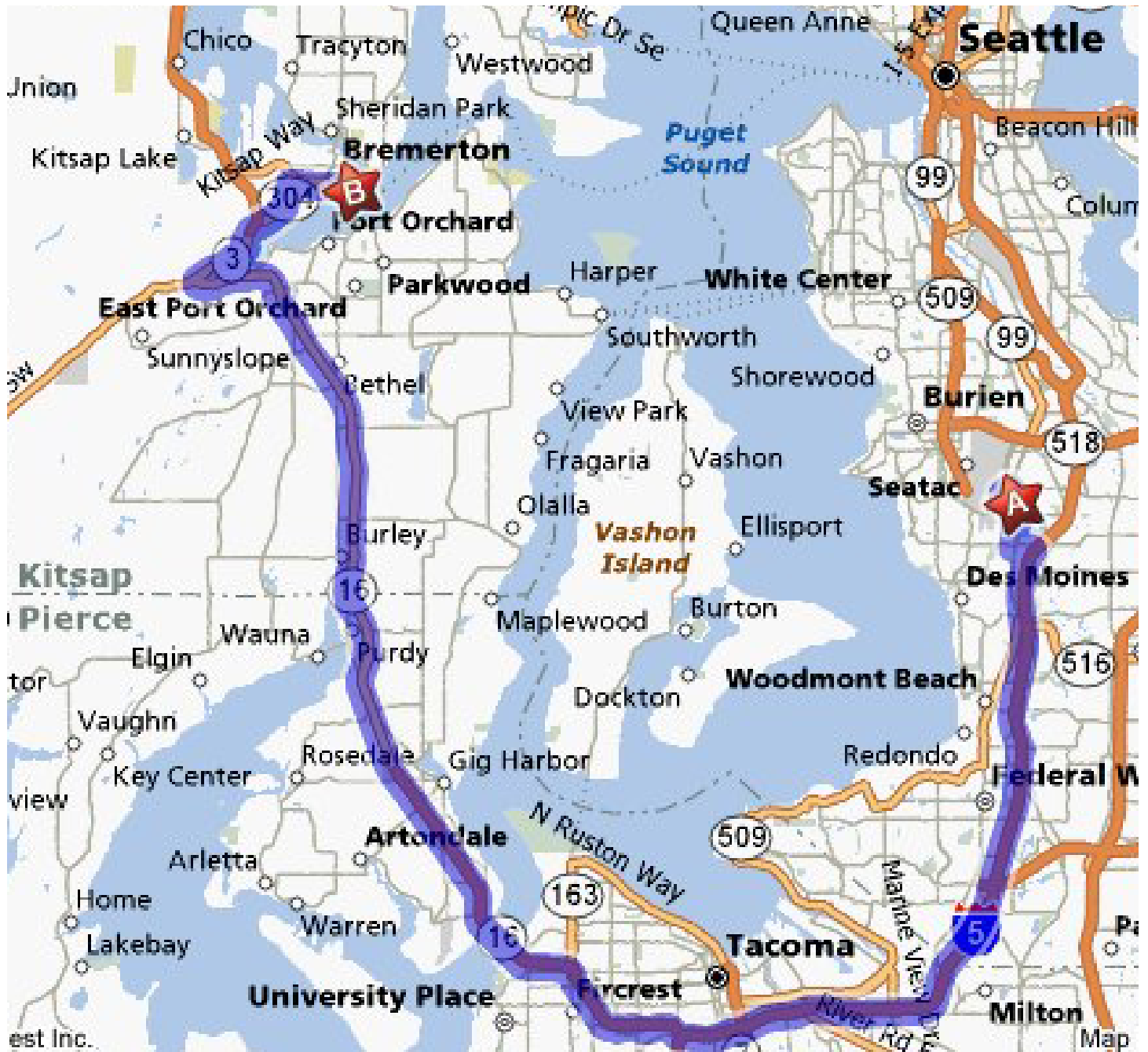
