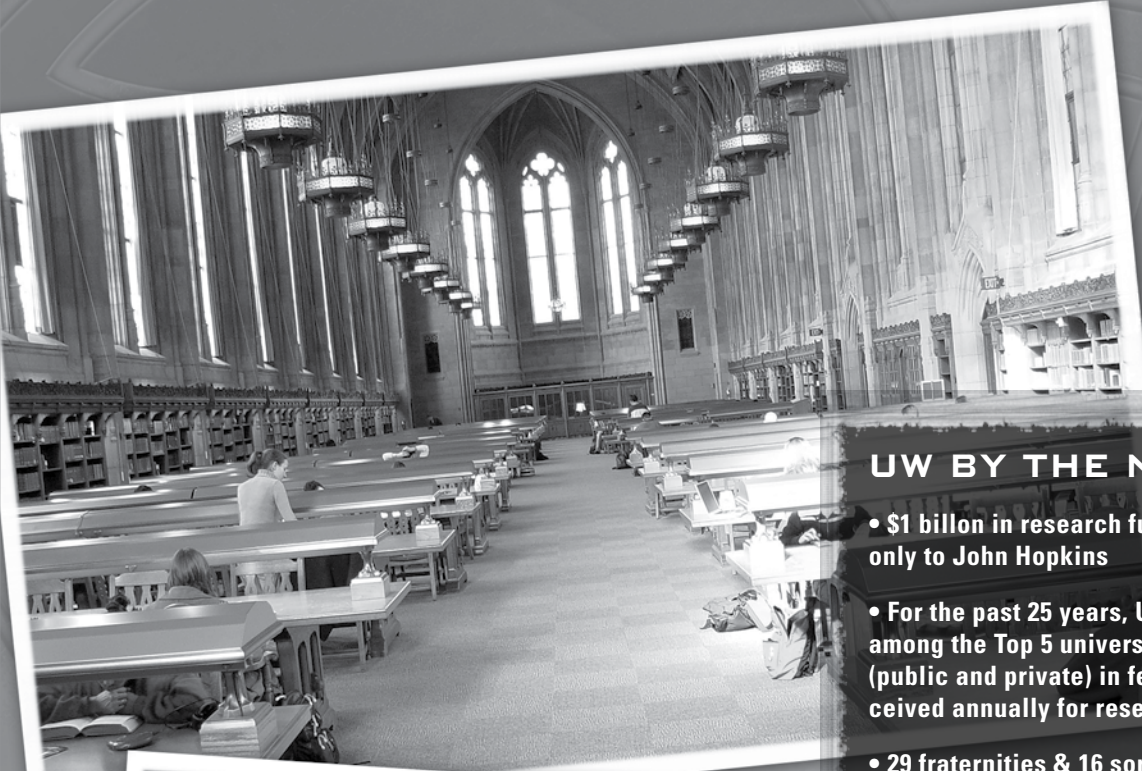

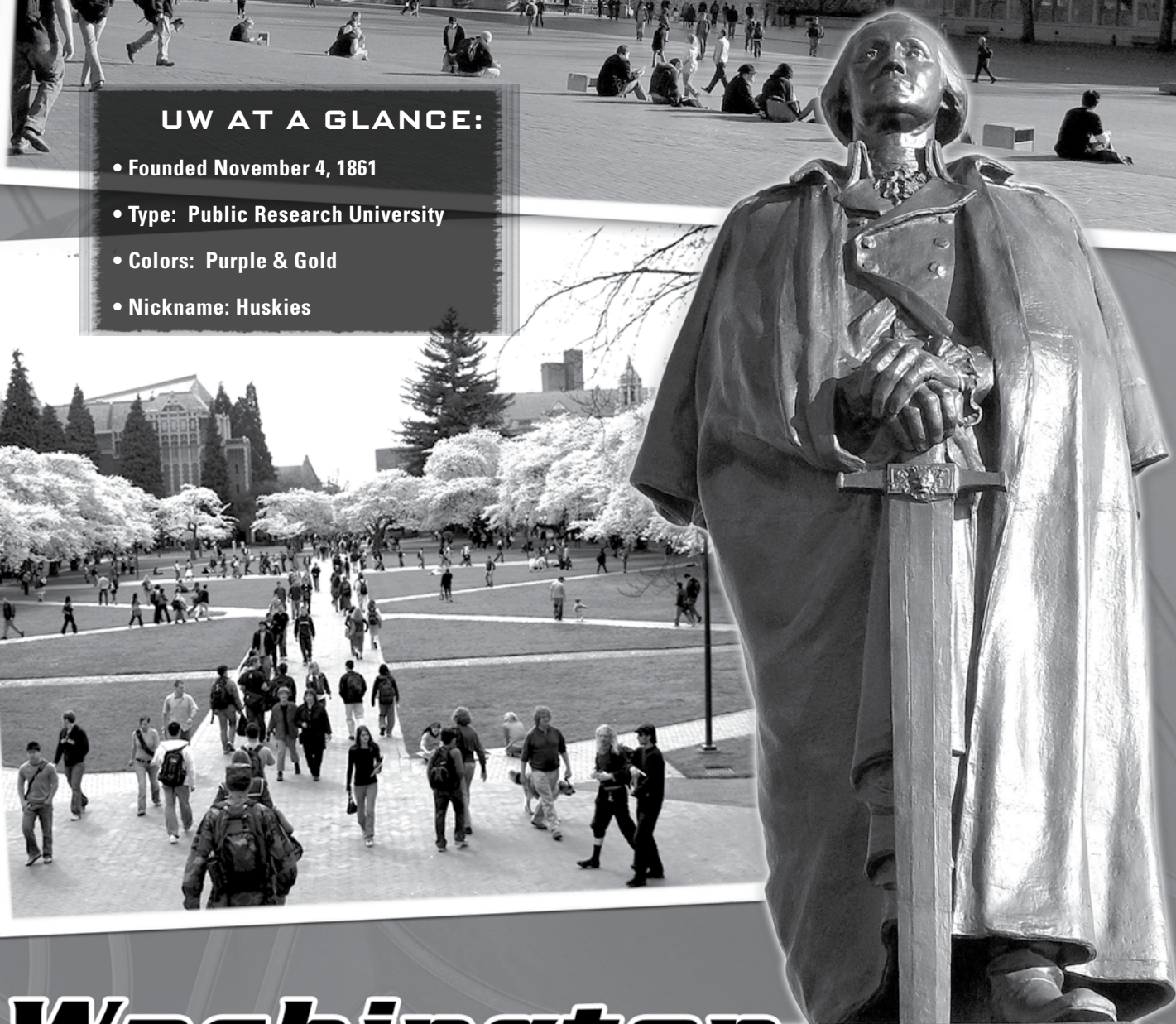

MARK EMMERT

University President

Mark A. Emmert became the 30th president of the University of Washington, his alma mater, in June 2004. As the leader of the nation's top public university in terms of research funding, he is committed to building on the UW standard of excellence to produce a transformative learning experience for students and improve the lives of the citizens of the state of Washington and beyond.

Since taking office, Emmert has led an array of efforts ranging from revitalizing undergraduate education to improving workplace culture. He has championed accessibility and diversity, and has strengthened the University's commitment to sustainability and environmental stewardship. He has developed and overseen a comprehensive strategic plan to put the UW on a more competitive financial footing with its peers.

Emmert is a seasoned academic leader. Prior to assuming the presidency at the University of Washington, he was chancellor at Louisiana State University. He also served as chancellor of the University of Connecticut and held administrative and academic positions at the University of Colorado and Montana State University. He was a J. W. Fulbright Administrative Fellow in Germany and an American Council on Education Fellow.

A native of Fife, Emmert attended Green River Community College before he transferred to the University of Washington. He graduated from the UW in 1975 with a degree in political science. He received his master's degree in 1976 and his doctorate in 1983, both in public administration from the Maxwell School of Syracuse University. Emmert and his wife, DeLaine, have been married for more than 30 years. They have two children, Steve and Jennifer.



SCOTT WOODWARD

Director of Athletics

University of Washington President Mark A. Emmert announced on Sept. 17, 2008 the appointment of Scott Woodward as the school's 16th director of intercollegiate athletics. Woodward, the UW's Vice President for External Relations since 2004, served as interim athletic director for the previous seven months.

"The search committee and I looked all over the country for an athletic director," said Emmert. "I concluded that we had the best person for the job already in place. Scott is a talented administrator who knows higher education and understands the place of intercollegiate athletics at a university like this. He is student-oriented and as his background in politics suggests, is highly competitive and puts a premium on winning. I have great confidence in his abilities and know he will provide excellent leadership for the department."

Woodward worked with Emmert at Louisiana State University as director of external affairs in the Office of the Chancellor from 2000 to 2004. In that position, he acted as the liaison between the university and government and corporate officials and advised the chancellor on the implications of potential policy changes external to the university. He also served as the liaison from the Chancellor's office to the LSU athletic department and helped Emmert oversee it.

While Emmert and Woodward were at LSU, the institution's intercollegiate athletic teams won 10 NCAA national championships, including one in football in 2003. Woodward also experienced first-hand national championship caliber teams in baseball, basketball, and track and field. In addition, during that span the athletics program ranked among the top 11 in the nation three times in the annual NACDA Director's Cup - a measurement of broad-based competitive athletics success - and claimed 11 CoSIDA Academic All-America selections.

"Scott has seen what it takes to compete at the highest levels and to do it the right way," said Emmert. "He knows the kind of support coaches need and has the right values to provide the kind of leadership our athletic program requires."

Woodward holds a bachelor's degree in political science from LSU. In Louisiana, he served as a political consultant, a legislative liaison in the office of the governor, a lobbyist, and for eight years as a principal in his own government and public relations firm.

"It is exciting to now have a leader and a direction for our department," said UW head football coach Tyrone Willingham. "Scott's passion for football is clearly evident but his dedication extends to all our athletic teams. He has experience with some outstanding programs, which have benefited from his leadership and high level of expectation. Our time together has been positive and I look forward to continuing to work with him."



STEPHANIE REMPE

Senior Associate Athletic Director

Stephanie Rempe enters her first year in 2008-09 at UW as senior associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator.

Rempe (pronounced REMP) is a key senior member of the athletic department's management team and serves as the department's liaison to the Pacific-10 Conference and NCAA committees related to women's athletics. She oversees the day-to-day operations for men's and women's basketball, as well as several Olympic sports, and has additional responsibilities in the day-to-day operation of the Husky athletics department.

Formerly a senior member of the University of Oklahoma athletics staff, Rempe served OU in a number of capacities - most notably serving as the sport administrator for men's basketball, volleyball, men's and women's gymnastics, wrestling and softball. During her tenure, she also had oversight responsibilities for women's basketball, soccer, men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track, the sports medicine program and the department's strength and conditioning program.

A 1993 graduate of the University of Arizona, where she was a four-year letterwinner on the Wildcat volleyball team, Rempe began her career in athletics at her alma mater while earning her master's degree in sports administration. She spent three years in the UA athletic department's Wildcat Club and coordinated the Arizona Alumni Letterwinner's Association.

In 1998, Rempe began a five-year stint as associate athletic director and senior woman administrator at the University of Texas at El Paso. While with the Miner athletics program, she oversaw 13 sports, football internal operations, the department's lifekills program, sports medicine and the strength and conditioning program.

A native of Santa Barbara, Calif., Rempe is an avid runner who has twice competed in the Boston Marathon and completed an Ironman Triathlon. She is a member of the Santa Barbara Athletic Round Table Hall of Fame and the Santa Barbara High School Ye le Gang Hall of Fame.



JOHN MORRIS

Senior Associate Director for Compliance

John Morris enters his fourth year as Washington's Senior Associate Athletic Director for Compliance.

As senior associate director, Morris is responsible for the athletic department's compliance with all applicable University, State, Pac-10 and NCAA rules, regulations and policies. He provides clarification and interpretations of

NCAA and Pac-10 rules to staff, student-athletes and representatives of athletic interests, and has oversight of procedures that deal with recruiting, eligibility and financial aid. Morris also oversees the academic support unit at UW.

Prior to coming to UW, Morris worked for two-and-a-half years as the Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance and Student Services at Sacramento State, managing all aspects of the Hornets' compliance program. Morris joined the Sacramento State staff after three years at the NCAA, including two years as the Associate Director of Membership Services/Coordinator of Interpretations.

Morris began his career in intercollegiate athletics at Vanderbilt. Prior to that, Morris was an attorney for the firm of Lowndes, Drosdick, Doster, Kantor & Reed in Orlando.

Morris earned his bachelor's degrees in French and political science from Vanderbilt in 1990, and his law degree from Vanderbilt in 1993. A native of St. Louis, Mo., Morris and wife, Taylor, have a son, Oliver.



JENNIFER COHEN

Senior Associate Director for Advancement

Jennifer Cohen was promoted in May, 2008 to oversee the department's development efforts as the senior associate athletic director for development.

Cohen, who previously served as the department's associate athletic director for major gifts since Dec., 2005,

oversees the department's fundraising efforts for various initiatives such as capital projects, planning giving and scholarships. She also oversees the athletic department's annual fundraising efforts through the Tyee Club, the Big "W" Club and special events.

A native of Tacoma, Cohen has served the UW development efforts for the past 10 years. She joined the athletic department staff in 1998 before moving to the university's central development office to focus on fundraising efforts on behalf of the office of undergraduate education.

Recently, she has been a driving force behind a major effort to maximize the university's "Students First" matching scholarship program, which has earned more than \$15 million for the department's endowment for athletics scholarships.

A 1991 graduate of San Diego State University, Cohen earned her master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration, from Pacific Lutheran University in 1994. She and her husband, Bill, are the parents of two sons, Tyson and Dylan.



PAUL KING

Senior Associate Director for Business and Finance

Paul King is in his 14th year overseeing the business and financial affairs of the athletic department. He is responsible for the overall financial management of all athletic programs, involving policy making, strategic planning, financial management, staff and organizational development. He is the department's chief operating officer and chief financial officer.

King supervises the business office, personnel and payroll, travel, and computer systems, and handles all contract and insurance matters for the department.

Beginning his 24th year overall at Washington, King previously worked as the department's business manager. King originally joined the Husky staff as an accountant in the business office.

King's prior business experience is in the airfreight and woodstove industries. A 55-year old native of Minneapolis, Minn., King received his bachelor's degree in accounting from the University of Minnesota. He and his wife, Deborah, have four adult children.



DR. J. PATRICK DOBEL

Faculty Athletic Representative

University of Washington Professor of Public Affairs Dr. J. Patrick Dobel enters his fifth year as the Huskies' Faculty Athletics Representative. Appointed by the President of the University, the FAR is responsible for overseeing the relationship between the University and the athletic department.

The FAR reports directly to the President, and focuses upon issues of academic integrity, compliance and the relationship between ICA and the academic community.

Dobel is a fixture on the UW campus, having worked in Washington's Evans School of Public Affairs since 1985. He has also chaired the King County Ethics Board and has served as a consultant on management, leadership and ethics issues to numerous public and nonprofit agencies. Dobel also served on the Seattle Ethics Commission, and chaired the University's NCAA Certification Process in 2005.

Dobel earned his Ph.D. in Politics and Political Philosophy from Princeton University in 1976, before teaching for the next decade at the University of Michigan-Dearborn. He has published several articles in academic journals, and is the author of the books, "Compromise and Political Action: Political Morality in Liberal and Democratic Life" and "Public Integrity."

CAMPBELL IS MMMM GOOD

Erin Campbell became UW's 32nd women's swimming All-American last season when she finished 8th in the 100 fly at the NCAA Championships. The school record holder in both the 100 fly and 200 back, Campbell also led the 200 medley relay and 400 free relay squads to ninth-place finishes at NAAs last year. She recently competed in the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials in three events.

SKY-HIGH STATS

The Husky softball program has produced 34 All-Americans and has been to the NCAA tournament in all but the first of its 16 years of existence. The Huskies have advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times.

Washington's men's golf team earned a seventh-place finish at the 2008 NCAA Championship, with Nick Taylor finishing second individually. Taylor also earned a spot to play in the 2008 U.S. Open at Torrey Pines.

THE FAST LANE

UW men's track and field team has finished in the top 20 at the past four NCAA Meets. At the 2008 outdoor meet, the men scored their most points since 1983. On the women's team, Katie Follett became Washington's first Pac-10 women's champion since 2004, winning the 1,500 meters. Follett was one of three Husky All-Americans in the mile. She was also a part of the 2007 women's cross country team that finished eighth in the NCAAs, its highest finish ever.

Winningest baseball coach in UW history ... coached 2006 Golden Spikes Award winner Tim Lincecum ... three-time Pac-10 North Coach of the Year ... has sent 71 players into professional baseball ... All-Pac-10 pitcher at UW in 1981.



WOMEN'S GOLF Mary Lou Mulflur

Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1999 ... Played in the U.S. Open in 1979 and 1980 ... NCAA Tournaments in 1995 and 1997-2006 including sixth place NCAA finish in 2006 and 2004 ... has coached 23 All-Scholar-Athlete team members.



SWIMMING Whitney Hite

Named UW head coach in September of 2006 ... led UW women to 12th place at 2008 NAAs, highest in school history ... assistant with Cal women, helping them to three top-8 national finishes ... won three NCAA titles as assistant with Georgia.



MEN'S BASKETBALL Lorenzo Romar

Led his alma mater to NCAA tournaments in 2004, 2005 and 2006 ... No. 1 seed in 2005 tourney ... 2005 Pac-10 Coach of the Year ... Led UW to Pac-10 Tournament title in 2005 ... Lettered for UW 1979-80 ... played in the NBA.



MEN'S GOLF Matt Thurmond

Led Huskies to 7th place at 2008 NAAs, 6th place at 2004 NAAs and 3rd in 2005 ... Won Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 2005 ... won 2005 Pac-10 title and coached NCAA individual champ in '05 ... Coached UW to regional title in 2002..



MEN'S TENNIS Matt Anger

Led UW to "Sweet 16" appearances in 2001-03, 2005 and 2006 ... led UW to NAAs in each of the last 14 years ... highest national ranking No. 6 in 2001 ... won 2005 Pac-10 team title ... 3-time All-American in college and ranked No. 23 as a pro.



WOMEN'S BASKETBALL Tia Jackson

Introduced as head coach on April 6, 2007 ... served as an assistant at Duke, UCLA, Stanford and Virginia Commonwealth ... played at Iowa where she led her squad to the 1994 NCAA Final Four ... played for Phoenix Mercury in the WNBA.



GYMNASTICS Joanne Bowers

Named UW head coach in June of 2006 and honored as 2007 Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year and West Region Coach of the Year ... while an assistant at Michigan coached 13 All-Americans ... a four-time letterwinner as a gymnast at James Madison.



WOMEN'S TENNIS Jill Hultquist

Former UW assistant named head coach in 2005 ... led UW to NAAs in 2008 ... 2001 national assistant coach of the year ... played on WTA pro tour from 1987-97, ranking as high as No. 6 in the world in doubles ... four-time All-American..

Student Athlete Academic Services

Student-Athlete Academic Services (SAAS) consists of academic counseling, academic coordination, a comprehensive tutorial program, learning resources and assistance for students with learning disabilities, a study skills program for all students, a comprehensive Life Skills program, and leadership and mentoring opportunities. We focus on the needs of each individual student-athlete and develop an individualized program to meet those needs. Integration into the larger campus environment is encouraged and facilitated through collaborative programs developed with a variety of UW programs and resources.

Four full-time academic advisors provide academic counseling support for student-athletes. Advisors assist students with course selection, major declaration, graduation planning, and career/internship opportunities through the use of individualized academic plans designed for each student.

Academic coordinators serve to assist students with the transition to university life and the University of Washington. They assist students with academic monitoring, tutorial scheduling, academic goal setting, time management and study skill development. One-on-one meetings are conducted with freshmen and students in academic difficulty on a weekly basis.

The Learning Resources unit is headed by a full-time learning specialist available to assist students with learning disabilities, study skills development, and academic success strategies. Under the direction

of the Tutorial Coordinator, approximately 70 highly trained tutors provide individual, small group, and review session tutorial services for student-athletes each quarter.

INTERVIEW POLICY

Contact Erin Rowley in the Athletic Communications Department at least 24 hours in advance for ALL interview requests. Coaches and players are typically available before or after practice on a first-come, first-served basis. Because of NCAA rules, which limit the time student-athletes can practice, it is imperative that media members wishing to interview players before practice be available before the scheduled practice start time. Practices will start on time, and players and coaches will not be interviewed once practice has begun. Student-athletes are not available for interviews on game day.

PRACTICE

The first 30 minutes of each practice are generally open to the media. Please call the Athletic Communications Department to confirm site and time.

CREDENTIALS

All single-game or season credential requests for Husky women's basketball should be directed to the UW Athletic Communications Department by phone or in writing. It is recommended that requests be made one week in advance of the game you wish to cover. If media are unable to pick up credentials prior to the game, they may be picked up at Will Call at the arena. Will Call opens 90 minutes before tip-off.

PARKING

For practice on campus, media parking is available in several locations, all within close proximity to the arena (E-8, E-11 and E-12). Lots E-11 and E-12 can be accessed through the main entrance to the Husky football stadium off Montlake Blvd. The E-8 lot is located behind the IMA building and can be accessed by taking the first entrance after Graves Building (travelling North on Montlake Blvd.). Media parking on game day will be available in close proximity to the arena. Media may pick up a parking pass from the Athletic Communications Office.

TELEPHONES

The Athletic Communications Department has limited telephone lines installed in the press seating area and workroom. These lines are primarily for use by the UW Athletic Communications Department. If media members require telephone lines, please contact the University of Washington Telecommunications Department, (206) 543-0133. They will arrange to have phone lines installed at your expense. There are co-op phone lines available to visiting flagship radio stations.

WIRELESS AND HIGH-SPEED INTERNET

Wireless internet access is available on gamedays inside Bank of America Arena. High-speed ethernet lines are also available in the media workroom.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photo passes are available for accredited news media. Passes should be requested one week in advance of the game you wish to cover. If media are unable to pick up credentials prior to the game, they may be picked up at Will Call at Bank of America Arena. Will Call opens 90 minutes before tip-off.

Photographers may work from the baselines, in accordance with NCAA rules. In no case may a photographer shoot from the sidelines or press row. No tripods are allowed. Passes and photo armbands must be visible at all times. Failure to adhere to any regulations, or any interference with play, is reason for expulsion.

GAME SERVICES

Computerized play-by-play accounts for each half, and halftime and final statistics, will be distributed in the press seating area and the media work room. A light meal will be served prior to tip-off in the work room at the arena.

Postgame interviews with visiting personnel will be conducted either outside the respective locker room or in the media work room, depending on demand.

The press seating area and the media work room will be available following each home game as work areas for media. Final statistics and play-by-play accounts will be available in both areas. Two telephones will be available for postgame filing in the press seating area.

NCAA GUIDELINES AND THE MEDIA

Media members should be aware of several NCAA rules that apply to student-athletes. If there is ever a question if any media-related activity or event including a Washington student-athlete could be a possible NCAA violation, contact Sr. Associate Athletic Director For Compliance, John Morris, for an interpretation. Areas of concern include:

- Coaches and University officials cannot make comments on prospective student-athletes until they sign a national letter of intent. A coach cannot comment on a prospective student-athlete who verbally commits to an institution.
- Coaches and athletic staff are not permitted to write guest columns for publications.
- Do not ask student-athletes to list or endorse products.
- Photographers cannot provide student-athletes with photographs or slides. The Athletic Communications office offers a similar service for student-athletes to purchase photographs.
- Student-athletes may not be used in advertisements or endorsements of products, including media-related publications.
- Student-athletes are not permitted to conduct interviews for 1-900 services.
- Establishing an Internet site in and of itself does not categorize an individual as a media entity. Therefore, individuals who establish Internet sites independent of the institution continue to be subject to all applicable restrictions related to contacting prospects for a recruiting purpose.
