Record: Virginia 10-0, Mississippi 6-2

Recap: No. 1 seed Virginia advanced to the ITA National Men's Team Indoor Championship with their 4-2 win over No. 5 seed Mississippi today. This is the second time in four years that the Cavaliers have beaten the Rebels in the semifinals; in 2005, No. 6 seeded Mississippi was upset by an unseeded Virginia team in the semifinals at this tournament, 4-1. The match was a close one from the first serve. Mississippi got the first win of the day at No. 2 doubles, as Bram ten Berge and Matthias Wellermann beat Houston Barrick and Dominic Inglot 8-3. But Virginia won the doubles point with close wins at Nos. 1 and 3 doubles. The Cavaliers took a 2-0 lead early in singles, as Sanam Singh beat Bram ten Berge 7-5, 6-1 in the No. 4 spot. Junior Robbye Poole

kept the Rebels in the game, however, with his 6-2, 1-6, 6-2 win over Treat Huey in the No. 3 singles spot. Jonas Berg tied it up at 2-2, as he beat UVA's Houston Barrick in the No. 5 singles spot, 705, 3-6, 6-3. A battle at No. 2 singles went to Virginia, putting them up 3-2; Dominic Ingot and Matthias Wellermann went to tiebreakers in the first two sets, before Ingot won the third set 6-4. The match came down to No. 1 singles where defending NCAA singles champion Somdev Devvarman had his hands full with Erling Tveit. Tveit, who is ranked No. 26 in the nation to Devvarman's No. 1, won the first set 6-4, and was serving for the match at 5-3 in the second set, but he couldn't stop Devvarman's comeback. Devvarman battled back to win the second set in the tiebreaker and force a third set; from there, he never looked back, as he beat Tveit in the third set 6-0, to clinch the 4-2 win for UVA. This will be the second finals appearance for the Cavaliers at this tournament; after upsetting Ole Miss in 2005, Virginia advanced to the finals, where they lost 4-1 to Baylor. The Cavaliers will face off against the winner of the No. 2 Georgia/No. 3 Ohio State match, Monday at noon.
