Recap: The No. 3 seed Ohio State Buckeyes advanced to the ITA Team Indoor semifinals today, with their 4-1 win over No. 6 seed Southern California. Ohio State got the match started quickly, winning the doubles point in just 35 minutes; wins at Nos. 2 and 3 doubles put the Buckeyes up 1-0. In singles, it took a bit longer, but OSU had similar results. Matt Allare was the first to finish his singles match, as he beat USC's Abdullah Magdas, 6-3, 6-4. USC's Robert Farah put the Trojans on the board with a 6-3, 6-2 win over Justin Kronauge at No. 1 singles, but it wasn't enough to keep Southern California in the game. Wins from Steven Moneke and Drew Eberly at Nos. 2 and 6 singles clinched the 4-1 win for the Buckeyes. With the win, Ohio State advances to the semifinals, where they will face off against the winner of No. 7 Texas/No. 2 Georgia. The

Buckeyes should root for the Longhorns to advance, as Georgia is 2-0 against Ohio State at this tournament; in 2007, Georgia knocked Ohio State out in the finals, 4-0, and it was the Bulldogs who beat the Buckeyes in the first round of the 2005 tournament, 4-3. Ohio State's semifinals match is slated to begin at 2:30 p.m. in Nordstrom Tennis Center on Sunday.
