Records: Virginia 8-0, Penn State 4-1

Recap: No. 1 seed Virginia remained unbeaten this season with a 4-0 win over Penn State today in the first round of the ITA National Team Indoors. Penn State, who was making its first-ever appearance at the event, held their own against the Cavaliers, but couldn't come up with a win in the end. Virginia got two quick wins in doubles from two of the top doubles teams in the country. The top team in the nation, Somdev Devvarman and Treat Huey beat Adam Slagter and Eddie Bourchier 8-3 to give UVA a head start on the Nittany Lions. Next, the No. 25 ranked pair of Houston Barrick and Dominic Inglot beat Ryan Gormley and Jake Toole, 8-5 to clinch the doubles point for Virginia. Up 1-0, the Cavaliers never looked back. Huey had the first singles win for UVA, as he beat Slagter 6-4, 6-4; he was followed by Sanam Singh, who beat Brendan Lynch 6-3, 6-2. And No. 5 singles Houston Barrick clinched the win for Virginia with his 6-4, 7-5 win over Ryan

Gormley. The other three singles matches were abandoned when the match was clinched, including a possible upset at No. 1 singles; No. 51 Michael James had taken the first set from reigning NCAA singles champion and current No. 1 ranked player, Somdev Devvarman, 6-4. Devvarman was winning in the second set, 5-3 when the match was abandoned. The Nittany Lions enter the back draw, where they will take on No. 9 seed Notre Dame at 11 a.m. on Saturday. Virginia advances to the quarterfinals, where they'll face No. 8 seed UCLA, who beat the Fighting Irish earlier today, 4-0. It isn't the first time UCLA and UVA will face off in this event: in 2005, an unseeded Virginia team knocked off No. 2 seed UCLA in the quarterfinals, 4-2, on the way to a finals appearance. UCLA is second all-time in total ITA National Indoor titles with seven. They will take on the Cavaliers Saturday at 11 a.m.
