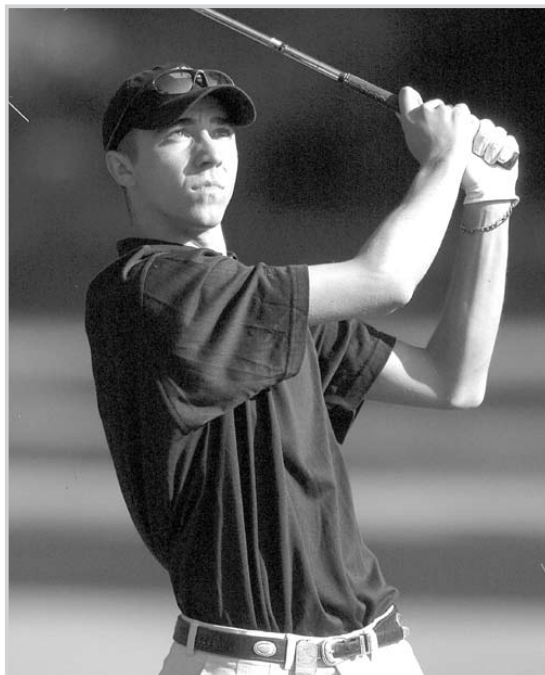

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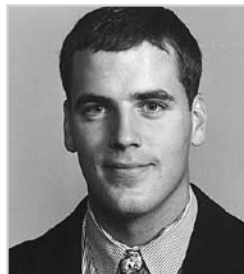

BROCK MACKENZIE

2001-2004

Brock Mackenzie (2001-2004) completed his Washington career in 2004 as the most decorated player in school history, earning All-America honors during all four of his years as a Husky. He was PING first-team All-American in 2003 and 2004 a second-team pick as a sophomore in 2002 and an honorable mention pick as a freshman. Mackenzie was a first-team All Pac-10 performer from 2002-2004. As a junior, he tied the collegiate scoring record by carding a 12-under 60 to set the course record at the Eugene Country Club during the Oregon Duck Invitational.

He owns the UW records for individual championships (four), single season scoring average (70.6 in 2004), single-season rounds played (47 in 2002), career rounds played (165) single-season top-10 finishes (11 in 2002) and career top-10 finishes (32), which is almost twice as many as the next Husky.

Mackenzie was the picture of consistency in excellence, leading UW in stroke average in all four of his seasons -- and each of those seasons the UW finished not worse than 26th at the NCAA Championship. He was named Washington's Top Dawg Award winner as the school's outstanding senior student athlete in 2004. He was also recognized as a Pac-10 Medalist that year. He was a member of the 2002 Palmer Cup and won all three of his matches while representing the United States in the 2003 Welker Cup.

His success at the collegiate level has translated over to the professional ranks as well. Mackenzie turned pro in 2004 and has finished in the top 25 in nine of the 56 total Nationwide tournaments he has played in. During the 2007 season, Mackenzie finished 53rd on the Money List with a scoring average of 71.06. His career Nationwide earnings in five years are \$148,001.



JAMES LEPP

2005-2006

Statistically, James Lepp (2005-2006) ranks near the top of the UW men's careers statistics, but it is another number that separates him from all former Huskies: One. Lepp is the only Husky to finish the season above all other golfers, with an NCAA Individual Championship.

Lepp began his collegiate career at the University of Illinois, where he was an honorable mention All-American his freshman year and a second team selection his sophomore year. It was with the University of Washington, however, that he achieved his greatest accomplishment: Erasing a six-stroke deficit on the final round of the 2005 NCAA Championship to win in a playoff. With rounds of 70-67-76-63-276, Lepp defeated Pepperdine's Michael Putnam in a three-hole playoff for medalist honors with birdies on seven of his final 15 holes in regulation. He capped off the season as one of Washington's two first-team All-Americans, and was a major part of helping the UW to a third-place finish at Caves Valley Golf Club in Maryland -- the Huskies' highest team finish to date. Lepp's final round of 63 set a course record at Caves Valley.

As a transfer halfway through his career, and a four-year All-American, Lepp has a unique perspective on UW golf, as he was able to play more rounds than most collegiate golfers.

"Washington has all that a golfer would need to further or develop their golf game, from great facilities to knowledgeable coaching," he said. "And the best part is, while learning all these things, you'll have so much fun doing so."

And while Lepp considers his individual championship his finest moment in his Husky career, he considers his time at Washington an enormous help later in life. To this day, Lepp is considered to be one of the cornerstones of Husky golf -- a perfect example of what is possible and a period in the program where expectations were raised on the course and in the classroom, as he was also a two-time Pac-10 All Academic honoree and a 2005 Scholar All-American.

"I do know that I learned a lot, whether it was how to golf my ball around the course, or learn business skills in the classroom. I probably learned the most from the people around me, and that starts with good coaches and solid teammates, which was definitely the case at Washington."

Despite playing just a pair of years for the Huskies, Lepp's name is still peppered throughout the school record books. His pair of medalist honors is tied for third highest in Husky history and his 2005 score of 198 (18-under) still stands as the best three-round score. His 2005 scoring average of 71.5 is third-highest among all Husky golfers in single season marks.

Lepp turned pro in 2007 and joined the Canadian Professional Tour. In 2008, the Abbotsford, B.C. native placed tied for first place in the Greater Vancouver Charity Classic on June 16. He has made the cut in five of his 11 tournaments this year.

O.D. VINCENT 1986-1989



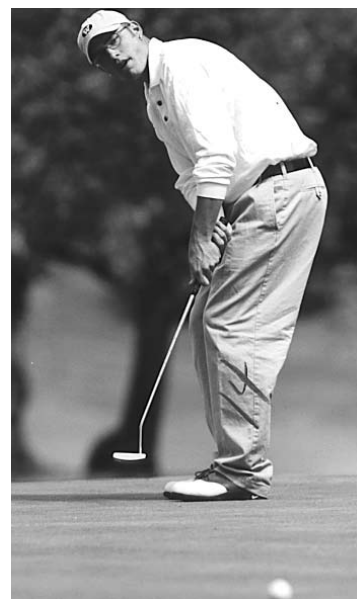
Considered one of the finest players in Husky history, O.D. Vincent is also recognized among his peers as a successful coach, directing the Husky program from 1996-2001.

In Feb. 2000, Vincent was named National Coach of the Year by the College Golf Coaches Association. In his fourth year as men's head coach, UW had arguably the most successful season in school history, capturing three event titles and a then-school record fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championship. Prior to his national honor, Vincent was named Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year. As a player, Vincent put UW golf back on the map by winning the 1988 Pac-10 Championship while leading the Huskies to the team title. Vincent also

won the Hammond-Bell Pacific Coast Intercollegiate and set a three-round school record at the Stanford/U.S. Intercollegiate with a score of six-under 210.

Vincent also enjoyed success after college. In November 1991, he fired a final-round 67 and became the only American to qualify for the European Tour in 1992. In the 1992 British Open, he was among the leaders throughout the first two rounds. He resigned as UW's coach in 2001 to return to again pursue a professional career. He is now a Husky Senior Associate Athletic Director.

TROY KELLY 1999-2000



Six years after leaving the University of Washington, Troy Kelly is a regular on the PGA Tour for the 2009 season.

Kelly, now 30, was a leader in the Huskies during his two letterwinning seasons of 1999 and 2000. During that time, Kelly led the team in stroke average with 72.4 (1999) and 72.7 (2000), both teams that went to the NCAA Championship tournament. In fact, Kelly led a 1999 team that posted a then school-best fourth place nationally. Kelly made his mark as a Husky Legend that week, turning in a then school-best runner-up finish for the individual championship.

For his exceptional play at the University of Washington, Kelly was named the school's first two-time All-American.

Since leaving the UW, Kelly has played on the Gateway Tour, the Golden State Tour and the Canadian Tour. He was a member of the Q-School before earning his tour card this year, showing just what a Husky golfer can accomplish with patience and knowledge of the game.

ROB RASHEL 1996-1999



Former Washington men's golfer Rob Rashell placed second at the 2004 PGA Qualifying School to earn his exemption to the 2005 PGA Tour. Rashell shot 416 over the six-round event and finished one stroke behind England's Brian Davis. Rashell Claimed \$40,000 from the event's \$1.2 Million purse. Rashell had rounds of 68-68-67-74-69 at the event, which was held at PGA West Stadium Course and the Jack Niclas Tournament Course. Rashell lettered at Washington from 1996-1999, leading the team in stroke average as a junior. Rashell never won a tournament as a collegiate player, but finished his career as UW's all-time leader with 18 top-10 finishes.

ALEX PRUGH 2004-2007



Alex Prugh was a four-time letter winner and a two-time All-American, earning the accolade as an honorable mention in 2004 and a 3rd team selection in 2006.

During his career, Prugh had two of the Huskies' most successful seasons, finishing with stroke averages of 71.7 in 2007 (6th all-time) and 72.2 in 2006 (7th). He is also second in the most career rounds played as a Husky with 162 and his 12 top-10 finishes tied him for fourth place in career top-10 finishes. He also finished 15th in the 2006 NCAA Championship, the fifth-best finish by a UW golfer.
