
### 2005 SEASON REVIEW

A Season To Remember: The 2004-05 season for Washington men's tennis will go down as one of the best in school history. Not only did the Huskies advance to their fourth NCAA Round of 16 in five years and host a regional for the first time, they held up the Pac-10 Conference trophy at the end of the season. Going 6-1 in conference matches, the Huskies tied with UCLA – the eventual 2005 NCAA champion— for the top spot in the Pac-10. It was the first Pac-10 title for Washington since the northern and southern divisions of the conference merged in 1998. Washington finished the year with a 20-5 record, its five losses coming to Top-25 opponents. The 20-win season marked the second under head coach Matt Anger and seventh in school history. The Huskies earned their way into the NCAA Sweet 16 with regional wins over Oral Roberts and USC, before falling to the second-seeded Virginia Cavaliers.

Huskies Take First Shot: Washington faced an early test when it hosted the Great Northwest Shootout four matches into the season. Minnesota, Tulane and Ohio State traveled to Seattle for a round-robin tournament from Feb. 4-6. Three of the four combatants were ranked in the top-20 at the time, with No. 11 Ohio State and No. 17 Tulane both slightly above the 18th-ranked Huskies. On day one, Washington handled 43rd-ranked Minnesota, 4-0, behind singles wins from Daniel Chu, Peter Scharler, and Mike Ricks. Next, Washington upset the OSU Buckeyes, 4-1, with singles wins coming from Alex Vlaski, Christoph Palmanshofer, and Andy Kuharszky. Playing for the title, the Huskies outlasted Tulane, getting four points from Vlaski, Alex Slovic, Palmanshofer and Scharler to pull out a 4-3 victory. Their sweep of the field established the Huskies as an early noisemaker nationally.


**UW Wins First Pac-10 Crown:** By completing their Pac-10 slate with a 6-1 mark, the 2005 Huskies earned a share of their first Pac-10 title and secured their place in Husky history. Since the Pac-10 north and south divisions merged in 1998, the Huskies had never finished higher than fourth in the conference, and no school other than Stanford, USC or UCLA had taken the conference crown. The Huskies finished in a first-place tie with the Bruins at 6-1. Washington made their move early on, sweeping Stanford and California in the first week of Pac-10 play to announce themselves as a legitimate contender.



The Huskies handled the Cardinal, 5-2, in the conference opener, for only their third series win over Stanford. A dramatic 4-3 win over Cal was one of the year's turning points, as seniors Alex Vlaski and Christoph Palmanshofer both won third-set tiebreaks within seconds of each other to pull out the win. A disappointing 5-0 loss to UCLA was followed by a thrilling 4-3 upset of USC. Again, just the win itself was historic in that it was only Washington's second win over the Trojans in 22 tries. The Huskies then took care of business in their final three matches, holding off Arizona, 4-2, then downing Arizona State and Oregon by 6-1 scores.

Third Time's Not a Charm For Vlaski: For Alex Vlaski, the Pac-10 singles title will forever be the one that got away. In his last go-around, Vlaski reached the singles final for the third time, and came up one win short for the third time. Vlaski was defeated in the title match by Stanford's Sam Warburg, 7-5, 7-5. However, the 15 wins Vlaski posted in his four years at the championships stand as an all-time record. Warburg also denied Washington hardware on the doubles courts. as he and KC Corkery defeated Alex Slovic and Daniel Chu, 8-6, in the final of the conference doubles tournament. Slovic and Chu did make a bit of Husky history, becoming the first UW duo to advance to the Pac-10 finals. Slovic also made a strong showing in singles play, nearly upsetting Warburg in the quarterfinals, but the eventual champion survived in a third-set tiebreak.

**Huskies Come Through In Regional:** Despite their No. 12 ranking at the time,



the Huskies were awarded the No. 15 seed heading into the NCAA Tournament, and were chosen to host a regional for the first time in program history. The Dawgs dispatched Oral Roberts, 4-0, in the first round. Mike Ricks scored his first win in NCAA action at sixth singles to lead the way. Round two's match with the USC Trojans was a thriller all the way to the last shot. Washington was on top of its game early, taking the top two doubles matches for a 1-0 lead, but the Trojans got on the board with two quick wins at No. 5 and 6 singles. Christoph Palmanshofer evened things with an upset of 55th-ranked Drew Hoskins in straight sets at No. 2 singles. USC regained the lead with a No. 4 singles win, but the Huskies survived the final two matches, with Alex Vlaski first defeating 19th-ranked Jamil Al-Agba, 7-5 in the third set of his last home match at No. 1 singles. Moments later, Alex Slovic also finished off a three set win, 6-7, 6-2, 7-5, to send the Huskies to their fourth Round of 16 in five years.

Virginia Ends Tourney Run: Back in the Round of 16, Washington ran into second-seeded Virginia, a team that had lost only twice all year. The Cavaliers had five singles players in the rankings at the time of the match, and their depth proved to be too much for the Huskies to overcome. Virginia earned the doubles point, then added straight set wins at second, fourth, and fifth singles to secure a 4-0 win. The match was closer than the score indicated, as the other three singles matches were all headed towards third sets when Virginia clinched.

## **2005 SEASON REVIEW**

Anger Earns Accolades: UW head coach Matt Anger was honored at season's end for guiding the Huskies to their stellar season. Anger was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year for the first time in his career, and also garnered ITA West Region Coach of the Year honors. His 20-5 Husky squad won its first ever Pac-10 title and made its presence felt at the national level. The Huskies ranked as high as 11<sup>th</sup> in the nation in 2005, including a No. 14 final billing.

Vlaski Leaves Mark As Top Dawg: In his final season at Washington, Alex Vlaski left little doubt that he was the program's greatest player. Vlaski did not participate in the fall season, but even with the abbreviated campaign, still broke the UW career singles wins record, finishing with 111. By skipping the fall, Vlaski began the season unranked, but quickly rocketed back into the top-ten, ranking as high as sixth before finishing No. 10. When Vlaski rejoined the team for the beginning of dual play, he ripped off eight consecutive straight-set wins, six of which came against ranked opponents. Vlaski had a total of six wins over top-20 opposition. He received his third-straight All-American award for singles, where no other Husky ever earned All-American status for more than one year. Vlaski captured the 2003 ITA All-American Singles Championship as a junior. becoming the first Husky since 1924 to win a national crown. As a sophomore, Vlaski also reached the semifinals of the NCAA Championships, and three times went to the final of the Pac-10 Championships. He was the Pac-10 and Region VIII Freshman of the Year in 2002, and was a first team All-Pac10 selection every year since his sophomore season. Vlaski also excelled academically, being named to the first team Pac-10 All-Academic Team from 2003-05, as well as being recognized on the 2005 Academic All-America At-Large Third Team. After his senior season, Vlaski was the recipient of the John Van Nostrand Award, a grant given by the ITA to a player with a bright future career in the pros.

Austrians Bid Farewell: While the loss of three-time All-American Alex Vlaski will clearly be tough to absorb, the Huskies said goodbye to two more key contributors at season's end. Christoph Palmanshofer and Peter Scharler, each hailing from Austria. spent the past four seasons racking up key dual wins for Washington, and stepped up as seniors should to lead the team. In 2005, Palmanshofer led the Dawgs in overall singles wins with 23 and in dual wins with 17 while playing in the second or third positions. He finished the season ranked 66th after reaching a career-high of No. 37 in February. Palmanshofer stepped up in some of the biggest matches as well, notching wins in critical victories over Ohio State, Tulane, Stanford, California, Arizona, ASU and USC in the NCAA Tournament. His 69 career singles wins place him 10<sup>th</sup> in Washington's record books, one spot below fellow countryman Scharler, who is tied for ninth with 72 wins. Scharler was the consummate team player. He anchored the lower half of the Huskies' singles line-up, posting a winning percentage of over 70% for his career. Despite being hampered by shoulder problems, Scharler still managed to post a 17-8 singles record and his 15 dual wins trailed only Palmanshofer and Vlaski.

Postseason Honors: In addidtion to head coach Matt Anger's accolades, many Husky players were also honored at season's end. Senior Alex Vlaski become the first threetime singles All-American in UW history, finishing with a final singles ranking of No. 10. Vlaski also earned his third-straight first-team All-Pac-10 nod. Joining Vlaski on the All-Pac-10 team were second-teamers Christoph Palmanshofer and Alex Slovic. Four Huskies were named to the Pac-10 All-Academic team, led by first-team selection Daniel Chu and Vlaski. Peter Scharler and Slovic were named to the second-team. Vlaski was also named the 2005 recipient of the John Van Nostrand Memorial Award, an honor that is a stipend that goes to a player planning on pursuing a career in professional tennis.
