Huskies Set For Championship

The Washington men's golf team comes into its ninth NCAA Championship in the past 10 years and 21st overall with its highest ranking in program history at No. 4 by Golfweek. The tournament will begin at 7 a.m. on May 26 at Inverness Golf Course. The Huskies, who tee off from the 10th tee beginning at 12:59 p.m. at the par-71 and 7,255-yard course, are paired with Arkansas and Tennessee.

New Format

This year's NCAA Championship will have a new format, with the first three days deciding the individual champion by strokes, while the team title will be decided by the following three days of match play. It will be the first time the team championship hasn't been decided by strokes since 1965. During match play, each match will be worth one point for the team, with all five players participating. The first team to three points advances.

Huskies Second at the Central Regional

Washington was the top seed at the Central Regional, hosted by the Club at Olde Stone in Alvaton, Ky. last week. It was the first time the Huskies had been the top seed at a regional in program history. Although taking a six-stroke lead into the final round, the Huskies finished in second place behind Pac-10 rival UCLA. Washington scored a 285-288-300 870, which was eight strokes out of the lead, and Nick Taylor carded his second consecutive runner-up finish at the regionals. Taylor also took a sizable lead (three strokes) into the final round, but a seven on the par-three 16th hole dropped him one shot behind North Carolina State's Matt Hill for medalist honors.

Pac-10 Champions

Washington won its fifth Pac-10 Championship just three weeks ago at the Seattle Golf Club. As was the case at the conference championship, and has become a theme for the Dawgs this season, the Huskies blew away the competition on its way to victory, ouscoring second-place Oregon by 18 strokes to grab the Pac-10 crown. A trio of Huskies carded top-10 finishes at Seattle Golf Club, including the individual champion, Darren Wallace. The Husky junior finished 11-under, beating the runner-up, UW junior Nick Taylor, by four strokes. On his way to becoming the Huskies' fourth individual conference champion, Wallace shot a second-round 65, which set the competitive course record.

Huskies in the Rankings

The Huskies began the 2008-09 season with their highest ranking in program history -- No. 4. After being bounced out of the top 10 for two months, the Huskies charged back into that No. 4 spot after the Pac-10 Championship. Individually, the Huskies boast two players inside the top 30, in NIck Taylor (9) and Richard Lee (27).

Washington at the NCAA Championships

In 2008, the Huskies came out of nowhere to finish seventh behind strong play from individual runner-up Nick Taylor. Taylor catipulted himself in the rankings with a second-round, 6-under 66 in 2008. He ended in a tie with Indiana's Jorge Campillo for the No. 2 spot, and fell three shots behind UCLA's Kevin Chappell for the championship. Three members of the 2009 team played in last year's NCAA Championship, including Tze Huang Choo (T55, 84-

72-76-78-310 +22) and Darren Wallace (T64, 79-76-81-77-313 +25). The Highest Husky team finish at nationals was a third-place effort in 2005. The Huskies also have an individual winner, James Lepp took the title

by shooting a 276, which included a fourth-round 63 to win. The second-best finish is by Nick Taylor (2008) and Troy Kelly (1999), who were runners-up. The Huskies have made the NCAA Championship 10 out of the past 11 years -- with seven finishes inside the top 11 during that time.

Pac-10 Dominance/Triumphant Trio

Not only have the Huskies won the Pac-10 team and individual titles, but they have also shown to be the most succesful team in a conference that has advanced the most teams (7) to the NCAA Championship. The Huskies have won a program record-tying five tournaments this season -- more than any other Pac-10 school. Those results yeilded postive reactions from Pac-10 coaches, as Taylor, Wallace and Lee were all named to the First Team. All Conference.

Success Under Thurmond

While just starting to get the national attention for its accomplishments, the Washington golf program has taken its play to the next step during Matt Thurmond's tenure. Since being named the head coach eight years ago at 26, Thurmond has guided the Dawgs to six top-11 finishes at the NCAA Championship. He has coached 11 All-Americans and one National Champion, and been named Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2009. Under Thurmond's guidence, the Huskies have accomplished their top individual and team finishes at the NCAA Championship, including James Lepp's title.

• Thurmond was tapped to coach the United States Palmer Cup team in 2009. The Palmer Cup is the collegiate version of the Ryder Cup.

Washington Golf Gets A New Home

Since the construction of the medical facility that was built on the campus course more than 50 years ago, the Huskies have had to go off campus to practice. That is all about to change, however, with the opening of the Huskies' new \$2 million golf facility this summer, located on the south end of Bank of America arena. The two-story facility that is set to open June 6th includes chipping and putting greens, along with the latest swing technology. There is a club house, locker room and club work station.

Cabinet Stuffers

The Huskies are having potentially the preimminent season in the history of the program and have the hardware to prove it, winning a record-tying five team titles -- the most for a Pac-10 team -- which included the Husky Invitational, Fresno State Lexus Classic, Oregon Duck Invitational, U.S. Intercollegiate and the conference championship. Individually, the Huskies have a trio of juniors earning First-Team, All-Conference honors in Nick Taylor (co-Player of the Year), Richard Lee and Darren Wallace. Also, sophomore Tze Huang Choo was an honorable mention. Matt Thurmond was voted as the conference's top coach and has presided over the Huskies becoming one of the powerhouses in college golf. Along with those end-of-the-year awards, the Huskies had three players earn Player of the Month honors in Taylor (November, March), Chris Killmer (September) and Wallace (April).

Taylor was also a semifinalist for the Ben Hogah Award, given anually to college golf's premiere player. Although not an award, coach Matt Thurmond has been selected to coach the 2009 Palmer Cup -- the top honor for a collegiate golf coach.

Canadian Pipeline

Washington's neighbors to the north have contributed mightaly to the success of Matt Thurmond and Husky golf. In fact two of the best players in Washington golf history hail from Canada in Nick Taylor and 2005 NCAA Champion James Lepp. There are three Canadians on this year's roster with another set to join the roster next year.

TaylorMaking History

Husky junior Nick Taylor caught fire at the end of the 2007-08 season, which culminated in a runner-up finish at both the NCAA Regional and the NCAA Championship. This year, Taylor has hardly slowed down, playing his way to perhaps the best season in Husky history. Just off a runner-up finish at the 2009 NCAA Central Regional, Taylor has earned medalist honors in four tournaments, including the CordeValle Collegiate, Hawai'i-Hilo Intercollegiate, Oregon Duck Invitational and U.S. Intercollegiate. Four medals is a single-season record for a Husky, and ties him with Brock Mackenzie for most career medals (4). Taylor was named the co-Player of the Year in the Pac-10, along with USC's Matthew Giles and won conference Player of the Month honors in November and March. The Abbotsford, B.C. native was a Ben Hogan Award semifinalist and runner-up at the World Team Amateur competition, representing his homeland Canada. In April, Taylor tied James Lepp's UW record for lowest 54-hole score at 198 at the U.S. Intercollegiate. He also set a record for lowest third-round score (63) for a Husky

Lee Adjusting Nicely

For a transfer from Bellevue Community College, Richard Lee has not needed any time developing his game to meet the Division I level. Lee, a Bellevue native, carded top-10 finishes in seven of his first eight tournaments and is ranked No. 29 by Golfweek. Lee has been a model of consistency for the Dawgs, playing in every tournament with the second lowest stroke average (72.50) on the team.

Choo Building Momentum

As is the story with many of this year's Husky golfers, Tze Huang Choo (pronunciation Say Ha-Wang Chew) has continued to improve as the season has progressed, culminating in four top-20 finishes in his past six tournaments. Choo, a Pac-10 Honorable Mention, tied for 27th place at the NCAA Regaionl as just another of his solid performances this season. He has finished third at the U.S. Intercollegiate and eighth at the Pac-10 Championship -- both tournaments in April.

He was also the runner-up at the U.S. Collegiate and the conference Player of the Month for April.
