No. 5, and 6-2 at No. 6 ... went 13-5 in tournaments, four more wins than the next closest Husky ... won 9 of first 10 dual matches, including a key 7-5, 6-2 win over Pepperdine's Brian Brogan at the No. 6 spot in UW's 4-3 victory over the Waves ... scored UW's only point of the dual match against UCLA, defeating Nick Meister, 7-6, 6-2 ... rebounded from a 6-0 first set loss against Arizona's Ravid Hazi to win the next two sets 6-4 and 6-3 and help the Huskies outlast the Wildcats, 4-3 ... advanced to the semis of the Pac-10 Invitational, defeating Trojans Jack Levis and Abdullah Magdas in the Round of 16 and Quarterfinals, respectively ... strung together four wins to reach the consolation final at ITA NW Regionals before falling to Xavier Barajas-Smith of Sacramento State ... was 4-4 in doubles play, 1-1 in dual matches teamed with Martin Kildahl ... his one dual win in doubles came against Ball State on Feb. 10 ... earned Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention.

**2006-2007 (Sophomore):** Saw action at No. 5 and No. 6 singles and was 15-9 overall and had a record of 7-5 in dual matches...4-1 at No. 5 and 3-4 at No. 6... started year 15-5 overall including 7-2 in dual matches before four match skid... advanced to the semifinals of the Flight B bracket of the Bulldog Classic...was 6-3 in singles action during the fall for the Huskies ...was 1-2 in doubles while pairing with Holden Ching.

was 22-13 overall in singles and 13-9 in dual matches including an 11-9 record at No. 1 singles and 2-0 at No. 2 ... named to the All-Pac-10 second team by a vote of conference coaches ... also earned second team Pac-10 All-Academic honors ... finished the season ranked 95th and reached a career-high No. 77 on March 18 ... based on the final ITA singles rankings, had wins over four ranked opponents, highlighted by his 6-2, 6-3 upset of 5th-ranked Andre Begemann of Pepperdine in UW's 4-3 win ... also defeated 67th-ranked Matt Brooklyn of Arizona State, 80th-ranked Syketh Maneni of Alabama, and 114th-ranked Kallim Stewart of California ... also was leading Illinois' No. 1 player Ruben Gonzales, 4-2, in a third set at ITA National Team Indoors but did not get to finish against the 41st-ranked player ... took care of business well, winning 18 of 20 matches against unranked opponents, with all dual losses coming to ranked players ... also moved into the No. 1 doubles role along with Jeevan Nedunchezhiyan ... the two were 8-6 at No. 1 doubles, and 4-1 at No. 2 ... also went 1-3 at No. 1 with Derek Drabble ... reached the Pac-10 Quarterfinals with Nedunchezhiyan, losing 9-7 to a Cal tandem ... earned first win over a ranked team in the NCAA First Round match with Wisconsin, as they beat 49th-ranked Baumann and Polley, 8-3 ... won six of first seven matches with Nedunchezhiyan, including wins over teams from NCAA Champion Georgia and Alabama ... had the most consistent fall of any Husky, reaching the final of the Bulldog Classic and the semifinals of the Chandler Cup ... played 24 straight-set matches in a row at one point.

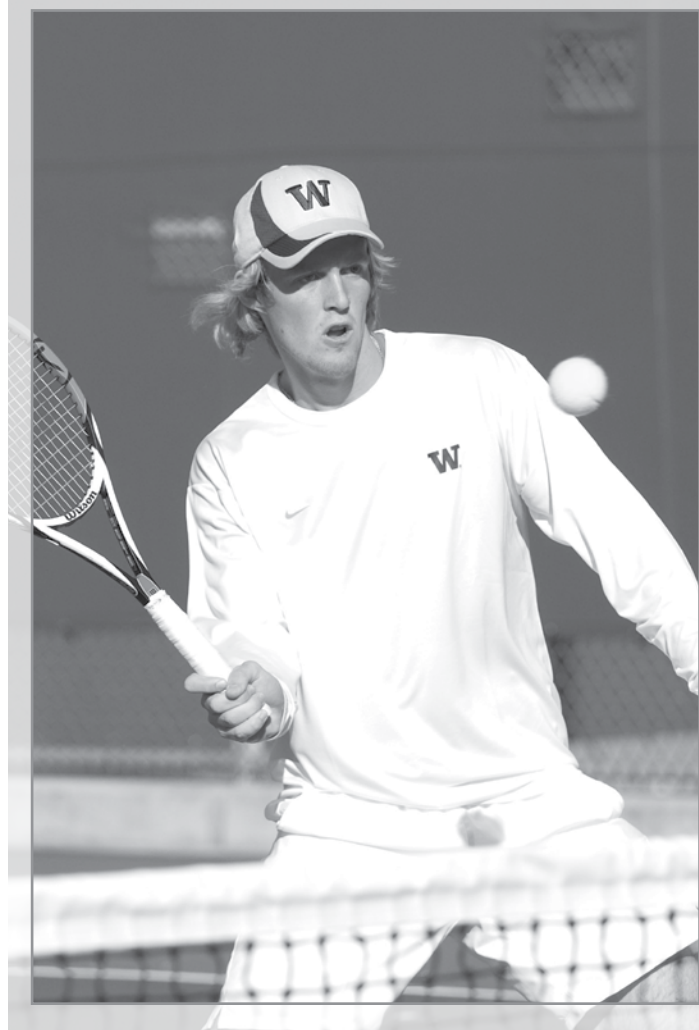

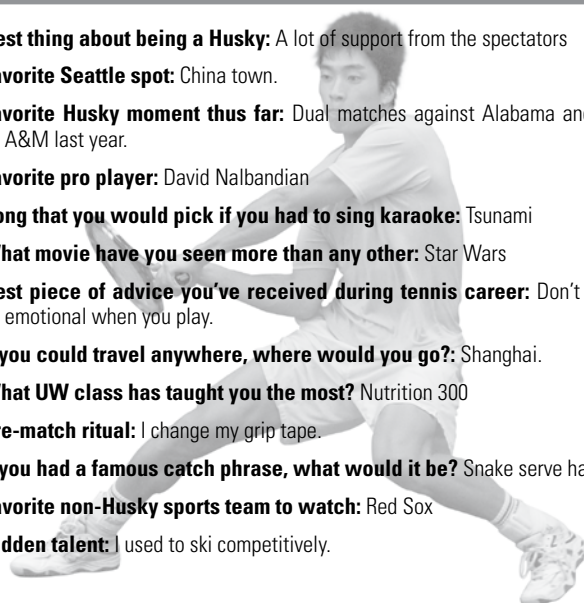
