Records: Mississippi 5-1, North Carolina 4-3

Recap: The No. 5 seed Mississippi beat No. 12 seed UNC today, 4-1. With the win, the Rebels improve to 5-1 on the season, while UNC falls to 4-3. Mississippi took an early lead in the match, as they won the doubles point with wins at Nos. 1 and 2 doubles. The No. 4 nationally-ranked doubles team of Jonas Berg and Erling Tveit had an 8-2 win over North Carolina's David Stone and Lenny Gullan, while Bram ten Berge and Matthias Wellerman beat UNC's Taylor Fogleman and Stefan Hardy, 8-3. In singles, it was Kalle Norberg at No. 6 for Ole Miss, who made it 2-0 Rebels; his quick 6-3, 6-0 win over UNC's David Stone put Mississippi up. Bram ten Berge made it 3-0 with his 7-5, 6-1 win over Chris Kearney at the No. 4 singles spot. North Carolina's only point came at No. 2 singles, where Stefan Hardy upset No. 5 nationally-ranked singles player Matthias Wellerman, 6-1, 6-3. But with a 3-1 win, it would only take one more point for the Rebels

to clinch the win, which they did at No. 3 singles, as Robbye Poole beat Clay Donato, 7-5, 7-5 to earn the 4-1 win for Mississippi.

The Rebels will now advance to the quarterfinals, where they'll take on No. 13 seed Oklahoma State. The Cowboys upset No. 4 seed Baylor in the other 8 a.m. match today, 4-2. Mississippi will hope to advance again, and reach the semifinals for the first time since 2005. UNC was making its first tournament appearance since 1993, when the Tar Heels advanced to the semifinals. With the loss, North Carolina enters the back draw, where they will take on the 7-1 Baylor Bears at 8 a.m. on Saturday.
