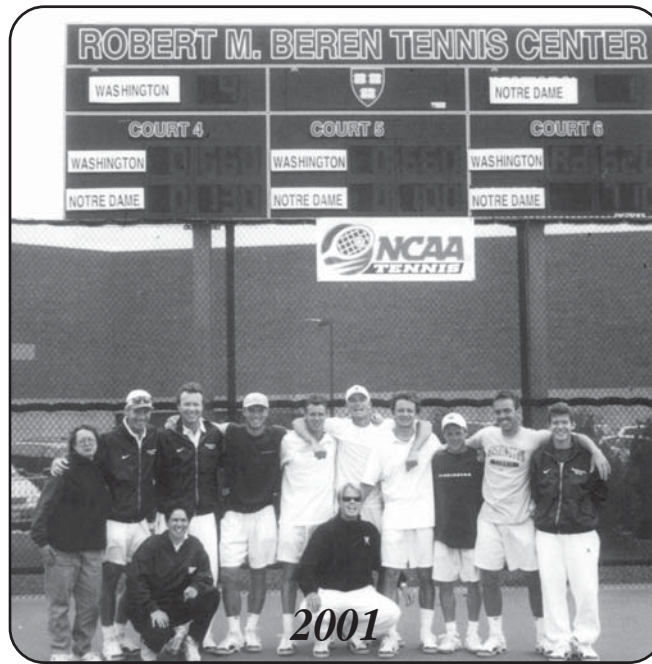


# THREE STRAIGHT NCAA SWEET 16 TEAMS



# 2003 SEASON REVIEW

**ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS, AGAIN:** Year in and year out, ever since Matt Anger took over the head coaching reigns at Washington, his Huskies continue to reach loftier heights each season. And 2003 was no different. A Husky squad, led by senior All-American Matt Hanlin and junior All-American Alex Vlaski, finished the year with its highest ever final national ranking at No. 12. The Huskies' highest ranking of the year was No. 7, just one spot shy of its all-time high ranking of No. 6 set in 2001. Washington has finished in the nation's Top-25 in five of the last six seasons. Washington also advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the third-straight year, also a school record. And for good measure, the Huskies set a new school-record with 14-straight wins to open the 2003 season. Just the previous season had Washington rattled off 13 consecutive wins to open 2002 schedule.

**HOW SWEET IT IS:** The Huskies joined some elite company when they advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the third consecutive year. Only three other Division I teams have accomplished this feat. Along with Washington, UCLA, Duke and Texas A&M are the only teams to reach the Round of 16 in the last three years. The feat is especially notable for Washington, a team that which has not hosted the first and second rounds. The Huskies have not had the advantage of playing on its home courts en route to the team finals any of those seasons.

**LET'S ROLL:** Washington opened the season on a roll, winning its first 14-straight matches and setting a school record in the process. Included among the Huskies' 14 victories were three against Top-25 teams all on the road: No. 17 Pepperdine (4-1), No. 19 Virginia Commonwealth (4-3) and No. 21 North Carolina (6-1). Eleven of the 14 opponents held national rankings. Also apart of the streak, the Huskies won their own Great Northwest Shootout with victories over No. 37 Clemson (6-1) and No. 27 Tulane (5-2). During the streak, Washington had the luxury of playing 10 of those 14 matches at home. It was at the height of their winning streak that the Huskies earned their highest ranking of the season at No. 7 in mid-March. The Huskies' fate would soon turn with Pac-10 play around the corner...

**A TALE OF TWO SEASONS:** An appropriate title for the story of a season when the tides quickly turned in late March. After Washington's school-record 14-0 start in non-conference matches, UW finished the regular season going 2-5 in Pac-10 play. After 14-straight wins, UW went on to lose four straight— to Stanford and Cal at home and on the road at Arizona and Arizona State. The Huskies were bit by the injury bug during the conference schedule, a tough

factor to overcome when facing perhaps the toughest tennis conference in the nation.

### **CHASING THE PAC:**

Following a pair of losses at home to sixth-ranked Stanford and seventh-ranked California, the Huskies seemed to be "chasing the Pac" ever since the start of conference play. Washington then had to play its final five league matches on the road, falling to No. 40 Arizona State, No. 52 Arizona, and No. 4 UCLA. The Huskies made a bit of history with its first win over USC in the program's history. The Trojans were ranked No. 22 at the time of the match. Washington also defeated Northwest rival Oregon to finish the regular season 16-5. "The down side of our season came in Pac-10 Conference play," Anger said. "That was where the injuries really caught up with us and a couple of losses probably cost us a top eight seeding in the NCAA Championships. The conference play, as always, will really be a strong focus for us this upcoming season."

**DOUBLES ANYONE?:** The Huskies excelled in doubles play last year, posting a 19-5 record with the doubles point which set a school record. During its 14-0 opening win streak, Washington won the doubles point in each match. "One of the forgotten keys to our success last season was our improved doubles play," Anger said.

### **VLASKI FALLS JUST SHY OF PAC-10 TITLE:**

For the second-straight year, Alex Vlaski fell just shy of winning the Pac-10 singles championship at the Pac-10 Championships held in Ojai, Calif. Vlaski advanced to the final and faced UCLA's Marcin Matkowski. It was also the second-straight time Vlaski faced a Bruin in the Pac-10 final, after falling to Rodrigo Grilli as a freshman in 2002. Vlaski was ousted in straight sets by Matkowski, 6-4, 6-2. But Vlaski did earn a victory

in 2003 over defending champion Grilli in the quarterfinals. Vlaski's teammate Matt Hanlin was eliminated from singles play in the quarterfinals, falling to John Paul Fruttero in straight sets, 6-4, 6-1. Neither Husky doubles pair made it past the first round of the main draw, but Scott Felsenthal and Nick Weiss did advance to the quarterfinals of the invitational doubles draw.

**HUSKIES HEAD TO SAN DIEGO:** The Huskies received a 16<sup>th</sup>-seed to the NCAA Tournament and traveled to beautiful San Diego, Calif. to begin their run to the Sweet 16. Washington's first round opponent was American, as the Huskies made quick work of the Eagles with a 4-0 victory. UW captured the first two doubles wins to take the doubles point thanks to victories by the teams of Ari Strasberg and Alex Vlaski, and Christoph Palmanshofer and Peter Scharler. Washington then proceeded to use singles wins from Vlaski, Hanlin and Palmanshofer to nail down the victory.

**GEORGIA ON THEIR MIND:** The Huskies posted a come-from-behind victory over host school San Diego State to earn a trip to the NCAA team finals in Athens, Ga. It wasn't easy for the Huskies, as San Diego State won the doubles point and held a 2-1 lead, when Washington rallied to win three of the final four singles matches. Senior Dillon Ruby's 6-3, 6-3 victory over Armando Carrascosa at No. 5 singles clinched the victory and a third-straight trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. Also picking up crucial singles wins were senior Matt Hanlin, sophomore Christoph Palmanshofer and sophomore Peter Scharler. Alex Vlaski was upset at No. 1 singles by Oliver Maiberger.

**TOP SEEDED ILLINOIS AWAITS UW:** The Huskies had their work cut out for them when they arrived in Athens, Ga., knowing they were

to face the nation's top-ranked team and the tournament's No. 1 seed in the mighty Illinois Fighting Illini. The Huskies put in a valiant effort, and after trailing the match 3-0, came back to get within one-point of Illinois, only to have the Illini capture the win on a victory at No. 4 singles by Michael Calkins over sophomore Christoph Palmanshofer. The Husky singles wins came from senior Matt Hanlin at No. 2 singles, with a straight-set upset of No. 12 Brian Wilson, 6-4, 6-3. Sophomore Peter Scharler also picked up a win for Washington at No. 6 singles, defeating Ryler DeHeart, 6-4, 6-3. A much anticipated match between No. 10 Alex Vlaski and No. 3 Amer Delic was never finished due to Illinois clinching the match at 4-2. "I was crushed when we lost to Illinois, the eventual NCAA Champions," Anger said. "We played well but there were certainly chances out there for us to pull the match out."

## VLASKI BATTLES TO NCAA SINGLES SEMIFINAL:

With the team portion of the NCAA Championships concluded for Washington, there was still much more tennis to be played for Alex Vlaski and Matt Hanlin in the individual singles championships. For Hanlin, it would be the last collegiate run of this career. The Husky senior picked up a first-round win over Andreas Lauland from Virginia Tech, but suffered a second-round loss to one of the nation's top players in fourth-ranked Bo Hodge. Hodge downed Hanlin in straight sets, 6-0, 6-4. Vlaski on the other hand, advanced as far as the singles semifinal to earn his first All-America honors. In the second round, Vlaski found himself pitted against an all-too familiar opponent in UCLA's Marcin Matkowski whom he faced in the Pac-10 final. This time, it was Vlaski who ended up on top 6-1, 6-3. Then in the Round of 16, Vlaski continued his phenomenal run, toppling the tournament's top-seeded player, Bobby Reynolds from Vanderbilt,

7-5, 7-6. It was the second victory for Vlaski over Reynolds during the season. Vlaski's quest for an NCAA title came to an end in the semifinals, losing to No. 3 Amer Delic from Illinois, 7-6, 3-6, 6-2.

## DONE TOO SOON:

"Overall, last year ended too soon for me," Anger said. "We had a couple players that struggled with injuries all season and I felt that we were just starting to get healthy. Had the year lasted another month there was no telling how well we could have done. That is the beauty of the NCAA Championships, though, they come once a year and you need to be at your best at that time."

## SIMPLY THE BEST:

Alex Vlaski put together arguably the finest season by an individual player in the Husky men's tennis program. In addition to earning All-America honors with a trip to the NCAA singles semifinal, Vlaski's sophomore campaign also saw him advance to the Pac-10 singles final, the ITA Regional final, the ITA National Indoor Championships quarterfinals and the semifinals of the All-American Championships. For good measure, Vlaski finished the season with an overall singles record of 37-8, two wins shy of the UW single season record of 39 set by Chet Crile in 1992-93. Vlaski also finished the season with a No. 6 singles ranking, the highest ever final ranking for a Husky men's tennis player.

## HANLIN MAKES MARK ON HISTORY:

Alex Vlaski wasn't the only Husky to have a stellar campaign in 2002-03. Senior Matt Hanlin finished the year with a final singles ranking of No. 24 and compiled a singles mark of 31-8. He also finished the year 19-6 in doubles with partner Dillon Ruby. Hanlin leaves the Husky program as the winningest player in all-time

school history. He culminated his career with 179 combined singles and doubles wins, far surpassing the previous record holder, Eric Drew, who had 158 combined wins from 1996-99. "This was really impressive to me since to get this record you need to perform consistently in singles and in doubles," Anger said. "When Matt came to Washington, he had almost no doubles experience and was forced to play very high in the lineup right away in singles, which made it a difficult first year for him. He didn't just barely break the record, Matt established a whole new standard."

## POST-SEASON HONORS:

A stellar season saw the Huskies receive many postseason accolades when awards were handed out season's end. Matt Hanlin and Alex Vlaski were named to the All-Pac-10 first-team, while Ari Strasberg and Vlaski were selected to the All-Pac-10 Academic first-team. Peter Scharler earned Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention accolades. Vlaski, in addition to his first career All-America certificate, was named the West Region's ITA Player to Watch. Hanlin was also honored at the regional level, being named the West Region's nominee for the John Van Nostrand Memorial Award. Strasberg was also awarded a Pac-10 post-graduate scholarship.

# TENNIS FACILITIES

## LLOYD NORDSTROM TENNIS CENTER



Located just north of Husky Stadium, the Lloyd Nordstrom Tennis Center is one of the Northwest's most modern indoor tennis facilities. The doors of the indoor facility at the University of Washington were opened with dedication ceremonies on June 1, 1989.

The tennis center, sporting six courts, was made possible by a \$2.5 million donation from the family of the late Lloyd Nordstrom. Mr. Nordstrom played on the Husky varsity tennis team from 1930-1932 and was noted for his love of the game and his loyalty to the University. Illsley Nordstrom, his wife, said, "My family is proud to honor the memory of Lloyd W. Nordstrom with the presentation of this indoor tennis center to the University of Washington. . . . we feel he would be honored and delighted."

All six courts at the Center have been renamed by Husky tennis donors. In 1999, Court Two was renamed Sosnowy Court in honor of the family that donated the first fully endowed scholarship for women's tennis. LaGayle and John Sosnowy established the Sosnowy Family Endowed Tennis Scholarship in recognition of their daughter and former Husky, Kori Sosnowy.

Then later in the summer, the Sosnowy's dedicated Court One to UW's athletic director, naming it Barbara Hedges Court. John, LaGayle and Kori Sosnowy also established the Barbara Hedges Endowed Women's Tennis Scholarship.

The Sosnowy's also dedicated Court Three to UW senior associate athletic director, Marie Tuite. They also established the Marie Tuite Endowed Women's Tennis Scholarship.

Court Four was named the Sedlock Family Court in recognition of the Thomas J. Sedlock Endowed Men's Tennis Scholarship established by Tom and Greta Sedlock.

Court Five was named "Sidney Pinch Court" in August 1990, in recognition of the \$100,000 donation made by Pinch to the Washington tennis program. Pinch, a long-time Seattle

businessman and Tyee Club member, made the donation to fund, in perpetuity, one tennis scholarship each year.

The last court to be named was Court Six in 2003, named for Neal Dempsey in recognition of the Neal Dempsey Endowed Scholarship.

In addition to the six courts, the complex includes seating for up to 278 spectators, locker rooms, a snack bar and space for other support activities.

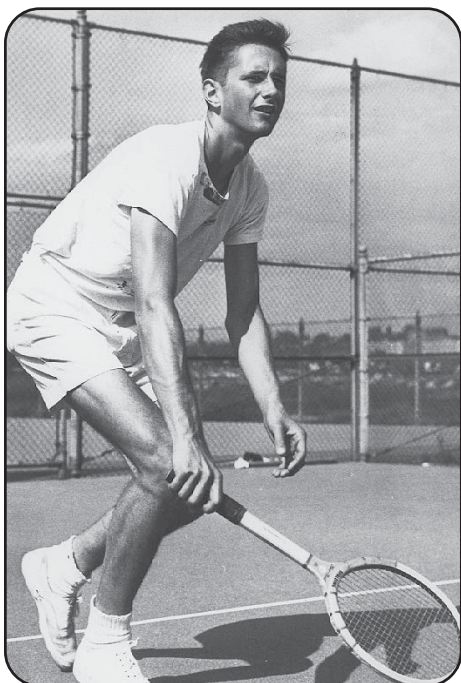
Nordstrom Tennis Center aids the Huskies in recruiting the nation's top competitors to Seattle. Prior to the opening of the tennis center, Husky tennis teams rented indoor courts for use during periods of cold and inclement weather.

In September of 1989, the Nordstrom Center was selected by the USTA's Technical Committee as one of the outstanding tennis facilities for 1989.

The USTA Facility Awards Program, now in its 20th year, was established to stimulate high standards in the construction industry and then to recognize facilities which make such a positive statement about the vitality of the game.

The tennis facility is used primarily as a competition and practice site for the Husky varsity men's and women's tennis teams. The center has also been made available to UW students, staff and faculty as scheduling permits.

Lori Pursley is in her 11th year as manager of the Nordstrom Tennis Center, performing a variety of duties. Along with scheduling times for use of the courts, Pursley also is the event manager, supervises the front desk staff, provides support for the varsity programs, and is responsible for the overall operation of the facility.



## BILL QUILLIAN STADIUM

Bill Quillian (pictured at left) has long been associated with tennis at the University of Washington, as a player, a coach and a member of the Husky Hall of Fame. His legacy was honored years ago when the University of Washington tennis courts were named in his memory. With renovation, and the possible expansion of Quillian Stadium this year, the Husky tennis teams make their outdoor home on those courts.

Quillian began his stellar tennis career at Washington in 1952 and advanced to the

quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship as a freshman with Don Fly. That duo had won the U.S. National Juniors Championship in 1951. Quillian also earned a berth in the NCAA Singles Championships all four years, finishing runner-up in 1955. He is the only Husky to have represented the United States in the Davis Cup, doing so in 1958.

As coach, Quillian compiled a 63-39 record from 1966 to 1973. His winning percentage of .618 and his win total both rank fourth among all Husky tennis coaches.
